#### Cross 6th Avenue South toward Student Life Center (SLC) 2 STUDENT LIFE CENTER (SLC)

- The SLC is the center for involvement on campus, serving as the physical location for many of our student organizations and student life departments. **Student Disability Services**

- · Early St. Petersburg landmarks that were donated to the university.
  - The Williams House

»Built in 1891 and moved here in 1995. »On the U.S. National Register of Historic Places. »Houses academic offices.

- The Snell House
- »Built in 1903 and moved in 1993.

»C. Perry Snell helped develop St. Petersburg in the early 1900s.

- »Home of the Florida Studies Program.
- »Houses the Judy Genshaft Honors College at USF St. Petersburg campus.
  - »Academically gifted, highly motivated students. »Small, seminar-style classes with individual
  - attention from distinguished faculty. »Students conduct undergraduate research alongside professors.
  - »Associated scholarship.
  - »Special study abroad opportunities.

#### 6 Continue north down 2nd Street / University Way PELICAN HALL (RHO ON MAP)

- 350 occupancy, 7 floors.
- Features apartment style living with single and shared bedrooms.
- Shared kitchens and living rooms, as well as cable and internet.
- Furnished with an extra-long twin bed, desk, desk chair, dresser, sofa, sofa chair, and a dining table with chairs, as well as a full-sized refrigerator, stove, and microwave.

- ٠ One of only a few University buildings nationwide named after (and by) a woman.
- Cutting edge technology in the classrooms.
- Merrill Lynch Wealth Management Center where students apply financial planning and ٠ investment techniques with real capital.
- **Bishop Center for Ethical Leadership** 
  - »Houses the leadership minor which can be applied to any major.

#### Continue down the sidewalk. across the crosswalk **NELSON POYNTER MEMORIAL LIBRARY (POY) M**

- There are 300,000 print books here in the library, and students have 24/7 access to over a ٠ million electronic resources through partnership with USF.
- Need a break? There are recreational readings, popular magazines, and graphic novels. ٠
- Free printing, up to 27 pages per day.

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- Floors operate on quietness levels. The first floor is for collaborative study, the second floor is ٠ typical library whisper, and the third floor is silent study.
  - Students can check out laptops, flash-drives, headphones, phone chargers, calculators, and more at the front desk.
- Textbooks on reserve are available to check out for three hours at a time; a great way to save money as a student!
- USF St. Petersburg campus Student Technology Center
  - »Academic Computing Helpdesk to help solve course-related software questions or escalate them to the USF IT Helpdesk when necessary.

#### From the library, turn right and follow the long sidewalk by the water HARBOR HALL (HBR)

- Houses Department of Verbal and Visual Arts, a merging of programs in graphic design, professional and technical writing, and literature.
- Features a communications studio, printing and design studios, student and community gathering spaces, and faculty offices.
- Affectionately known as the "old Dalí," as it used to be the home of The Dalí Museum. Students can enjoy the new Dalí museum for free with a student ID.

Walk back along the sidewalk, enter the building to the right of the library BAYBORO HALL (BAY)

#### Undergraduate Admissions

»Students can obtain information on application procedures, admissions requirements, documents needed, etc.

#### Financial Aid

- »Students may apply for several types of financial aid through a single financial aid application: the FAFSA (Free Application for Federal Student Aid).
- »FAFSA opens on Oct. 1 every year, and apply before the priority deadline of Jan. 1 in order to be considered for additional financial aid from the federal
- and state government, as well as USFSP.
- »Scholarships are also available through Financial Aid. »USF Scholarships: After being admitted, students can apply at
  - usfsp.edu/scholarships. By completing a questionnaire, you can see a list of scholarships you may qualify for.

#### Cashiers & Parking Services

- »Where students pay for tuition and purchase a parking decal to park on campus. A parking pass is required to park on campus and any student can have a car on campus!
- Registrar

» Students may come to the Registrar's Office for information on obtaining proof of enrollment, ordering transcripts, registering for classes, submitting grade forgiveness forms, and updating personal information such as name changes.

