

Heritage High School 2022-23 Local Scholarship Application

Scholarship Checklist

- Step 2: Print, initial and sign application where indicated.
- Step 3: Create cover pages include: Name of Local Scholarship(s), your First & Last Name, photo and the one word that best describes you. SAMPLE on page 8.
- Step 4: Write required Writing Response on page 7.
- Step 5: Complete additional requirements as necessary for scholarships (pages 2-7). Label each with your First & Last Name and Name of Scholarship.
- Step 6: Put the application together in the following order:
 - Item 1. Supplemental Criteria pages 2-7
 - Item 2. Additional Item page 8
 - Item 3. Cover Page(s), be sure to follow example page 9
 - Item 4. Additional Requirement ex: Essays, half page, letter, etc.
 - Item 5. Application pages 9-12
 - Item 6. Unofficial Transcript
 - Item 7. Required Writing Response
 - Item 8. Recommendation Letters (2)

Step 7: Copies: NO FOLDERS and PLEASE follow instructions or ASK questions.

- Two complete copies of all **items** 1-8 (listed above in step 6).
- Additional copies for <u>each</u> scholarship that requires their own copy noted on pages 2-6 with a *YES.

 - Item 3, Cover Page, be sure to include the name of the scholarship

 - Item 5, Application pgs. 9-12
 - Item 6, Unofficial Transcript (Request from your counselor or in Career Center)
 - Item 7, Writing Response
 - Item 8, Recommendation Letters (2)
- Step 8: Turn In copies to the HHS College & Career Center on or before 4 PM on
 - January 20, 2023. NO LATE APPLICATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED!
 - Two completed applications, **items** 1-8

- 2. Describe the most significant challenge you have faced and the steps you have taken to overcome this challenge. How has this challenge affected your academic achievement?
- 3. What is the one thing that you think sets you apart from other candidates applying to the Local Scholarship Program?

Item 8: Letters of Recommendation:

Provide two (2) letters of recommendation, from an adult in the community (i.e. coach –non HHS staff, pastor, employer, etc.). The letters of recommendation should be addressing the HHS Local Scholarship Committee commenting on your character, responsibility, and sense of purpose.


