## LIST A, B & C TABLES FOR DEER, ELK, PRONGHORN & BEAR

Misleading wording was included in the printed version of the brochure about how to get List A & B licenses in the big-game draws.

The wording implies that you can purchase one List A or one List B license through either the primary **or** the secondary draw, but not both.

**The correct information is:**  
If you draw a license in the primary draw, you can still apply for licenses in the secondary draw, too, with certain restrictions depending on the List type of the license.

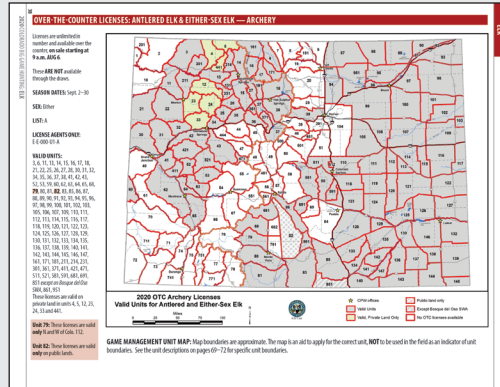

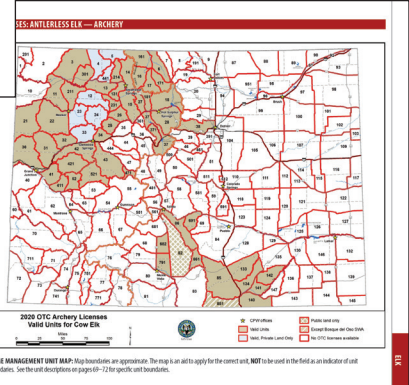
The over-the-counter archery elk maps were missing the bear paw symbol at the time of publication.

“MULTIPLE OPTIONS FOR HUNTING BEAR!” ORANGE BOX

Information for one of the options for hunting bear was incorrect at the time of publication. The “Hunter C” section incorrectly stated that a customer could purchase an over-the-counter archery deer or elk license.

**The correct information is:** For “Hunter C,” the only option for an over-the-counter archery license is for elk. Deer do not have OTC archery licenses available.

**MULTIPLE OPTIONS FOR HUNTING BEAR!**

There are multiple ways to get a license and hunt bear in Colorado for 2020; it just depends on what you'd like to do! For example:

**Hunter A:** Hunter A only likes to hunt bear, so hunter A would need to:

1. Apply for a **limited** archery, muzzleloader or rifle bear license from the hunt code tables on pages 63–65. And/or:
2. Buy an **over-the-counter** rifle bear license when OTC licenses go on sale Aug. 6 at 9 a.m. (*hunt code tables on page 67*).

**Hunter B:** Hunter B is planning to draw a deer or elk license, so hunter B has two options:

1. Also apply for a **limited** archery, muzzleloader or rifle bear license.
2. Wait to see if they are awarded an archery or muzzleloader deer or elk license, and then add on an **over-the-counter** bear license of the same method of take that matches at least one of the same units when OTC licenses go on sale.

**Hunter C:** Hunter C does not participate in the draw, but purchases an over-the-counter deer and/or elk license every year. Hunter C will wait until **over-the-counter** licenses go on sale, purchase an OTC archery deer or elk license, and then add on an OTC bear license of the same method of take that matches at least one of the same units.

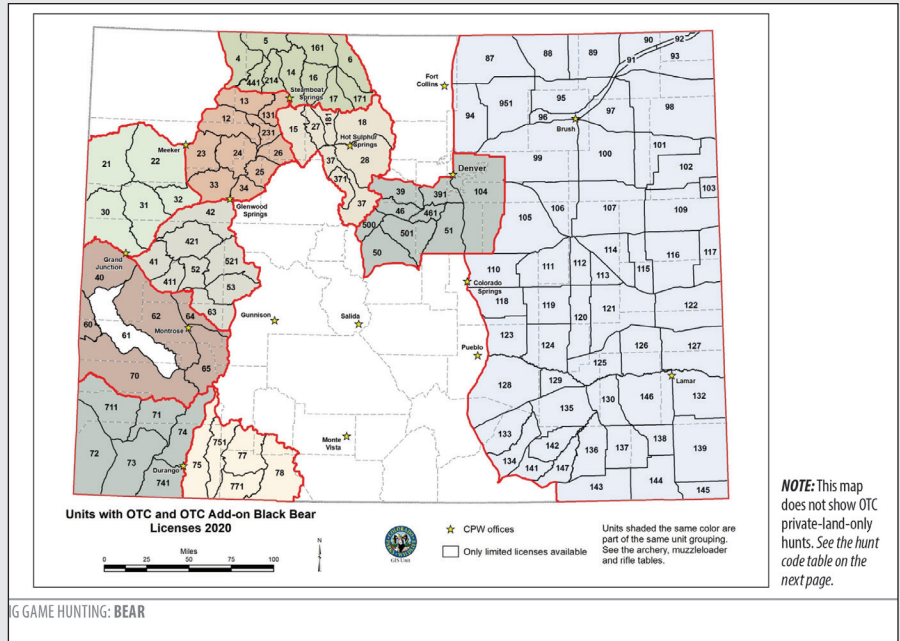
### OVER-THE-COUNTER BEAR MAP

The over-the-counter bear map was incorrect at the time of publication. Certain unit groupings were shaded the same color, indicating a customer could hunt all of those units, even though the list of units in the over-the-counter hunt code tables did not match the map shading.

