A copy of a notice describing some, but not all of such hazards is attached hereto (please see below) and made a part hereof, and I have read and understand such hazards. I certify that I am fully capable of participating in the said activity.

Certain risks cannot be eliminated without destroying the unique character of this activity. The same elements that contribute to the unique character of this activity can be causes of loss or damage to my equipment, or accidental injury, illness, or in extreme cases, permanent trauma or death. Therefore, I assume full responsibility for personal injury to myself, and for loss or damage to my personal property and expenses thereof as a result of my negligence of participating in said activity. I further understand that Mule Shoe Outfitters, LLC reserves the right to refuse any person it judges to be incapable of meeting the rigors and requirements of participating in hunting activities.

I have read, understand, and accept the terms and conditions stated herein and acknowledge that this agreement shall be effective and binding upon the parties during the entire period of participation of said hunting activities.

If participant is under eighteen (18) years of age, the signature of the parent/guardian must accompany the minor Childs signature.

RISKS, HAZARDS, AND DANGERS

The following describes some, but not all of said Risks, Hazards, and Dangers.

- The propensity of the riding and pack animals to behave in ways that may result in injury, harm, or death to persons on or around them.
- The unpredictable of the animals' reaction to such things as sounds, sudden movement, and unfamiliar objects, persons, or other animals.
- Certain hazards such as surface and sub-surface conditions.
- Collision with other animals or objects.
- The potential of the participant to act in a negligent manner that may contribute to injury to the participant or others.
- Encounters with variations within the terrain; including creeks, water, bridges, traveled roads, stumps, forest growth, debris, rocks, cliffs, and other obstacles whether they are obvious or not obvious, man-made or natural.
- Hiking in rugged country.
- Encounters with wildlife and insects.
- Temperature extremes.
- Adverse unpredictable weather conditions.
- The unavailability of immediate professional (EMTs, MDs) medical attention in the wilderness area.
- The risk of handling firearms and being near others that have firearms in their possession

Hunter Equipment Recommended List for pack in camps

(please use as a guideline check-off list)

Mule Shoe Outfitters, LLC provides for hunters while in hunting camp: All meals, beverages, and cots. Sleeping quarters in hunting camp are in wall tents with heat.

- License(s) and Conservation Stamp: (Stamp Cost \$21.50)-can be obtained at the lodge when you arrive
- Elk Special Management Permit: Cost \$15.50 (anyone hunting elk in areas with feed ground-areas) **conservation stamp and Elk Management Permit can be purchased at Kendall Valley Lodge.
- Rifle, Cartridges, etc.
- Binoculars
- Hunting knife
- Fluorescent orange vest or hat
- Camera
- Water Bottle
- Flashlight, with extra batteries (headlamps are usually the best – it provides hands free)
- Lightweight daypack/backpack (saddlebags are provided on your riding horse to pack things, a daypack is not required only suggested)
- Sleeping bag (0 degrees or better)
- Pad (a thick pad is best to keep the cold from getting under you on your cot): we can provide a pad if you are unable to bring one-please let us know in advance.
- Warm clothes (it is best to dress in layers-you can always remove or add clothing)
- Long Johns
- Waterproof heavy warm jacket/coat (you can bring a warm heavy jacket and a rain coat-please be sure that the rain coat you bring is not noisy while you're wearing it during the hunt)
- Waterproof light warm jacket/coat (something to put under your heavy coat- Vest, Sweater, Heavy Shirt, etc.)
- Waterproof hunting pants or similar types (non-noisy)
- Waterproof boots (you may want to bring 2 pairs, should one get wet-we can dry any boots or clothing by the wood stove in the cook tent)
- Hat (a hat with a brim is best for protection against the weather and sun)
- Gloves (at least 2 pairs)
- Personal items
- Duffel bag(s)

The weather in Wyoming is truly unpredictable. The fall hunting weather is usually mild; it will be warm to moderate during the day and will chill down, possibly below zero, as soon as the sun sets in the evening. The most important thing is for you not to get wet; once you get wet then you will get cold, so please prepare yourself to remain as dry as possible. Snowstorms are likely during your hunt, and in the mountains the storms pose blizzard conditions.

When packing your bag(s) for the trip into hunting camp, it is best to use 2 or more medium to small sized duffel bags rather than one large/huge duffel bag and with no hard edges.

If you need emergency contact information for your family while you are in hunting please let us know and we can provide the information for them prior to your hunt. We now have satellite phones while in camp.
