The assessment grid can help an organization identify areas of strength and areas needing improvement, measure changes in capacity over time, and draw out different views within an organization regarding its capacity. Areas that are assessed include:

- Strategies
- Organizational skills
- Human resources
- Systems and infrastructure
- Organizational structure