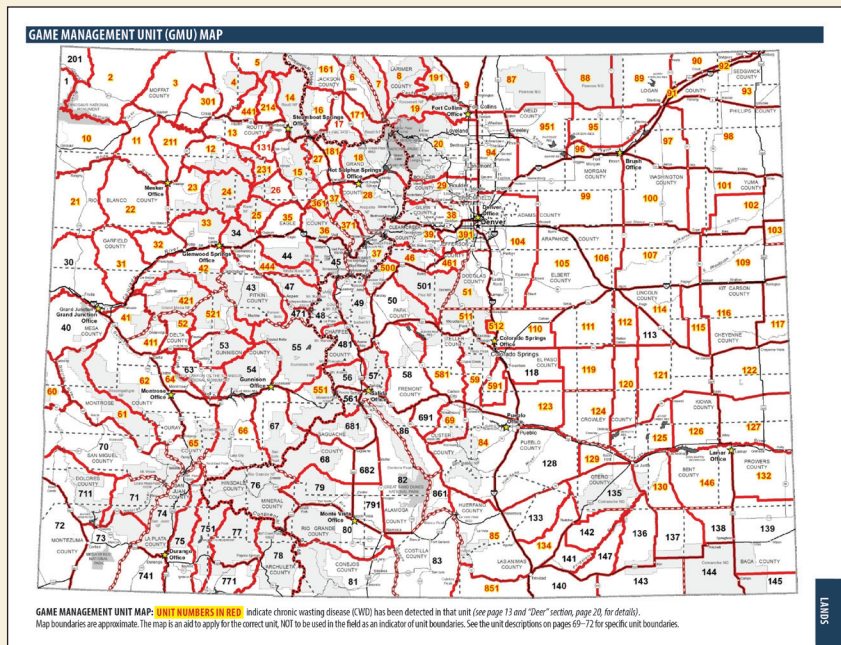

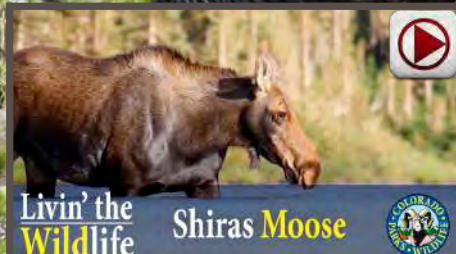

# WHAT'S NEW: 2020 REGULATION CHANGES & NEW INFORMATION

## ▶ NEW SECONDARY BIG GAME DRAW REPLACES THE LEFTOVER DRAW:

- Most elk, deer, pronghorn and bear licenses not issued through the primary draw will now be made available in a secondary draw that is **open to anyone**, whether they applied for the primary draw or not.
- There will no longer be a leftover draw.
- Applicants must have a qualifying license to apply for the secondary draw.
- The \$7 resident and \$9 nonresident application fees will apply per species for the secondary draw as well as the primary draw.
- The secondary draw does not use preference points, and you cannot apply for preference points.
- Secondary draw applications are accepted June 5–July 7, 8 p.m. MT.
- Any licenses remaining after the secondary draw (except for Ranching for Wildlife licenses) will be placed on the leftover list and available for purchase on leftover day, starting Aug. 4 at 9 a.m. MT.
- Applications for both the primary and secondary draws are only available online or by phone.
- NOTE:** "Unsuccessful options" have been removed for the draw application process. A list of hunt codes eligible for the secondary draw will be posted online June 5. Over-the-counter unlimited licenses will be available for purchase starting Aug. 6 at 9 a.m.

## ▶ VALID DATES FOR ANNUAL LICENSES & HABITAT STAMPS HAVE CHANGED:

Annual hunting and fishing licenses (such as fishing, small game, furbearer, resident combo small game/fishing) and Habitat Stamps will be valid March 1–March 31 of the following year (13 months), instead of April 1–March 31. **Annual and qualifying licenses go on sale March 1.**

## ▶ BIG GAME SEASON STRUCTURE CHANGES GO INTO EFFECT IN 2020:

The new 2020–2024 big game season structure starts in 2020. Some of the bigger changes include season choice hunts for bull and either-sex moose, and many **new** over-the-counter and limited licenses for archery, muzzleloader and rifle seasons for bear (see below).

## ▶ FLOAT GROUP CHANGES:

Many float groups — groups of hunt codes where the quota is shared between them — have changed this year. Be sure to apply for the hunt code you wish to hunt, as you may not be able to exchange your license once you receive it.

## ▶ LOOK FOR THE BEAR PAW SYMBOL TO GET AN ADD-ON OVER-THE-COUNTER ARCHERY OR MUZZLELOADER BEAR LICENSE!



Some archery and muzzleloader bear licenses are available in unlimited numbers this year as "add-on" licenses only: You can add on one of these bear licenses if you have a deer or elk license for the same method of take and at least one hunting unit overlaps.

Check the archery and muzzleloader hunt codes for deer (pages 22–25) and elk (pages 41–43) for the available add-on OTC bear license hunts. **Note that for some unit groupings, not every unit is valid for adding on an OTC bear license. Check the unit information in the tables carefully! Also see page 66 of the "Bear" section.**

## ▶ SEASON CHOICE HUNT OPTIONS FOR MOOSE:

Starting in 2020, you can hunt bull or either-sex moose during archery, muzzleloader and/or rifle seasons with the correct method of take in certain units until you fill your license. You must follow all applicable season restrictions, including season dates. See "Moose" section, page 58.

### NOTE: STATE OF COLORADO PROPERTIES

Not all state lands (shown in blue on most maps) are open to the public. Some require permission from the leaseholder. ## ▶ THE HUNT CODE LETTER FOR SEASON CHOICE HAS CHANGED:

Instead of the letter "R" at the end of season choice hunt codes, there will now be the letter "X." For example: **D-F-091-53-X**. See page 32 for the deer season choice hunt code table and page 61 for the moose season choice hunt code tables.

## ▶ HUNTING RESERVATIONS MAY NOW BE MADE ONLINE OR BY PHONE:

Hunters must make big-game hunting reservations for all properties that require them, either online at [cpw.state.co.us](http://cpw.state.co.us) (click "Buy & Apply") or through the **NEW** reservation phone number: **1-800-244-5613**

The following units are anticipated to become part of the hunting reservation system in 2020: GMUs 1, 11, 23, 40, 41, 211 and 441. Starting in May, visit [cpw.state.co.us/huntingreservations](http://cpw.state.co.us/huntingreservations) for updates and more information.

## ▶ BIG GAME WALK-IN ACCESS HAS EXPANDED:

## ▶ NEW NOVICE ADULT OUTREACH LICENSES:

## ▶ FIRST RESPONDER LIFETIME COMBO & ANNUAL SENIOR COMBO LICENSES NOW QUALIFYING LICENSES:

The new resident first responder combo small game/fishing license and the new annual senior combo small game/fishing license are now qualifying licenses for the big game draw(s). See pages 4–6.

## ▶ REMEMBER! IF YOU PLAN ON HUNTING SMALL GAME OR WATERFOWL WITH YOUR QUALIFYING LICENSE, EXTRA STEPS ARE REQUIRED:

All of the qualifying licenses for the big game draw(s) — except for annual spring turkey — require you to register with the Harvest Information Program (HIP) if you're planning on hunting small game or waterfowl. Register with HIP at [www.colohip.com](http://www.colohip.com) or **866-COLO-HIP (1-866-265-6447)**. Although small-game licenses go on sale March 1, HIP numbers are not available until April 1. You must also purchase the Colorado and Federal Waterfowl stamps, if applicable.

## ▶ MANDATORY CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE (CWD) TESTING IN SELECT GMUs:

In 2020, CPW will require mandatory submission of CWD test samples (heads) from all deer harvested during any of the rifle seasons from specific GMUs. There will be no charge for mandatory testing. Get more information about where and how to submit a CWD sample at [cpw.state.co.us/cwd](http://cpw.state.co.us/cwd). See page 21 of the "Deer" section for a list of the mandatory GMUs.

