

<p>Question 1</p> <p>Primary Dimension to Measure: <i>Emotional Maturity</i></p>	<p><b>Describe what you think your biggest adjustments in college will be.</b></p> <p><i>Potential Follow-up Questions</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How are you preparing yourself?</li> <li>• Scenario: It's half-way through your first semester in college and you've been keeping the same study habits you had in high school. The results from your first exams come back, and they're not as high as you expected. How do you proceed?</li> </ul>
<p>Question 2</p> <p>Primary Dimension to Measure: <i>Critical Thinking</i></p>	<p><b>What is your favorite subject in school and why? How did it influence the colleges you applied to?</b></p> <p><i>Potential Follow-up Question</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• What other factors did you consider when researching potential universities? (Interviewer Instructions: Probe culture, social, size, demographics, location, school resources, if not readily noted.)</li> </ul>
<p>Question 3</p> <p>Primary Dimensions to Measure: <i>Emotional Maturity</i> <i>Leadership/Service</i></p>	<p><b>You may have heard the adage, "It takes a village to raise a child." What villages (i.e. communities) have helped shape you?</b></p> <p><i>Potential Follow-up Questions</i></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Please tell me a bit more about how each one has influenced who you are today?</li> <li>• How will you use the values you have acquired through your community to make an impact in the future?</li> </ul>
<p>Question 4</p> <p>Primary Dimensions to Measure: <i>Emotional Maturity</i> <i>Critical Thinking</i></p>	<p><b>Interviewer instructions:</b> <i>The four prompts below are the essay prompts students answered in Phase Two of the application. Based on the interview thus far, please select one prompt you would like to know more about.</i></p> <p><b>Question: I want to know more about one of your essays. To refresh your memory, I will read you the prompt for the essay I'm referring to. [Choose and read <u>ONLY ONE</u> prompt]. Tell me why what you wrote is meaningful to you?</b></p>
<p>Essay Prompt 1</p>	<p>In 2042 you are selected as one of Time Magazine's 100 Most Influential People in the world. What achievement(s) earned you a spot on this list? How did you achieve success and what impact is it having on your community, the United States, and the world?</p>
<p>Essay Prompt 2</p>	<p>Tell us about your community. How has your community shaped the person you are today?</p>
<p>Essay Prompt 3</p>	<p>What does leadership mean to you? Describe how you have exemplified leadership via one, or several, of your high school extracurricular pursuits.</p>
<p>Essay Prompt 4</p>	<p>Tell us about a time when you failed at something. What were the circumstances? How did you respond to failure? What lessons did you learn?</p>
<p>Final Question</p>	<p><b>Is there anything else you think is valuable for the selection committee to consider that you have not yet shared in the application process?</b></p>
