EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

The Centre for Monitoring Election Violence (CMEV) commenced its monitoring for the Central and North Western Provincial Council Elections on 10th January 2009. CMEV focused its monitoring on election related malpractices, irregularities and incidents of electoral violence in three phases:

- 1. Campaign
- 2. Polling Day
- 3. Post election violence

CMEV monitoring is founded on the belief that the electoral process is the basic mechanism for choice and change in a functioning democracy. Furthermore, political parties bear a responsibility for protecting the integrity of the electoral process through their choice of candidates and electoral practices. Individual candidates, likewise. Accordingly, the integrity of the electoral process is of pivotal importance for the legitimacy of the governance and government that it produces. Electoral violence and malpractice and discrimination in favor of any political party or section of the electorate will erode public trust and confidence. The basic modus operandi of CMEV is the deployment of monitors in the field attached to each of the relevant Polling Divisions in a District. They report back to the CMEV Secretariat for the further corroboration of information pertaining to electoral violence and malpractice. The Secretariat releases the information to the public through the media after this further process is completed.

Overall, in the elections to the two Provincial Councils, there was a sizeable decrease in the number and nature of incidents, especially on Election Day. There were however, a number of incidents reported during the campaign that adversely affected the environment for conducting a free and fair election.

In these two elections, the highest number of complaints related to the disenfranchisement of voters on account of the lack of proper identification documents. This was also the case in the previous provincial council elections- the Eastern Provincial Council Election held on 10th May and North Central and Sabaragamuwa Provincial Council Election held on 23rd August 2008.

CMEV consistently highlighted the issue and the importance of taking steps to rectify it. The problem however

has persisted. Other issues identified are the misuse of public resources and biased print and electronic media coverage mainly by the State media.

This has become a common feature of elections held in Sri Lanka and is yet another reinforcement of the argument constantly advanced by CMEV regarding the urgency of the full implementation of the 17th Amendment.

CMEV believes that the establishment of independent commissions for the Police, the Public Service and Elections amongst others provided for by this amendment, is necessary for the protection of the integrity of the electoral process.

The Commissioner of Elections acted decisively in response to malpractices being confirmed at one Polling Station. The Commissioner declared the results of No. 47 Polling Station at P/ Nayakkarchenai Tamil Vidyalya in the Puttalam Polling Station (Puttalam District) null and void and ordered a re-poll in that station. CMEV welcomed the decision of the Commissioner of Elections and reiterates that it will serve as a strong precedent and effective deterrent against future electoral irregularities and malpractice. CMEV deployed a special team to monitor the re-poll and recorded 12 incidents of election related violence on the day of the re poll.

Introduction

The Provincial Council Elections for the Central and North Western Provinces were held on 14th February 2009. They were won by the UPFA which polled 59.53% of the votes in the Central Province and 69.43% of the votes in the North Western Province. Consequently the UPFA obtained 36 of the 58 seats in the Central Provincial Council and the UNP got 22 seats. In North Western Province, the UPFA obtained 37, the UNP 14 seats and the JVP 01 seat. Voter turnout in both provinces was 60%.

The two Provincial Councils were dissolved on 25th December 2008 before their respective terms expired. The reason for the dissolution advanced by the Governors of the respective Provinces was that the Councils were unable to function or carry out programmes because of a lack of a clear legislative majority in support of the executive.

The elections were held against the backdrop of the war against the LTTE. The ruling UPFA coalition insisted on the importance of this, of the military campaign being at a crucial stage and of receiving a renewed mandate to bring the war to a successful conclusion. The opposition UNP on the other hand focused on the economy and on provincial development issues. The election campaign was also fought in the aftermath of the breakup of the JVP into two factions and the subsequent allegations and counter-allegations that followed.

Methodology

Throughout the campaign period, CMEV deployed 42 monitors in the electoral divisions of the two provinces. On Election Day, CMEV deployed 650 stationary monitors and 57 mobile monitoring teams, in the areas identified as "prone to violence". CMEV monitored 1295 (51%) Polling Stations out of the total number of 2541 Polling Stations in the two provinces.

CMEV also monitored the Postal Vote which was held on 2nd and 3rd February, 2009. This took place across 941 Polling Centres in both provinces. Of this number, CMEV monitors observed the postal vote in 187 Polling Centres.

