## #24 NEBRASKA (1-0) AT COLORADO (1-0)

SATURDAY, SEPT. 7, 2019 • 2:30 P.M. CT • BOULDER, COLO. FOLSOM FIELD • CAPACITY: 50.183 • SURFACE: NATURAL GRASS



The Nebraska Cornhuskers take to the road for the first time in the 2019 season, traveling to Boulder, Colo., to take on the Buffaloes on Saturday afternoon. Kickoff between the former conference rivals is set for 2:30 CT (1:30 MT) at CU's Folsom Field, with national television coverage provided by FOX and radio coverage available on the Husker Sports Network from Learfield-IMG.

Nebraska heads to Colorado after a 35-21 season-opening victory over South Alabama in Lincoln. The Huskers relied on an opportunistic defense and special teams in the win. Nebraska reached the end zone on an interception return, fumble return and punt return to overcome a sluggish offensive performance on opening day.

Colorado also comes into the game off a win, posting a 52-31 victory over Colorado State on Friday night in Denver. The Buffs' explosive offense showed great balance in the victory, rushing for 243 yards and adding 232 yards through the air. Colorado trailed 21-17 late in the second quarter against CSU, but outscored the Rams 35-10 from that point powered by four takeaways.

Nebraska and Colorado are meeting for the second consecutive season, as part of four games between 2018 and 2024. Colorado pulled off a fourth-quarter comeback to win in last year's meeting in Lincoln. Overall, Nebraska holds a commanding 49-19-2 edge in the series. The two schools were in the same conference for more than 60 years in the Big Seven, Big Eight and Big 12, before moving to the Big Ten and Pac-12, respectively, in 2011.

Nebraska makes its first trip to Boulder to take on Colorado in 10 seasons. The last meeting at Folsom Field occurred in the 2009 regular-season finale. Nebraska and Colorado are scheduled to meet again in 2023 and 2024.

Nebraska scored three non-offensive touchdowns in its victory over South Alabama, including an interception return, punt return and fumble return. It marked the first time Nebraska had three non-offensive touchdowns in a season a game since 2005.

Nebraska had five takeaways in the season opener against South Alabama. It tied the Blackshirt defense's high in takeaways in Coach Scott Frost's two seasons and marked just the fourth time since 2010 that Nebraska has had five or more takeaways.

All postpractice interviews will be conducted at the practice site. Interviews will not be conducted in the weight room, Student Life Complex, training room, hallways or the tunnel leading from the locker room to the field. The Nebraska locker room, training room and football office meeting rooms are OFF LIMITS to the media. When arriving for post-practice interviews, media should come to the Hawks Championship Center, or outside Memorial Stadium as instructed.

#### SERIES HISTORY: NEBRASKA VS. COLORADO

Nebraska and Colorado are long-time foes with Saturday's meeting the 71st all-time between the schools. It is the second game in a home-and-home agreement that saw Colorado pull out a 33-28 victory in Lincoln last fall. That was the first meeting between the teams since both schools left the Big 12 Conference following the 2010 season.

- In last year's contest in Lincoln, Colorado jumped to a two-touchdown lead in the first quarter, before Nebraska rallied and eventually took an eight-point lead in the second half. However, the Buffs scored the game's final 13 points, including a touchdown with 1:06 remaining to escape Lincoln with a win.
- Nebraska and Colorado met each season from 1948 to 2010, as members of the Big Seven, Big Eight and Big 12 conferences.
- From 1996 to 2010, the Huskers and Buffs concluded the regular season against each other on Black Friday.
- $\bullet \, \text{Nebraska} \, \text{and} \, \text{Colorado} \, \text{combined} \, \text{to} \, \text{win} \, \text{the final eight Big Eight championships from 1988 to 1995}.$
- In addition to this Saturday's game, Nebraska and Colorado are scheduled for another home-and-home series in 2023 (Boulder) and 2024 (Lincoln).

#### **NEBRASKA HAS LONG HISTORY VS. PAC-12**

Nebraska's meeting with Colorado continues a tradition of marquee non-conference games against Pac-12 opponents. Since 1983, Nebraska has played 33 regular-season non-conference games against teams that were in the Pac-12 at the time.

- Nebraska is 23-10 against the Pac-12 in regular-season games in that span, including a 6-1 record against Arizona State and a 5-3 mark vs. UCLA. The record against the Pac-12 foes only includes last year's meeting with Colorado, not games against Colorado when the schools were conference rivals.
- Nebraska has also played five bowl games in that time period against the Pac-12, going 2-3 in those games.
- Nebraska played at least one non-conference game against a Pac-12 foe for 17 straight seasons from 1983 to 1999.
- Nebraska has four games on its future schedules against Pac-12 opponents. In addition to the 2023/2024 series with Colorado, Nebraska will play Arizona in 2028 and 2031.

#### FROST IN SECOND SEASON WITH HUSKERS

**Scott Frost** is in his second season at Nebraska in 2019. The 2017 consensus national coach of the year, Frost boasts a 24-15 career record as a collegiate head coach.

• Although Nebraska finished with a 4-8 record in 2018, five of the eight losses came by a combined 21 points. NU lost five games by five or fewer points, including a trio of three-point defeats. Nebraska won four of its final six games, and the two losses were a five-point loss at an Ohio State team that ended the year ranked No. 3 in the nation and a three-point loss at lowa, when the Hawkeyes kicked a game-winning field goal as time expired. Iowa finished with a No. 25 ranking.

