### SHAEF SHOULDER PATCH

The cloth shoulder patches of the Supreme Headquarters Allied Expeditionary Force (SHAEF) and of the United States Army, Europe (USAREUR) are similar in design; however, the former has a black background and the latter a deep blue one. SHAEF was a headquarters organization created in 1944 to plan and command the invasion of Europe and subsequent land operations. Gen Dwight D. Eisenhower, as Supreme Commander, was authorized a maximum of 10,000 officers and enlisted men at his headquarters, each of whom wore the black patch with flaming sword. SHAEF was discontinued on Jul 1945. Later, when USAREUR existed, blue replaced black in the shoulder patch and all members of all units assigned to USAREUR wore it on their right shoulder. See:
