

Progressing to the Professional Teaching Certificate

The Professional Teaching Certificate is valid for up to 5 years and may be applied for any time requirements are met.

Requirements

- 3 years of <u>successful teaching</u> since the issue date of the **initial** Standard Teaching Certificate within the content areas and grade level of the Standard Teaching Certificate; and
- 2. 6 semester credit hours of <u>reading methods course work</u> for elementary teachers and 3 semester credit hours for secondary certified teachers. If you completed your teacher preparation program in Michigan since 1985, you have met this requirement; and
- 3. 3 semester credit hours of <u>reading diagnostics and remediation</u>, which includes a field experience. This credit can be applied toward the professional learning requirement listed below, assuming the credit was earned after the issue date of the most recent certificate or renewal; and
- 4. Education-Related Professional Learning totaling 150 hours; or
 - An education-related master's or higher degree earned at any time (even if previously utilized to renew the Standard Teaching Certificate) from a <u>regionally accredited college or university</u>; and
- 5. Effectiveness ratings* in accordance with MCL 380.1531j:
 - a. **Consecutive:** effective or highly effective ratings on your annual year-end performance evaluations for the 3 *consecutive* school years immediately preceding your application for a Professional Teaching Certificate; or
 - b. Nonconsecutive: effective or highly effective ratings on your annual yearend performance evaluation for at least 3 nonconsecutive school years prior to applying for the Professional Teaching Certificate, including an <u>Effective</u> <u>Educator Recommendation</u> form completed by the chief school administrator of the school where you are currently employed.

IMPORTANT NOTE: Educators who hold the School Counselor (NT) endorsement on a teaching certificate, *regardless of current assignment*, must meet the requirements of law (MCL 380.1233) to renew that teaching certificate. Information pertaining to renewing a school counselor credential can be accessed via the School Counselor Credential Renewals document. Endorsements are not renewed; rather, certificates are renewed, and a renewal

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of that certificate will maintain the existing endorsements. An endorsement can *only* be removed from a Michigan teaching certificate if the nullification process is utilized.

Education-Related Professional Learning Options

One of the following <u>education-related professional learning</u> options must be earned since the issue date of the most recent Standard Teaching Certificate or renewal. These hours must be entered into <u>Michigan Online Educator Certification System</u> (MOECS) prior to applying for the renewal for the system to recognize your eligibility:

- 6 semester credit hours appropriate to the content and grade level of the certificate and endorsement from a regionally accredited college or university; or
- 6 semester hours in a planned course of study** from a <u>regionally accredited college</u> <u>or university</u>; or
- 150 Michigan <u>State Continuing Education Clock Hours</u> (SCECHs) appropriate to the content and grade level of the certificate and endorsement; or
- 150 hours of Michigan <u>District Provided Professional Development</u> (DPPD) appropriate to the content and grade level of the certificate and endorsement.
- Any combination of the above.

Education-Related Professional Learning Hour Conversion:

College credit: 1 semester credit = 25 professional learning hours
SCECH Hours: 1 SCECH hour = 1 professional learning hour
DPPD Hours: 1 DPPD hour = 1 professional learning hour

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^{*}The approximate release date for effectiveness ratings is the 3rd week of July. Educators in their 3rd year of teaching cannot progress to the Professional Teaching Certificate until the ratings have been released and are viewable in their MOECS ratings tab.

^{**}Credits in a planned course of study may include credits taken as part of an educationrelated master's or higher degree or credits in a program that leads to an endorsement.