Issues and Incidents

a) Campaign

During the campaign, CMEV recorded a cumulative total of 120 incidents of which 70 have been classified as major and 50

as minor. Though a relatively lower level of incidents of election related violence was seen in the Central province, the North – Western province showed an escalation in incidents at the end of the campaign [Refer chart 01 for Pre and Election Day related incidents].

b) The Election Day

On Election Day, CMEV received 175 complaints of election violence. However, major incidents of physical violence were not reported on Election Day. A significant issue that has been reported from a number of polling stations was that of voters being unable to exercise their right to vote as they were not in possession of the required identification documents.

b.1) Deprivation of Vote due to Lack of Identification

The Election Secretariat informed the public that in addition to the National Identity Card (NIC), voters could produce passports, postal IDs, valid driving licenses and railway season tickets. Temporary identification documents authorized by the Divisional Secretariats, Bhikku IDs and Senior Citizen IDs issued by the Social Services Department were also to be considered as valid documentation for voter identification purposes. Though the Elections Secretariat had instructed all Assistant Returning Officers (ARO) and SPOs at Polling Stations not to allow any person to vote who did not present an authorized identity document, this was not effectively communicated to the election officials at Polling Stations. As a consequence, a large number of voters were deprived of their right to vote, recognized under Article 14(1) (g) of the Constitution – the right to freedom of speech and expression including publication. c) The Media

The media has a crucial role in providing voters with the information they require to make informed choices. Accordingly, the Election Commissioner issued a list of ethical standards to be adhered to by the media. Sadly however, adherence to these standards was, by and large, not forthcoming.


Statistics

CMEV focused its monitoring on election related malpractices, irregularities and incidents of electoral violence in two phases:

- a. In the run-up to Polling Day
- b. Election Day

Chart 01 below depicts the incidents of (a) and (b) above. There were no reported and confirmed cases under the post election phase.

Observations and Recommendations

1. The high percentage of disfranchisement of voters could be on the one hand, due to the ignorance of public regarding the identification documents and on the other, the inefficiency and the irresponsibility of the Government officials, particularly the Divisional Secretariats, made the problem more complicated.

Most of the Plantation Tamil community relied on the temporary IDs authorized by the *Grama Sevaka* but ultimately found that they could not exercise their vote without the authorization of the Divisional Secretariat.

Therefore the public and also the government officials must be properly and specifically informed on the procedures agreed upon with regard to Voter Identification requirements in order to avoid the repetition of the problem in future.

2. CMEV continuously highlighted the issue of misuse of public property and urged the Election Commissioner and IGP to arrest the situation which could directly affect the outcome of the poll, but no effective measures were taken against it.

CMEV urges the Election Commissioner to consider this as a matter of urgency and to exercise the full gamut of powers vested in him to protect the integrity of poll.

- 3. The Seventeenth Amendment to the Constitution heralded as a measure taken to strengthen the framework for good governance through the establishment of the independent commissions must be implemented forthwith. This entails the appointment of members to the vacant positions in the Constitutional Council and the establishment of independent commissions for the Police, Elections and the Public Service amongst others. By facilitating the independence of the officials and agencies of the State charged with responsibilities in the conduct of elections, the establishment of the commissions will go a long way in ensuring the integrity of the electoral process.
- 4. Given the charges of bias leveled against the state owned and controlled media during the campaign, it was regrettable that the election commissioner's actions against it were ineffective. According to the 17th amendment empowers the commissioner to control the media and CMEV urges the commissioner to proactively employ the powers in the course of the campaign as the guidelines are not strictly adhered in most of the instances

Media Communiqué 01

22nd January 2009, Colombo, Sri Lanka: The Centre for Monitoring Election Violence (CMEV) will be monitoring the upcoming Provincial Council Elections on 14 February 2009 in the Central and North - Western Provinces. We would like to inform all the political parties, independent groups and other relevant parties that CMEV hopes to adopt the same methodology and practices we employed in earlier monitoring of elections.

After completing preparatory work related to monitoring, CMEV has trained and posted 42 electoral division monitors in the field. Our operations centre is located in Colombo at the address noted above. CMEV will deploy 675 polling centre monitors and about 40 mobile monitoring teams to cover at least 70% of polling stations in the two Provinces.

CMEV solicits the full corporation from political parties, independent groups and other relevant parties to conduct impartial and fruitful monitoring exercise.

CMEV has confirmed 21 election violence related incidents up to 22nd January 2009. This is relatively low in comparison to previous Provincial Council elections. Political parties, groups and other responsible authorities need to ensure that violent trends do not increase in the lead up to and on Election Day. CMEV also notes that those in power must disallow the use of public property for campaigning and electioneering.

