Microsoft Intune helps organizations provide their employees with access to corporate applications, data, and resources from virtually anywhere on almost any device, while helping to keep corporate information secure. Through integration with Intune, you can extend your existing System Center 2012 Configuration Manager infrastructure to provide a consistent management experience across devices from on-premises and in the cloud.

Licensing Overview

Microsoft Intune is a user based subscription service. It is licensed per user per month allowing up to 5 devices per user. Intune includes on premises use rights for System Center 2012 Configuration Manager (ConfigMgr) Client Management License (CML) & System Center 2012 Endpoint Protection (SCEP) Client Management License (CML). Frequently Asked Questions:

What on-premises use rights do I get with Microsoft Intune?

Microsoft Intune subscriptions provide on-premises use rights for System Center Configuration Manager (ConfigMgr) CML and Endpoint Protection (SCEP) CML. These are non-perpetual use rights to manage up to 5 devices per user to which an Intune license is assigned. You also get non-perpetual use rights of ConfigMgr Server Software (Console). If the Intune subscription is not renewed the ConfigMgr and SCEP software must be removed from the user's devices.

If I purchase Microsoft Intune or the Microsoft Intune Add-On (Microsoft Intune Add-on for System Center Configuration Manager and System Center Endpoint Protection - per user) under my Enterprise Agreement can I manage x86 PCs?

Yes. However, any x86 PC that is managed (either by System Center Configuration Manager or Microsoft Intune) is a qualified device under the terms of your Enterprise Agreement and must be appropriately licensed.

Can I buy additional storage?

Yes. Additional storage for Microsoft Intune can be purchased in 1 GB increments in EA, MPSA and MOSP channels.

Is there any special offer available for Education?

Yes. Microsoft Intune Online Service offer is available for Education customers only. This service includes the Microsoft Intune service without the on-premises use rights for System Center Configuration Manager (ConfigMgr) and Endpoint Protection (SCEP).

Are there any options for Microsoft Intune to buyout the System Center Configuration Manager component once the service contract has ended?

No, there is no such option for online services.

Is Microsoft Intune included in the Enterprise Mobility Suite (EMS) offer?

Yes. Enterprise Mobility Suite (EMS) is a single license to buy Microsoft Azure Active Directory Premium, Microsoft Azure Rights Management Services and Microsoft Intune.

What is the price of Microsoft Intune as a standalone online service?

Microsoft Intune's price varies by the licensing program. In MOSP (Microsoft Online Subscription Program), the ERP list price is \$6 per user per month.
