OPENING KICK

- ▶ No. 5/4 Oklahoma plays its first game away from home this season when it faces UCLA on Saturday at 6 p.m. CT at Spieker Field at the Rose Bowl. The contest will be televised nationally by FOX with Joe Davis, Brock Huard and Bruce Feldman announcing.
- ▶ Oklahoma's 20-game true road game winning streak is the longest in the nation (next longest is 10 by UCF). The Sooners haven't lost a true road contest in almost five years years (Oct. 4, 2014). If OU beats UCLA it would tie as the second-longest such streak nationally in the post-World War II era. The Sooners won 25 consecutive true road games from 1953-58 under Bud Wilkinson, and Alabama won 21 in a row from 1970-75. OU's current 20-game streak is tied with Miami, Fla. (1984-88) and Ohio State (2012-16)
- ▶ Saturday's game will mark the sixth meeting between Oklahoma and UCLA, with the Sooners leading the series 4-1 (1-1 in Pasadena). It's the second game of a two-year home-and-home series, with OU winning 49-21 last year in Norman (Sept. 8).
- ▶ The Sooners are 26-4-1 overall and 8-3 in true road games as the No. 5 team in the AP poll. Against unranked opponents, OU is 16-1 (6-0 on the road) as the AP's No. 5 squad.
- ▶ OU has won 32 consecutive non-conference games against unranked opponents. The last such loss came to UCLA in 2005 (41-24 in Pasadena).
- ▶ Oklahoma is coming off a 70-14 home win over South Dakota on Saturday, racking up 733 yards while surrendering 339. A school-record 10 Sooners scored a touchdown and OU produced its most points since 2007 (79 vs. North Texas). It also recorded its first three defensive takeaways of the season, one of them a Brendan Radley-Hiles interception he returned 30 yards for a TD. He was named Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week.
- ▶ UCLA dropped a 23-14 home decision to San Diego State on Saturday, a game in which the Aztecs held the Bruins to 261 yards and 3.9 yards per play. UCLA fumbled four times on the day (lost two) and SDSU held a 38:16 to 21:44 advantage in time of possession. Bruins guarterback **Dorian** Thompson-Robinson completed 24 of 35 pass attempts for 199 yards and a touchdown.

KEY STORYLINES

▶ OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** is the only player in the country with more than 500 passing yards (591) and more than 200 rushing yards (223). He leads the nation with his 252.3 passing efficiency rating (next highest is 219.1 by LSU's Joe Burrow) and paces all quarterbacks (ranks 18th overall) in rushing yards (next most is 177 by Baylor's Gerry Bohanon). Hurts owns



Jalen Hurts is the only player in the country with more than 500 passing yards (591) and more than 200 rushing yards (233) this season. He leads the nation in passing efficiency rating (252.3; next highest is 219.1) and paces all quarterbacks in rushing yards. Since the start of his sophomore year at Alabama, he has 31 TD passes and 3 interceptions (10.3-to-1 ratio).

A BALANCED APPROACH

Since the start of the 2018 season. Oklahoma has recorded seven games of at least 300 passing yards and at least 300 rushing yards. The next highest total nationally is three. Only one other Big 12 program (Oklahoma State) has done it once.

the nation's second- and third-best passing efficiency ratings this season (253.6 vs. South Dakota and 251.3 vs. Houston).

- ▶ OU is one of just three teams since the start of the 1996 campaign to average at least 7.9 yards per rush in each of its first two games of a season (minimum of 35 attempts per game). It averaged 9.6 yards per carry vs. Houston and 7.9 vs. South Dakota.
- ▶ In their history, the Sooners have rushed for 300-plus yards and passed for 300-plus in a game 13 times. Amazingly, seven of those 13 occasions have come in the last 16 games (since the start of last season), and OU has accomplished the feat six times in the last nine contests (including each of the first two games this season). Only two other programs (UCF 3 and Cincinnati 2) have registered more than one such performance since the start of the 2016 season.
- ▶ The Sooners led the nation last year in both yards per yards per pass attempt (11.3) and yards per rush (6.6). So far this season, OU ranks first nationally with its 14.0 yards per pass attempt (next highest average is 11.5) and ranks second with its 8.7 yards per rush (South Carolina averages 9.0).
- ▶ Under the direction of first-year defensive coordinator **Alex Grinch**, OU has forced three turnovers, two turnovers on downs and 11 punts through two games, while registering 16 tackles for loss and five sacks. Houston (5 for 13) and South Dakota (1 for 11) combined to convert 6 of 24 (25%) third-down attempts (conversely, the Sooners are 12 for 18 on the year for 67%).
- ▶ Oklahoma has consistently featured several Californians on its roster, and this season is no different. Eight Sooners on the 2019 roster hail from the Golden State, and five of those have seen action this season. Junior tight end Grant Calcaterra (Rancho Santa Margarita) and sophomore defensive back Brendan Radley-Hiles (Inglewood) have started each of the first two games this season, while redshirt senior defensive tackle Dillon Faamatau (Norwalk), redshirt junior defensive back Jordan Parker (Pittsburg) and freshman safety Jeremiah Criddell have also seen action. Senior linebacker Caleb Kelley (Fresno) and sophomore running back T.J. Pledger (Pacoima) have yet to play due to injury, and freshman linebacker Jonathan Perkins (San Bernardino) has not seen action, either.

