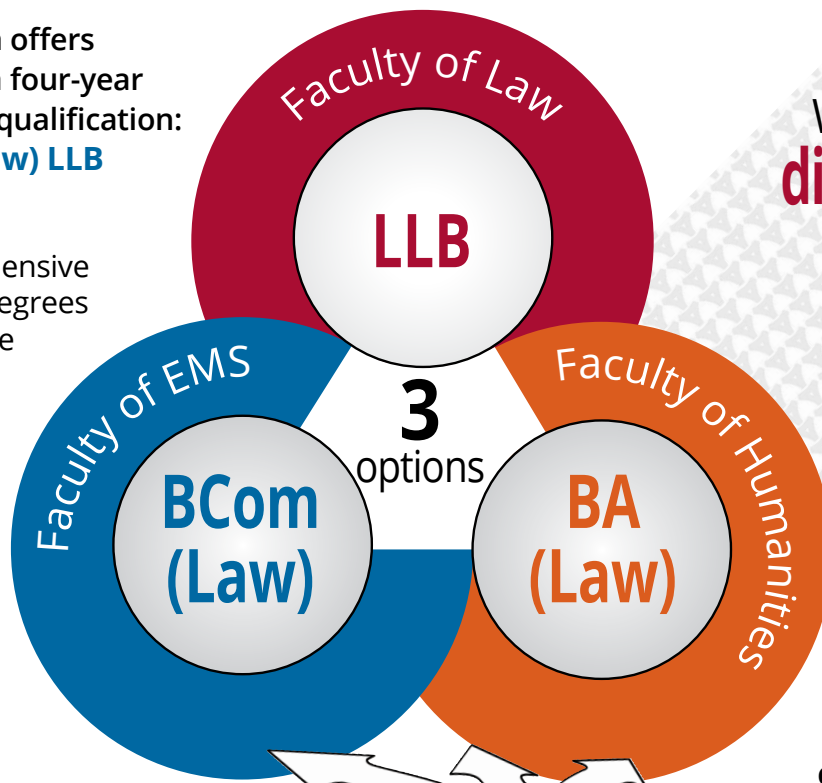

Many prospective law students are unsure about which degree option to pursue.



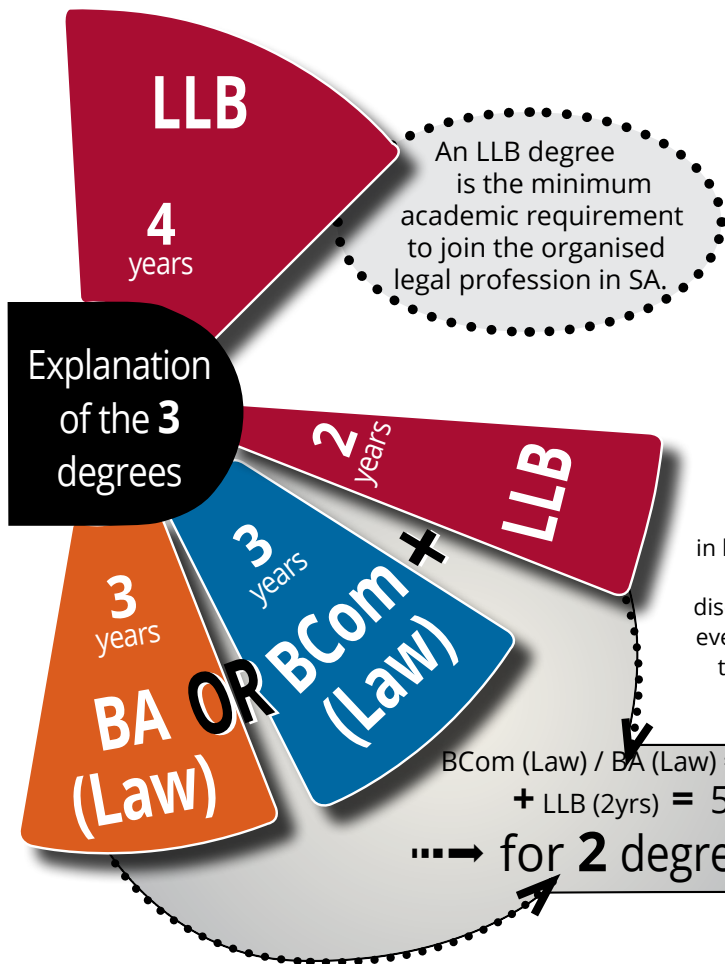

So which law degree do you choose? It all depends on your aptitude and personal circumstances.



