
Meeting Directions:

Where do you shop most often for Corvette themed merchandise? Online or in a store? ZIP? Mid America Motorworks? West Coast Corvette? Have you tried the Corvette Store housed in the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, Kentucky? Certainly, an onsite visit might be best and is to be encouraged whenever possible. However, an online experience is a great option and often seems to be the experience of choice.

Since our recurring push is for Corvette Club of Richmond member support of the NCM, utilizing the Corvette Store as one important source of your Corvette items regularly benefits the Museum and can frequently save you money on your purchases. That's not simply a general sales statement but rather a reference to the recurring discount on goods given to NCM members. One of CCR's annual goals is to boost membership in the NCM by encouraging our club members to join and then renew annually. Recall that the Museum is a not-for-profit organization that relies soley on sales, gifts,




raffles, contributions, and donations for its continued existence. Purchases made from the store lend ongoing support while members enjoy discounts of 15%, 10%, or 5%, depending on membership type.




Current membership categories include LIFETIME, which is a pretty stiff \$1500, but this is a one time cost which affords two members a 15% shopping discount and is available by payment plan with withdrawals being take monthly from a designated credit card or bank account. Another category is FAMILY costing \$100 initially but with annual renewals of \$50 and a purchasing discount of 10% on all store or online items. An INDIVIDUAL membership is \$50 annually while also qualifying for 10% off on all purchases. An infrequently chosen but available option is an EMEMBERSHIP costing \$25

annually and qualifying for a 5% purchase savings. All less costly memberships can be upgraded to a higher level category at any time by contacting the NCM at corvettemuseum.org.

Remember, that in August of 2014, now only twelve months away, the National Corvette Caravan will be assembling the week prior to Labor Day Weekend to journey to the Museum for participation in the NCM's 20th Anniversary Celebration. Non-National Caravan club members will also be making the trip singularly and in groups. However, there is no cost to register for the Caravan and we hope you will. Being involved begins with your checking out the Museum's web site for registration information and sign-up. DO IT TODAY...help the museum by becoming a member, making regular store purchases, and then going there with us next August. We can guarantee you'll be in awe of what you and your fellow Corvette lovers have created.



CCR River Rats Cruise the James

I've always told people that our tubing trip was going to be one of the best CCR events they could attend. Fun, sun, laughs, and relaxation on the water. Well, last year, thanks to a cold front, it was only 71 degrees when we put into the river. Brrrrrr! If that wasn't bad enough, it rained hard and long and the sun never came out. I seriously considered not hosting this event again.

Well, what are the chances we'd get TWO bad years in a row? I scheduled our 2013 trip.

We didn't get much of a spring this year and then June and July had too many rainy days. James River Runners' (JRR) updates the river conditions on their website each morning, so I checked the site daily. For over a week, the water level of the James River in Scottsville was too high for tubing, rafting, and kayaking. JRR has a no refunds policy so we couldn't cancel, but if they cancelled our trip due to bad conditions, we would get our money back. We would just have to "wait and see."

A few days before our event, water levels started to drop--a *good* sign. The rains had finally let up, the river was dropping, and the weekend was going to be a scorcher. But Friday morning--a *bad* sign--JRR cancelled all the day's reservations because a train derailed Thursday spilling over 1300 tons of coal. The accident blocked the road where we usually put in and CSX wasn't sure how long it would be before the road would reopen. Uh-oh! Maybe this event really wasn't meant to be after all! On Friday afternoon, I talked to JRR. By then, the road had been cleared and the river was still dropping. Our trip was on. YAY! I wanted this trip!







We met at 9:00 a.m. at the I-64 rest area at mile marker 168 in Goochland and departed a little later than planned as one of our OTCs (other-than-Corvette) wouldn't start. It took a team effort to get it going, but thanks to Bubba, Dave, Jesse and Nancy and their tools and know-how, our caravan of four red Vettes and five OTCs hit the road. Traffic was good and the 45 minute drive on I-64 was easy. We had our usual short pit stop about 30 minutes from JRR where the team again had to get that finicky OTC started. It was a quick fix and we were on the road again.

Due to the train derailment, JRR couldn't take us UP RIVER to put in as usual. Instead, we would put in at Hatton Ferry and travel four miles downstream to Scottsville. I asked JRR if there was a sandy shore where we could stop for our lunch break and was told there was a small island midway down river that we could use. I quickly asked what side of the river the island was on...EVERYone laughed and I was told the island was in the middle of the river. Ooops.







We walked the short distance to the ferry and were given twine to tie our tubes and cooler tubes together. Time to hit the water. Anxious about the higher water, a few of us wore life vests that Donna and Bubba brought (JRR also has vests available for free). This was new scenery for us and, with the river not being as low as past years, we floated quickly and effortlessly downstream without having to shout "butt up" to dodge rocks. I don't know if this portion of the river is less rocky or if rocks were submerged due to the higher water, but the trip was WONDERFUL and the river was a dream! It was deeper than normal--a little over four feet--and felt very safe. Because we didn't have to navigate around rocks, our group was able to stay pretty much together--close enough for Jesse to toss shots to eager takers. Thanks, Jesse! Midway down river, we stopped at the island (in the middle of the river) for our lunch break.

C6 Tech Tips: Trapped in Your C6? We're Here to Help!




All kidding aside, I've been reading about a few cases of C6 Corvette owners being "trapped" in their cars after the battery has died.


If the battery dies on a C6 Corvette, the door-release buttons are inoperable. However, GM has equipped all C6 Corvettes with levers on the floor that, when pulled, manually open the doors. This is clearly printed in the owner's manual, but we're all probably guilty of not reading an owner's manual from cover to cover. We'd guess that most valets don't have a clue about this either. Don't forget

that removing the targa top is also an option. The steps to open the door are as follows:


If power to the vehicle or the keyless access transmitter is lost, there are two ways to open the door.



From inside the vehicle, use the door release handle located on the floor next to each seat. Pull the handle up to unlock and unlatch the door.



From outside the vehicle, use the door release tab located on the carpet inside the trunk on the driver's side of the vehicle. Pull the tab to unlock and unlatch the driver's door. See *Hatch/Trunk on page 2-14* for information on opening the trunk during a loss of power.



If your vehicle has lost battery power, open the hatch/trunk using the vehicle key. The key lock cylinder is located on the rear of the hatch/trunk lid above the license plate. Turn the vehicle key clockwise in the lock.

Becoming a Member of the CCR

In 1960, a small group of Corvette enthusiasts began to gather together on a regular basis for fun and fellowship. The first official Club meeting took place in July of 1961. CCR is the oldest Corvette club in Virginia with membership approaching 400. To be eligible for regular membership, you must be a person of good character and own a Corvette. You must attend at least one meeting or event. If you don't own a Corvette, an "associate membership" is available. Associates can participate in all events and functions but have no voting rights. You'll make good friends, have fun and learn more about Corvettes. Club meetings are at 7:30 p.m. on the second Friday of each month. After the meetings, there is usually a party where you can enjoy socializing with other club members.

Annual dues are \$25 for pilots or \$35 for both the pilot and co-pilot (includes spouse or significant other). A membership application can be found on the CCR website: www.corvetteclubofrichmond.com.

Your membership application must be approved by both the board and the club's membership. Acceptance may take a couple of months. After your application is received, we'll be in touch to fill you in on the process and answer any questions you may have.