#### **NOTING GAME 1**

- Nebraska won its season opener for the 33rd time in the past 35 seasons. NU improved to 14-0 all-time in August and 10-1 against Sun Belt Conference foes.
- Nebraska scored three non-offensive touchdowns in a game for the first time since a 31-3 win over Wake Forest in 2005. In that game, the Blackshirt defense scored three touchdowns. This marked the first time the defense had scored two touchdowns since a 2013 win over Southern Miss.
- Senior safety Eric Lee Jr. had two interceptions, including a 38-yard return for a touchdown. The interceptoins were Lee's first two career picks. It was also Nebraska's first interception return for a touchdown since Marcus Newby returned an interception 49 yards for a touchdown against Northwestern in 2017. Lee is the first Husker with two interceptions since Nate Gerry had two picks in a 2016 game at Wisconsin.
- JD Spielman had a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown, his second career punt return score. He also had a kickoff return for a touchdown earlier in his career.
- Senior Alex Davis scored his first career touchdown on a fumble recovery in the fourth quarter. It was the first fumble return for a touchdown by a Husker since Josh Mitchell against Miami in 2014.
- True freshman place-kicker Dylan Jorgensen earned a start in place of the injured Barret Pickering. Jorgensen is the first true freshman walk-on to start a game since fullback Andy Janovich in 2012.
- Tight end Jack Stoll had a career-long 42yard catch and his 66 yards receiving were also a career high.

- As the head coach at UCF, Frost improved from 6-7 in his first season to 13-0 in year two. A similar turnaround at Nebraska could be historic. A nine-win season by Nebraska in 2019 would tie for the second-largest win improvement from one season to the next in school history (five games), while a 10-win campaign would tie the largest win improvement (six games).
- In 12 seasons as a full-time assistant or head coach, Frost's teams have posted a 127-33 record, averaging nearly 11 wins per season. Frost has been a part of seven conference championship teams and coached in two national championship games in his 12 seasons.
- Frost's teams have been ranked in the top 15 in 10 of his 12 seasons, including eight final top-10 rankings and six final top-five rankings.
- Each of Nebraska's last five head coaches won at least eight games in their second season, while the four head coaches previous to Frost each produced their best winning percentage at Nebraska in year two.

#### NINE OF 10 ASSISTANTS RETURN FOR SECOND SEASON

Nine of Nebraska's 10 assistant coaches returned for their second season in 2019, with all nine having coached with **Scott Frost** in each of his four seasons as a head coach.

- Nebraska's nine returning assistant coaches mark its highest number of returning assistants since 2013, when a Husker coaching staff last had zero turnover during the offseason. Nebraska has had at least one coaching change each of the last six seasons.
- The lone new addition to the staff is **Tony Tuioti**, who coaches the Husker defensive line. Tuioti comes to Nebraska after spending the past two seasons at Cal, including the 2018 campaign as the Bears' defensive line coach. Tuioti was also an assistant defensive line coach for two seasons in the NFL with the Cleveland Browns in 2014 and 2015.
- Four of the Huskers' 11 full-time coaches played at Nebraska, including Frost, offensive line coach **Greg Austin**, running backs coach **Ryan Held** and inside linebackers coach **Barrett Ruud**.
- Nebraska's coaching staff has been lauded the past three seasons. In addition to Scott Frost being
  recognized as the 2017 national coach of the year while at UCF, the Husker staff features a Broyles
  Award finalist in offensive coordinator Troy Walters (2017) and two Broyles Award nominees in
  defensive coordinator Erik Chinander (2016) and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco (2018).
  The Broyles Award is presented annually to the nation's top assistant coach.

#### **NEBRASKA AIMS TO BUILD OFF STRONG FINISH TO 2018**

Nebraska won four of its final six games last season after an 0-6 start. The Huskers were nearly two touchdowns per game better both offensively and defensively over the second half of the 2018 season while facing four bowl teams in their final six games, including a pair of teams who were ranked in the final 2018 Associated Press top-25 poll.

- As part of its 4-2 finish, Nebraska won three games by at least 19 points. The Huskers' two losses were a five-point loss at Ohio State and a last-second three-point loss at Iowa.
- Offensively, Nebraska averaged 36.7 points per game in the final six games of 2018, after averaging 23.3 points per game in its first six contests.
- Defensively, the Huskers held two of their final five opponents to single digits last fall. Nebraska allowed 24.2 points per game in its final six contests after allowing 38.3 points per game in its first six games.

#### FROST OFFENSES IMPRESSIVE ON OPENING DRIVES

One common theme of a **Scott Frost**-led offense has been a fast start, and that has held true for Frost's tenure in Lincoln. Nebraska received the opening kickoff against South Alabama and drove nine plays and 81 yards for a touchdown to a take a 7-0 lead. The opening-drive score continued a theme from 2018.

- Nebraska scored on its first possession seven times in 12 games last season, including six of the final seven games. All seven of NU's opening scoring drives resulted in touchdowns.
- NU received the opening kickoff nine times in 2018 and scored touchdowns on six of those drives while punting only once. The Huskers had a game-opening touchdown drive to take a 7-0 lead in five straight games during the Big Ten Conference season.
- The Huskers scored on nearly 60 percent of their opening possessions in 2018, even with a pair of drive-ending turnovers in opponent territory. Nebraska's average touchdown drive covered more than 74 yards, including one 80-yard touchdown march and five 75-yard scoring drives.
- Over the last three seasons 2018-19 at Nebraska and 2017 at UCF Frost's offenses have scored a touchdown on their opening possession 17 times in 26 games (65 percent). The average length of the touchdown drive in that span is 73 yards.
- In three-plus years as a head coach, Frost's offenses have scored on their opening drive 21 times in 39 games, with 20 touchdowns and one field goal. In 79 games over six-plus seasons as a play-caller, Frost's offenses have scored on their first possession of the game 42 times, putting points on the board in more than half of their opening possessions.

#### **HUSKERS CONTINUE STREAKS INTO 2019 SEASON**

Nebraska continues a pair of long team streaks in the 2019 season, while a pair of Huskers are also riding impressive individual streaks.

