CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cleveland Cavaliers return to Quicken Loans Arena to begin a three-game homestand, starting tonight against the Washington Wizards. This is the third of four regular season matchups between the two teams. The teams have split the first two games with each defending home court.
- Including tonight's contest, 10 of Cleveland's next 13 games will take place at The Q, where they also defeated the Wizards 116-101 on Dec. 8. The Cavs led by as many as 29 points that night, while shooting 47-89 (.528) from the field and connecting on a season high 15 three-pointers (15-31, .484). Cleveland also outrebounded the Wizards 49-33 and dished out 26 assists with only nine turnovers. **TRISTAN THOMPSON** recorded a double-double with a season-best 23 points (11-18 FG), a game-high 19 rebounds, a career-high tying five assists and two blocks in 42 minutes, while **COLLIN SEXTON** posted a career-high tying 29 points (13-23 FG), three rebounds, a career-high six assists and two steals in 40 minutes.
- COLLIN SEXTON** has scored over 20 points in both meetings against the Wizards this season, averaging 26.5 points on .564 (22-39) shooting, including .500 (5-10) from three-point range, 3.0 rebounds and 4.0 assists in 37.0 minutes per game.
- CAREER MILESTONES: CHANNING FRYE** (3,991 REB) is 9 rebounds away from 4,000 for his career. **JORDAN CLARKSON** (1,977 FGM) needs to make 23 more field goals to reach 2,000.
- On Sunday in Chicago, the Cavs grinded out a 104-101 victory over the Bulls that featured 14 ties and 23 lead changes. Cleveland dished out 26 assists on 39 made field goals (13 three-pointers), while committing only eight turnovers at Chicago. On the season, the Cavs have the 5th-lowest turnovers per game in the NBA at 13.6.
- The Cavs shot 13-15 (.867) from the free throw line in Sunday's win at Chicago. The Wine & Gold currently have the 8th-highest FT% in the NBA (.793) and three players ranked in the NBA's Top 30 in FT%: **RODNEY HOOD** (.918, 3rd in NBA), **COLLIN SEXTON** (.853, 25th in NBA) and **JORDAN CLARKSON** (.848, 28th in NBA). **Hood enters tonight's game with 35 consecutive made free throws (since 4Q of 12/18/18).**
- ALEC BURKS** had the game-winning put back with 17.0 seconds to go to seal the 104-101 victory for the Cavaliers over the Bulls. Burks shot 3-7 (.429) from three-point range and finished with a team-high tying 18 points, eight rebounds and two assists in 32 minutes. Burks has scored in double figures 18 times since being acquired by the Cavaliers, including in each of his last three appearances (since 1/23), which he is averaging 13.7 points, 8.0 rebounds, 3.7 assists, 1.0 steal and a .500 (6-12) clip from three-point range in 29.3 minutes per game.
- JORDAN CLARKSON** also tallied a team-high tying 18 points on 8-11 (.727) shooting, seven rebounds and a team-high six assists in 22 minutes off the bench against Chicago. **Clarkson has the most double-digit scoring performances among all NBA reserves (44 games) and ranks 3rd among all bench players with a career-best 16.5 PPG.**
- CEDI OSMAN** recorded 17 points, eight rebounds, two assists and two steals in 39 minutes at Chicago. Osman has scored in double figures in 32 contests this season. **Over his last five games (since 1/19), Osman is averaging 19.2 points (.523% FG%, .433% 3FG%), 4.6 rebounds, 2.4 assists and 1.4 steals in 34.7 minutes per game.**
- MATTHEW DELLAVEDOVA** contributed 16 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting, four rebounds and five assists in 22 minutes as a reserve against the Bulls. He has tallied nine double figure scoring games since joining the Cavs.
- ANTE ZIZIC** has scored in double-digits in 6 of his last 7 games, averaging 15.0 points on .568 (42-74) shooting and 9.1 rebounds in 30.8 minutes per game over that span (since 1/16). Against the Bulls on Sunday, Zizic posted career-highs of 14 rebounds and three assists to go along with eight points in 36 minutes of work.
- RODNEY HOOD** added 14 points, two assists and two steals in 31 minutes against Chicago. Hood has 31 double figure scoring games this season.

