## **MATERIALS USED**

- YOUCAT is short for Youth Catechism of the Catholic Church, which was distributed in multiple languages on World Youth Day 2011 in Madrid, Spain. The English-language edition is available from Ignatius Press. Developed with the help of young Catholics and written for high-school age people and young adults, YOUCAT is an accessible, contemporary expression of the Catholic Faith. The appealing graphic format includes Questions-and-Answers, highly-readable commentary, summary definitions of key terms, Bible citations and inspiring and thought-provoking quotes from Saints and others in the margins. What's more, YOUCAT is keyed to the Catechism of the Catholic Church, so people can go deeper. It explains:
  - What Catholics believe and why (doctrine)
  - How Catholics celebrate the mysteries of the faith (sacraments)
  - How Catholics are to live (moral life)
  - How they should pray (prayer and spirituality)

The questions are direct and honest, even at times tough; the answers straightforward, relevant, and compelling. YOUCAT will likely become the "go-to" place for young people to learn the truth about the Catholic faith.

### OTHER COMPONENTS OF THIS CLASS:

- FIRST YEAR CONFIRMATION RETREAT (NOV. 18, 2017) Every year we have a retreat for our first and second year confirmation students. This year's first year retreat will take place at St. Ann's Parish Center from 8:30am to 5:30am (mass from 4:30am to 5:30am: parents are invited to attend the mass).
- **ATTENDANCE AT MASS:** Anyone preparing for confirmation should be attending mass every weekend. This is the most basic obligation of being a Catholic and must be observed.
- VOLUNTEER HOURS: Each first year confirmation student will be required to complete no less
  than 10 hours of volunteer service. A necessary aspect of service hours is that you are not paid
  anything for them. They should also in some way be related to one of the 7 corporeal works of
  mercy. Which are the following:
  - o To feed the hungry.
  - o To give water to the thirsty.
  - o To clothe the naked.
  - To shelter the homeless.
  - To visit the sick.
  - o To visit the imprisoned, or ransom the captive.
  - To bury the dead.
