

How year long course grades will be reported in Powerschool:

- When students/parents log into Powerschool they will see that S1 grades have been converted to F1 grades. Q3 grades will also be posted. These Q3 grades will end up being the S2 grade.
- Eventually the S2 grade will be converted into a second F1 grade. At the end of the school year students will have two final grades (F1s) for each year long course on their transcript.
- Each passing F1 grade will be awarded a 0.5 credit.
- All S1 grades will be reported numerically.
- Passing S2 grades will be reported as PC19.
- S2 grades below a 60% will not receive a 0.5 credit and will appear as a WC19 on the transcript.

Requesting a Numeric Grade Option and Deadlines:

- All S2 grades will be inputted as PC19 or WC19 by teachers at the end of the school year.
- If a student wants to post their numerical grade rather than PC19, they **must request this option** using a written request that comes from the parent and student (both signatures are required). If no request is made, the student will automatically receive a PC19 for passing grades on their transcript for S2.

- Students may make this choice individually by course. For example, the student may choose to take their numerical grade in six courses, but a PC19 in the other two courses.
- Students will make this choice only after knowing their final Q3 grade; available on June 5th.
- **JUNE 12th is the deadline** for requesting a numeric grade. Enloe will not be accepting requests for numeric grades after this date.
- Families can either email the form to enloehs-covidgrading@wcpss.net or send it via USPS. If mailing in the request, the postmark must be on or before June 12th. (If families choose to mail the request, we cannot guarantee delivery. There will be no drop-off available for safety reasons.)
- Numeric grade requests will be processed throughout the summer; please understand the time it takes to change and update individual grades, and we ask that students and families refrain from asking when their numeric grades will show in Powerschool.

Understanding GPA and what colleges are saying:

- Teachers, counselors, and administration will not calculate GPAs for any student.
- Understanding how a GPA is calculated is important and there are many tools available to students and families.
- Grades of PC19 and WC19 will not be included in a student's GPA calculation.

- Each passing numeric grade will calculate as a half credit and half quality points (similar to how a semester course is calculated).
- Based on WCPSS recommendation, any student that has a grade of 80 or above is encouraged to complete the request for numeric grading form to show their actual percentage on their transcript instead of the PC19. It is important for students to demonstrate to College Admissions that they were able to persevere through challenging times.

** Fall semester courses have been finalized and will be posted to the transcript.

** Spring semester courses will be treated like an S2 grade and will receive a .5 credit if passing. These courses will also default to the PC19/WC19 grade unless the student and parent complete the numeric grade request form.