RECAPPING THE WIN OVER SOUTH DAKOTA

- ▶ No. 4/4 Oklahoma outgained South Dakota 733 yards to 339 and registered its first three takeaways of the season in a 70-14 home win over South Dakota on Saturday night. OU's 70 points were its most since a 79-10 home win over North Texas to open the 2007 campaign, and a school-record 10 Sooners scored touchdowns on the night.
- ▶ In less than two-and-a-half quarters of work, quarterback **Jalen Hurts** completed 14 of 18 passes for 259 yards and three touchdowns while rushing eight times for 47 yards. He recorded the highest national pass efficiency rating of the week (253.6) and second highest of the season. He exited the contest with 11:03 left in the third quarter and OU leading 42-0.
- ▶ OU threw for 423 yards on the night (Hurts, **Tanner Mordecai** and **Spencer Rattler** combined to complete 24 of 30 attempts; 80%) and rushed for 310 more yards. Running back **Rhamondre Stevenson** led four Sooners who ran for at least 47 yards. The junior college transfer carried six times for a team-high 104 yards (including a 75-yard TD run) and was followed by **Kennedy Brooks** (six carries for 69 yards and a TD), **Trey Sermon** (nine carries for 56 yards and a score) and Hurts.
- ▶ Receiver **CeeDee Lamb** led the Sooners with six receptions for 144 yards (all in the first half) and a score. H-back **Jeremiah Hall** and receiver **Charleston Rambo** registered their second TD catches of the season while freshman receivers **Trejan Bridges**, **Jadon Haselwood** and **Theo Wease** all caught a TD pass.

YARDS-PER-PLAY LEADERS

Oklahoma led the nation with its 8.3 yards per play in 2017 (the previous single-season school record was 7.6 in 1971) and then set an FBS record with its 8.6 yards per play last season. OU now owns the No. 1 and No. 3 spots on the FBS all-time single-season list.

So far this season, the Sooners pace the country by averaging 10.9 yards per play. Only one other team averages more than 8.7 (minimum two games played):

LONG-DISTANCE DIALERS

Since the start of the 2015 season (when Lincoln Riley took over as OU's offensive play-caller), the Sooners have scored 76 offensive touchdowns of 40-plus yards. That's 21 more than the Power Five program with the next most (Clemson has 55, in five more games).

- ▶ The Sooners' first two takeaways under first-year defensive coordinator **Alex Grinch** were made by sophomore defensive back **Brendan Radley-Hiles**, who recovered a second-quarter fumble and returned a third-quarter interception 30 yards for his first career touchdown en route to Big 12 Defensive Player of the Week honors. Freshman cornerback **Jaden Davis** added an interception with 11:12 left in the fourth quarter. OU did not commit a turnover.
- ▶ Sophomore safety **Pat Fields** led the Sooners with six tackles while **Kenneth Murray**, **Bryan Mead** and **Justin Broiles** recorded four each. OU held the Coyotes to one first-down conversion on 11 tries.
- ▶ The game marked the first since 2016 at West Virginia that OU turned in a plus-three turnover margin.

TRUE ROAD WARRIORS

- ▶ By the time Saturday arrives, the Sooners' last true road loss will have occurred 1,806 days ago. The last time OU lost a true road game was Oct. 4, 2014, when No. 4 OU dropped a 37-33 decision at No. 25 TCU. Eleven AP Top 25 teams lost that week, including four of the top six.
- ▶ Since 1975, OU's 20-game road winning streak is tied with Miami (Fla.) (1984-88) and Ohio State (2012-16) for the longest nationally.
- ▶ During the 20-game streak, the Sooners have outscored opponents 983-592 (49-30 average) and have outgained them 11,673 yards to 8,537 (584-427 average). OU has scored at least 31 points in all 20 games and at least 41 points in 16 of them. Eight of the wins have come against top-25 teams.

- ▶ The Sooners have outgained their opponent in 18 of the 20 road wins. West Virginia (in 2016 and 2018) is the only home team to outgain OU during the stretch.
- ▶ Thirteen of the 20 victories have been by double digits, seven by at least 25 points and five by at least 35.

SCOUTING UCLA

- ▶ UCLA is 0-2 this season with losses at Cincinnati (24-14) and at home against San Diego State (23-14).
- ▶ The Bruins average 239.5 yards of offense per game (62.0 rushing, 177.5 passing) and have converted 38 percent of their third downs (11 of 29). Opponents have averaged 395.0 total yards per game (127.5 rushing, 267.5 passing), converted 45 percent of their third downs and hold a 38:22 to 21:38 advantage in time of possession. UCLA is minus-four in turnovers, having thrown two interceptions and lost four fumbles.
- ▶ Quarterback **Dorian Thompson-Robinson**has passed for 355 yards and three touchdowns, completing 32 of 61 throws (52.5%) with two interceptions. Running back **Joshua Kelly** tallied 53 rushing yards and a touchdown against San Diego State in his first action of the season while **Demetric Felton** has recorded a team-high 99 rushing yards on 33 carries in two games. Felton is also the Bruins' leading receiver with 127 yards and a touchdown on nine catches, including a 75-yard reception at Cincinnati.
- ▶ Linebacker Khrys Barnes leads UCLA with 16 tackles, which include 3.0 tackles for loss and a sack, and has a pass breakup and a QB hurry. Defensive lineman Osa Odighizuwa has collected 11 stops, including a team-high 3.5 tackles for loss and a sack. Defensive back Jay Shaw has the team's lone interception, which he returned 66 yards against Cincinnati
- ▶ UCLA is 3-11 in its second season under head coach **Chip Kelly**. Prior to leading the Bruins, Kelly served as the head coach of the San Francisco 49ers (2016) and the Philadelphia Eagles (2013-15). Kelly compiled a 46-7 collegiate head coaching record in four years at Oregon (2009-12), guiding the Ducks to four BCS bowl appearances, including the 2011 BCS National Championship (2010 season), Rose Bowls in the 2009 and 2011 campaigns and the Fiesta Bowl to cap the 2012 season.