## ▶ VOLUNTARY CWD TESTING FEE WAIVED FOR SELECT GMUs:

In 2020, testing fees for voluntary submissions will be waived for all deer harvested during the archery and muzzleloader seasons in the mandatory-testing rifle GMUs. All other GMUs will have a fee of \$25 for voluntary testing. See page 21 of the "Deer" section for a list of the mandatory GMUs.

## ▶ VOLUNTARY CWD TESTING FEE:

In 2020, hunters not included in mandatory testing may choose to have their deer, elk or moose tested for CWD. Testing cost is \$25. Get more information about where and how to submit a CWD sample at: [cpw.state.co.us/cwd](http://cpw.state.co.us/cwd)

# NEW PLANNING YOUR HUNT

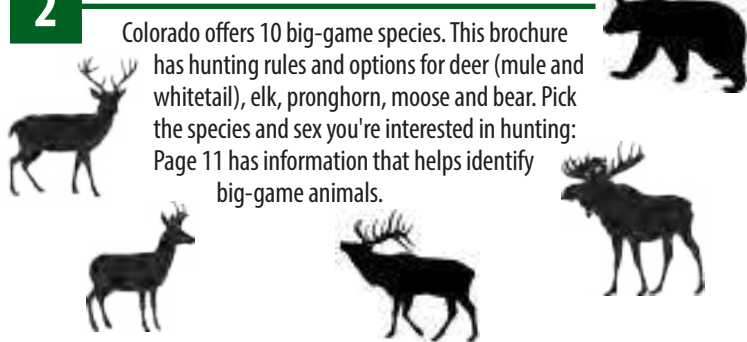

This brochure will help you decide which big-game species you'd like to hunt, when and where you'd like to hunt, what method of take you'd like to use and the requirements for getting your hunting license. It only takes a few steps to plan your hunt:

## 1 DO YOU HAVE YOUR HUNTER EDUCATION?

You'll need to have your hunter education certification and card number before applying for the draw(s) or purchasing a hunting license if you were born after Jan. 1, 1949. Remember that you *must* carry proof of hunter education in the field when you hunt! See pages 5–6 for additional license requirements.

## 2 WHICH SPECIES DO YOU WANT TO HUNT?



Colorado offers 10 big-game species. This brochure has hunting rules and options for deer (mule and whitetail), elk, pronghorn, moose and bear. Pick the species and sex you're interested in hunting: Page 11 has information that helps identify big-game animals.

## 3 WHERE DO YOU WANT TO HUNT?

Colorado is divided into hunting areas called game management units (i.e. GMUs). It's important that every hunter knows the boundaries of their hunting area, including private land boundaries. Check out the state map and unit descriptions in the back of this brochure or online:

## 4 WHEN DO YOU WANT TO HUNT?

In general for deer, elk and bear hunting, archery season starts in early Sept. and lasts almost a month. Muzzleloader season starts in the middle of archery season, and four rifle seasons follow that.

The first rifle season is limited to elk and bear hunting only. The second, third and fourth rifle seasons are for elk, bear **and** deer hunters, who will be in the field at the same time.

## 5 WHAT DO YOU WANT TO HUNT WITH?

Colorado has seasons for archery, muzzleloader and rifle hunting. Legal requirements for the various methods and transporting them in the field are described in this brochure.



## 6 TYPES OF LICENSES YOU CAN GET

Each year, a set (limited) number of licenses is allotted to each GMU. You can apply for the big game draw(s) to get one of these limited licenses, or after the draws are over, you can purchase a remaining limited license (leftover limited license) when they go on sale.

Some licenses for elk, pronghorn and bear are also available without needing to enter the draw(s) and are not restricted in quantity (unlimited). These can be purchased over the counter after they go on sale in person, online and at sales agents around the state.

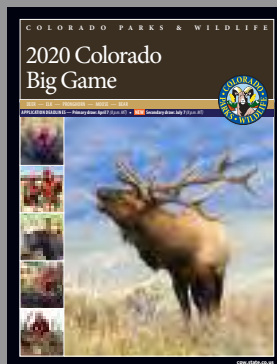
## 7 READ THIS BROCHURE!

# NEW HUNTING LICENSE TERMS & DEFINITIONS

## LICENSE TYPES

- ◆ **Qualifying licenses:** A current-year qualifying license is required in order to apply for any of the big-game draws. *See page 4 for more.*
- ◆ **Limited licenses:** A set (limited) number of licenses are available for specific units and dates for each species, and are issued through an application and draw process.

### LIMITED LICENSES INCLUDE:

**Public land licenses:** Licenses you can get through the draw(s) that are valid on all CPW-owned or leased public lands, private lands and most federal lands in the specific units listed on your license/in this brochure.

**Private-land-only licenses:** Licenses you can get through the draw(s) that are only valid on private lands in the specific GMUs listed on your license/in this brochure. **If your license hunt code has a "P" in the second-to-last part, it's valid on private land ONLY. For example: E-F-007-P5-R**

**Leftover limited licenses:** Licenses that weren't issued in the primary draw. They become the licenses eligible for the secondary draw, and any remaining licenses after the secondary draw become available as over-the-counter leftover limited licenses (*see "OTC leftover limited licenses" below*).

**Ranching for Wildlife (RFW) licenses:** Licenses that are available on certain ranch properties for Colorado residents only. *See: [cpw.state.co.us/rfw](http://cpw.state.co.us/rfw)*

**Season choice licenses:** Licenses that let you hunt in any or all of the seasons (archery, muzzleloader and/or rifle) in specified units with the correct method of take until your license is filled. These licenses are available for deer and **NEW** bull or either-sex moose only. *See pages 32 and 61.*

- ◆ **Over-the-counter (OTC) licenses:** Licenses (unlimited, unlimited add-on bear and leftover limited) that are available without having to go through the draw(s). They do not require buying/having a qualifying license, do not use preference points and may be purchased any time through the day before the applicable hunting season begins. They're available at over 700 sales agents around the state, online or by phone.

### OVER-THE-COUNTER LICENSES INCLUDE:

**Unlimited licenses:** Licenses that are not restricted in quantity by CPW. You may purchase these licenses when over-the-counter licenses go on sale. "Unlimited" does not mean you can purchase an unlimited number of licenses: *See the "List A, B & C" definition at top right.*

**NEW Add-on bear licenses:** If you have an archery or muzzleloader deer or elk license, you can purchase an OTC bear license for the same method of take. At least one hunting unit must overlap on both licenses. *See the deer and elk hunt tables for available hunts (look for the bear paw symbol!), pages 20 and 35, and "Bear," page 66.*

**OTC leftover limited licenses:** Licenses that weren't issued in the primary or secondary draws that go on the leftover list; reissued licenses (*see "reissues," bottom right*) also go onto the list. These are available for purchase in person, online or at sales agents starting on leftover day (*see page 4*).

