### Step #1: CLAIM

Read and Understand the prompt:

- Circle key words
- Underline directions (action words: compare, analyze, convince)
- State message (thesis) in your own words.
- Identify Audience and Purpose.

### **Effective Body Paragraph:**

By changing to a four-day school week, students will have more time out of the classroom. Many students have several extracurricular activities such as playing on sports teams, which require hours of practice a week. By having school only four days a week, the fifth day would be free for these types of activities.
