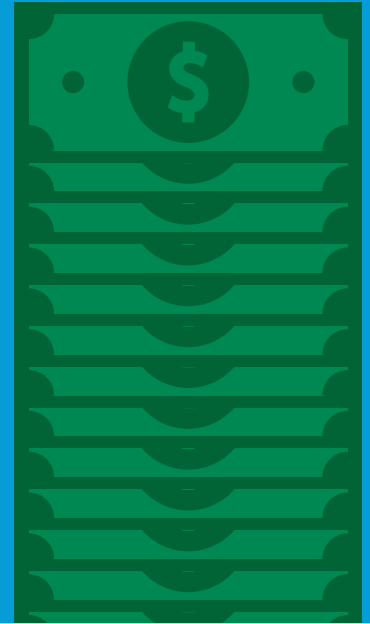
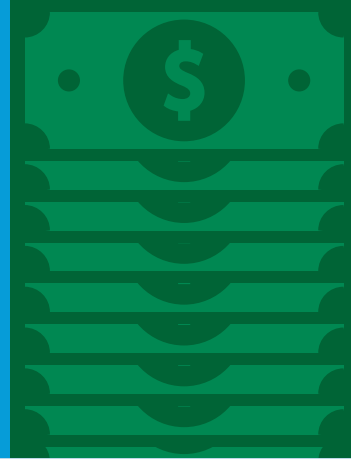


# How To Make Money Fast

## Top Three Ways to Make Money Online:



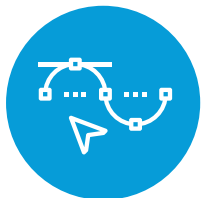
### Selling Items