- ◆ **Landowner preference program (LPP) vouchers:** The LPP encourages private landowners to provide habitat for the benefit of wildlife populations and to relieve hunting pressure on public lands. Deer, elk and pronghorn vouchers are allocated to landowners who meet certain qualifications. Applications are drawn during the primary draw, and successful landowners receive a voucher for each winning hunt code. The voucher is transferred directly to a hunter, who then purchases a license to hunt. *See page 7 and [cpw.state.co.us/bg/landowner](http://cpw.state.co.us/bg/landowner).*

## BIG GAME DRAWS

**Primary draw:** The first, main big-game draw of the year for hunters applying for limited hunting licenses.

**NEW Secondary draw:** This draw replaces the big-game leftover draw from past years and includes deer, elk, pronghorn and bear. Applicants can apply for the secondary draw whether or not they applied for the primary draw. Preference points will not be used.

## LIST A, B & C

**List A, B & C:** All big-game hunting licenses are either List A, B or C, as indicated in the hunt code tables (*see image at right* ▶) or next to most of the OTC maps. The List types exist so that you know if you can get more than one license for the same species:

- ◆ **List A:** You can only get **ONE** List A license = **A**
- ◆ **List B:** If a hunt is List B, you can get up to **TWO** licenses: one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B** or **B+B**
- ◆ **List C:** If a hunt is List C, you can get **ANY** number of List C licenses, as well as one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B+C+C+C**, etc. or **B+B+C+C+C**, etc.

## PREFERENCE POINTS

**Preference points:** Preference points help hunters to be successful in future primary draws because points add up per species until an applicant draws a first-choice license. One preference point is awarded to each applicant who qualifies for and **DOES NOT** draw their first-choice limited license for deer, elk, pronghorn or bear in the primary draw, or who applies using a specific preference-point hunt code that gets them a preference point only as their first choice.

**Weighted preference points:** For moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat, applicants with at least three preference points will be awarded a weighted preference point in subsequent draws and will be given weighted preference during the license draw. *See page 9 and [cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference](http://cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference) for more details.*

## OTHER DEFINITIONS

**Carcass tag:** The bottom portion of a hunting license, to be signed, removed and kept with the carcass **ONLY** after harvesting the animal.

**CWD:** CWD is a fatal neurological disease that attacks the brains of deer, elk and moose, and has been found in several regions in the state. In 2020, CPW will require mandatory submission of CWD test samples for deer from certain units. *See pages 13 and 20.*

**Float groups:** When the quota — or number of licenses available — is assigned to a group of hunt codes, rather than just one, that is considered a float group. If you draw or purchase a hunt code in a float group, you may exchange that hunt code for another hunt in that group for a fee as long as your season hasn't started.

**GMU:** Hunttable areas are broken down into units called "game management units." These units help you decide where you'd like to hunt. *See the GMU map on the inside back cover.*

**Method of take:** Colorado has hunting seasons based on archery, muzzleloader and rifle/associated methods. *See table on page 14 for details on which method you can use to hunt each of the big-game species in this brochure.*

**Refunds:** You can get a refund **OR** have your preference points restored for a big-game license that you draw. You must return the license to CPW at least 30 days before the start of the season for which the license is valid.

**Reissues:** Most limited licenses that have been returned will be made available to other hunters through a reissue process. Returned limited licenses that took 5 or more preference points to draw will be offered to the next applicant in line, up to 5 applicants. Those that took 4 or fewer preference points to draw will be available to the public on the leftover list.

**Exchanges:** You can also exchange a license, as long as the license you want to get is for a hunt code for the same species as the current license and there is quota remaining (except for float groups and unlimited licenses). In most cases, you can exchange from an OTC license to a limited license of the same species and vice versa. Note that there are no refunds or preference point restorations available on exchanged licenses. The fee to exchange is half the cost of the license, not to exceed \$25. Once a season starts, an exchange is no longer available.

# LICENSE OPTIONS, AVAILABILITY & DATES

**REMEMBER!** You may submit one application for each species, per draw, per year. For each draw application, you may fill in up to 4 hunt code choices.

## LICENSE SALES DATES

Colorado offers many different options for obtaining the various types of big-game licenses:

### ► QUALIFYING LICENSES

**On sale starting March 1**

All applicants must first purchase or hold a qualifying hunting license for the current license year **BEFORE** applying for either the primary or secondary big game draws. Online draw applications will not be accessible until you purchase your qualifying license.

Qualifying licenses are 2020 annual resident and nonresident small game, annual resident combo small game/fishing, **NEW** annual resident senior combo small game/fishing (these licenses are valid March 1, 2020–March 31, 2021), annual resident and nonresident spring turkey, resident veteran lifetime combo small game/fishing and **NEW** resident first responder lifetime combo small game/fishing. Licenses must be valid for the current 2020 license year and are available for purchase starting **March 1**. A 2020 Habitat Stamp will be automatically added when purchasing your qualifying license, if applicable.

### ► LIMITED LICENSES: PRIMARY DRAW

**Available through the draw process**

**Applications accepted: March 1–April 7 (8 p.m. MT)**

To get limited licenses or preference points, hunters must apply for the draw by **April 7, 8 p.m. MT**. These licenses include public-land, private-land-only (PLO) and Ranching for Wildlife (RFW) licenses.

### ► **NEW** LIMITED LICENSES: SECONDARY DRAW

**Available through the draw process**

**Applications accepted: June 5–July 7 (8 p.m. MT)**

The secondary draw replaces the leftover draw of previous years and is now open to everyone. It includes the remaining limited licenses with quota from the primary draw for deer, elk, pronghorn and bear.

By applying through your online account for this draw, you can skip waiting in line and have the opportunity to secure your license before they go on sale to the public on leftover day!

- This draw is open to all applicants, whether you applied for the primary draw or not. If you draw a license in the primary draw, you can still apply for the secondary draw, too.
- You must have a qualifying license in order to apply for this draw.
- The \$7 resident and \$9 nonresident application fees will apply for this draw.
- This draw does not use preference points, and you cannot apply for them.
- Youth ages 12–17 receive priority for all licenses in this draw.
- Applications for both the primary and secondary draws are only available online or by phone.
- **NOTE:** "Unsuccessful options" have been removed for the draw application process. A list of hunt codes eligible for the secondary draw will be posted online June 5. Over-the-counter unlimited licenses will be available for purchase starting Aug. 6 at 9 a.m. (see below).
- Any licenses remaining after the secondary draw (except for Ranching for Wildlife licenses) will be placed on the leftover list and available for purchase starting Aug. 4 at 9 a.m. (see below).

### ► LEFTOVER LIMITED LICENSES: OVER-THE-COUNTER (OTC)

**On sale starting August 4 (9 a.m. MT)**

Available in person at sales agents ([cpw.state.co.us/license-agents](http://cpw.state.co.us/license-agents)), by phone at **1-800-244-5613** or online: [cpw.state.co.us](http://cpw.state.co.us) (click "Buy and Apply")

- Reissued licenses will be available on the leftover list. Any additional reissued hunt codes that are not on the initial list will be added starting **Aug. 11**. Hunt codes will continue to release Tues.–Fri., 9 a.m.–4 p.m., until the end of the season.