- Saturday's season opener against South Alabama marked Nebraska's 369th consecutive sellout. The sellout streak began in 1962 and is in its 57th year in 2019.
- Nebraska has scored in 296 consecutive games. The streak is the longest in school history, the eighth-longest in FBS history and the fifth-longest active streak.
- Junior wide receiver **JD Spielman** has made at least two catches in each of his 22 career games. His streak of 22 straight games with a reception is the eighth-longest streak in school history.
- Sophomore place-kicker **Barret Pickering** has made 10 consecutive field goals, 26 consecutive extra points and 36 straight kicks overall entering Saturday's game at Colorado. His streak of 10 straight made field goals is the seventh-longest streak in program history. Pickering did not play in the season opener against South Alabama.

#### **BLACKSHIRT DEFENSE MAKES NOISE IN OPENER**

The Nebraska defense has focused on taking a step forward in 2019, specifically causing more turnovers and big impact plays. Nebraska checked the box on that offseason priority in Week One against South Alabama.

- · Nebraska had five takeaways against South Alabama including four in the second half of the 35-21 victory. The five takeaways matched the most in two seasons under Scott Frost (Illinois, 2018) and was only the fourth time since 2010 that a Nebraska defense recorded five or more takeaways.
- Nebraska scored a pair of defensive touchdowns-a 38-yard interception return by Eric Lee Jr. in the third quarter and a fumble recovery in the end zone by Alex Davis in the fourth quarter to cap the scoring. The two defensive touchdowns marked the first time Nebraska scored a pair of defensive touchdowns since having two interception returns for touchdowns against Southern Miss in 2013.
- Lee's interception return for a touchdown was the first by a Husker since Marcus Newby had an interception for a touchdown against Northwestern in 2017.
- Davis' fumble recovery for a touchdown was the first by the Huskers since Josh Mitchell returned a fumble 57 yards for a touchdown against Miami in 2014.
- Nebraska also scored on a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown by JD Spielman in the third quarter. The three non-offensive touchdowns were a first for Nebraska since the Huskers had three defensive touchdowns in a 31-3 win over Wake Forest in 2005.
- Nebraska was the only team in Week One with three non-offensive touchdowns and the two defensive scores are tied with Utah for the national lead.
- Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander has a history of producing disruptive defenses. In 39 games as a defensive coordinator (UCF, Nebraska) Chinander's defenses have scored 11 touchdowns.

#### BARRY IS THE BIG TEN'S TOP RETURNING TACKLER

Senior inside linebacker Mohamed Barry is back after a breakthrough junior season in 2018, when he totaled 112 tackles after recording only 44 tackles in his first two seasons combined.

- Barry led Nebraska with 112 tackles in 2018, the most by a Husker since Lavonte David made 133 stops in 2011. Barry was second in the Big Ten and 38th nationally with an average of 9.3 tackles per game, and he is the Big Ten's leading returner in that category.
- Barry opened the season with a team-high 12 tackles against South Alabama, tying his career high and marking his eighth career double-figure tackle game. He has led Nebraska in tackles in 10 of 13 games since the start of the 2018 season.
- This fall, Barry will look to become the sixth Husker to have back-to-back 100-tackle seasons, joining David (2010-11), his position coach Barrett Ruud (2003-04), Lee Kunz (1977-78), Clete Pillen (1975-76) and Jerry Murtaugh (1969-70).
- Barry was tabbed as a third-team All-Big Ten selection by the conference media in 2018 and was an honorable-mention selection by the league's coaches. He is on the 2019 preseason watch lists for the Butkus Award and the Lott IMPACT Trophy.

#### **BOOTLE BREAKS UP OPPONENT'S PASSING GAME**

Junior Dicaprio Bootle wreaked havoc on opponent passing games in 2018. Bootle broke up 15 passes and had a career-high 39 tackles in his first season as a starter in 2018, helping Nebraska rank 34th nationally in pass efficiency defense, a 61-spot improvement from the 2017 season.

- Bootle broke up 15 passes in 2018, ranking ninth nationally in breakups and 16th nationally in passes defended per game (1.3). Bootle's 15 pass breakups ranked second on Nebraska's season chart and were the most by a Husker since DeJuan Groce broke up a school-record 17 passes in 2000. Bootle opened the 2019 season with a team-high two PBU against South Alabama.
- Bootle earned third-team All-Big Ten honors last year, becoming the first Husker cornerback to be honored by the conference in four seasons.

2019 NEBRASKA FOOTBALL

#### SPIELMAN CONTINUES TO CLIMB HUSKER CHARTS

Junior wide receiver **JD Spielman** has already made Husker history as the only player in program history to have a 200-yard receiving game. In only two-plus seasons and just 22 games, Spielman is also leaving his mark on Nebraska's career record book. He has 123 career catches for 1,684 yards, ranking seventh all-time at Nebraska in receiving yards and eighth in receptions.

- Spielman needs 67 receptions and 1,064 yards to become Nebraska's all-time leader in both categories. He averaged 61 catches and 842 receiving yards per season in his first two years. On a per-game basis, Spielman averages 5.6 receptions and 76.5 receiving yards.
- Spielman reached 1,000 career receiving yards in only 15 games. He reached the mark faster than any other Husker, eclipsing Heisman Trophy winner Johnny Rodgers (16 games).
- Spielman is the only player in school history to record 100 catches prior to his junior season.
- Spielman owns the only two 200-yard receiving games in Husker history (200 yards vs. Ohio State in 2017 and 209 yards at Wisconsin in 2018).
- Spielman is the only wide receiver in school history to have two career games with double-digit receptions (11 vs. Ohio State in 2017 and 10 vs. Purdue in 2018). Running back Marlon Lucky is the only other Husker to have two career games with double-digit catches.
- Spielman had more than 800 receiving yards in each of his first two seasons, joining Johnny Rodgers and Stanley Morgan Jr. as the only Huskers with two 800-yard receiving seasons. No Husker has ever had three 800-yard receiving seasons.
- Spielman had more than 50 catches in each of his first two seasons, joining Johnny Rodgers, Kenny Bell and Stanley Morgan Jr. as the only players in program history with multiple 50-catch seasons. No Husker has ever had three 50-catch seasons.
- Spielman opened the 2019 season with a 76-yard punt return for a touchdown, marking his second career punt return score. He had a 77-yard punt return touchdown last season against Bethune-Cookman. He also had a 99-yard kickoff return for a touchdown in his first career touch against Arkansas State in the 2017 season opener. Spielman is one of only eight players in program history to return both a punt and kickoff for a touchdown.