Insisting upon proper voter identification at the polling stations by the Elections Commissioner will minimise opportunities for malpractices. But the illiterate voters especially among the estate workers may not have a clear understanding of the notice of the Election Commissioner. Field reports from our monitors indicate that the exhibition of the notice of Election commissioner at public places where the estate workers are living is not just sufficient. We call upon the Grama Niladharies [GN] and Estate Superintendents to take immediate steps to protect the voting rights of them.

In response to our inquiries, the Assistant Elections Commissioner in Nuwara Eliya said that steps had been taken to issue 2000 temporary identity cards. He also noted that there were nearly 28,000 people in Nuwara Eliya District without identity cards. The Deputy Elections Commissioner in Kandy told CMEV that 81,000 people in the Kandy District were without identity cards. He went on to say that after informing Estate Superintendents and the GN on this matter, he had issued 60,000 application forms to field workers to be distributed amongst people to obtain temporary identity cards. A spokesman from the Elections Office in Matale noted that upon inspection, it was found that around 26,000 people did not have the identity cards. In light of this, they had issued 4,000 application forms.

However the exact number of people who applied for temporary identity cards could only be ascertained after the closing date of applications. CMEV reiterate that it is the responsibility of the political parties and the civil society organizations in the area to make them aware on the matter and to direct them to relevant agencies to obtain temporary identity cards. This needs to be addressed as a matter of priority.


Central and North-Western Provincial Council Elections Media Communiqué No.02 06th February, 2009.

CMEV received 75 election related complaints since the beginning of nomination on 24th December 2008 up to 6th February, 2009.

Of the total complaints, CMEV categorized 45 (60%) complaints as major incidents and the rest 30 (40%) as minor incidents.

Major incidents include 3 grievous hurts, 11 hurts, 16 assaults, 9 threats and intimidations, 2 robberies and 4 arsons.

Election Related Complaints



Of the total 75 complaints, 44 reported from Central province and the balance 31 from North Western province. District wise Puttalam (16) and Kandy (16) each account for the highest number of incidents followed by Kurunegala 15, Nuwara Eliya 14 and Matale 14.

CMEV is concerned about gradual escalation of election related violence from a peaceful condition prevailed at the beginning of the election campaign.

Chart no.2 shows clearly the increase of violence from the beginning of the nomination to date.



CMEV recognizes the increasing number of attacks, grievous hurts, threat and intimidations as an impediment to conduct the forthcoming election in a free and fair manner.

North - Western Province. *Kurunegala District*.

Of the 15 incidents reported from Kurunegala district UPFA is accused of 14 incidents and the UNP is accused of one

incident. It is reported that the supporters of UPFA candidate Chandana Prasad Yapa (Preference no 26) are directly involved in three incidents and further more these incidents took place in Katugampola electoral division of Kurunegala district.

In addition UPFA candidates Tikiri Banda Adikari (preference no.04) and Nimal Karunatilaka (Preference no.03) are accused of one complaint each.

Puttalam District.

Of the 16 complaints reported from Puttalam district, 9 complaints are against UPFA and the UNP is accused of one incident. There are 6 incidents against unidentified groups. UPFA candidate K. Sanath Nishantha Perera (preference no.12) is accused of 2 incidents and the UNP candidate A. O. Ali Khan(preference no 6) is accused of one incident.

In addition the Deputy Minister of Livestock Mr. K. Bhais is accused of two incidents and CMEV found from its investigations that the minister and his supporters are becoming the focal point of election related violence in Puttalam district. CMEV observes that the behavior of the Deputy Minister will affect the self - determination of the police in the area to exercise its duties fairly and impartially.

Central Province *Kandy District*.

CMEV received 16 election related violent incidents from Kandy district and 10 of them are against UPFA. UNP is accused of one incident and 5 are against unidentified parties.

Of the total number of complaints against UPFA three candidates, Nishantha Subhasiri (preference no.10) Dilum Amunugama (preference no 6) and Ananda Aluthgama (preference no 7)are responsible to one complaint each.

Matale District

CMEV received 14 election related violent incidents from Matale district and 08 of them are against UPFA and 6 are against unidentified parties.

Of the total number of complaints against UPFA candidate, Pramitha Bandara Tennakoon (preference no.10) was directly accused in two incidents. Non cabinet Minister of Urban Development and Sacred Area Development, Rohana Dissanayake and his supporters were accused in one incident.

Nuwara Eliya.

UPFA is responsible for 11 complaints received from Nuwara Eliya. UNP and JVP are responsible to one complaint each

while one complaint is against an unidentified party. Of the 3 complaints against UPFA candidates, supporters of Nimal Piyatissa (preference no 18) Shantha Kumara Dasanayake (preference no 5) and W G Ranasinghe (preference no 3) are accused of one incident each. In addition, Minister for Youth and Socio-economic Development Mr. Arumugam Thondaman and his supporters are accused of two incidents. UNP candidate Digambaran (preference no 9) and his supporters are responsible for one incident, it is alleged.

