What benefits can iPads deliver for children with autism?

- A magical device (Steve Jobs)
- Helps kids deal with sensory overload
- Autism expert Dr. Martha Herbert: “the iPad lets autistic kids have direct control over the interface”
- Cool component!
- iPad for Autism is still “new”
- iPad can meet a lot of different needs
- Many great free or inexpensive APPS available
- People see benefits quickly
- Most folks with autism have a strength in understanding **visual** information

When is Enough, Enough?

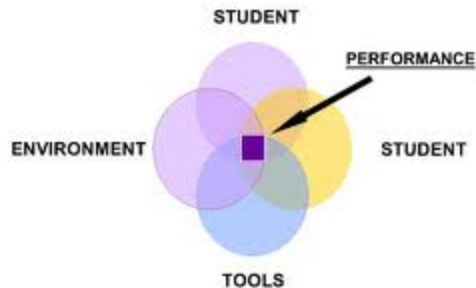
- Over 500,000 apps for the iPhone, 140,000 for the iPad
- Many apps that support.....
 - Communication
 - Speech/oral motor
 - Social skills training
 - Visual schedules/visual supports
 - Data and behavior tracking
 - Sign language

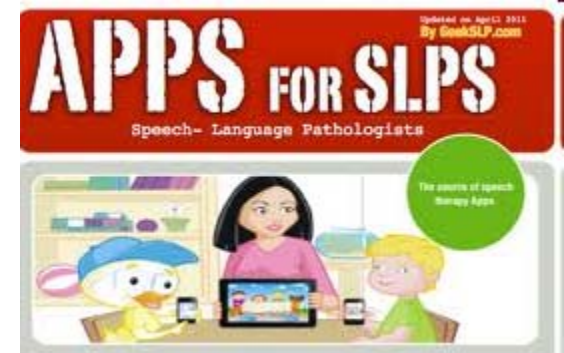

Pros and Cons:






- Affordable (many are free!)
- Main-stream technology
- Developed daily
- Utilize the power of current, dazzling technology
- **Not a real language (no 'snugs'!)**
- Not easily funded
- Difficulties separating 'communicating' from 'computing'
- Technology may be more fragile
- Less of the research/language input
- Less tech support

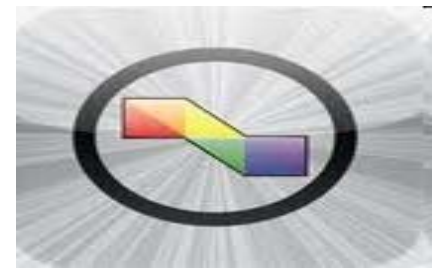

- TaptoTalk AAC – Assistyx LTC, free, go to website to create and customize albums
- Talk4Me – free, English, Chinese, Spanish
- My Choice Board - \$9.99 – visual display of choices
- TapSpeak Choice - \$149.99 – more like an SGD
- My Talk – mobile lite version free, unlimited content \$49.99
 - “medium robust,” fully customizable, can create on computer

 - words and phrases in context packages, core vocabulary, Fitzgerald Key format

- Pictello by AssistiveWare - \$18.99
- Stories2Learn – MDR - \$13.99
 - give a situation, and then show you the “correct” response. For example, if a girl waves at you, you are supposed to wave back – this is what is considered socially acceptable
- Quick Cues - \$4.99
 - helps teens and young adults handle new situations and learn new skills
- Mister Rogers’ Makes a Journal - \$1.99
- Sonic Pics - \$2.99 – lets you create digital stories with pictures
- Photo Books with Text – Stories2Learn - \$13.99
- TherAD for Autism - \$14.99
 - by Marz Consulting, Inc., video self modeling application, student watches "motivating" media (movies), paused, short video self modeling clip presented of student engaging in targeted behavior , then student is returned to the motivating content.

 - simple schedule, can view as single picture, 2 pictures, or list. Can add own pics and recordings.

 - Picture schedules, visual countdown timer, choice prompts. Can import pics
- Picture Scheduler - \$2.99 – www.jankuj.com
 - Task organizer. Can use pics, text, video, audio.
- TASUC – \$20.99 - www.apps.tasuc.com
 - Picture-based schedule, can add sub-schedules/choices. Esp. for small children, daily timetable with image cards, sounds, voices, video. Can save multiple schedules

- **Percentally by RinnApps - \$2.99**
 - tally counter that automatically converts tallies to percentages
- **SLP Goal Bank by Smarty Ears - \$14.99**
 - Annual, short term goals
- **My Medical by Steven Chaitoff - \$2.99**
 - comprehensive record-keeping app for personal medical information
- **Data Tracker by Super Duper -\$5.99**
 - Create multiple goals for each student,.
 - Choose from various response types
 - Store data for an unlimited number of sessions.
 - Add students to multiple groups.
 - Write notes for each student in a session.
 - Graph results for each goal.
- **BehaviorTrackerPro - \$29.99**
 - Used by BCBA's, behavior therapists , allows graph