#### SPIELMAN RANKS AMONG NATION'S TOP WIDE RECEIVERS

**JD Spielman** was one of the top returning receivers in the country in 2019. The two-time All-Big Ten selection has earned a spot on the preseason Biletnikoff Award watch list each of the last two seasons, and he was a freshman All-American in 2017.

- Spielman averages 76.5 receiving yards per game in his 22 career games. That total ranks third nationally among all active FBS players with a minimum of 1,000 career receiving yards. Among Power Five teams, Spielman is one of only three active players to average 70 receiving yards per game along with Purdue's Rondale Moore and Oklahoma's CeeDee Lamb.
- Spielman owns 1,684 career receiving yards, which ranks sixth nationally among non-seniors.
- Spielman is also one of the top wideouts in the Big Ten Conference. His career totals of 123
  receptions and 1,684 receiving yards both rank third among all 2019 Big Ten receivers and are the
  highest totals among non-seniors.
- In Big Ten play, Spielman has posted 1,339 career receiving yards. He owns more receiving yards in conference play than any other active Big Ten player, an impressive accomplishment considering Spielman has only played in 15 career Big Ten games, missing the final conference game of the 2017 season and the final two Big Ten contests last season.

#### **MARTINEZ DRIVES HUSKER OFFENSE**

Quarterback **Adrian Martinez** put together an impressive rookie campaign as a true freshman in 2018. A freshman All-American a season ago, Martinez played a major role in Nebraska ranking 25th nationally in total offense and setting a school record by gaining at least 450 yards in seven consecutive games.

- Martinez ranked 12th nationally and first among freshmen with an average of 295.1 yards of total offense per game in 2018, a school record. In addition to the school record, it smashed the Huskers' previous freshman record of 199.7 yards per game set by Taylor Martinez in 2010.
- Martinez's average of 295.1 yards of total offense per game marked the 10th-best total offense average by a freshman in FBS history, including the fifth-highest mark by a true freshman and the highest mark ever by a true freshman quarterback for a Power Five team.
- Martinez is the top returner from 2018 in total offensive yards among Power Five quarterbacks. Overall, Martinez (295.1 ypg) ranked third in returning total offensive yards per game behind Houston's D'Eriq King (332.4 ypg) and Hawaii's Cole McDonald (325.7 ypg). UCF's McKenzie Milton (297.0 ypg) also has a higher average than Martinez, but Milton will miss the 2019 season.

#### MARTINEZ POSTED RECORD-BREAKING FRESHMAN SEASON

**Adrian Martinez** was one of the most productive freshman quarterbacks in NCAA history last season, when he earned freshman All-America honors after setting several school records. Martinez started 11 of 12 games last fall, more than all other true freshmen quarterbacks in Nebraska history combined. He led an offense that ranked 25th nationally with an average of 456.2 yards per game. Martinez completed nearly 65 percent of his passes, threw for 2,617 yards and 17 touchdowns and rushed for 629 yards and eight scores.

- Martinez averaged a school-record 295.1 yards of total offense per game in 2018, an average that ranked 12th nationally and was the top mark among freshmen.
- Martinez set Husker season records for 300-yard total offense games (7) and 400-yard total offense games (3), while tying the Nebraska career record with three 400-yard total offense games.
- Martinez set Nebraska freshman records in completions (224), completion percentage (64.6), passing yards (2,617), passing touchdowns (17), total offensive yards (3,246) and total touchdowns (25). His 629 rushing yards were the most ever by a Husker true freshman quarterback and the most by any Nebraska true freshman since 2002.
- In addition to his school records, Martinez ranked in the top five on Nebraska's season chart in completion percentage (2nd, 64.6), completions (4th, 224) and total offensive yards (5th, 3,246).
- Martinez posted an 86.2 percent completion percentage against Minnesota last October, setting
  a Nebraska record for the highest completion percentage with a minimum of 20 attempts.
  Martinez broke the record held by Dave Humm that stood for 44 years.

#### MARTINEZ BRINGS DUAL THREAT TO NEBRASKA OFFENSE

**Adrian Martinez** is one of the nation's top dual-threat quarterbacks. In 11 games as a true freshman in 2018, Martinez threw for more than 2,500 yards and rushed for more than 600 yards.

- Martinez averaged 237.9 passing yards per game and 57.2 rushing yards per game in 2018. He was one of only four FBS quarterbacks who averaged 225 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game in 2018.
- Martinez became the sixth freshman in NCAA history to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards per game. He was just the second true freshman to hit those marks in FBS history and the first true freshman at a Power Five school to average 200 passing yards and 50 rushing yards.
- With his dual-threat ability, Martinez is on the preseason watch list for the Maxwell and Walter Camp Player-of-the-Year Awards, along with the Manning and Davey O'Brien Awards.

#### **HUSKER OFFENSE LOOKS TO BE ONE OF NATION'S TOP UNITS**

Despite a new system and a true freshman starting quarterback, Nebraska featured one of the nation's top offenses in 2018, and the Huskers were also one of the nation's most improved units. Nebraska opened with a sluggish offensive effort against South Alabama, but has the tools to once again be one of the nation's best units.