Misuse of Public Resources.

The use of public resources by UPFA for its election campaign is observed at a high level in this election also.

It is confirmed by an investigation carried out by CMEV in Kurunegala district that two double cabs numbered WP TD-2271, WP HI2766 and a van numbered 252-6010 belonging to Nation Building Ministry are used by UPFA candidate Ms. Manjula Dissanayaka (preference no.33). CMEV has confirmed information that UPFA candidate Ms. Somakumari Tennakone (preference no.11) is using the vehicle no. 53-6116 belonging to Nikaweratiya Pradeshiya Sabha for her election campaign.

CMEV expresses its concerns and the condemnation that even though the UNP and the JVP reported these incidents of abuses of public resources with detailed information to the government and to the media the authorities did not responded with any degree of responsibility. Mr. Ajith Wasantha Kumara, Magistrate, Kurunegala has ordered the Police to detain 03 vehicles and **UPFA** supporters as they were canvassing in an unruly manner **and** obstructing the functions of the **C**ourt.

CMEV field monitors also report that the Police usually do not take **action** against such **violations of the law**, despite receiving many complaints.

22nd January 2009, Colombo, Sri Lanka: As the provincial council election campaign draws to an end, at 12.00 hrs. on February 13, CMEV received 110 incidents of election related violence.

Of the total number of incidents reported 70 are from the Central province. North Western reported 40 cases. On district basis 31 incidents are reported from Kandy, 21 from Matale, 18 from Nuwara Eliya, 22 from Kurunegala and 18 from Puttlam.

CMEV observes that the relatively peaceful situation prevailed at the beginning of the election campaign deteriorated into violence which may not conducive to hold free and fair election on February 14.

There is a noticeable increase of assaults, inflicting injuries, intimidations and threats, robberies and arson. CMEV firmly

believes that the emerging situation will not be helpful in anyway to conduct the election in a peaceful and impartial manner.

Of the 92 complaints received by CMEV 62 are against UPFA, 6 against UNP and 2 against JVP and 22 complaints are against unidentified political parties or individuals.

It is interesting to note that there are 12 complaints made by UPFA candidates against their own group. UPFA made 6 complaints against UNP, 2 against JVP and 7 against unidentified parties and groups. Serious competition among UPFA candidates for preference votes contributes to the increase of complaints against their own party members.

UNP made 30 complaints against UPFA and one against their own candidates. There are 5 more complaints against unidentified parties and groups.

JVP made 18 complaints against UPFA and 7 against unidentified parties and groups.

Therefore CMEV requests all political parties and independent groups to take immediate steps to arrest this situation. CMEV also believes that the Police and other concern institutions will take necessary actions to strictly implement the election law.

CMEV received confirmation from Assistance Election commissioners that they are processing to issue temporary identity cards and already issued 59010 temporary identity Cards and already issued 59010 temporary identity Cards and Already issued 15,653 in Kandy district, 5,000 in Matale district, 11,577 in Nuwara Eliya 20,750 in Kurunegala, 6,030 in Putlam district.

CMEV emphasize that the manipulation of the media during the election campaign by the ruling party to its advantage is a clear violation of election laws.

We have already completed preparatory arrangements to monitor the election and will deploy 645 one day monitors to cover the election. In addition we will appoint 32 mobile monitors and 45 field monitors to cover at least 70% of polling booths.

We request all parties concern to extend their cooperation and support to our monitors to carry out their duties without any obstacle.

Following telephone numbers at CMEV are available throughout the Election Day for voters, political parties and independent groups to report any information of election related violence.

The Centre for Monitoring Election Violence (CMEV) is monitoring the Provincial Council Elections in the Central and North-Western Provinces. CMEV has deployed 42 field monitors, 650 day monitors and 57 mobile teams for the process of Election Day monitoring in the 40 polling divisions of the 2 provinces. CMEV will be present for the entire duration of polling at 650 polling stations while the mobile teams will visit 855 polling stations. By the end of election day, CMEV will have visited at least 50% of the polling centers.

Initial reports from CMEV monitors indicate that there have been no major incidents of violence since the polls opened at 07.00 a.m. Voter turn-out during the first five hours was approximately 40%. There have been some violations of election law including campaigning after the campaign period was officially over and at least one incident of voter impersonation. A significant issue that has been reported from a number of polling stations is that of voters being unable to exercise their franchise as they did not possess the required identification.