SERIES WITH THE BRUINS

- ▶ Oklahoma owns a 4-1 series lead against UCLA and is 1-1 in Pasadena. The Sooners have outscored the Bruins 204-103 in the series.
- ▶ In the 1986 season opener in Norman, **Barry Switzer's** defending national champs handed **Terry Donahue** and the No. 4 Bruins a 38-3 loss thanks to stellar defense. The No. 1 Sooners intercepted quarterback **Matt Stevens** (now UCLA's game day radio analyst) a school-record-tying five times and permitted just 34 rushing yards on 24 carries. Behind QB **Jamelle Holieway**, OU's wishbone attack racked up 470 rushing yards. It was UCLA's worst season-opening loss in 56 years.
- ▶ No. 23 Oklahoma also notched a 34-14 win at No. 19 UCLA in 1990 under head coach **Gary Gibbs** thanks to a suffocating defensive effort. The Sooners held the Bruins to just 203 yards, or 3.6 per play, while registering four interceptions and five sacks. On the ground alone, it limited UCLA to 28 yards on 27 rushes. The season-opening game marked the first in the career of OU quarterback **Cale Gundy**, a freshman who saw action in a reserve role. Gundy, who is OU's co-offensive coordinator and inside receivers coach, is in his 21st season on the Sooners' coaching staff. He finished his playing career as OU's all-time leading passer.
- ▶ In 2003 in Norman, **Bob Stoops'** top-ranked Sooners only gained 354 yards offensively, but that's because they only ran 60 plays. They used an NCAA-record three punt return TDs by **Antonio Perkins** to register a 59-24 victory over the unranked Bruins, led by first-year head coach **Karl Dorrell**. Perkins, who scored on returns of 65, 74 and 84 yards, is still the outright FBS single-game record holder for punt return TDs and punt return yards (277).
- ▶ UCLA's lone win in the series came in 2005, a 41-24 outcome in Pasadena. The unranked Bruins turned three OU fumbles into 17 points, and held **Adrian Peterson** to 58 yards on 23 carries as the No. 21 Sooners fell to 1-2.
- ▶ Last year in Norman, OU led 21-7 at halftime and 42-7 in the fourth quarter before settling for a 49-21 win (recap below).

LAST YEAR VS. UCLA

- ▶ No. 6 Oklahoma registered its 31st consecutive victory over an unranked non-conference opponent by defeating UCLA 49-21 in Norman last year on Sept. 8.
- ▶ Quarterback **Kyler Murray** accounted for five touchdowns on the day, earning him Big 12 Offensive Player of the Week, Walter Camp National Offensive Player of the Week and Davey O'Brien Quarterback of the Week honors. The redshirt junior was 19-for-33 through the air for 306 yards and three TDs (one interception), and rushed 10 times for 69 yards and a pair of scores. It marked the first time since OU's 2014 game at lowa State (**Trevor Knight** with 146) that a quarterback led the Sooners in rushing yards.
- ▶ Sophomore receiver **CeeDee Lamb** finished with seven catches for 146 yards and a 35-yard score. He also returned two punts for 63 yards, including a career-long 66 yarder. Junior **Marquise Brown** hauled in four passes for 88 yards, one of them a 58-yard catch-and-run for a TD.

OU'S 20-GAME ROAD WINNING STREAK

Oklahoma enters the UCLA contest riding a 20-game road winning streak, longest in the nation. The average score in those games has been 49-30, and OU has averaged 584 yards.

- ▶ OU's defense was disruptive, registering six sacks and 12 tackles for loss. Defensive end/linebacker **Mark Jackson Jr.** recorded a career-high 10 tackles and a tackle for loss and linebacker **Kenneth Murray** had nine tackles, a career-high 2.5 TFLs and a sack.
- ▶ The Sooners' special teams were also extremely effective. In addition to Lamb's 63-yard punt return, OU got an 85-yard first-quarter kickoff return from sophomore **Tre Brown**. It was the program's longest non-scoring play/return in the 95-year history of Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium. Brown's other kick return was a 36-yarder.
- ▶ OU outgained UCLA 485 yards to 383 and converted 7 of 12 third downs (58 percent) to the Bruins' 5 of 15 (33 percent).

RILEY'S RARE FEAT

Lincoln Riley is just one of five people to win at least 24 games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. The last time a head coach won more games than Riley in his first two seasons was 1892 and '93 (125 years ago).