CAVALIERS 116, WIZARDS 101 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (12/8/18)

KEY PERFORMERS: Tristan Thompson recorded his 15th double-double of the season with a season-best 23 points on 11-18 (.611) shooting, a game-high 19 rebounds, a career-high tying five assists and two blocks in 42 minutes; It was his 3rd career 20-point, 15-rebound game (4/5/13 at BOS, 2/12/14 at DET); Thompson had 13 points and 11 rebounds in the 2nd quarter alone, securing a double-double in a single quarter for the first time in his career; The last Cavalier to tally a double-double in a single quarter was Anderson Varejao on 1/20/14 vs. DAL (4th quarter, 10 PTS & 11 REB); With his third rebound, Thompson passed Hot Rod Williams (4,669 REB) for 4th-most in franchise history...Collin Sexton finished with a career-high tying 29 points on 13-23 (.565) shooting, three rebounds, a career-high six assists and two steals in 40 minutes...Alec Burks contributed 14 points, a season-high tying seven rebounds, four assists and a steal in 34 minutes...Larry Nance Jr. chipped in 13 points on 4-7 (.571) shooting, including 2-3 (.667) from three-point range, seven rebounds, a career-high tying seven assists, one steal and a block in 27 minutes...Cedi Osman added 12 points, two rebounds, two assists and a block in 39 minutes...Jalen Jones tallied season-highs of 12 points on a career-best 4-4 (1.000) shooting from beyond the arc, three rebounds, a steal and a block in 14 minutes off the bench...In his first career start, Jaron Blossomgame recorded career-highs of six points and six rebounds in 20 minutes...For Washington, Bradley Beal had a team-high 27 points, four rebounds and five assists in 33 minutes...Otto Porter Jr. finished with 15 points on 6-10 (.600) shooting and seven rebounds in 29 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavs trailed 22-18 midway through the first quarter but went on a 31-4 run to go up 49-26 with 6:56 left in the second quarter.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Cleveland led by as many as 29 points, scoring 116 points on 47-89 (.528) from the field...The Wine & Gold set a season high for three-pointers made, shooting 15-31 (.484) from beyond the arc...The Cavaliers outrebounded the Wizards 49-33 and had at least six players score in double figures for the 12th time this season (Collin Sexton – 29, Tristan Thompson – 23, Alec Burks – 14, Larry Nance Jr. – 13, Jalen Jones – 12, Cedi Osman – 12)...The Cavs dished out a season-high tying 26 assists on 47 field goals made and had only nine turnovers.

KEY PERFORMERS: Collin Sexton poured in a career-high 24 points on 9-16 (.563) shooting, three rebounds and two assists in 34 minutes...David Nwaba chipped in 11 points on 5-8 (.625) shooting, a season-high seven rebounds, two steals and a block in 29 minutes...Larry Nance Jr. had 10 points on 3-4 (.750) shooting, six rebounds, a season-high tying five assists and a season-high four steals in 26 minutes...Rodney Hood tallied 10 points, two rebounds and two assists in 16 minutes...Andrew Harrison finished with 10 points on 3-5 (.600) shooting, four rebounds, two assists, two steals and one block in 19 minutes...Tristan Thompson had a near double-double with nine points, a game-high eight rebounds, two assists, two steals and a block in 19 minutes...For Washington, Bradley Beal tallied a team-high 20 points and three steals in 28 minutes...Otto Porter Jr. finished with 15 points on 7-11 (.636) shooting and four rebounds in 26 minutes...John Wall added eight points and a game-high nine assists in 21 minutes.

