Any image created by YOU that is your original work	Yes	No documentation needed	"Personal image, Your Name", or "Image created by this Author"
Images created by YOU that are exact copies of original work	Yes; With permission to adapt the image from the original source	Email/letter from owner providing permission to adapt the image	Follow instructions from the artist, or, if not specified, attribute as "Image adapted with permission from Owner's Name"
Graphs/tables/charts obtained from journals, articles, textbooks, etc.	Yes; With permission from current image owner (publisher)	Email/letter from owner providing permission to adapt the image	Follow instructions from the owner and cite as specified
Images purchased from a stock image company	Yes; With proof of image purchase	Upload receipt of image purchase and/or proof of subscription that allows for image use	Follow instructions from the website and cite the image as specified
Images obtained from a "copyright free" source	Yes	No documentation needed	Follow instructions from the website and cite the image as specified
Photographs: personal property	Yes; Remove all patient identifiers, if applicable	No documentation needed	"Personal photo, Your Name"
Photographs: obtained from another source	Yes; With permission from original owner	Email/letter from photo owner providing permission to use	"Photo used with permission from Owner's Name"
Radiographic or clinical images: from your personal files	Yes; With permission from original source and after removing all patient identifiers	Email/letter/receipt of purchase to use the image from the original owner uploaded	Follow instructions from the owner and cite as specified
Cartoons	Yes; With permission from original source	Email/letter/receipt of purchase to use the image from the original owner uploaded	Follow instructions from the artist and cite as specified
University logos	Yes	No documentation needed	No citation needed
Commercial interest business logos	No	Remove entirely from the presentation	N/A
Presenter-owned business logos (non-commercial interest businesses)	Yes; On the intro slide or poster title area only	No documentation needed	No citation needed
Images of devices or brand name medications (pills, containers, etc.)	Yes; Remove/blur the device/medication name	Email/letter/receipt of purchase to use the image from the original owner uploaded	Follow instructions from the owner and cite as specified, or follow photo instructions above if personal property
