# **Green Words**

### Note to parents:

You will find the green words below in order. The children work through set 1 sounds before moving on to set 2, and then the same for set 3. There are dots and lines under the different sounds – this is to help the children identify the phoneme (sound) and sound it out.

Practice these words with your children regularly, work at their pace and remain on a certain set for as long as you need to – it is useful to complete the sets that your children are working on in phonics (you will have been told if your child is following set 1 or set 2/3 when home learning began). We recommend that you do not go beyond your set as your child will not know these sounds yet. **Learning to read Green Words:** Use Fred Talk – point with your finger under each phoneme (sound) as you make the sound, then run your finger under the whole word to blend those sounds together to say the word. Over time, as they get more confident, encourage children to use 'Fred in your head' so that they are saying the sounds in their head quickly then saying the word out loud. (At school, we use a puppet called Fred who is an expert on sounding out words! We call it, 'Fred Talk'. E.g. m-o-p, c-a-t, m-a-n, sh-o-p, b-l-a-ck.)