### ► UNLIMITED LICENSES: OVER-THE-COUNTER (OTC)

**On sale starting August 6 (9 a.m. MT)**

Available in person at sales agents ([cpw.state.co.us/license-agents](http://cpw.state.co.us/license-agents)), by phone at **1-800-244-5613** or online: [cpw.state.co.us](http://cpw.state.co.us) (click "Buy and Apply") After the season starts, they are available at CPW locations only — except for OTC archery elk, OTC plains rifle either-sex elk and OTC archery pronghorn licenses, which can be purchased at any sales agent. **NEW** Add-on bear licenses are unlimited over-the-counter licenses.

### LICENSE SALES CUTOFF DATES

Over-the-counter licenses can be purchased at sales agents, by phone and online through the day before the season starts. Once the season starts, they're only available in person at CPW locations:

Muzzleloader .....	Sept. 11
1st Rifle.....	Oct. 9
2nd Rifle .....	Oct. 23
3rd Rifle .....	Nov. 6
4th Rifle .....	Nov. 17

Some CPW locations offer extended hours on these days; check online.

**EXCEPTION:** You can still purchase OTC archery elk, OTC plains rifle either-sex elk and OTC archery pronghorn licenses at any sales agent throughout the applicable season.

## NONRESIDENT LICENSE ALLOCATIONS

Nonresident allocations are determined by the average number of preference points a Colorado resident needed to draw a specific license during a 3-year period that ended with the 2009 drawing. (Units with low numbers of available licenses may not have any remaining for nonresidents after resident licenses are drawn.)

1. For elk and deer hunt codes that required six or more points for a Colorado resident to draw, up to 20 percent may go to nonresidents. These hunts are designated in unit tables by a + under the SEX column.
2. For hunt codes that required fewer than six points for a Colorado resident to draw an elk or deer license, up to 35 percent may go to nonresidents.
3. Nonresident allocations may increase if licenses remain after all Colorado resident first choices have been drawn for that hunt code.
4. License allocations do not apply to private-land-only and Ranching for Wildlife licenses.
5. In a group of applications made up of both residents and nonresidents, all nonresidents in the group will count against the nonresident allocation.

## WHAT YOU NEED TO BUY A LICENSE

- 1 ► **ID:** Secure and verifiable ID (See [cpw.state.co.us/secure-verifiable-id](http://cpw.state.co.us/secure-verifiable-id) for more information.) **AND:**
  - **PROOF** of residency for Colorado residents. (See page 6.)
- 2 **PROOF** of hunter education. (See page 6.)
- 3 **HABITAT STAMP:** A 2020 or lifetime Habitat Stamp is required prior to buying a license or purchasing a qualifying license to apply for the draw(s) for anyone ages 18–64. One will be automatically added to your purchase, if applicable. (See page 6.)
- 4 **QUALIFYING LICENSE:** Required **ONLY** for participation in the big-game draw(s). (See page 6.)

**NOTE:** A Social Security number is required for hunters age 12 and older.

## LICENSE REQUIREMENTS

- You must have a license to hunt. Sign it and carry the original with you while hunting.
- You must carry proof of hunter education while in the field.
- You may hunt only the animal, sex, season, units and method of take authorized by the license. Complete season dates may not be printed on the license because of space constraints. Check the details in this brochure for your specific license.
- It is illegal to give false information to obtain a license. It also is illegal to alter a license, or to loan, transfer, sell or give your license to someone else.
- If you lose or destroy your license, a duplicate is available for half the price of the original license, not to exceed \$25. You can get a duplicate before the season opens from any sales agent. After the season begins, duplicate licenses are available only at CPW locations.
- Licenses expire on the expiration date printed on the license.
- Nonresidents can continue to use their combo fishing license after harvesting a big-game animal, as long as the carcass tag is the only part of the license that has been detached. The rest of the license must remain intact. The fishing license is good through March 31, 2021.

## ACCEPTED FORMS OF PAYMENT

■ **Online and by phone:** Visa, Mastercard, Discover credit/debit cards and CPW gift certificates.

**NOTE:** If you're applying for the big game draw(s), you **must** provide a credit card number, or a Visa or Mastercard gift certificate number, to keep on file in your online account to be charged for your license. CPW gift certificates **cannot** be kept on file in your account.

■ **CPW offices/parks:** In addition to the above: check, money order, traveler's checks and cash.

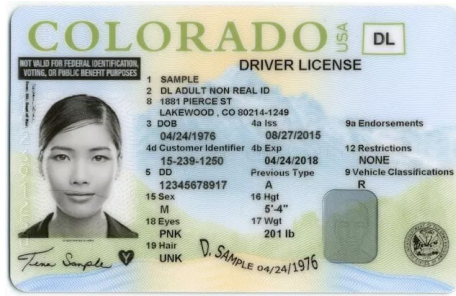
■ **Sales agents:** Any form of payment the agent accepts. CPW gift certificates are **not** valid.

## 1 SECURE ID & RESIDENCY REQUIREMENTS

### ▶ [cpw.state.co.us/proofofresidency](http://cpw.state.co.us/proofofresidency)

- ▶ The physical residence address you give to buy or apply for a license must be the same as the address given for Colorado state income tax purposes.
- ▶ You terminate your Colorado residency if you apply for, buy or accept a resident hunting, fishing or trapping license issued by another state or foreign country, register to vote outside Colorado or accept a driver's license that shows an address other than in Colorado.
- ▶ CPW **cannot** accept Colorado-issued drivers licenses, permits or IDs that state **"Not valid for federal identification, voting or public benefit purposes"** (see image above). You will need another valid form of identification to purchase a hunting or fishing license in Colorado. See: [cpw.state.co.us/secure-verifiable-id](http://cpw.state.co.us/secure-verifiable-id)  
**NOTE:** CPW **can** accept valid drivers licenses, permits or IDs issued by another state, even if those out-of-state documents do not meet federal REAL ID requirements.



Above: Colorado "blackline" licenses may not be used as secure and verifiable identification or to prove residency.

## RESIDENCY TYPES

### 1. STANDARD COLORADO RESIDENT

- a. **Requirements:** You must live in Colorado for at least 6 consecutive months prior to buying or applying for any resident CPW product, have your primary residence in Colorado and have not applied for or purchased a resident license or pass outside of Colorado in the last 6 months.
- b. **Proof:** Current and valid Colorado driver's license/ID with a Colorado address issued 6 or more months prior. If the Colorado driver's license/ID is not 6 months old, you must provide at least two forms of additional residency proof, as outlined in "Additional Residency Proofs" below.

