



Is the stock in an uptrend during the 10 Days.	☐ Yes	☑ No	It can undercut its 10-dma as long as it shows resilience by showing volume that is greater than the highest down volume day over the prior 10 days.
Is the pocket pivot occuring with base breakouts or with gap ups.	☐ Yes	□ No	This can be thought of as added upside power should this occur
Is overall good chart up formation during a multi-month trend (5 months or longer).	☐ Yes	□ No	If NO, then do not buy if the overall chart formation is in a multimonth downtrend .
Is the stock is above a critical moving average such as the 50-DMA or 200-DMA	☐ Yes	□ No	If well under its 50-dma, and getting support near the 200-dma, it can be bought provided the base is constructive.
Is the stock NOT in a 'V' shape during the 10-dma or 50-dma	☐ Yes	□ No	V' where it sells off hard down through the 10-dma or 50-dma then shoots straight back up in a 'V' formation. Such formations are failure prone.
Is the stock NOT in wedging patterns.	☐ Yes	□ No	This is an upward-slanting handle not the typical downward-sloping handle form near the end of a stock's cup-shaped base
Is pocket pivots occuring before the stock is extended from the base?	☐ Yes	□ No	Don't buy if they are too extended from the 10 or 50 day moving averages (no specific threshold but 2% or more above those MAs is probably a starting points)