- Nebraska ranked 25th nationally in total offense in 2018, averaging 456.2 yards per game. The Huskers finished in the top 25 in total offense for the first time since 2008.
- The Huskers gained at least 450 yards of offense in seven consecutive games during the 2018 season, the longest such streak in school history. Nebraska also eclipsed 500 yards of total offense five times last fall, the program's most games with 500 yards of offense since 2000.
- Nebraska gained more than 2,500 yards rushing and 2,500 yards passing in 2018, marking just the fourth time the Huskers had reached both of those marks in the same season.
- The Huskers ranked 87th in the country in total offense in 2017 before improving to 25th in 2018. Nebraska's 62-spot improvement ranked seventh nationally. The Huskers also ranked 14th nationally by averaging 71.2 more yards per game in 2018 than they did in 2017.
- Nebraska improved its rushing offense ranking by 91 spots from 2017 to 2018, the No. 2
  improvement nationally after going from 119th in 2017 to 28th in 2018. NU was also third with a
  rushing improvement of 101.5 yards per game from 2017 (107.5 ypg) to 2018 (209.0 ypg).

#### **ROSTER FULL OF YOUTH FOR 2019 HUSKERS**

Nebraska features a youthful roster again in 2019, one year after the Huskers' 2018 freshman class made a significant impact.

- Among the 153 players on the Husker roster, 105 are underclassmen, including 78 freshmen and 27 sophomores. Overall, 69 percent of Nebraska's roster is comprised of underclassmen. Additionally, 101 of the 153 players on the roster have been added in Scott Frost's two seasons.
- Nebraska's two leading returning rushers from 2018, its leading passer, its leading scorer, its leading kickoff returner and two of its top four returning receivers were all freshmen in 2018.
- Sophomore quarterback **Adrian Martinez** is Nebraska's leading returning rusher after he ran for 629 yards as a true freshman. Sophomore running back **Maurice Washington** is the Huskers' second-leading returning rushers after gaining 455 yards as a true freshman in 2018.

#### FROST AS A HEAD COACH

- In the passing game, Martinez returns after leading Nebraska with 2,617 passing yards as a true freshman in 2018. Two of his top four returning targets are classmates, as Washington ranks second among Husker returners with 24 catches in 2018 and **Kade Warner** ranks fourth with 17 catches.
- Nebraska's top scorer last season was Barret Pickering, who totaled 82 points as a true freshman in 2018.
- The youth movement may not be as pronounced on defense, but the Blackshirts are expected to be led by several players who were first-year starters in 2018.
- Nebraska's top returner in tackles (senior Mohamed Barry), tackles for loss (Barry), sacks (junior Ben Stille) and pass breakups (junior Dicaprio Bootle) were all first-year starters in 2018, and the Huskers are hoping that year of starting experience will pay dividends this fall.
- NU also featured first-year starters at punter and place-kicker last season with both starters
  returning. Senior Isaac Armstrong was second in the Big Ten in punting average in 2018 with the
  ninth-highest average in NU history (43.6 yards per punt). Pickering connected on 14-of-18 field
  goals last year. He made his final 10 field goals and including PATs, he has made 36 straight kicks.

#### FRESHMEN MAKE IMPACT ON OFFENSIVE LINE

Nebraska, which has no seniors on its offensive line depth chart, saw two freshmen earn playing time on the line in the season opener against South Alabama last Saturday.

- Redshirt freshman **Cameron Jurgens** earned the start at center against South Alabama. Jurgens became the first freshman (true or redshirt) to start a game at center for Nebraska since the NCAA restored freshmen eligibility in 1972.
- Jurgens, who spent the majority of his redshirt season working at tight end, also became only the sixth freshman offensive lineman (true or redshirt) to start a season opener for Nebraska.
- Redshirt freshman Will Farniok also saw playing time at center in his career debut.
- True freshman **Bryce Benhart** did not play in the season opener but is listed as the No. 2 right tackle.

Senior linebacker **Mohamed Barry**, senior defensive lineman **Darrion Daniels**, junior offensive lineman **Matt Farniok** and sophomore quarterback **Adrian Martinez** will serve as captains in 2019.

- Farniok's selection marks the seventh straight year an offensive lineman has served as captain.
- Martinez becomes just the second sophomore captain at Nebraska since at least 1930. The only
  other sophomore to serve as captain since 1930 was quarterback Joe Daily in 2004.

#### **NEBRASKA RANKS AMONG NATION'S ATTENDANCE LEADERS**

Nebraska averaged 89,034 fans over seven home games in 2018 to rank 10th nationally in average attendance. The Huskers were ninth with a total season attendance of 623,240.

• The Huskers have ranked in the top 15 nationally in average attendance every season since 2006. Nebraska has ranked in the top 20 nationally in average attendance every year this century.

#### **RECORD SELLOUT STREAK CONTINUES**

Nebraska has sold out every game at Memorial Stadium since Nov. 3, 1962, an NCAA-record streak of 369 consecutive sellouts, 101 more than second-place Notre Dame. Nebraska is 311-58 (.843) during the streak and overall attendance during the streak is more than 28 million fans.

#### **HUSKERS OWN BIG HOME-FIELD ADVANTAGE**

Nebraska has won at least six home games in 24 of the past 32 seasons. Nebraska is 176-36 (.830) at home over the last 30 seasons.

- Since 1970, Nebraska has posted 41 perfect home seasons.
- The Huskers are 545-155-20 all-time in Lincoln (.771 in 130 years).
- Nebraska is 420-132-13 in Memorial Stadium (.755 in 96 years dating back to 1923).

