LANGUAGE

Aanjobimaadizing, which means "Changing Lives," is a program of the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe. Through the Aanjobimaadizing Project, sixteen first speakers teamed with linguists, teachers, and Ojibwe language experts to create this new literature for Ojibwe language learners. The stories, printed in Ojibwe (no English), reflect a rare authenticity as they transmit cultural values, increase vocabulary, and reinforce identity. In collaboration with the Mille Lacs Band of Ojibwe, the MNHS Press published three Aanjobimaadizing books in the fall of 2020.