BIG-PLAY SOONERS

- ▶ Despite ranking 104th out of 130 FBS teams last season in offensive plays per game (just 66.3), Oklahoma led the country in plays of at least 20 yards (111) and at least 30 yards (59), and ranked second in plays of at least 40 yards (34; Clemson had 35 in one more game).
- ► So far this season, the Sooners have picked up where they left off in 2018. They lead all teams in plays of at least 10 yards, (52), 20 yards (23), 30 yards (16; next most is 11) and 40 yards (nine), despite 89 teams running more plays than their 130

SOONERS CELEBRATING 125TH SEASON

▶ The 2019 Oklahoma football campaign marks the 125th in the program's illustrious history, and the Sooners are celebrating that colorful and accomplished past throughout the fall. The "125" logo will be featured on the backs of helmets and on Owen Field during the 2019 season, as well as on various fan merchandise and apparel. The OU Athletics Department is also planning a variety of content, collectibles and activities that honor the Sooners' storied past.

OU'S COACHING LEGENDS

OU is the only program nationally that can boast four coaches who each registered at least 100 career wins (Bennie Owen, 122; Bud Wilkinson, 145; Barry Switzer, 157; Bob Stoops, 190). With 26 wins, current head coach Lincoln Riley is more than a quarter of the way to 100 victories after just 30 games, and owns the best winning percentage of the quintet.

▶ In their first 124 years, the Sooners amassed an 896-325-53 (.724) record, good for the fifth-best winning percentage nationally during the period, and posted only 13 losing seasons.

RILEY'S FAST START

▶ The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, **Lincoln Riley** was named the Oklahoma's 22nd head man on June 7, 2017, and quickly set school records for wins by a first-year head coach (12) and victories in his first two seasons (24). No one at any school in the last 125 years (since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892-93) won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach. In addition to his 24-4 record in his first two years, Riley won two Big 12 titles, participated in two College Football Playoffs and produced seven first-team All-Americans, two Heisman Trophy winners and two No. 1 overall NFL Draft picks in his two years as OU's head coach. He turned 36 on Sept. 5.

HURTS WINS STARTING QB JOB

- ▶ After a competitive battle during August camp, head coach **Lincoln Riley** announced Aug. 19 that senior **Jalen Hurts** will be OU's starting quarterback to start the season, and that redshirt freshman **Tanner Mordecai** would be his backup, and freshman **Spencer Rattler** would be third on the depth chart.
- ▶ A graduate transfer from Alabama who arrived at OU in January, Hurts follows in the footsteps of OU Heisman Trophy winners **Baker Mayfield** (2017) and **Kyler Murray** (2018). He started 14 games in each of the Crimson Tide's 2016 and 2017 seasons, and saw action in 13 games in 2018. He played in three College Football Playoff National Championships and helped Alabama to the 2017 national title. UA went 41-3 in his three seasons in Tuscaloosa.
- ▶ Hurts led the Crimson Tide to a 26-2 record in his 28 starts over the 2016 and 2017 seasons. One of his appearances in 2018 came in the SEC Championship when he replaced injured starter Tua Tagovailoa and rallied UA to a 35-28 win after it trailed 28-21 when he entered the game in the fourth quarter. Hurts threw a 10-yard pass with 7:08 left to tie the game at 28 and ran for a 15-yard score with 1:04 remaining for the game's final points.
- ▶ From Channelview, Texas, Hurts owns the Alabama quarterback career record with 23 rushing touchdowns and ranks second in school history with 1,976 career rushing yards and 71 touchdowns responsible for. He amassed 7,602 yards of total offense and threw for 48 touchdowns, both good for third place in UA history.
- ▶ In his debut season of 2016, Hurts was named SEC Freshman of the Year, a freshman All-American by ESPN and USA Today and a finalist for the Manning Award. He completed 62.8 percent of his passes for 2,780 yards and 23 touchdowns against nine interceptions. He also ran for an Alabama quarterback-record 954 yards (5.0 per carry) and 13 TDs. In the second game of the season, Hurts became the first UA freshman quarterback to start a game under head coach Nick Saban, and he went on to start each of the next 27 contests. The Crimson Tide won its first 14 games in 2016 before falling to Clemson in the CFP National Championship, 35-31.
- ▶ Hurts' 2017 sophomore season saw him complete 154 of 255 pass attempts (60.4 percent) for 2,081 yards and 17 touchdowns versus just one interception. He rushed for 855 yards (5.6 per carry) and eight scores, and was named a Davey O'Brien Award semifinalist. Hurts registered three games of at least 100 rushing yards and was named offensive MVP in Alabama's 24-6 win over Clemson in the CFP Semifinal at the Allstate Sugar Bowl.
- ▶ Last season, Hurts played in 13 games, completing 51 of his 70 passes (72.9 percent) for eight touchdowns with two interceptions, good for a 196.7 passing efficiency rating. He also ran for 167 yards (4.6 per carry) and two TDs.

NO LITTLE LAMB

▶ A preseason All-Big 12 selection and a preseason first-team All-American by The Athletic, junior wide receiver **CeeDee Lamb** is continuing his ascent on OU's charts this season. The Richmond, Texas, product has 119 catches for 2,155 yards and 20 touchdowns in his two-plus years as a Sooner. His 20 TDs already rank as ninth most in school history and he needs six more to move into the top three. Through two games this season he has posted team highs of eight catches and 190 receiving yards. He is averaging 23.8 yards per grab and has scored two TDs.

Last year, Lamb, who has started 28 of his 30 career games, caught 65 passes for 1,158 yards, the sixth-highest yardage total in single-season school history. He caught at least one touchdown pass in seven consecutive games and finished with a team-high 11 TD grabs. If he repeats his 65-catch performance this year, he would move into sixth place on OU's all-time receptions list (would give him 176).