#### **NEBRASKA AMONG TOP ALL-TIME PROGRAMS**

Nebraska is playing its 130th season of football in 2019, and the Huskers boast an 898-388-40 all-time record (.692) in 1,326 games. The Huskers are one of 10 programs with 800 all-time victories, ranking sixth all-time with 898 wins.

- Nebraska will look to join the 900-win club this fall. Michigan (954), Ohio State (912), Texas (910) and Alabama (906) are the only teams with 900 all-time wins.
- Since 1970, Nebraska owns a 464-146-5 record (.759), and the Huskers are the nation's wins leader over the last 50 years.
- NU boasts 27 10-win seasons in school history, including 24 since 1970. The Huskers also have 12 seasons with 11 or more wins, seven seasons with 12 or more wins and three 13-win seasons.
- The Huskers own 50 nine-win seasons, an NCAA record. Forty-two of those nine-win seasons have come since 1970 and 48 since 1962, 13 more than any other school.
- Nebraska was the first team in NCAA history to win 100 games in consecutive decades, leading the nation with 103 wins in the 1980s and ranking second with 108 wins in the 1990s.

#### **NEBRASKA NO. 2 IN CONFERENCE TITLES**

Nebraska is one of only five schools in NCAA history that has won at least 40 conference championships, ranking second all-time with 46 conference titles. In 36 seasons (1962-97) under Hall-of-Fame coaches Bob Devaney (8) and Tom Osborne (13), the Huskers won 21 conference titles.

#### **HUSKERS RANK HIGHLY IN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

Nebraska has won five national championships, including three outright titles (1971, 1994, 1995) and two shared championships (1970, 1997). In 1970, Nebraska was awarded the Associated Press national title, but was No. 3 in the coaches poll behind No. 1 Texas and No. 2 Ohio State, both of whom lost their bowl games (the coaches' poll was voted on before bowl games). In 1997, undefeated Nebraska was voted No. 1 in the coaches' poll, while undefeated Michigan was No. 1 in the AP poll.

- Nebraska's four AP national championships rank seventh all-time.
- The Huskers' four coaches' poll national championships rank fourth all-time.

#### **HUSKER HIGHLIGHTS**

Nebraska football is the only team in any sport in NCAA history to boast 100 athletic All-Americans and 100 academic All-Americans.

Three Huskers have won the Heisman Trophy, all since 1972. Johnny Rodgers won in 1972, Mike Rozier in 1983 and Eric Crouch in 2001.

Nebraska has won five national titles: 1970, 1971, 1994, 1995 and 1997. The Huskers rank second with five national titles since 1970.

Nebraska ranks sixth in NCAA history with 898 all-time victories. The Huskers are one of only 11 teams with 800 all-time wins.

NU ranks ninth nationally with a total of 24 former players and coaches (18 players, six coaches) enshrined in the College Football Hall of Fame.

Nebraska leads the nation with a former Husker on a Super Bowl roster for 26 consecutive years.

NU ranks second in NCAA history with 46 conference titles, including 33 unbeaten conference seasons.

Nebraska has won at least nine games in a season 50 times in its 129-year history, an NCAA record for most nine-win seasons.

Nebraska ranks third in NCAA history with 53 all-time bowl appearances.

Nebraska football has totaled 108 Academic All-Americans, the most of any team in any sport in NCAA history.

NU has totaled an NCAA-record 338 Academic All-Americans in all sports.

Memorial Stadium has been sold out for an NCAA-record 369 consecutive games dating back to Nov. 3, 1962.

#### **HOME OF THE HUSKERS**



Memorial Stadium's history dates back more than 90 years. In the fall of 1922, a drive for \$430,000 in stadium construction funds was undertaken by faculty, students, alumni and friends of the University.

The stadium was named Memorial Stadium to honor all Nebraskans who served in the Civil and Spanish-American Wars; the 751 Nebraskans who died in World War I; the 3,839 in World War II; the 225 in Korea; the 422 in Vietnam; and those in Iraq.

Construction was completed in a few more than 90 working days and Memorial Stadium was dedicated on Oct. 20, 1923, at the Homecoming game in which Nebraska was held to a scoreless tie by Kansas.

The field at Memorial Stadium was named Tom Osborne Field - after the Huskers' legendary Hall-of-Fame coach - in 1998, one year after Osborne's retirement following 25 years and 255 victories as head coach.

#### NEBRASKA ALSO EXCELS IN THE CLASSROOM

Nebraska's rich tradition is not limited to the field, as the Huskers have been outstanding in the classroom as well.

- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 338 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans across all sports.
- Husker football has produced 108 CoSIDA Academic All-Americans, the most of any single sport in NCAA history.
- Nebraska owns the NCAA record with 17 NCAA Top 10 Award Winners, which is considered the "Heisman Trophy" of academics.
- Nebraska football has produced nine NCAA Top 10 Award winners, the most of any single team in NCAA history.

#### **NEBRASKA ATHLETICS 2019 HALL OF FAME CLASS INDUCTED**

The 2019 Nebraska Athletics Hall of Fame Class was inducted on Aug. 30 and included three individuals with Husker football ties. Former football star **Grant Wistrom** was one of four student-athletes in the 2019 hall-of-fame class, while **Carol Frost** and **Ed Weir** are being inducted as Nebraska 150 Pioneers in recognition of their significant contributions as the University of Nebraska celebrates its 150th anniversary in 2019.

- Wistrom was a member of three Husker national championship teams (1994, 1995, 1997), and Nebraska posted a 49-2 record in his four-year career with three perfect seasons. Wistrom was a three-time All-American, the 1997 Lombardi Award winner, the 1997 Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year and the 1997-98 Big 12 Conference Male Athlete of the Year.
- Carol Frost, the mother of Nebraska Head Coach Scott Frost, was the first woman from Nebraska and the first Husker female to compete in the Olympics, throwing the discus at the 1968 Mexico City Games. Frost trained for the Olympics while pursuing a double major at Nebraska, but she had no track and field team with which to train. Although she attended Nebraska before women's athletics had earned varsity status, Frost's accomplishments were so great that she was presented with an honorary letter in 2004.
- Weir was the first two-time All-American in the history of Nebraska football, earning first-team accolades in both 1924 and 1925. A member of the inaugural College Football Hall of Fame class in 1951, Weir's No. 35 jersey is retired.

