| Middle | <p>Mathematics</p> <p>Ask someone to help you collect 20 objects. Practise counting your collection, forwards and backwards. You could even try starting from different numbers (for example, start with 5 objects and keep counting).</p> <p>Trace around your foot on a piece of paper and cut it out. Find 5 things in the house that are longer than your foot. Find 5 things in the house that are shorter than your foot.</p> <p>Complete number worksheet for 0.</p> | <p>Mathematics</p> <p>Number hunt: what numbers can you find in your house? Can you find all the numbers from zero to twenty? Try writing these numbers in your scrapbook, for example the numbers on a remote control or a clock. Can you find numbers on shoes, on food in the cupboard or in the fridge?</p> <p>Collect your favourite toys, books or LEGO. Sort them into different categories. How did you choose to sort them? Is there another way you can sort them? For example: Organise from shortest to tallest, biggest to smallest.</p> <p>Complete number worksheet for 1.</p> | <p>Mathematics</p> <p>Count how many steps it takes to walk around your bedroom. Count how many steps it takes to walk around other rooms in the house. Which room took the most steps? Which room took the least steps?</p> <p>Draw a map of your room.</p> <p>Sing 5 little ducks song or other number songs.</p> <p>Complete number worksheet for 2.</p> | <p>Mathematics</p> <p>Choose some objects in your house. Order them from shortest to longest.</p> <p>Measure yourself using a piece of string.