### 2. STUDENT: ATTENDING SCHOOL FULL-TIME IN COLORADO

- a. **Requirements:** You must be attending school full time at an accredited Colorado school starting at least 6 months prior to buying or applying for any resident CPW product.
- b. **Proof:** Student ID, name of institution, date you became a full-time student, school transcript showing full-time status.

### 3. STUDENT: ATTENDING SCHOOL FULL-TIME OUTSIDE OF COLORADO

- a. **Requirements:** You must meet Colorado residency requirements and be attending an accredited school outside of Colorado, paying nonresident tuition.
- b. **Proof:** Student ID, name of institution, date you became a full-time student, proof of out-of-state tuition payment.

### 4. MILITARY: STATIONED IN COLORADO

- a. **Requirements:** You must be active-duty military stationed in Colorado (including your spouse/dependents). Residency begins the date the orders begin.
- b. **Proof:** Military ID and orders.

### 5. MILITARY: COLORADO HOME OF RECORD

- a. **Requirements:** You must be active-duty military stationed outside of Colorado, but with Colorado as your home of record, paying income tax as a Colorado resident (including your spouse/dependents).
- b. **Proof:** Military ID and orders.

### 6. YOUTH

Children under the age of 18 have the same residency status as their parent, legal guardian or person with whom they live the majority of the time per court order.

## OTHER RESIDENCY INFORMATION

### 1. ADDITIONAL RESIDENCY PROOFS

If you otherwise meet residency requirements but your Colorado driver's license or ID was issued or renewed less than 6 months ago, or you have a CPW-approved religious exemption to photo identification on your record, you must provide at least two additional proofs of residency showing 6 consecutive months of Colorado residency immediately prior to buying or applying for a license. Those proofs include: income sources (pay stubs), utility bills, state income tax documents (as a full-time resident), lease agreements/rent receipts, motor vehicle registration, voter registration.

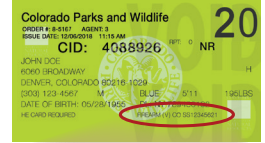
### 2. MULTIPLE HOMES

If you have a home in Colorado and another location, call 303-297-1192 to make sure you comply with Colorado residency requirements before obtaining a CPW license or state park pass.

## 2 HUNTER EDUCATION

### HUNTER EDUCATION (SAFETY) REQUIREMENTS

1. Anyone born on or after January 1, 1949, is required to have a hunter education card to hunt in Colorado.
2. A hunter education card is required to apply for or buy a hunting license.
3. Your hunter education card must be carried while hunting, unless it is verified and your license is marked with a "V." To get your hunter education card verified, take your hunter education card to a CPW office or state park.
4. CPW honors hunter education cards from other states, provinces and countries.

### HUNTER EDUCATION EXEMPTIONS

1. Individuals over age 50 or active duty U.S. military and veterans can obtain a hunter education certificate by testing out of hunter education: [cpw.state.co.us/HunterEdTestOut](http://cpw.state.co.us/HunterEdTestOut)
2. A one-time apprentice certificate can be obtained for hunters who are at least 10 years old (12 for big game) and who must be accompanied by a mentor in the field: [cpw.state.co.us/apprenticecertificate](http://cpw.state.co.us/apprenticecertificate)

## 3 HABITAT STAMPS

Habitat Stamps are **REQUIRED** for hunters and cost \$10.13; only one is required per person, per year for anyone ages 18–64. **NEW Habitat Stamps are now valid March 1–March 31 of the following year (13 months).**



- ▶ A lifetime stamp is \$304.11.
- ▶ **One 2020 Habitat Stamp will automatically be added to your first hunting or fishing license purchase of each license year, if applicable.**

When you purchase your qualifying license in order to apply for the draw(s), a 2020 Habitat Stamp will automatically be added if you haven't purchased one already and are ages 18–64. Habitat Stamps are non-refundable, even if you are unsuccessful in the draw.

- ▶ Anyone who holds a free resident lifetime fishing license, resident veteran lifetime combo small game/fishing license or **NEW resident first responder lifetime combo small-game/fishing license**, or is approved for the Big Game Mobility Impaired Hunting Program is exempt from the Habitat Stamp requirement. ## 4 QUALIFYING LICENSES

A current-year qualifying license is required in order to apply for the big-game draw(s). Qualifying licenses are annual resident and nonresident small game, annual resident combo small game/fishing, **NEW annual resident senior combo small game/fishing** (these licenses are valid March 1, 2020–March 31, 2021), annual resident and nonresident spring turkey, resident veteran lifetime combo small game/fishing and **NEW resident first responder lifetime combo small game/fishing**. Hunters who wish to purchase a **leftover limited or over-the-counter license do not need to have a qualifying license.**

# OTHER LICENSE OPTIONS

## LANDOWNER PREFERENCE PROGRAM (LPP)

### FOR LANDOWNERS:

1. Deer, elk and pronghorn licenses (*in units that are totally limited for all rifle licenses*) are allocated to deeded landowners who own at least 160 contiguous acres of private agricultural land. Further qualifications apply: [cpw.state.co.us/bg/landowner](http://cpw.state.co.us/bg/landowner)
2. Landowner preference quotas are:
  - ▶ **GMUs WEST OF I-25:** 10 percent of the quota of public licenses may be issued as a voucher valid for a specific hunt code. An additional 10 percent of the public quota may be issued as a private-land-only voucher.
  - ▶ **GMUs EAST OF I-25:** 15 percent of the quota of public licenses may be issued as a voucher valid for a specific hunt code. An additional 10 percent of the public quota may be issued as a private-land-only voucher and may only be transferred to a youth or an immediate family member.
3. LPP applications are drawn just before CPW's public limited drawing. Successful landowners receive a voucher for each winning hunt code. Landowners will be notified at the same time as public applicants.
4. The deadline to register for 2020 has passed. Registrations for 2021 may be submitted through Dec. 1, 2020, at the web address listed above. Registrations are valid for up to five years.

### FOR HUNTERS:

1. The landowner or designated land manager must transfer the voucher directly to the hunter. A voucher that has been transferred by any person who is not the landowner or designated land manager is void. A voucher that is brokered for another person is void. A hunting license obtained for use with a void voucher is also void. No person shall broker a voucher on behalf of any landowner or person, or use or possess any brokered voucher.
2. Landowner vouchers may be transferred one time only. The transfer of the voucher occurs when the hunter's name is written on the voucher, or the landowner or designated land manager hands (or mails) the voucher to the hunter.
3. If a hunter cannot use a voucher, the voucher becomes **VOID**. The voucher **CANNOT** be reprinted or transferred to another hunter, even if the voucher has not been redeemed for a license.
4. Annual bag limits still apply. Be sure you can legally have the license before acquiring a landowner voucher. List A, B or C is printed on the voucher. *See pages 20, 36 and 53 for details.*
5. The transfer of a voucher by a landowner or designated land manager must include permission to access and hunt all of the registered land for which the voucher was awarded, and for the entire season for which the voucher was awarded, without discrimination among hunters entering the land. Restrictions are not allowed, except for manner of access (*i.e. foot, horseback, vehicle*) reasonably necessary to prevent damage to land.
6. The voucher must be taken to a sales agent or CPW location in person to be redeemed for a proper and valid license **PRIOR** to hunting. The appropriate license fees are paid at that time.
7. A list of landowners is **NOT** available from Colorado Parks and Wildlife.