Assault of a candidate

Hiriyala Polling Division, Kurunegala District: At around 3.00 am at Melsiripura Kumbukwewa road, Ganegama, supporters of the UPFA candidate Manjula Dissanayake (preference no.33) had assaulted UPFA candidate A. Don Kamal Indika (preference no.10) and the victim was admitted to the Hiripitiya Rural Hospital. He has since been discharged. The police informed a complaint was made at the Wellawa police station (complaint no. EIB/30/26).

Campaigning continuing despite end of campaign period

Naththandiya Polling Division, Puttalam District: At around 6.15 am posters of the UPFA North Western Provincial Council Candidate Jude Sumal Tissera were pasted at School Building at Ihala Katuneriya St. Jude Church Premises within 500 meters to the polling station no 27.

Vennappuwa Polling Division, Puttalam District: At around 8.50 am at the Chilaw/ Lunuwila Roman Catholic Kanista Vidyalaya Kirimatiyana North polling station no 43, a large sum of hand bills with the JVP "bell" symbol had been found in front of the gate of the said polling centre.

Vennappuwa Division, Puttalam District: At around 8.20 am at the Chilaw/Lunuwila Buddhist Kanista Vidyalaya Polling Centre no 6, a large sum of small hand bills of UPFA candidates L.Kalana Geesara (preference no.10) and L.K . Jagath Priyankara had been found in front of this polling station.

Raththota Polling Station, Matale District: At around 9.00 am CMEV monitor witnessed three supporters of UPFA candidate D.M.P.K.B. Dissanayake (preference no. 09) attempting to influence voters close to the election centre 26 at Ukuwela Ajmeer Government Muslim Vidyalaya.

Kundasale Polling Division, Kandy District: At around 7.30 am a group of UNP supporters had distributed UNP leaflets from a vehicle at polling Station no 06, at Mahawatte Maha Vidyalaya, Yakgehinna.

Puttalam Polling Division, Puttalam District: A large sum of hand bills containing the elephant symbol of UNP candidates Chandrasena Sirimanna (preference no 13) and Duglous Indika Senadira (preference no 19) were distributed in front of the gate of the Daluwa Saint Anthony's Maha Vidyalaya Polling Centre no 48 at around 8.20am.

Maskeliya Polling Division, Nuwara Eliya District: S.P.O. M.D Dasanayaka reported that a vehicle with stickers of UNP candidate Gurusinghe Aarachchige Piyasiri Gurusinghe (preference no 6) was stationed within the premises of the polling centre No. 87. Kalukale Vidyalaya, Kalukale for about 20 minutes at 8.20 am.

Voter impersonation

Theldeniya Polling Division, Kandy District: CMEV monitor was informed that at polling station no 29, Dunhinna Maha Vidyalaya Hall no 2 the vote of Kadirawelu (756444360V) had been allegedly cast by an imposter.

Inability to vote as a result of not having the required identification

CMEV monitors were informed by a number of voters that they had been unable to cast their vote due to their nonpossession of a national Identity card or any of the seven other relevant documents that the Election Commissioner declared could be used as a legitimate form of identification in order to be eligible to vote. The polling officers seem to have taken the appropriate action of not allowing the individuals to vote due to the lack of appropriate documentation. Nonetheless, the number of incidents highlights the lack of awareness among the voting public - an issue which CMEV has repeatedly pointed to. CMEV was reported the following incidents:

Senkadagala Polling Division, Kandy District: The CMEV monitor reported that at 8.10 am a voter was not allowed to vote due to not holding a valid identification card at, Electorate, Polling Station No 14. Mahamaya Vidyalaya. Kandy Polling Division, Kandy District: CMEV field monitor at Polling Station No. 4, Kingswood College, Kandy reported that two persons were not permitted to cast their vote due to them not possessing valid identification cards.

Harispaththuwa Division, Kandy District: Around 9 am the CMEV monitor reported that four persons could not cast their vote due to not having valid identification cards at Polling Station No. 26, at the Pradeshiya Sabha Office, Thiththapajjawa.

Laggala Polling Division, Matale District: CMEV monitors reported that 6 persons could not cast their vote due to not holding valid identification cards at Polling Station No 28, Bobella Government Primary School.

Hanguranketha Polling Division, Nuwara Eliya District: According to CMEV monitor, three persons could not cast their vote due to not having valid identification cards at Polling Station No 34, Thiyathilaka Madya Maha Vidyalaya – Udumalugama, Hall 2. Three other persons were turned away as they did not having valid identification cards at Polling Station No 33, Thiyathilaka Madya Maha Vidyalaya – Hall 1. One person did not carry identification at all while the other two only had expired drivers licenses. Around 7.30 am at Dholugala Primary School, Polling Station no 31 two voters were not allowed to vote because they did not have their relevant identification documents.

