Connecting to UO_WIFI: Windows 10



What is UO_WIFI?

UO_WIFI is the wireless network available to staff, students, and contractors to use when on University of Otago sites. Those with laptops and wireless capable devices can connect to UO_WIFI to access both internal University resources and the internet. Your level of access is determined from your username.

Connecting to UO_WIFI

 Click on the Network icon located in the taskbar (near the clock at the lower righthand side), and a box will pop up showing a list of available wireless network connections.

2. Select UO_WIFI and click Connect, leaving the Connect Automatically box ticked.
