Kerry started working at Curtis Brown Ltd. in 2011 as assistant to Tim Knowlton and Holly Frederick in the Film and Television Department. She has a certificate in publishing from the Columbia Publishing Course, a masters in Art in Education from Harvard Graduate School, and a Bachelors from Bowdoin College.
