SAMPLE INTERVIEW QUESTIONS FOR INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS/SCHOLARS

Some questions to get you started on your interview. Not all questions may be appropriate. Choose at your own discretion and add your own:

- 1. How did you choose to come to the U.S.?
- 2. How long have you been in the U.S.?
- 3. What do you like the most/the least about the U.S?
- 4. What do you miss the most about your home country?
- 5. What has been the most academically challenging portion of your immersion experience in the U.S.?
- 6. What are the biggest differences you see between the university experience here and in your home country?
- 7. What other facets of this experience have been challenging?
- 8. Can you describe a situation in which you felt it necessary to be an ambassador for your country? For example, has there been a situation in which you needed to clarify erroneous stereotypes or assumptions about your home culture? How did you handle that situation?
- 9. What is the general perception of the U. S. in your home country? Are those perceptions correct? In your opinion, what are U.S.'s greatest strengths and weaknesses?
- 10. Has your experience here helped you gain an appreciation for how the world is interconnected on all levels (environmental, socio-cultural, and geopolitical)? If so, can you cite specific examples?
- 11. Has your experience here helped you gain an ability to communicate effectively within and among diverse cultural groups? If so, can you cite specific examples?
- 12. Has your experience here helped you learn to respect cultural differences? If so, can you cite specific examples?
