	Z30.432	Encounter for IUD removal (if patient desires removal)	<p>58301 or 58301-22*</p> <p>*NOTE: You may append modifier -22 if the removal was complicated. Supporting documentation may be requested by a payer. If the string is easily located in the canal, -22 modifier should <i>not</i> be added. It should be appended only if it is a very difficult extraction and is separately documented with the claim.</p>	

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Common LARC Modifiers

Modifier	Definition	Possible Clinical Scenarios	Documentation
-22	Increased procedural services	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Complex or difficult insertion Unsuccessful insertion, followed by successful insertion during the same surgical session 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Total time of the procedure as compared with typical duration Reason for the additional work required Include diagnoses with appropriate ICD-10 codes or simple descriptive diagnoses that explain the reasons for the added difficulty
-25	Significant, separately identifiable E/M service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Patient came in for general contraceptive counseling, ends up choosing IUD or implant, and it is inserted that day 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document time spent counseling
-51*	Multiple procedures performed on the same day, during the same session	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Removal of IUD and insertion of new IUD on the same day Removal of implant and insertion of new implant on the same day 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document should support the reasons for removal and reinsertion on the same day (eg. IUD expired, desired to continue with same method)
-52	Failed procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provider couldn't complete procedure for anatomic reasons (eg. stenosis) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document reasons for procedure failure (eg. N88.2 Stricture/ stenosis of cervix)
-53	Discontinued procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Provider couldn't complete procedure due to concerns for patient well-being Severe pain Vasovagal Patient changed mind during procedure 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> How much work was actually performed Document reason procedure terminated (eg. R55 Syncope/ vasovagal)
-59*	Distinct procedural service	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Removal of IUD and insertion of new IUD on the same day Removal of implant and insertion of new implant on the same day 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document should support the reasons for removal and reinsertion on the same day (eg. IUD expired, desired to continue with same method)
-76	Repeat procedure	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Successful insertion but the IUD is expelled, followed by repeat insertion 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Document reason for repeat procedure (eg. IUD was expelled)

* When choosing between modifiers -51 and -59, payer policy may be the determining factor. Some payers will not pay for multiple procedures using modifier -51. **Check with payer.**
