- **Tax efficiency.** Index funds tend to have low portfolio turnover rates, so they are typically subject to fewer capital gains distributions. As a result, they may be more tax efficient.
- **Broad exposure.** Mirroring a benchmark's holdings and potentially its performance, index funds may offer investors broad market exposure at a lower cost in relation to other products.
