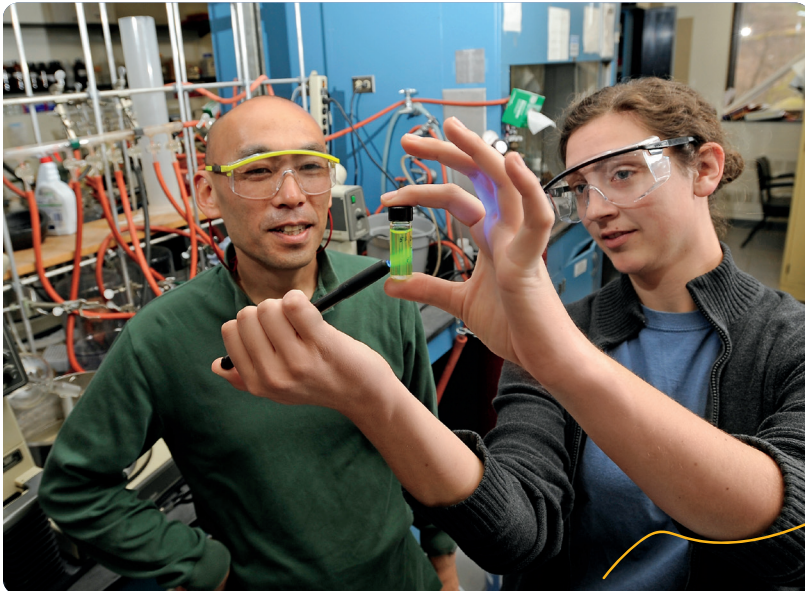

- Fill out the online application: admissions.pitt.edu/apply (get it in by April 1 for the fall term or October 1 for the spring term).
- Submit your responses to the Short Answer Questions.
- Enter your high school academic information from grades 9-12 using the Self-Reported Academic Record (SRAR) or submit an official high school transcript with transcript evaluation.
- SAT or ACT results (optional).
- Official TOEFL, IELTS, or Duolingo scores, if required.
 - Record of any university credits taken.
 - \$55 application fee (USD)

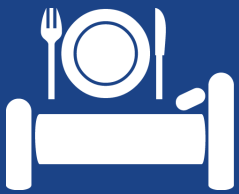
International Scholarships
