Job's Friends



"With friends like you who needs enemies?

"I have heard many things like these; miserable comforters are you all!" Job 16:2



There are three friends that carry on a sparing match of wits with Job through chapters 4 to 31. It's very much like a three round tag team boxing match with each on throwing a punch followed by Job's answer. By the end of three rounds the arguments get weaker and weaker with Bildad's last assault being only six verses and Zophar doesn't even come out of his corner for the final round.

The fourth voice of Elihu appears in chapter 32-37 from a young whippersnapper who condemns all of them, and though he has many good things to say about God he too lacks compassion. They are all full of sound and fury.

Eliphaz – The eldest, logical, common sense from experience 2+2=4. He is like the kindly mother scolding a child, "*Now you don't mean that. Apologize and say your are sorry.*"

Bildad – The lofty theologian, legalist, traditionalist and echoes the position of the Pharisees in the New Testament. "Who sinned this man or his parents that he was born blind?"

Zophar – The finger-pointing, stone-throwing, angry, judgmental, blaming and shaming friend. He is the hothead among them.

Elihu – the youthful zealot, a know-it-all, disagrees with everyone but himself. Even through he has much good to say about God, he is lacking compassion. He is the only voice not condemned by God.

The sum of it all was not in their arguments but in the attitudes. None of them were kind, merciful, understanding or compassionate. They all failed to be true friends, born for adversity, and demonstrate impatience, anger, and self-righteousness. The point of it all is to help us see ourselves in one or all of Job's friends.

They were <u>not very friendly</u>. They were <u>not loving</u>. They were <u>not kind</u>. They were <u>not helpful</u>. So too, we can be terribly judgmental and impatient with friends who suffer.

True Friends

The Bible has much to say about friendship. Jesus is the example of true friendship in that while we were yet sinners he still loved us. He laid down his life for his friends and he is the friend that loves at all times and sticks closer than a brother.

Job 6:14-15

A despairing man should have the devotion of his <u>friends</u>, even though he forsakes the fear of the Almighty. But my brothers are as undependable as intermittent streams, as the streams that overflow.

Our Words

James 3:1-12

Not many of you should presume to be teachers, my brothers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly. 2 We all stumble in many ways. If anyone is never at fault in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to keep his whole body in check. 3 When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. 4 or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. 5 Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. 6 The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. 7 All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, 8 but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. 9 With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in God's likeness. 10 Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers, this should not be. 11 Can both fresh water and salt water flow from the same spring? 12 My brothers, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water.