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James registered his 17th triple-double of the season (72nd of career) with a team-high tying 16 points, a game-high tying 13 rebounds and a game-high 12 assists in 39 minutes...Kevin Love recorded his 30th double-double of the season and 400th of his career with 13 points, a game-high tying 13 rebounds, one steal and one block in 36 minutes...J.R. Smith contributed 15 points on 6-11 (.545) shooting, going 3-6 (.500) from deep and four rebounds in 26 minutes off the bench...Jordan Clarkson tallied a team-high tying 16 points on 5-9 (.556) shooting and a game-high three steals in 25 minutes as a reserve...Harrison Barnes recorded a game-high 30 points on 10-19 (.526) shooting, including a 5-10 (.500) clip from distance, five assists and three rebounds in 36 minutes...Dennis Smith Jr. added 14 points, a team-high six assists and four rebounds in 33 minutes.

TURNING POINT: Cleveland trailed 81-77 early in the fourth quarter but went on a 19-2 run to go up 96-83.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Wine & Gold held Dallas to 32-80 (.400) shooting from the field and scored 15 points off 15 Mavericks turnovers...Cleveland connected on 11-26 (.423) shooting from beyond the arc...The Cavaliers bench combined for 45 points...Cleveland had an 11-2 edge in second chance points and outrebounded Dallas 50-38.

CAVALIERS 111, MAVERICKS 104 – AMERICAN AIRLINES CENTER – DALLAS, TX (11/11/17)

KEY PERFORMERS: Kevin Love posted his 9th double-double of the season with a game-high 29 points (15 in the 3rd Q) on 11-19 (.579) shooting, a 3-5 (.600) clip from deep, a game-high 15 rebounds, three assists and one block in 36 minutes...LeBron James also recorded a double-double, his 8th of the season, with 19 points, 11 rebounds, a team-high four assists and one block in 42 minutes...J.R. Smith shot 4-9 (.444) from three-point range and finished with 17 points, three rebounds, three assists and two steals in 38 minutes...Jae Crowder tallied 15 points, seven rebounds and three assists in 35 minutes...Kyle Korver added 13 points (all in the 4th Q) on 4-7 (.571) shooting, including 3-6 (.500) from beyond the arc, and three rebounds in 20 minutes off the bench...For Dallas, Harrison Barnes finished with a team-high 23 points and a team-high 12 rebounds in 39 minutes...Dennis Smith Jr tallied 21 points and a game-high seven assists in 30 minutes...Dirk Nowitzki had 14 points on 6-9 (.667) shooting and five rebounds in 25 minutes.

TURNING POINT: The Cavaliers used a 15-2 run in the third quarter to turn a two-point deficit (64-62) into an 11-point advantage (77-66). Cleveland outscored Dallas 34-22 in the third period and took a nine-point lead (83-74) into the fourth. The Cavaliers never trailed in the final period.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Five Cavs players scored in double figures...Cleveland connected on 12 three-pointers and shot 29-35 (.829) from the foul line...Defensively, the Cavs held Dallas to 39-92 (.424) shooting from the field and outrebounded them 53-42.

ON THE LINE: So far this season, the Cavs have the 8th-highest free throw percentage in the NBA at .793. Cleveland has three players ranked in the NBA's Top 30 in free throw percentage: RODNEY HOOD (.918, 3rd in NBA), COLLIN SEXTON (.853, 25th in NBA) and JORDAN CLARKSON (.848, 28th in NBA).

- .900 OR HIGHER:** The Cavs have shot at least .900 from the charity stripe on 10 occasions this season, their most in a single season. Their previous franchise record was 9 such games in 2017-18.

WELCOME BACK DELLY: After Cleveland acquired Matthew Dellavedova on Dec. 7, he scored in double-digits in each of his first 5 games (Dec. 10-16), the longest double figure scoring streak of his career. Over 22 games since returning, Dellavedova is averaging 8.4 points on .471 shooting from the field, .392 (29-74) from three-point range, .852 from the foul line, and 3.7 assists in 19.0 minutes per game.