An LLB degree is the minimum academic requirement to join the organised legal profession in SA.

Choose the degree that suits your needs!

If you have a strong interest in languages and social sciences or commercial and economic disciplines and you would like to eventually practice law in one of these fields, it's a good idea to enrol for the BA (Law) or BCom (Law).



Obviously, combined programmes are more expensive and take longer to complete than the LLB four-year degree programme.

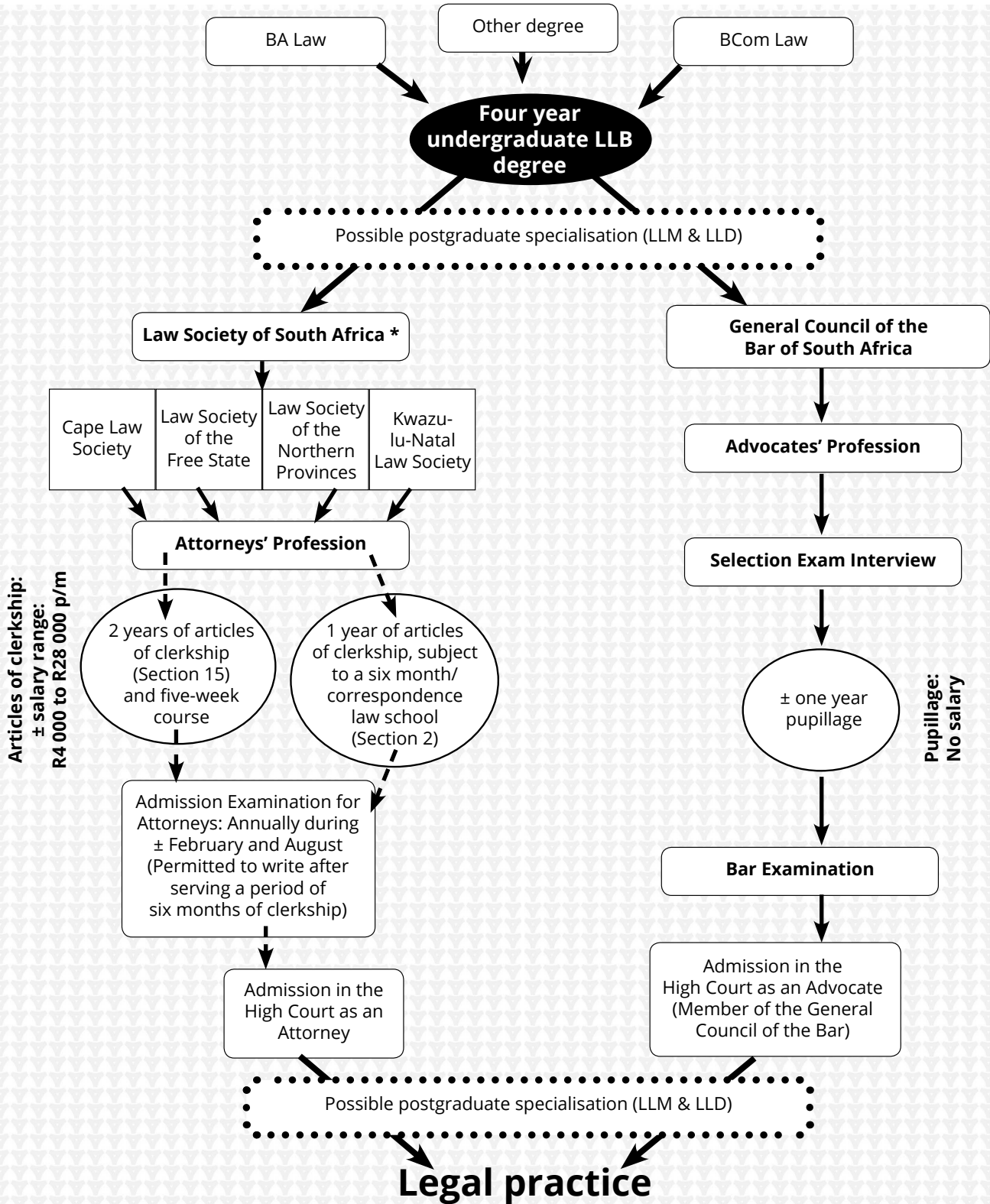
