Upon acceptance into the Classroom Pathways Bundle Program, you will enter the Master of Science in Education program and have access to the American Board Plus Program resources to help you prepare for the pedagogy and subjectarea exams. American Board program resources and examination costs are included in the price of tuition for the Classroom Pathways Bundle; one less thing to think about on your path to becoming a certified teacher.4