▶ Lamb was the only player in the country last year with multiple receptions of 80 yards. He registered an 86-yard catch against Baylor and an 82-yard grab vs. Kansas State, both for scores. He also caught an 82-yard TD pass as a freshman against Tulane.

▶ Also a 2019 preseason AP second-team All-American as an all-purpose player, Lamb ranked eighth nationally in 2018 with his 8.2 yards per punt return. He is averaging 9.8 yards on five returns this year.

MURRAY NAMED PRESEASON BIG 12 DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

▶ Junior linebacker **Kenneth Murray**, who ranked second in the Big 12 and 13th nationally last season with his 155 total tackles (most by a Sooner since **Curtis Lofton** had 157 in 2007), was named 2019 Preseason Big 12 Defensive Player of the Year by media who cover the league. He's off to a good start, registering team highs of 17 tackles and 3.0 tackles for loss. He was named the Lott IMPACT Player of the Week after the season-opening win over Houston (13 tackles, 2.5 TFLs, 1 breakup and 1 QB hurry).

▶ Murray registered nine games of double-digit tackles last season as a second-team All-Big 12 performer, including three contests of at least 15 stops (28 vs. Army [most by an FBS player since at least 2000], 17 vs. Baylor and 15 vs. Alabama in CFP Semifinal at the Orange Bowl).

▶ Murray, who has started all 30 games since the start of 2017, has 23.0 career tackles for loss and 6.0 sacks. His fumble recovery against Oklahoma State last season with the game tied at 41 helped OU post a 48-47 win.

OFFENSE HAS ROLLED UNDER RILEY

▶ Oklahoma owns the nation's most productive offense since the start of the 2015 season, which was **Lincoln Riley's** first year as OU's offensive coordinator. Riley called plays as the program's offensive coordinator and continues to as head coach.

▶ Since the start of the 2015 season, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.6), total offense (564.7; next most is 527.7), touchdowns from scrimmage (324; next most is 297), pass efficiency rating (191.5; next best is 161.6), completion percentage (69.5; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is fourth in passing offense (330.0) and 10th in rushing offense (234.7).

▶ In 56 games since the start of the 2015 season, OU has registered at least 500 yards of total offense 42 times, including in 32 of the last 40 outings, topped the 600-yard mark on 22 occasions and gone over 700 yards seven times. Similarly, OU has scored at least 30 points in 50 of 56 games since Riley's arrival, at least 40 points 38 times, at least 50 points 23 times and at least 60 points eight times.

▶ The Sooners have registered at least 700 yards of offense 13 times in their history, and seven of those occasions have come since the start of the 2015 season: 854 at Texas Tech in 2016, 785 at Oklahoma State in 2017, 773 vs. Tulsa in 2015, 733 vs. South Dakota in 2019, 710 at Kansas in 2015, 702 vs. Kansas State in 2018 and 702 vs. Oklahoma State in 2018.

GOING FOR BIG 12 FIVE-PEAT

▶ If Oklahoma wins the 2019 Big 12 title, it will mark the program's fifth straight league crown. The last time the Sooners won at least five consecutive conference championships was 1972-80 under head coaches **Chuck Fairbanks** (1972) and **Barry Switzer**.

▶ OU is the only program to win three straight Big 12 titles, and it has done so twice (also from 2006-08). Baylor (2013-14) is the only other program to win two Big 12 championships in a row.

▶ The last Power Five program to win five straight outright league titles was Alabama (SEC) from 1971 through 1975.

BIG 12'S BELL COW

▶ Since the first year of the Big 12 in 1996, OU has claimed 12 league titles and is followed by Texas (three), Baylor, Kansas State and Nebraska (two each), and Colorado, Oklahoma State, TCU and Texas A&M (one each). All 12 of the Sooners' titles have come since the start of the 2000 campaign, with no other program during that span winning

RILEY SECURES ANOTHER TOP-10 RECRUITING CLASS

Lincoln Riley's 2018 recruiting class — his first as head coach at OU — was a consensus top-10 one. His 2019 class was ranked even higher The Sooners' "New Wave 19" class was rated No. 4 nationally by ESPN, No. 5 by Rivals and No. 6 by 247Sports.

The Sooners signed 23 players, 19 of them ranked as four- or five-star prospects by 247Sports, ESPN or Rivals. Four players were ranked as five-star prospects by at least one service in quarterback Spencer Rattler and receivers Trejan Bridges, Jadon Haselwood and Theo Wease. The class is comprised of 12 defensive players and 11 offensive players. Eight of them enrolled at OU in January and participated in spring practice (Bridges, Haselwood and Wease, tight end Austin Stogner, offensive lineman Finley Felix, defensive lineman LaRon Stokes, linebacker Jonathan Perkins and defensive back Jamal Morris).

more than two. OU is 132-28 (.825) in regular season Big 12 play since the start of the 2000 season. That's 22 more wins than the program with the next most victories during that period (Texas; 110-50) and 43 more than the program with the third most (Oklahoma State; 89-71).