LARRY'S CAREER YEAR: on the season, Larry Nance Jr. is averaging career highs in rebounds (7.4), assists (3.0) and steals (1.44), while putting up 8.6 points in 25.3 minutes per game. He recorded at least one steal in a career-high 15 consecutive games from Dec. 8-Jan. 5. During 15-game steal streak, he swiped two or more steals in 11 of the 15 games and totaled 33 steals over the streak.

- **AT THE BUZZER:** Nance Jr. had his first career game-winning buzzer beater with a tip-in at Indiana on Dec. 18, giving the Cavs a 92-91 victory.
- **HISTORIC END TO YEAR 2018:** Nance Jr. closed out 2018 with an historical night at Atlanta on 12/29. LET'S TALK ABOUT SEXTON: The Cavs' No. 8 pick of the 2018 NBA Draft, **Collin Sexton**, is off to a solid start this season. He is the only Cavalier to appear in all 51 games (41 starts) and is averaging **14.4 points (4th-best among rookies)**, 3.0 rebounds and **2.8 assists (4th among rookies)** in 29.6 minutes per game. He also leads all qualified rookies in free throw percentage (**.853**) and has scored in double-digits in **43 of 51** contests.

- **FIRST OF HIS CAREER:** At Oklahoma City on 11/28, Sexton recorded his **1st career double-double** with 21 points, a career-high 10 rebounds, three assists and one steal in 38 minutes. Sexton became the **first Cavs rookie to post at least 20 points and 10 rebounds in a game since March 19, 2012 when Tristan Thompson accomplished that feat** (27 PTS, 12 REB vs. Nets).
- **18 IN A ROW:** Sexton scored in double figures in **18 consecutive games from 11/7/18 to 12/12/18**, passing Dave Sorenson (17, 1/24/71 to 2/21/71) for the **6th-longest double-digit scoring streak by a Cavs rookie in team history** and was the longest since **LeBron James' 29 in 2003-04 season**. The only longest double figure scoring streaks for a Cavs rookie ahead of Sexton are the following: Ron Harper-69 (11/1/86 to 3/21/87), LeBron James-29 twice (12/9/03 to 2/9/04, 2/18/04 to 4/14/04), Austin Carr-29 (1/25/72-3/19/72) and Brad Daugherty-23 (1/23/87 to 3/12/87).

- **THE ONLY ONE:** Love is the **only player in NBA history to have a career average at least 10.0 rebounds and make 1,000 threes or more.** He has nailed 1,031 career three-pointers and owns a 11.3 rebound average.

CLEVELAND TO HOST NBA ALL-STAR 2022 AND COMMEMORATE THE LEAGUE'S 75th ANNIVERSARY

CLEVELAND, Nov. 1, 2018 – The NBA announced that Cleveland has been selected to host NBA All-Star 2022, when the league will be commemorating its 75th anniversary. The 71st NBA All-Star Game will take place at Quicken Loans Arena, home of the Cleveland Cavaliers, on Sunday, Feb. 20, 2022. The Cavaliers previously hosted NBA All-Star in 1997, when the NBA celebrated its 50th anniversary, and in 1981.

NBA Commissioner Adam Silver made the announcement on Nov. 1 during a press conference at Quicken Loans Arena, where he was joined by Cavaliers Chairman Dan Gilbert, Cavaliers and Quicken Loans Arena CEO Len Komoroski, Cleveland Mayor Frank G. Jackson, Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish and U.S. Representative, Eleventh Congressional District of Ohio, Marcia Fudge.

“Cleveland is a passionate sports city with a proven track record of hosting large-scale, global events,” said Silver. “We thank Dan Gilbert, Len Komoroski and the civic leaders for their commitment, and we look forward to a weeklong celebration of our game.”

With the current, large-scale arena renovations underway that will be completed in advance of NBA All-Star 2022, the game and extended activities in the transformed Quicken Loans Arena will offer fans an enhanced experience.

