

Childcare Resume Guide

Please read through this carefully as it will help you format your Nannies by Noa resume.

- We send our clients Nannies by Noa branded resumes that do not include your personal contact information (phone, address, email). For representation, we ask all candidates to provide a Nannies by Noa resume.
- A Nannies by Noa resume looks exactly like the sample provided below. This includes the font (Times New Roman), 12-point sizing, order, layout and logos.
- When referring to past positions, use the past tense to describe your duties. If you're currently in a position, you can use present tense.
- Under Career Profile, *in your own words*, please include a brief bio (100 words or less) describing your childcare philosophy and the qualities, strengths and knowledge you bring to the role.
- It is important that the entire resume be written in your own words, especially the Work Related Skills section.
- If a past employer prefers not to have their name shared, please write "Private Family."
- The photo is optional; however, our families tell us they love to have a face to go with the resume. If you choose to include one, please use a professional looking headshot. To protect the privacy of children and their families, please, no photos of you with children.
- Please accurately but briefly describe the responsibilities you had and the years worked *starting with your most recent*. Make sure the years line up and there are no major, un-explained gaps in your history. If you worked at a non-childcare position in between nanny jobs or were out of work for a while, just remind us via email when you send the resume.
- Jobs that fall under Childcare Experience include: nanny, babysitting, teaching, tutoring, camp counselor, daycare worker, working with children in a therapeutic setting, etc.
- Please submit your new Nannies by Noa resume as a Word Document and <u>not a PDF</u> with your application at <u>www.nanniesbynoa.com/for-nannies</u>.