COLLEGE FOOTBALL'S BEST

- ▶ During the modern era of college football (since the end of World War II), the Sooners are the nation's No. 1 team with more wins (651) than any other program (next most is 611 by Alabama).
- ▶ OU is the highest-scoring program in college football history with 35,912 points (in 1,276 games).
- ▶ No program has more all-time 10-win seasons than Oklahoma, which has 39. In addition, OU's 25 seasons with at least 11 wins are the most in college football history.
- ► Since former head coach **Bob Stoops** arrived in Norman in 1999, OU leads all Power Five conference programs in wins (216) and points scored (10,309).
- ▶ Only Alabama (118) and Ohio State (105) have been ranked No. 1 in the AP Poll more weeks than Oklahoma (101). OU's 414 weeks in the AP's top five are most of any school (Alabama next with 400 and Ohio State third with 374). The AP Poll was introduced in 1936.
- ▶ Only Ohio State (625) has more all-time top-10 AP poll appearances than OU (590).
- ▶ Only Alabama (10) and Notre Dame (8) have earned more alltime AP national championships than Oklahoma (7).

EXTRA POINTS

- ▶ Oklahoma head coach **Lincoln Riley** turned 36 last Thursday (Sept. 5). He is the fifth-youngest FBS head coach.
- ▶ First-year OU cornerbacks coach **Roy Manning** spent the 2018 season as UCLA's outside linebackers coach and special teams coordinator.
- ▶ OU holds a 66-32-3 (.668) all-time record against current members of the Pac-12 Conference. The bulk of the matchups occurred against former conference foe Colorado, against which the Sooners are 40-17-2 (.695) all-time.
- ► Since the start of his sophomore season at Alabama, OU quarterback **Jalen Hurts** has posted a 10.3-to-1 touchdown-to-interception ratio (31 TDs to three INTs).
- ▶ OU ranked fourth nationally last year by converting 51.7 percent of its third-down plays and is 12 for 18 this season (66.7%). The Sooners ranked 11th last year by converting 66.8% (9 of 14) of its fourth-down plays and is 1 for 1 in 2019.
- ▶ The Sooners have been ranked in the AP's top 10 in 40 of the last 41 polls. The only time it wasn't during that stretch was following its 2017 loss to lowa State (fell from third to 12th).
- ▶ OU is the only program to win at least three straight Big 12 titles, and has done so twice (2006-08 and 2015-18). Its current streak of four straight outright league championships is the longest among Power Five programs since Alabama won five in a row from 1971 to '75 (Clemson is also riding a four-game outright streak [ACC]).
- ▶ The Sooners have won more Big 12 titles the last four seasons (four) than they have lost games against Big 12 opponents (35-3 record).

- ▶ OU committed 13 turnovers each of the last two years. That's the second-lowest total in school history (11 in 2008). It has committed two this season (fumbles vs. Houston).
- ▶ Oklahoma is 33-3 (.917) in regular season Big 12 play the last four years, which coincides with **Lincoln Riley's** arrival at OU. Oklahoma State ranks second during that period (23-13; .639), TCU and West Virginia third (22-14; .611) and Texas fifth (19-17; .528).
- ▶ Redshirt junior receiver **Lee Morris** has 23 career catches and 10 have gone for touchdowns. The 43-percent touchdown rate ranks first in school history among players with at least 20 receptions. Eight of Morris's 21 receptions last year resulted in a score.
- ▶ OU has scored at least 50 points 23 times since the start of the 2015 season, most in the nation.
- ▶ Oklahoma has scored at least 30 points in 38 of its last 40 games (29 and 28 in the other two). It has won 36 of those 40 contests
- ▶ The Sooners' 2019 starting offensive line logged a combined 156 career starts by season's end. This year's offensive line entered 2019 with a combined 12 career starts (all by center **Creed Humphrey** last season).
- ▶ OU is the only program that has produced at least four NFL Draft picks each of the last 12 years.

GAME 3: OKLAHOMA AT UCLA STADIUM NOTES

GAYLORD FAMILY

OKLAHOMA MEMORIAL STADIUM



OU's \$160 million stadium renovation and modernization project bowled in the south end of the facility and added premium seating and the second-largest collegiate video board.

OKLAHOMA'S PALACE ON THE PRAIRIE

- ▶ Gaylord Family Oklahoma Memorial Stadium is one of America's most recognized college football cathedrals. Situated on the east side of the Norman campus, this historical facility is the largest sports arena in the state and ranks among the 18 largest on-campus facilities in the nation.
- ▶ In 1921, University of Oklahoma students started a movement for construction of a student union. By 1925, the idea had grown to include a combined football stadium/student union. In the original architect's drawings, the north end of the proposed structure was strikingly similar to the present Oklahoma Memorial Union, which eventually was constructed separately when head coach and athletics director Bennie Owen suggested it would be best to raise funds for a union and a stadium.
- ▶ The field is named Owen Field after Owen, who became a charter member of the National Football Hall of Fame. The first game played at the site took place Oct. 20, 1923 (a 63-7 win over Washington, Mo.).
- ▶ In 1925, the first contest was played in front of the new stands on the west side of the field. The 16,000-seat Oklahoma Memorial Stadium, named in honor of University personnel who died in World War I, was erected at a cost of approximately \$293,000.
- ▶ Expansions increased the stadium's capacity to 32,000 (1929), 55,000 (1949), 61,836 (1957), 71,187 (1975), 75,004 (1980), 72,765 (1998), 82,112 (2003) and 83,489 (2016). With this year's widening of aisles and some seats, capacity has dropped to 80,126.
- ▶ In July, 1970 the original natural grass surface was removed and artificial turf was installed. That tartan turf was replaced with super turf before the 1981 season. Owen Field returned to grass in 1994.