Dambulla Polling Division, Matale District: SPO informed CMEV that around 7.50 san at AMillawana Governman Seven Vidyalaya, Polling Station_{CO}no_{CO}Noter who had a photograph certified by the Grama Sevake was not allowed to cast his vote as he did not have the identity card certified by the Assistant election commissioner

Disparity between numbers of ID card and ballot card

Kandy District, Udunuwara Electorate, Polling Station No 19, Cultural Centre: Around 8.30 am CMEV monitor reported that a voter was turned away due to disparity in numbers on the identification card with those on the ballot card.

Kotmale Polling Division, Kandy District: At 8.20am the SPO at Polling Station_No 6. Kumbal Oluwa Vidyalaya, Kumbaloluwa, did not permit a voter named Mahinda Wijeratne to cast his vote as the voter's National Identification Card number did not match the number given on his ballot card.

Media Communiqué 06

The Centre for Monitoring Election Violence (CMEV) monitored the Provincial Council Elections in the Central and North-Western Provinces. CMEV deployed 42 field monitors, 650 day monitors and 57 mobile teams for the process of Election Day monitoring in the 40 polling divisions of the 2 provinces. CMEV was present for the entire duration of polling at 650 polling stations while the mobile teams visited 855 polling stations. By the end of Election Day CMEV had visited at least 50% of the polling centers.

There was a low incidence of violence in the Central and North-Western Provincial Council elections. Consequently, the integrity of the overall polls was not affected by electoral violence. Particular violations in specific polling centres however raised serious concerns for CMEV. There have been a few major incidents at particular polling stations including the threat and intimidation of voters, assault, threat and assault of police officers and government servants serving as party polling agents.

CMEV also continues to note with concern the problems associated with voter identity documentation resulting in the effective disenfranchisement of voters. Given the recurrence of the problem, the parties, relevant officials and monitors associated with the election need to collaborate and agree upon effective ways of ensuring that this is not repeated in forthcoming elections.

CMEV has supported the use of the National Identity Card for voter identification and therefore calls for the expedient issue of National Identity Cards. CMEV and its constituent members have advocated and litigated on this matter. This issue needs to be speedily addressed in light of elections in the near future.

Further, CMEV reiterates its repeated call for the full implementation of the Seventeenth Amendment to the Constitution, which provides for the establishment of independent commissions for elections and the police, an issue that has been continuously advocated and litigated by CMEV and its constituent members.

CMEV has recorded 172 incidents as of 6pm today February 14. Of these, 5 major have been classified as major offences

and 167 as minor offences. In the Central Province Kandy recorded the highest number of offences (54), followed by Matale (28) and Nuwara Eliya (19), while in the North Western Province Puttalm (41) recorded a higher number of violations than Kurunegala (30).

Reports from CMEV monitors indicate that there have been no major incidents of violence since the polls closed at 04.00 p.m.

CMEV has observed that there was a 60% voter turnout during the voting period today.

CMEV is concerned with the violence during the campaign period, specifically during the last two weeks leading up to election day. CMEV noted of 45 major incidents and 30 minor incidents in its press release No. 2, dated 6 February. On 13 February, a bus (no 30-2531) belonging to UPFA candidate Mr. H.M.D Herath (candidate No. 22) in Kurunagala district was burnt in front of his house by an unidentified group. CMEV was informed by the candidate that he had received calls monitoring his movements prior to this incident.

An illustrative sample of the incidents of violence and the violations of election laws reported by CMEV monitors is provided below.

Threat and intimidation of voters

Gampola Electorate, Mahanuwara District: At 3.40 p.m. at Atabage Ihalagama Junior School No 35, sixty UNP supporters who had arrived to cast their votes were intimidated by the supporters of the UPFA Candidates Nissanka Herath and Ananda Aluthgamage. CMEV monitors had witnessed this incident. Police election monitoring mobile team from Pussallawa Police Station (vehicle bearing number plate 61-5678), had arrived at the scene but had not intervened. When the CMEV referred the matter to Pussallawa Police Station they had reported of receiving a phone call through 119 regarding the matter and stated that they had visited the site but that there had been no problem. Further, the police stated that the two numbers in the licence plate given by CMEV were incorrect.