#### HARBOR LAWN

- Harbor Lawn hosts many events throughout the school year, such as carnivals, outdoor laser tag, and many more!
- One of our traditions is our annual Cardboard Boat Race. Teams build boats out of cardboard, duct tape, and plastic bags and race out in the bay and back. Most boats do make it back to shore, but some of the rowers do end up swimming back too!

#### Look north toward the building with the USF St. Petersburg campus logo DAVIS HALL (DAV)

- The College of Arts and Sciences Office is located here.
  - »Home of the Internship Coordinator available to help connect all
  - College of Arts & Sciences students to internships.
- Academic Advising

»Students should meet with their Advisor prior to each registration period. It is important to register for classes as early as possible each semester in order to obtain the classes you need to graduate on time. Meeting with your advisor is a critical part of progressing efficiently toward your degree.

»Free peer tutoring for a range of classes, including Pre-Calculus, Business Calculus, Statistics, Biology, Chemistry, Economics, Spanish, academic and science writing, and more.

#### **HELLER HALL (HWH)**

#### (2nd floor)

- Home to the College of Education
  - »Dual Certification: Undergraduate degree program results in certification in both Elementary K-6 and Special Education K-12, with Reading and ESOL (English as a Second or Other Language) Endorsements, which leads to a 98% employability rate.
  - »Multiple partnerships with Elementary and Secondary Schools within Pinellas County, where students obtain hands on experiences and best practices for the classroom.
- STEM Inquiry Innovation Lab for students to learn and develop skills in educational technology. This lab hosts many field trips for local elementary and middle schools, provides professional development for Pinellas County Schools teachers, is a popular stop at the annual St. Petersburg Science Festival and is home to the STEM Robotics Summer Camp for 4th -8th graders. All of these events provide more ways for College of Education students to obtain real world teaching experience within their community. Heller Hall (1st floor)

# COMPASS STUDENT EXPERIENCE OFFICE

· Campus-wide initiative that supports all undergraduate students through their transitions to ensure they develop and maintain personal and academic goals.

- Offers a variety of programming options for first year, second year, and transfer students that promote student success.
- Peer Coaching Program: A mentorship program that connects undergraduate students with student leaders on campus known as Peer Coaches, who are experienced students that provide guidance for students to succeed. **Student Success Advocates:** Student Success Advocates are professional staff
- members dedicated to conducting focused mentoring to help students persist in their major. They also help coordinate effective academic interventions, reinforce successful behaviors, and serve as a liaison regarding issues affecting student success.
- PATHe (Pinellas Access to Higher Education): PATHe is a collaborative effort to help streamline the academic transition from St. Petersburg College to USF St. Petersburg campus. THE EDGE

- The Edge houses two meeting rooms, an outside deck, a lounge, a pool, and a gaming area.
- Gaming area includes a pool table, foosball, and shuffleboard as well as TVs and ports for video gaming consoles.
- The Edge hosts viewing parties for USF football games, World Cup soccer and more!

#### 1 MILITARY AND VETERANS SUCCESS CENTER

- Serves more than 600 veterans, active duty military, spouses, and dependents. • Open to any and all students.
- •
- Assists in processing VA educational benefits. Lounge space with 75" TV and gaming stations.
- Sponsorship/mentorship program for prospective student service members/veterans.
- Peer to peer tutoring program.
- Individualized and group services for those struggling with integration into college life.
- Home to the USF St. Petersburg campus Student Veterans Organization.
- Free coffee and snacks. •

#### At the sidewalk, turn left 10 SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY BUILDING (STG)

- Houses classroom space as well as teaching science laboratories and faculty research labs (in which many undergraduates work with faculty on research proiects).
- Undergraduate students in all majors have opportunities to do research with faculty and even be published in scholarly journals.
- First LEED Gold Certified building at USF, which means it is very environmentally • friendly with a low carbon footprint.
- Other sustainable initiatives on campus include solar panels, trash receptacles made of recycled milk jugs, the elimination of plastic straws in the dining facility, and an ORCA Waste Management System.