RECENT RENOVATION

- ▶ The OU Board of Regents approved a proposal from OU Athletics on June 25, 2014, to proceed with the development of plans and projects for a major renovation and modernization of the stadium at an estimated cost of \$160 million. The project was carried out entirely from Athletics Department-generated capital funds, bond funds and other private sources.
- ▶ The first phase of the building project was completed prior to the 2016 home opener with a focus on the south end zone. The most visible aspect is a completed south end zone seating bowl, a feature that initially increased the seating capacity to 83,489.
- ▶ The seating bowl features an expanded concourse, additional restrooms and concessions, and other amenities. The new structure features 22 suites, 60 open-air loge boxes and 1,976 club seats. Club patrons also benefit from two new clubs.
- Among the most unique features of the new south end zone facility are a pair of open-air fan plazas, one each in the southwest and southeast corners. They each measure at slightly more than 3.000 square feet each and feature a view directly to the game field.
- ▶ All student-athlete services in the new building were moved to the ground floor. That space, completed this past summer, includes a new locker room, strength and conditioning area, training room, nutrition center, meeting rooms and the equipment operation. The third floor of the building houses all of the football offices and the team's video department.
- The weight room nearly tripled in size to 26,600 square feet and includes a 70-yard turfed, indoor speed and agility training area. The athletic training room also grew substantially to nearly 10,000 square feet.
- A significantly larger and more more detailed video board has replaced the old video board above the north end zone for 2018. The new board is 62 feet x 38 feet (2,356 square feet).

LINCOLN RILEY

THIRD SEASON AS HEAD COACH • 26-4 RECORD (.867) • 2018 CO-BIG 12 COACH OF THE YEAR OWNS OU RECORDS FOR WINS IN A DEBUT SEASON (12) AND IN FIRST TWO SEASONS (24) DIRECTED SOONERS TO BIG 12 TITLES AND COLLEGE FOOTBALL PLAYOFF BERTHS IN 2017 AND '18 WINNER OF 2015 BROYLES AWARD AS NATION'S TOP ASSISTANT COACH

fter presiding over two of the most prolific offenses in OU history as offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach in 2015 and 2016, Lincoln Riley took over the program's head coaching reins on June 7, 2017, following the retirement of one of the most accomplished coaches of the last guarter century in Bob Stoops. Ou's 22nd head coach, all Riley has done in his first two years at the helm is lead the Sooners to their 11th and 12th Big 12 titles and to a pair of College Football Playoff berths. He was also named the 2018 Co-Big 12 Coach of the Year.

The Football Bowl Subdivision's youngest head coach (33) at the time of his hiring, Riley became just the fifth mentor in FBS history with no previous head-coaching experience at a four-year college to win at least 12 games in his debut season. At 24-4, he also holds the OU record for most wins by a head coach in his first two seasons (Barry Switzer held the previous mark with 21 over the 1973 and '74 seasons). No one has won more games in his first two seasons as a college head coach since Penn's George Woodruff in 1892 and '93.

Originally from the 5,000-person West Texas town of Muleshoe, Riley, who continues to call Oklahoma's offensive plays as head coach, has made his name as perhaps the best up-and-coming star in college football by overseeing an explosive — and balanced — OU offense the last four seasons.

Since the start of the 2015 campaign, OU ranks first nationally in points per game (45.8; next most is 41.6), total offense (564.7; next most is 527.7), touchdowns from scrimmage (324; next most is 297), pass efficiency rating (191.5; next best is 161.6), completion percentage (69.5; tied) and yards per pass attempt (10.8), and is fourth in passing offense (330.0) and 10th in rushing offense (234.7). With that kind of offensive production. it's no surprise the Sooners have posted a 47-8 (.855) record since his arrival (33-3 in Big 12 play). OU's overall mark since 2015 is fourth best nationally, with only Alabama (57-4), Clemson (57-4) and Ohio State (50-6) having better records.

Individual player honors and accomplishments have poured in under Riley, highlighted by quarterbacks Baker Mayfield and Kyler Murray becoming OU's sixth and seventh Heisman Trophy winners in 2017 and 2018. Mayfield also won the Maxwell, Davey O'Brien, Manning and Walter Camp Player of the Year Awards, was named AP Player of the Year and was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2018 NFL Draft. Murray also won the O'Brien and Manning Awards and was named AP Player of the Year. Receiver Dede Westbrook finished fourth in Heisman voting in 2016 and became OU's first winner of the Biletnikoff Award, while tight end Mark Andrews claimed the school's first Mackey Award in 2017. Seven Sooners have earned first-team All-America honors the last two years. Running back Joe Mixon set the OU single-season record with 2,331 all-purpose vards in 2016, while backfield mate Samaie Perine set the school career rushing record with 4,122 yards in only

Oklahoma's newest head man joined the Sooners in January 2015 after he caught the eye of Stoops during a highly successful five-year stint as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach under Ruffin McNeill at East Carolina from 2010-14. With OU looking for a new play caller and wanting to get back to the up-tempo attack it helped make mainstream, Riley's numbers at ECU made him the perfect hire.

At East Carolina, Riley installed and directed a spread offensive scheme that made an immediate impact as the Pirates set more than 50 team or individual school offensive records in his five seasons with the program. His squads recorded the top five passing seasons in school history and the top four marks for total offense in a season.

He spent his final season with the Pirates serving in the role of assistant head coach/offensive coordinator/quarterbacks coach in 2014 as the team ranked third in the nation in passing offense (371.9 ypg) and was fifth in total offense (533.0 ypg). With Riley calling the shots, the Pirates set a single-season school record with 6,929 yards of total offense.

