Reading:

Writing:

Please choose three or four writing prompts and write at least five complete sentences for each prompt. Remember that you are a good writer. You always begin your sentences with a capital letter and end your sentences with a punctuation mark. Be sure to include a subject noun and a verb in each one. Adjectives and adverbs make your sentences interesting! Don't forget to draw a picture when you are done.

Math:

- Over Summer Break would be a great time to continue to practice Math facts to help with quick recall, fluency, and speed. Addition and Subtraction facts would be great. Practicing Multiplication facts: 2, 3, 4, 5, 10, and 11 would be beneficial as well.



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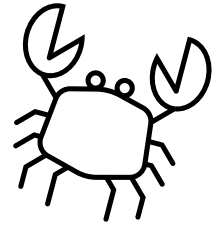
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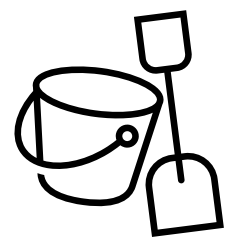