“We are proud to host NBA All-Star weekend in Cleveland in 2022,” said Gilbert. “We have been working with the NBA, the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County to deliver this iconic event to Northeast Ohio for the last couple of years. The transformation and new state-of-the-art Quicken Loans Arena was an important factor in the NBA’s decision to choose Cleveland for this exciting classic broadcast across the globe. The world will get to see the modern Cleveland and all of its diversity, innovation and promise for the future.”

“Along with the excitement and appreciation for the NBA selecting Cleveland and Quicken Loans Arena to host NBA All-Star 2022, we want to extend a big ‘thanks’ to our local partners at Destination Cleveland and the Greater Cleveland Sports Commission, and our City, County and Civic leaders,” said Komoroski. “Their support and energy to always demonstrate what we as a community do best is at the core of bringing these major events to our city. We have a great partnership that will deliver an experience fitting for the NBA All-Star global spotlight. We thank the NBA for their confidence in this collective group, and we will put forth the focus and commitment to ensure that the players, fans, corporate partners, media and all who visit have an extraordinary experience in Cleveland and at the transformed Q in 2022.”

“The City of Cleveland is pleased to host NBA All-Star 2022,” said Mayor Jackson. “Our city is no stranger to hosting successful, large, global events. It is a good opportunity, once again, for visitors to come to Cleveland and experience all we have to offer.”

“This is great news for Cleveland and Cuyahoga County,” said Budish. “When we made the decision to invest in the transformation of the Q, we were aiming for exactly this kind of result. I am thrilled to see the NBA All-Star Game coming in 2022 with an expected \$100 million economic impact to our region. Once again, our city and county will shine on the national and international stage and our businesses and residents will reap the rewards.”

NBA All-Star on-court events will tip off on Friday, Feb. 18 at Quicken Loans Arena with MTN DEW ICE Rising Stars, an annual showcase for top rookies and second-year NBA players. On Feb. 19, State Farm All-Star Saturday Night will feature the Taco Bell Skills Challenge and the Three-Point and Slam Dunk contests. NBA All-Star 2022 will culminate with the NBA All-Star Game on Sunday, Feb. 20.

The NBA will host several events for fans of all ages at venues throughout the city, including The Wolstein Center at Cleveland State University and Huntington Convention Center of Cleveland. These events, including NBA All-Star Practice and the NBA All-Star Celebrity Game presented by Ruffles, will feature basketball programming and entertainment for fans as well as up-close access to NBA players, legends and celebrities.

The league will also continue to celebrate its tradition and commitment to social responsibility with a full schedule of NBA Cares events during NBA All-Star 2022. Through partnerships with schools, government and local nonprofit organizations in Cleveland and surrounding areas, the league will reach thousands of children and families and provide critical resources to community-based programs.

In 2022, the NBA All-Star Game will be televised in prime time on TNT for the 20th consecutive year, marking Turner Sports’ 37th year of NBA All-Star coverage. The game will be broadcast worldwide in 215 countries and territories and in 50 languages.

NBA ALL-STAR HISTORY IN CLEVELAND

Cleveland last hosted NBA All-Star in 1997, when the league celebrated its 50th anniversary season. The NBA’s 50 Greatest Players were honored during a ceremony at halftime of the All-Star Game.

The 1997 NBA All-Star Game featured a historic performance from Charlotte Hornets forward Glen Rice, who set an All-Star record for points in a quarter with 20 in the third period. Rice finished with 26 points to lead the Eastern Conference past the Western Conference 132-120, earning MVP honors.

Also at NBA All-Star 1997, Los Angeles Lakers rookie guard Kobe Bryant won the Slam Dunk Contest, Chicago Bulls guard Steve Kerr triumphed in the Three-Point Contest and Philadelphia 76ers rookie guard Allen Iverson was named MVP of Rising Stars.

The Cavaliers also hosted NBA All-Star 1981, at Richfield Coliseum, the team’s home from 1974-94. Behind MVP Tiny Archibald of the Boston Celtics, the East defeated the West 123-120.