Riley's East Carolina offensive units routinely earned national top-10 rankings in major statistical categories such as passing offense (third in 2014, eighth in 2010), scoring offense (fifth in 2014, eighth in 2013), third-down conversion percentage (seventh in 2013) and red zone scoring efficiency (third in 2012, fifth in 2010).

Among his notable pupils, Riley helped transform a pair of East Carolina wide receivers into the most productive pass catchers in FBS history. He guided walk-on Justin Hardy to 387 career catches, breaking the NCAA record previously held by OU's Ryan Broyles (349). Hardy's 4,541 career receiving yards rank third all-time in FBS annals as he flourished in Riley's offense, registering three 1,000-yard seasons at ECU that culminated with a 121-catch, 1,494-yard year as a senior in 2014. Riley also coached recent second-round NFL draft selection Zay Jones for the first two years of his career. Jones went on to break Hardy's record and is the NCAA's leader in career receptions (399) and receptions in a season (158 in

In addition to overseeing Mayfield's and Murray's recordsetting careers, Riley also developed dynamic quarterbacks Dominique Davis and Shane Carden at ECU. Conference USA's 2010 Newcomer of the Year, Davis set ECU career marks for completions and TD passes despite playing just two seasons. Davis ranked second among FBS signal callers with 393 completions and 46 total touchdowns in 2010. He set an NCAA record with 36 straight completions in 2011.

Carden took over the job in 2012 and went on to break the majority of Davis' records, becoming the first 4,000-vard passer in program history and setting single-season standards for completion percentage (70.5 in 2013) and passing yards (4,736 in 2014). Carden earned Conference USA MVP honors in 2013 and was the American Conference's Offensive Player of the Year in 2014. He led all FBS passers with 392 completions in 2014.

Prior to East Carolina, Riley spent seven seasons on the staff at Texas Tech, where he was part of seven bowl teams and five bowl wins. During that span, Red Raiders quarterbacks won NCAA passing titles in 2003, 2004, 2005 and 2007. A walk-on quarterback at Tech during the spring and summer of 2003 who then became a student coach, Riley immersed himself in head coach Mike Leach's offense and worked his way into a full-time position as wide receivers coach in 2007. He served as inside receivers coach in 2008 and '09, and eventually called plays as interim offensive coordinator in the 2010 Alamo Bowl, where the Red Raiders racked up 579 vards in a 41-31 victory over Michigan State to cap the 2009 season.

Under Riley's guidance in 2007, wide receiver Michael Crabtree won the Biletnikoff Award after smashing Big 12 records and NCAA freshman standards with 134 recentions. for 1,962 yards. Crabtree also accumulated 22 touchdown catches his first season. In fact, wide receiver Danny Amendola joined Crabtree that year as Texas Tech receivers who each amassed 100-catch, 1,000-yard efforts.

A 2006 Texas Tech graduate who earned a Bachelor of Science degree in exercise and sport sciences, Riley and his wife, Caitlin, have two daughters, Sloan and Stella.

NORMAN — Jalen Hurts accounted for six touchdowns and set the record for total offensive yards by a player in his Oklahoma debut as the Sooners beat Houston 49-31 to start the 2019 season. OU's 686 total yards were its most ever in a season opener.

A graduate transfer quarterback from Alabama, Hurts was 20 for 23 through the air for 332 yards and three touchdowns while running 16 times for a career-high 176 yards (11.0 average) and three more scores. His 508 yards of total offense smashed the school record for a Sooner debut, previously held by Baker Mayfield (396 vs. Akron in 2015).

Hurts became the first Sooner to ever throw for at least 300 yards and rush for at least 150 in a game, and the first player in Big 12 history to throw for at least 300 and rush for at least 150 while completing at least 80 percent of his passes.

OU ran for 354 yards and threw for 332 on the night.

The Sooner defense held a Houston offense that last year ranked seventh nationally in total yards per game (512.5) to 408 yards (5.9 per play). OU by comparison averaged 11.2 per play, third most in program history. Linebacker Kenneth Murray led the Sooners with 13 tackles and 2.5 tackles for loss while recording a pass breakup and a quarterback hurry.

NORMAN — Oklahoma outgained South Dakota 733 yards to 339 and registered its first three takeaways of the season in a 70-14 win over South Dakota. OU's 70 points were its most since a 79-10 home win over North Texas to open the 2007 campaign, and a school-record 10 Sooners scored touchdowns on the night.

Jalen Hurts completed 14 of 18 passes for 259 yards and three touchdowns while rushing eight times for 47 yards before leaving the game with 11:03 left in the third quarter. Redshirt freshman Tanner Mordecai replaced Hurts on OU's second possession of the third quarter with the Sooners leading 42-0 and promptly engineered a four-play, 68-yard touchdown drive in which he connected with freshman receiver Jadon Haselwood on a 14-yard score. It was the first career touchdown for both players. Mordecai finished 6 for 8 for 114 yards and two TDs. Freshman QB Spencer Rattler made his collegiate debut and threw for 50 yards and a TD on 4-for-4 passing and ran for 15 yards on two carries.

Sophomore defensive back Brendan Radley-Hiles recovered a second-quarter fumble and returned a third-quarter interception 30 yards for his first career TD. Freshman cornerback Jaden Davis added an interception with 11:12 left in the fourth quarter.