Assault

Dambulla Polling Division, Matale District: CMEV was informed by the UNP candidate Ashoka Bandara Tennekoon (No 7), that his driver who was in a car (no.302 - 0405) belonging to the candidate, was assaulted by a group supporting UPFA candidate Pramitha Bandara Tennekoon, in front of the Dambulla Rajaye Maha Vidyalaya Hall no. 2 Polling Centre no. 72. No police complaint was made.

Threats and assault of police officers

Puttalam Polling Division, Puttalam District: Between 10 am and 11am a large group of UPFA supporters had gathered outside the Fathima Balika Vidyala Polling Station Polling Centre Nos. 31 and 32 and attempted to enter the Polling station to cast their vote. The police had intervened and dispersed the crowd, asking them to vote individually. Deputy Minister K.A. Baiz who had arrived at the scene had threatened and assaulted a police officer present at the scene. There is no police report on this incident. CMEV spoke to eyewitnesses to corroborate the story.

Public officials serving as polling agents for political parties

Mawathagama Polling Division, Kurunegala District: A UNP supporter N.P Karunadhasa complained that two Samurdhi Officers of Ihala Waligepola from Sinhapura Grama Niladari division (Mawathagama) and from Akard Grama Niladhari division (Mawathagama) were working as polling agents in the polling station No 7 Paragahadeniya Muslim Maha Vidyalaya. The former was nominated by the UPFA and the latter by Sri Lanka Progressive Front. CMEV confirmed that these two individuals are Samurdhi Officers and that they were functioning as polling agents.

Continued campaigning during polling

Puttlam Electorate, Puttlam District: CMEV monitor reported that at around 9.00 am a black colour cab and two motorcycles belonging to UPFA candidate Thahir (candidate no 16) traveled back and forth close to the polling station no 49, Puttlam Nawakkaduwa Tamil Vidyalaya, which had stickers bearing his candidate number 16. The vehicles were visible to voters. The cab carried four of his supporters while the motor cycles had two supporters each.

Chilaw Polling Station, Puttlam District: CMEV monitors observed leaflets containing UPFA candidate Janaka Soysa (candidate no 14) carrying his candidate number and political party in close proximity to Polling Station no. 15, Kurukkupane Tamil Vidyalaya, Chilaw.

Maskeliya Polling Division, Nuwara Eliya District: The CMEV mobile team reported that leaflets supporting UPFA candidate Wimalie Karunaratne (preference no. 18) were found in the vicinity of Mahinda Maha Vidyalaya Polling Centre no.68 at around 12 noon.

Inability to vote as a result of not having the required identification

As stated in the communiqué No 5, CMEV monitors were informed by a number of voters of their inability to exercise their franchise. The initial communiqué highlighted a number of incidents where voters had been unable to cast their vote as they did not posses a National Identity Card or any of the seven other relevant documents that the Election Commissioner had declared could be used as a legitimate form of identification in order to be eligible to vote. CMEV monitors observed that polling officers had taken appropriate action of not allowing individuals to vote when specified documentation was not presented. Nonetheless, the number of incidents highlights the lack of awareness among the voting public - an issue which CMEV has repeatedly pointed to. There were a number of incidents particularly from Matale district where voters attempted to use photographs signed by GSs but were not accepted by the Senior Presiding Officers (SPOs). This also suggests that key government officials may also lack awareness as to the legitimate forms of identification or that they have not adequately informed potential voters of the process for obtaining documentation, resulting in the disenfranchisement of voters.

Matale Polling Division, Matale District: At around 2pm, 15 voters were not permitted to vote at the Aluwihara Rajamaha Vihara Polling Centre no.18 despite the fact that they produced documents certified by GS and a local Justice of Peace.

At 1.40 pm 5 voters were not permitted to vote at the Aluwihara Rajamaha Vihara Polling Centre no. 17 as they did not have valid identification documents. They had produced a photograph certified by the GS.

At 1.50 pm 4 voters who arrived at the Matale Government Hindu Maha Vidyalaya Hall no.2 Polling Centre no.20 were not allowed to vote as they produced passports which had expired.

At around 1.20 pm 16 people were not permitted to vote at Mahawela D.M Gunaratne Government Maha Vidyalaya Polling Centre No. 39 as they had submitted only photographs certified by the GS.

Rattota Polling Division, Matale District: At around 12.45 pm 8 people at Old Dehideniya Government Primary School Polling Centre no. 39 were not permitted to vote because they produced photographs certified by the GS and passports which had expired. At around 12.45 pm 5 people were not allowed to vote at Navaratnagoda Pagngnarama Maha Vidyalaya Polling Centre no. 40 as they were not in possession of valid identification documents and had only produced photographs certified by the GS.

