

Statistics

- 18 square miles
- 217 centerline miles Citymaintained roads
- 53 centerline miles statemaintained roads
- 1.37 square miles of City-maintained pavement
- +/- 398.34 centerline miles of sidewalk in the Public Right of Way
- 26.14 centerline miles of sidewalk to clear of snow



SCHEDULE OF OPERATIONS

PUBLIC WORKS SNOW OPERATIONS



Snow Preparation

- Pretreat prior to storm with brine (if practicable), calcium chloride or magnesium chloride
- Active plow operation starts approximately at 2" accumulation
- Post storm treatment after storm ends and roads are plowed curb to curb


Snow Removal

- Operations starts approximately 24 hours after storm ends
- Maximum 4 removal teams
- Vital traffic and high volume areas a priority
- Crew district assignment & priorities change by weather and event schedules

SNOW OPERATIONS



- 6 Districts
- Residential Streets
- Targeted "A-Route" arterials
- 30 Plow Routes
- 24 Residential routes
- 4 A-Route routes
- 279 other locations including sidewalks, crosswalks & parking lots

ALERT OVERVIEW					
START TIME:	Saturday 3 - 6 AM	END TIME:	Sunday 12 - 3 AM	TOTAL:	2.0 - 4.0" (Highest South of Hartford)
DURATION OF PRECIP:	12 - 20 hours	INTENSITY:	Moderate/ Briefly Heavy		
- Due to the minor shift north, we are currently leaning on the higher side of totals - As previously mentioned, a 20 mile shift north or south will drastically change totals -Winds will gust 40 - 45 mph, creating low visibility and blowing/drifting snow					

SIDEWALK SNOW & ICE CLEARANCE

PUBLIC WORKS SNOW OPERATIONS



<u>City Ordinance – Chapter 31, Article V</u>

- Sidewalks must be cleared or abated of snow and ice within six (6) hours of the end of winter weather event
- If a winter weather event ends after sunset, property owners have until 9:00am the following morning to clear or abate snow and ice on their properties
- Failure to comply can result in the issuance of a Notice of Violation (NOV) and if uncorrected a \$99 fine per day until the snow and ice is abated or cleared.



Sidewalk Clearance Operations

- Contractors <u>CANNOT</u> stack snow in public rightof-way during morning commute (5:30am-9:30am)
- Snow/ice <u>CANNOT</u> be pushed or thrown into the public right-of-way
- Property owner subject to a \$99 fine

WINTER WEATHER PARKING BANS



- Parking bans are a necessary inconvenience to City residents, commuters, and visitors.
- Violators impede our crews' ability to keep streets passable during the storm and clear snow curb-to-curb thereafter.
- Cars parked in violation of the ban are subject to ticketing and towing.





WINTER WEATHER PARKING BANS



- In preparation a ban, DPW initiates a process allowing for timely deployment of resources:
 - Activate Blue Lights
 - Open Snow Lots
 - Update Web Page
 - Alert News Media
 - Alert Social Media
 - Activate Police Support
 - Notify Tow Operators

- HPD arrives with tow trucks
- Lights flashing & announcement via PA
- Immediate issuance of tickets & hookup
- Stay on scene until street is cleared of snow
