Using the HCA Healthcare logo

Versions of the HCA Healthcare logo are available in both a stacked form, meaning HCA and the Diamond Plus rest atop the word Healthcare, and a horizontal form. The preferred logo usage is in its stacked form.

Clear space requirements





The HCA Healthcare logo must always be surrounded by clear space that contains neither text nor graphics. The clear space surrounding the logo should be proportionate to the size of the Diamond Plus mark within the logo.

What's in the logo zip file

Once you have downloaded the HCA Healthcare logo, extract the .zip file to find all of the versions and formats that you will need. There will be two folders inside:

HCA Healthcare primary logo folder

The preferred format of the HCA Healthcare logo is the one that is stacked with HCA and the Diamond Plus resting atop the word Healthcare. Various color applications and file formats for the preferred HCA Healthcare logo are located in the HCA Healthcare logo folder.

HCA Healthcare horizontal logo folder

Use the horizontal HCA Healthcare logo when you have space limitations. For example, if the preferred logo would be hard to read because of the design area or required layout, then use the horizontal logo. Color and file type variations for this logo format are available in the horizontal logo folder.

Note: Each folder contains a subfolder titled "Optimized for digital use." These logos are best for digital assets such as websites because they have been saved as a smaller file size and RGB color format, and should not be used in print assets.

File types

Two file types are included in the logo zip file:

- **EPS files** can only be previewed or opened using graphic design software such as Adobe Illustrator and InDesign. EPS files are the source files that designers use to produce branded assets. EPS files are often used for high-resolution printing for large-scale banners, signage, awards, etc., and may be requested by vendors who produce those materials.
- PNG files are typically used in PowerPoint, Word, printed materials, digital screens and web assets.
 PNG files have a transparent background, so the image will not display in file preview. Open the .PNG file with image viewing software to verify you have selected the appropriate file.
- Use the chart on the next page to help you know when to use which type of logo file.