At around 1.20 pm, 5 people at Pitakanda No. 1 Government Tamil Primary School Polling Centre no. 52, were not allowed to vote as they were not in possession of valid identification documents and had only produced photographs certified by the GS.

Kurunegala Electorate, Kurunegala District: 20 persons were not allowed to vote at Pimburuwellagama Madya Maha Vidyalaya Polling Station no 10 as they only had photographs certified by the GS.

<u>Re - polling at Naykkarchenai Tamil Vidyalaya</u> <u>polling station</u>

Repoll in Nayakkarchenai Tamil Maha Vidyalaya (Polling Centre no-47) in the Puttalam Polling Division started at 7.00 am today. CMEV has deployed a station monitor and a mobile team to monitor the re-poll. Approximately 62% of the 1,195 voters (741) had cast their ballot by 14.00 hrs.

CMEV field reports indicate a tense situation prevails in the area due to presence of a large number of supporters and candidates. Several police personnel have been deployed both within the polling centre and in the vicinity (including 500 meters away from premises) of the centre.

No media persons have been allowed into the polling station. The Senior Presiding Officer (SPO) has the discretionary power to permit media access.

Voters are being transported

CMEV observers report that voters are being transported by UPFA supporters in vehicles.CMEV observers reported, at 9.15 am a white coloured dolphin van (62-5427) is transporting voters to polling station. The van has a flag of Naina Thambi Marikkar Mohamed Thahir of UPFA (preference no 16). CMEV received reports that the police had warned the vehicle driver after which the vehicle and all the documents had been taken into police charge. The vehicle was parked close to the polling station from 9.12 am to 12.15 pm by the police after which it was released. When CMEV contacted the Police, ASP I.B.T.Sugathapala confirmed that the police had issued a warning to the vehicle listed above and that the van had driven away immediately.

CMEV also observed voters are still being transported by vehicles including a cream coloured cab (51-3189) with stickers of Amal Chintaka Mayadunne of UPFA (preference no 05) beyond the 500 meter limit.

Other incidents

Amal Chintaka Mayadunne of UPFA (preference no 05) travelling in a Suzuki swift car (NW KS – 3313) and Naina Thambi Marikkar Mohamed Thahir of UPFA (preference no 16) traveling in a double cab (WP PE – 6833) had stickers of the candidates and were circling in areas close to the polling station at around 7.20 am

CMEV monitors report, large number of people who do not appear to be voters are gathering in various locations at Nayakkarchenai Junction, Karambe . As of 12.00 pm, the police is attempting to disperse the crowds who continue to gather.

CMEV urges the authorities to ensure that steps are taken to prevent the types of incidents highlighted above including campaigning during polling, transportation of voters by parties and the gathering of crowds which could affect the outcome of the poll. CMEV stresses that it is the responsibility of the election officials, police and the candidates to ensure a free and fair poll and most importantly, one in which the integrity of the electoral process is protected and in no way affected.

Repoll in Nayakkarchenai Tamil Maha Vidyalaya (Polling Centre no-47) in the Puttalam Polling Division concluded at 4.00 pm. CMEV deployed a station monitor and a mobile team to monitor the re-poll.

CMEV reports that 68% of the 1,195 voters (816) had cast their ballot by 16.00 hrs. While there were no major incidents of violence during the re-poll, CMEV recorded a number of election- related offences including campaigning during polling, transportation of voters by parties, an individual case of voter impersonation and the gathering of crowds which could affect the outcome of the poll.

Campaigning during Polling

CMEV observers report that UPFA candidate A.H.M. Riyaz (preference no 2) stood by the entrance to the polling station and attempted to influence voters by asking to vote for him during the last ten minutes of the poll.

Voter Impersonation

During the last few minutes of the polling an individual attempted voter impersonation was prevented from doing so. He was arrested by the Puttalam Police and is in police custody. Puttalam Police OIC, U.A. Piyaseeli Fernando confirmed this incident.

CMEV welcomed the decision taken by the Commissioner of Election to declare the poll held at P/Nayakkarchenai Tamil Vidyalaya held on February 14 null and void and to re-poll. During its monitoring of the last provincial council elections, including Eastern, North Central and Sabaragamuwa, North Western and Central provinces CMEV has raised a number of concerns including

- The disenfranchisement of voters due to problems with identification documents
- Misuse of public property by candidates during the campaign

• Biased media print and electronic coverage on State media

While CMEV calls on the Election Commissioner to take steps to prevent and remedy these problems in upcoming polls, CMEV firmly believes that a key measure to ensure that effective action to prevent and address these violations can take place only if the 17th Amendment to the Constitution is implemented immediately.
