



The first step in funding a post-secondary education is completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

Federal Scholarships and Grants

Pell Grant (Federal) – Award amount based on financial need, the cost of attendance at your school and your enrollment status (full-time or part-time).

Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) – For undergraduate students who exhibit exceptional financial need.

Federal TEACH Grant - Students who receive grant must agree to fulfill a full-time teaching obligation post-graduation.

Iraq and Afghanistan Service Grant – For students whose parent or guardian was a member of the U.S. armed forces and died as a result of performing military service in Iraq or Afghanistan after the events of 9/11.

Tuition Aid Grant (TAG) - (NJ State Grant) one of the nation's largest and most generous financial aid programs. Pro-rated awards may be given to students attending school part time.

Educational Opportunity Fund - Assists low-income NJ residents who are capable and motivated but lack adequate preparation for college study.

NJ GIVS- Scholarship – Provides funding to female or minority students enrolled in an eligible certificate program at a NJ community college.

NJ Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship (NJSTARS) - A program that was created by the State of New Jersey to provide access to higher education for the State's highest achieving students.

NJ Student Tuition Assistance Reward Scholarship II- Enables successful NJ STARS scholars to transfer to a New Jersey four-year public or non-public college or university and earn a bachelor's degree.

Private Scholarships and Grants

In addition to federal and state financial aid programs, youth are strongly encouraged to apply for private scholarship opportunities.