#### **SCHEDULE NOTES**

• Nebraska faces seven teams that made a bowl game in 2018, including three defending conference division champion. The Huskers played both 2018 Big Ten division champs close on the road last fall, suffering a three-point overtime loss at West Division champion Northwestern and a five-point loss at East Division champion Ohio State. NU also faces Northern Illinois, the 2018 MAC East Division champion.

- Nebraska plays five teams that appeared in the Associated Press top-25 poll at least once last season: Colorado (as high as No.19), Ohio State (as high as No. 2), Northwestern (as high as No. 20), Wisconsin (as high as No. 4) and lowa (as high as No. 18).
- NU faces four teams with a new head coach in 2019: Colorado (Mel Tucker); Northern Illinois (Thomas Hammock); Ohio State (Ryan Day); and Maryland (Michael Locksley).
- After playing 12 consecutive weeks during the 2018 season, Nebraska will have a pair of byes (Oct. 19 and Nov. 9) in 2019. The last time Nebraska had two byes in the same season was in 2014.

#### **COACHING STAFF NOTES**

- Scott Frost is in his fourth season as a head coach in 2019. Frost is one of four former Husker players to return to the Nebraska sideline as head coach, and he is one of 19 FBS head coaches coaching at his alma mater in 2019.
- Nebraska's staff also includes former Huskers Greg Austin (2003-06), Ryan Held (1993-96) and Barrett Ruud (2001-04).
- Frost is one of only four FBS head coaches who won a national title as a player. Both Frost (1995 & 1997) and Ryan Held (1994 & 1995) were two-time national champions at Nebraska.
- Frost and nine of his 10 assistant coaches are in their fourth consecutive season working together, including two seasons at UCF.
- The lone new addition to the staff is defensive line coach Tony Tuioti, who came to Nebraska after spending the past two seasons at Cal.
- Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, while offensive coordinator Troy Walters was a finalist for the 2017 Broyles Award. Defensive coordinator Erik Chinander was a nominee for the 2016 Broyles Award and quarterbacks coach Mario Verduzco was a Broyles Award nominee in 2018.

 Walters, the all-time leading receiver in Pac-12 history, was the 1999 Biletnikoff Award winner as the nation's top receiver. He is the only Biletnikoff Award winner currently coaching in college football.

#### **ROSTER NOTES**

- Nebraska's roster features 153 players. NU is believed to have the largest roster of any non-service academy in the country.
- The roster features players from 29 different states, including 69 homegrown Huskers.
- Behind Nebraska, the most common states are: Georgia (8), Colorado (7), Florida (7), Texas (6), Arizona (5), California (5), Iowa (5), Missouri (5).
- The roster features 57 newcomers, including 46 true freshmen and 11 transfers, including five FBS transfers, four from Power Five programs.
- More than two-thirds of the Husker roster is underclassmen, as 105 of the 153 players are either freshmen or sophomores (69 percent).
- Nebraska has 78 freshmen on its roster, more than the sophomore, junior and senior classes combined. Fifty-one percent of NU's roster is freshmen, the fifth-highest total of any FBS team behind UCLA, Oklahoma State, Coastal Carolina and Virginia Tech, respectively.
- NU's 78 freshmen are the most of any nonservice academy team and are 12 more than the next closest team (Coastal Carolina, 66).
- Of the 153 players on the roster, 101 have joined the program since Scott Frost was hired as head coach in December of 2017 (66 percent).
- Nebraska has five sets of brothers on its 2019 roster (Brant & Brig Banks; Damion & Darrion Daniels; Carlos & Khalil Davis; Matt & Will Farniok; and Connor & Corbin Ruth). The five sets of brothers ties Clemson for the most brothers on any FBS roster.

#### **ACADEMIC NOTES**

- The Husker football program has produced more CoSIDA Academic All-Americans (108) than any other sport in NCAA history.
- A total of 16 Huskers are playing the 2019 season as graduates. That total ranks fourth in the FBS and leads all Big Ten schools.

### **HEAD COACH SCOTT FROST**



#### HISTORIC TURNAROUND AT UCF

At UCF, Frost produced the greatest two-year turnaround in college football history, inheriting an 0-12 team and leading the Knights to a 13-0 record just two years later.

- In his first season in 2016, Frost made history as the only first-time head coach in FBS history to make a bowl game with a team that was winless the previous season.
- UCF tied for the national lead with a six-win improvement from the 2015 to 2016 season.
   The Knights then ranked third nationally after improving by seven wins from the 2016 to 2017 season.
- The Knights' seven-win improvement from 2016 to 2017 ranked 11th in NCAA history and marked just the second time ever a bowl team improved by more than six wins the next season.
- UCF was the American Athletic Conference and Peach Bowl champions and was the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- Frost called UCF's plays, orchestrating the greatest two-year offensive turnaround in NCAA history. The Knights went from last to fifth in total offense, improving their output by more than 260 yards per game. UCF also went from third-to-last to first in scoring offense, improving by nearly 35 points per game.

#### 13-0 AS A PLAYER & COACH

In his second year as a head coach, Scott Frost guided UCF to a 13-0 record in 2017, when the Knights were the nation's only undefeated team.