## AUCTION & RAFFLE LICENSES: WIN THE HUNT OF A LIFETIME!

Special auction and raffle licenses are available for deer, elk, pronghorn, moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat. A total of 18 auction and raffle licenses allows one to hunt during extended seasons in any unit open to hunting a certain species. ## SPECIAL LICENSES

CPW offers several programs for hunters and anglers with disabilities. Go to [cpw.state.co.us/accessibility](http://cpw.state.co.us/accessibility) for more information on each program and how to apply. *These programs require advance legal paperwork submissions.*

### HUNTERS WITH DISABILITIES

Accommodation permits are available to hunters with disabilities. Hunters must have a temporary or permanent disability that significantly impairs major life functions and the ability to hunt.

### HUNTERS WITH MOBILITY IMPAIRMENTS

Some doe deer, cow elk and doe pronghorn licenses are offered to hunters with mobility impairments. Hunters must have a mobility impairment result-

ing from permanent medical conditions, making it physically impossible to hunt without someone else's help.

### RESIDENT VETERAN LIFETIME PROGRAM

Military veterans who are disabled, residents of Colorado and have proof of a service-connected disability (with an overall combined rating of 60% or more by the Dept. of Veteran's Affairs) can obtain a lifetime combo small game/fishing license.

### RESIDENT FIRST RESPONDER LIFETIME PROGRAM

Colorado residents who are disabled first responders and have proof of a permanent occupational disability can obtain a lifetime combo small game/fishing license.

## REFUNDS

1. Application fees, the \$10.13 Habitat Stamp fee, qualifying licenses, and preference point fees are nonrefundable.
2. **If you drew a license you would like to return, payment for the license is still required first.** You can then return it for a refund **OR** preference point restoration. You must relinquish your license **AND** carcass tag at least 30 days before opening day of the season for which the license is valid.
  - ▶ License must be accompanied by a completed request form obtained at a CPW location or our website. Most refunds are subject to a \$15 processing fee. Preference points are reinstated to a pre-draw level. You do **NOT** receive an additional preference point for 2020.
  - ▶ Requests must be postmarked at least **30 DAYS** before the season for which the license is valid starts and mailed to CPW, attn: Refund Office, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216. A license cannot be recovered once it has been returned along with a refund or preference point restoration request form to CPW.
3. Once there are fewer than 30 days until the season starts, refunds or preference point restorations are limited to extreme medical circumstances of the licensee, death of the licensee or death of the licensee's immediate family member, members of the U.S. military whose service prevented them from requesting a refund or reinstatement on time, or jury duty which overlaps with the season dates on the license.
  - ▶ These requests must be accompanied by evidence that the license has not been used **AND** the circumstances that precluded the licensee from being able to make their request 30 days or more from season start.
  - ▶ Customers with an extreme medical circumstance will need to fill out the new Extreme Medical Exception request form. Find instructions online: [cpw.state.co.us/refunds](http://cpw.state.co.us/refunds)

## REISSUES

1. Limited licenses that are returned may be available for purchase on the leftover license list. Leftover licenses go on sale starting Aug. 4 at 9 a.m. All additional reissued licenses that are not on the initial leftover list will be added starting Aug. 11. Hunt codes will continue to release Tues.–Fri., 9 a.m.–4 p.m., until the end of the season.

## EXCHANGES

1. All license exchanges will be charged a fee of half the cost of the original license, not to exceed \$25.
2. No refunds or preference point restorations are available on exchanged licenses.
3. Exchanges can be completed at a CPW office or park up until the day before the season starts on the original license. Once a season starts, an exchange is no longer available.
4. Licenses may only be exchanged for a hunt code for the same species as the current license.
5. Exchanges cannot be completed until leftover limited licenses and OTC licenses go on sale: Aug. 4 for leftover licenses, Aug. 6 for OTC licenses.

PREFERENCE POINTS

1. **ONE PREFERENCE POINT IS AWARDED PER SPECIES APPLIED FOR** to hunters who apply properly and are unsuccessful in drawing a license for a first-choice hunt code in the primary draw for big-game species in this brochure. You may apply for a preference point as your first-choice hunt code (*see below*).

**Preference points are only used during the primary draw, they do NOT apply for the secondary draw.**

- 2. **YOUTH AGES 12–17** can apply for a point. Youth age 11 can also apply for a point provided they turn 12 in 2020.
- 3. **PREFERENCE POINT HUNT CODE:** You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your application to use another year; specific preference-point hunt codes are listed at the beginning of each species section in this brochure. You can also choose other hunt codes as your second, third or fourth choices. Do not submit a separate application for preference points, or both applications will be disqualified.
- 4. **IF YOU ARE ISSUED A FIRST-CHOICE LICENSE,** all accumulated preference points for that species become void and return to zero.
- 5. **POINTS ACCUMULATE** until you draw a first-choice license. If an applicant fails to apply for a species or has not purchased a license for that same species during any given 10-year period, all accumulated preference points for that species become void.
- 6. **PRIORITY** goes to those with the most points, except when the license quota or nonresident cap would be exceeded, and except for the hybrid draw. *See page 19 for hybrid draw information and hunt codes.*
- 7. **GROUP APPLICATION** priority is based on the member with the fewest points. *See "Apply as a Group" at [cpw.state.co.us/bg/planyourhunt](http://cpw.state.co.us/bg/planyourhunt).*
- 8. **SECOND-, third-, fourth-choice, over-the-counter, leftover limited licenses** and the secondary draw don't use or generate points.
- 9. **PREFERENCE POINT FEE:** The preference point fee no longer applies to deer, elk, pronghorn or bear. See right for details on the preference point fee.
- 10. **CURRENT PREFERENCE POINT LEVELS** will be listed in your CPW account: Go to [cpw.state.co.us](http://cpw.state.co.us) and click "Buy and Apply."
- 11. **PREFERENCE POINTS ARE NOT TRANSFERABLE BETWEEN HUNTERS.** Points are awarded for specific species, not for hunt codes, sex, unit(s), season(s) or method of take.
- 12. **ACTIVE DUTY U.S. MILITARY** stationed in Colorado or who claim Colorado as their home of residence and are deployed outside the U.S. are eligible, when they return home, to apply for preference points for any primary draws they missed while deployed. Applications will be available at the end of July.

