The Almighty's true name...

The Almighty's true Hebrew name **YAH-shua**, has been <u>needlessly</u> transliterated <u>three times</u> over the centuries! First to 'leousus', then to 'lesus' and then to 'Jesus' in the 17th century. Because of this, our Savior's real name 'Yahshua', is <u>virtually unknown</u> to people!

Yahshua has blessed us however, because of our love and faith in Him! He allowed us to grow spiritually through the names that people have known Him by over the years. Names such as 'leousus', 'lesus', and 'Jesus' have been a blessing to those who used them because they had not previously known His true name.

When I talk with people about the name Yahshua, they often have one of the following responses:

1 I'm not Jewish, I speak English

I reply a that a person doesn't have to be Jewish, or be fluent in Hebrew to say a Hebrew name. For example, we say 'Netanyahu' don't we? We say the names of people from foreign lands routinely without feeling the need to 'first' change them into 'our' language.

2 But, everybody uses the name 'Jesus'

To this, I call upon the wisdom of my mother who said to me, "If everybody jumps off a cliff are you going to jump off too?"

#3 *Names are really not that important to God* To this, I politely ask if they read the Bible regularly.

Many Believers are not understanding the true issue. This is not about what language you speak, or what country you live in.

This is about our Savior's 'heaven sent' Hebrew name being <u>systematically dismantled and</u> <u>destroyed</u> by multiple 'man-made' transliterations.

Scriptures tell us there is only one Savior, the Almighty Father <u>Himself</u>.

"I, even I, am YAH-weh; And besides Me there is NO Savior" Isaiah 43:11

The Almighty Father waited until He came in person to give us His highest name, 'YAHshua' (YAH is salvation); the name which is above every name.

Sadly, the multi-transliterated name 'Jesus' has eliminated both the Almighty Father's <u>name</u> and the <u>Glory</u> due <u>*Him*</u> as being our Savior. <u>*This*</u>, is a great wrong we need to make right.

Now that we know His true name, what should Believers do?

I'm reminded of a time I mistakingly called someone I had met by a name not their own. This person very politely told me what their name <u>actually</u> was (*I guess all of us desire to be called by our real name*). Anyway, from that moment on I always called him by his true name.

What do these names mean?

YAH

YAH, is The Almighty Father's name

Sometimes you will hear people say that 'YAH' is the shortened, or *abbreviated* form of the Almighty Father's name, but that is not correct. YAH *is* the name of the Almighty Father.

King David tells us clearly in Psalm 68:4 that the Almighty Father's name is 'YAH'.

Sing to God, sing praises to His name; Extol Him who rides on the clouds, By His name <u>YAH</u>, And rejoice before Him.

The prophet Isaiah tells us the Almighty Father's name is 'YAH' in Isaiah 12:2.

Behold, God is my salvation, I will trust and not be afraid; 'For <u>YAH</u>, the LORD, is my strength and song; He also has become my salvation.'

YAH: (YAH - Strong's H3050)

YAH-weh

YAH-weh, is the Almighty Father's name with a 'descriptor' *added*.

The name 'Yahweh' (YAH-weh) is the Fathers name YAH, <u>followed</u> by a 'descriptor'. The descriptor is the Hebrew word 'weh', which means, 'The Self-Existent one' (I AM). So, the name YAH-weh means, 'YAH - The Self-Existent one'.

YAH-shua

YAH-shua, is the Almighty Father's name with His *highest* descriptor <u>added</u>.

The Almighty Father waited to give us His <u>highest</u> name until He came to us <u>*Himself*</u> in the <u>New</u> Testament!

Now, YAH combines His name with His <u>highest</u> 'descriptor'! This 'descriptor' is the Hebrew word 'shua', which means '<u>is salvation'</u>. When you combine the Almighty's name YAH, with the word 'shua', it means, "**YAH is salvation**"!

The Almighty Father is proclaiming <u>His</u> name to us <u>as Savior</u>! This is why the name YAH-shua, <u>is the name above every name</u>! Philippians 2:9

When a person believes in the name YAH-shua, he is believing in what that name <u>means</u> - that YAH, the Almighty Father, <u>is our Savior who</u> was manifest (made visible) in human form.

... **God** was manifested in the flesh...

1 Timothy 3:16

What about the name Yeshua?

This is an error that must be addressed when discussing our Saviors true name. Some have *mistranslated* our Savior's name, changing it from <u>Yah</u>shua, to '<u>Ye</u>shua'.

The error of changing Yah to 'Ye' is due to the *man-made* tradition of the Jewish priests. Their misguided reverence for the holy name caused them to believe that it was too sacred to pronounce and thus, must be changed.

To prevent the pronunciation of the name **Yahshua**, the priests changed the vowel points from an 'a' to an 'e' and omitted the letter 'H' altogether, resulting in the name 'Yeshua'.

Our Savior <u>Himself</u> tells us His name is <u>Yah</u>shua, not <u>Ye</u>shua in John 17:11.

...keep them in <u>Your name</u>, the name which You have given Me...

As previously discussed on page 1 of this pamphlet, Scriptures clearly show the Father's name is \underline{YAH} , not Ye.

HalleluYAH, not HalleluYE

We also can see the Almighty's name is **YAH** in Revelation 19:1-6 as the multitudes praise Him saying, Hallelu**YAH**! Which means, *"Praise YAH!"*

What about the name Jesus?

If we could go back in time and ask the disciples, "Would you take us to see Jesus?" They would have gotten a puzzled look on their face and said, "Who?"

You see, the disciples never knew the Messiah by that name. They would have said, *"Please come, we want you to meet Yahshua, the Messiah!"*

The History of the name 'Jesus'

For fifteen hundred years after our Savior walked the earth, the world had <u>never</u> heard the name 'Jesus'. Why? Because that name <u>did not exist</u>.

Notice, you will <u>not</u> find the name 'Jesus' in the King James Bible published in 1611. Instead, you will find the name 'Iesus'. The name 'Jesus' <u>first</u> appeared in the Revised King James Bible published in 1769, *just 249 years ago!* *

* Perhaps the biggest difference between the 1611 and 1769 versions of the King James Bible is spelling. For instance, there was no letter "J" in 1611 so "Jesus" was spelled "lesus." **(TheKJVstore.com)**

By 1769, our Saviors *'Heaven sent'* <u>Hebrew</u> name 'Yahshua', had been needlessly transliterated three times, in three different languages. *

*transliterate: to write or print (a letter or word) using the closest corresponding letters of a different alphabet or language.

- The first transliteration was from Hebrew to Greek.
- The second, from Greek to Latin.
- The third, from Latin to English.

Tragically, the result of these 'man-made' changes was the complete <u>removal</u> of <u>the Almighty</u> <u>Father's name!</u>

"To remove the name is to extinguish the person"