- Frost became the fourth coach in FBS history to post a 13-0 record or better in either his first or second season as a head coach. Among that quartet, Frost is the only coach who inherited a team that won fewer than five games, as UCF went 0-12 the year before Frost's arrival.
- Frost is one of only seven active FBS head coaches who has posted a 13-0 season or better, joining Jimbo Fisher, Gary Patterson, Chris Petersen, Nick Saban, Dabo Swinney and Kyle Whittingham.
- Frost also led Nebraska to a 13-0 record and a national title as the Huskers' starting quarterback in 1997. Frost was the first person in NCAA history to be part of a 13-0 season as both a player and a head coach.

#### NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Frost was the consensus choice as the 2017 national coach of the year, earning the honor from at least eight different organizations.

- Frost won the 2017 Paul "Bear" Bryant Award as the national coach of the year. He joined Chris Petersen (2006 & 2009, Boise State) as the only coaches in the 32-year history of the award to win the honor while coaching a team outside of a Power Five Conference.
- Frost was also the AP Coach of the Year, becoming the sixth coach to win the award in his first or second season as a head coach.

#### FROST A TOP OFFENSIVE COACH

For each of the last 10 years, Scott Frost has either been an offensive assistant, offensive coordinator or head coach who calls the offensive plays. During that time, he has consistently proven to be one of the nation's finest offensive coaches.

- In 10 seasons coaching offense, Frost has worked with eight units that finished in the top 10 nationally in scoring, including seven that ranked in the top five.
- Frost has also been a part of seven teams that ranked in the top 10 nationally in total offense the past 10 seasons.

#### **FROST A PROVEN WINNER**

Frost is a proven winner. In his 12-year full-time coaching career, Frost's teams have combined for a 127-33 record.

- Frost has averaged nearly 11 wins per season and has been a part of seven 12-win teams.
- He has won seven conference titles in 12 years.
- Frost has coached in two national title games and his teams have finished with a top-10 ranking eight times in the past 12 years.
- In two seasons as UCF's head coach, the Knights were the nation's most improved team in 2016 and were the only FBS team to go undefeated in 2017.
- As a Husker quarterback, Frost was a two-time national champion who helped NU to a 36-2 record, including a 24-2 mark as a starter.
- Frost is one of four active head coaches who won a national title as a player and is the only coach who won multiple national titles.

Colorado (1-0) opened the 2019 season with a 52-31 victory against in-state rival Colorado State on Friday night in Denver. Colorado's defense produced four turnovers and a touchdown



and Alex Fontenot rushed for three touchdowns to give Mel Tucker the win over the Rams in his head coaching debut.

While offense was the name of the game for most of the night — the 83 combined points were the most in series history — the Buffs defense came up with some huge stops that paved the way for CU's fifth straight win in the series.

Quarterback Steven Montez went 13-for-20 with 232 yards and two touchdowns in the air, while Tony Brown led the team with three catches for 71 yards.

On the other side of the ball, Nate Landman had a team-best 11 tackles, while Jona Van Diest and Terrance Lang each had 1.0 sack against Colorado

#### **SERIES HISTORY**

The Nebraska-Colorado rivalry is one of college football's oldest, dating back to 1898. The Huskers lead the overall series 49-19-2. The teams regularly competed when both were part of the Big 12 Conference, and meet again for the second straight season. In 2018, the Buffaloes escaped from Memorial Stadium with a 33-28 win in Nebraska's season opener and Scott Frost's official debut as the Husker head coach.

#### **COLORADO FOOTBALL**

Colorado has fielded a football team since 1890. Colorado won a national championship in 1990 and has 26 conference titles, including five Big Eight Championships and one Big 12 title (2001). The Buffs joined the Pac-12 Conference for the 2011 season, after spending 15 seasons in the Big 12 Conference. Since moving to the Pac-12, CU has a 35-59 record, which includes a 17-55 record in conference play.

**Lincoln (Aug. 31)** - No. 24 Nebraska forced five South Alabama turnovers, and the Cornhuskers scored three non-offensive touchdowns in the second half to post a 35-21 victory.

Leading 14-7 at halftime, the Husker defense and special teams accounted for all three second-half scores, marking the first time since 2005 that NU had scored at least three non-offensive touchdowns in a game.

On the first drive of the second half, Eric Lee Jr. intercepted a Cephus Johnson pass and returned it 38 yards for a score to push the margin to 14. The interception was the first of the Lee's career and the first defensive touchdown by the Blackshirts since 2017. After a three-and-out, JD Spielman fielded a punt, made a pair of Jaguar defenders miss and went 76 yards for his second career punt return touchdown to make it 28-7 less than four minutes into the second half.

South Alabama pulled to with 28-21 and had the ball to start the fourth quarter, but another defensive play gave NU some breathing room. Cam Taylor-Britt sacked Johnson, who coughed up the ball. Alex Davis recovered it in the end zone for a touchdown to make it 35-21.

In the game, Nebraska managed just 276 total yards, including just 66 in the second half. South Alabama produced 314 total yards on 79 plays, including 222 yards on 47 plays after halftime.

The Huskers looked sharp early on, going 81 yards on nine plays, as Jack Stoll's 42-yard reception to the USA 5-yard line set up Dedrick Mills' first TD three plays later. Stoll finished with three catches for 66 yards, as Adrian Martinez completed 13-of-22 passes for 178 yards in the win.

The teams traded touchdowns, as Johnson led the Jaguars 41 yards in nine plays, scoring from three yards out midway through the first quarter. The Huskers regained a 14-7 advantage midway through the second quarter as Mills scored from one yard out.

Senior linebacker Mohamed Barry led the Blackshirts with 12 tackles, while Taylor-Britt added five tackles, including two tackles for 16 yards lost. He also hauled in his first career interception and returned it 48 yards in the second half. Lee pitched in four tackles and the first two interceptions of his career while adding a breakup. As a team, NU produced 10 tackles for 49 yards lost, including four sacks for 32 yards.