PREFERENCE POINT FEE

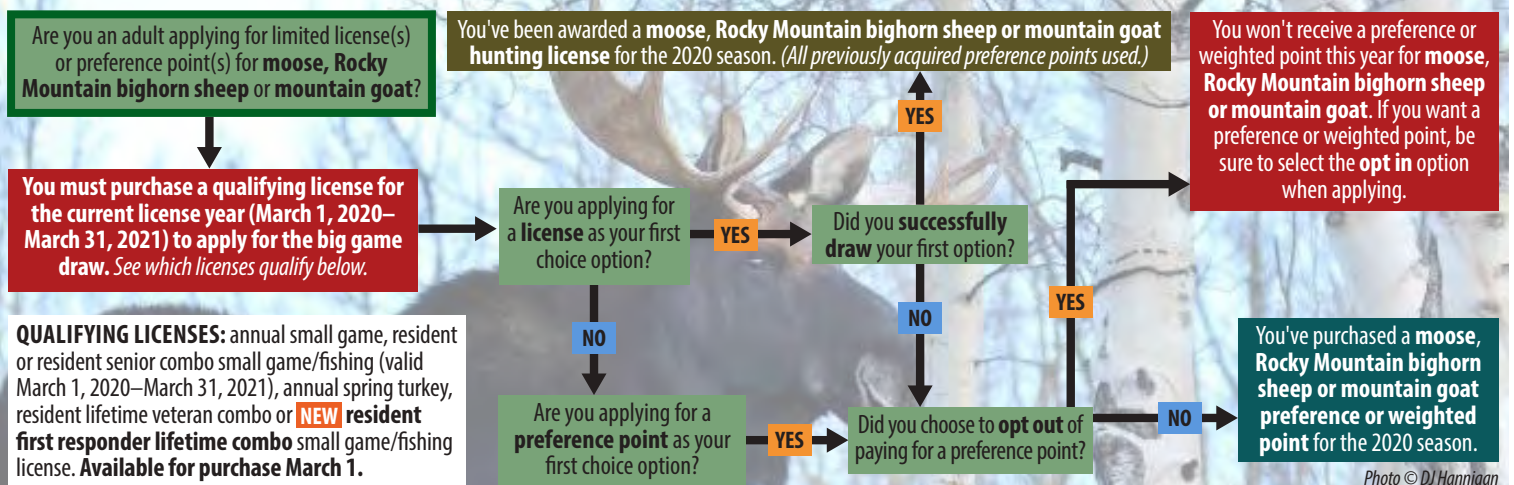
- ▶ Moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat have a preference and weighted preference point fee. If you apply for a preference point hunt code as your first choice or are unsuccessful in drawing your first choice hunt, **you'll be charged a \$50 resident or \$100 nonresident preference point fee.** *The fee is waived for youth, resident lifetime license holders and residents who are in the military on active duty outside Colorado.*
- ▶ You'll have the option to **OPT OUT** of paying the preference point fee while filling out your draw application(s), and therefore will not be charged the fee and will **NOT** acquire a preference or weighted point for 2020. This includes if you apply for a preference point hunt code as your first choice.
- ▶ If you apply for a point only, your credit card on file will be charged after the draw. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. If your card can't be charged, we will email you. If you don't pay by the payment deadline (**JUNE 19**), you will forfeit your preference point for 2020.

WEIGHTED PREFERENCE POINTS

- 1. There are three species of big-game animals that use the weighted preference point system to award licenses in Colorado: moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat.
- 2. Weighted preference increases your probability of drawing and applies to both male and female licenses.
- 3. Hunters can only accumulate up to three points for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat. If you have three preference points and you fail to draw a first-choice license, you will receive weighted preference.
- 4. Weighted preference is calculated by converting your application number into a different, random application number, then dividing that new application number by the number of weighted points you have, plus one. Individuals with three preference points and no weighted preference will have their application number divided by one.
- 5. This generates a new application number. Applications are sorted by this new number from lowest to highest, and low numbers for each hunt code are awarded licenses.

**NOTE:** The preference point fee for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat applies to preference points **AND** weighted preference points. Go to [cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference](http://cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference) for more details.

## HOW TO READ HUNT CODES

### HUNT CODES CONTAIN A LOT OF INFORMATION:

Learning how to read hunt codes can ensure that you apply for the right hunt in the limited license draw(s) each year. **Hunt codes are an 8-character code used to designate species, sex, GMU, season and method of take:**

- FIRST CHARACTER** designates the species:
  - D** = deer
  - E** = elk
  - A** = pronghorn
  - M** = moose
  - B** = bear
- SECOND CHARACTER** designates the sex of the animal:
  - M** = male
  - F** = female
  - E** = either sex
- THIRD CHARACTERS** designate the game management unit (GMU):
  - 001** = unit 1
  - 201** = unit 201
  - etc.**

*If more than one unit is valid, only the lowest unit number will appear.*
- FOURTH CHARACTERS** indicate the season/hunt dates:
  - O1** = first season
  - O2** = second season
  - etc.**
  - P** = private-land-only hunts (followed by the season number: P1, P2, P3, P4, P5)
  - E1** = early season
  - L1** = late season
  - K2, K3** = youth-only
  - W or J** = Ranching for Wildlife
- FIFTH CHARACTER** designates the method of take:
  - A** = archery
  - M** = muzzleloader
  - R** = rifle and associated methods
  - NEW X** = season choice

**NOTE:** Be aware that the zero (0) in the hunt units and the letter "O" in the season section look similar!

- THE TITLE** above each table indicates the method of take for the hunt codes within that table. Start here to find the method of take you wish to use.
- THE UNIT COLUMN** is where you'll look next to locate the game management unit (GMU) you wish to hunt. Please read the unit tables carefully. Some licenses are valid in one unit only, while others are valid in multiple units. This column also indicates which hunts offer add-on bear licenses in the over-the-counter deer and elk archery and muzzleloader tables: **Look for the bear paw symbol!**
- THE VALID UNIT(S) COLUMN** will display information for each hunt and whether it is private land or has other restrictions. **If a hunt is labeled as private land, you must get permission from a landowner in that unit before you hunt.**
  - ▶ If the hunt code for a certain unit is also valid in additional units, the **VALID UNITS** column will list all the units where you can hunt with that same license.
  - ▶ If a unit has the same hunt details and hunt codes as another unit, the chart will read **"SEE UNIT \_\_\_"**. Look up the unit referred to for the correct hunt codes for your hunt.
- THE DATES COLUMN** lists the applicable season/hunt dates when the license is valid. Each unit may have multiple hunt dates, so please read carefully.
- THE SEX COLUMN** indicates which sex of animal can be hunted for that specific hunt code. Read the information carefully because the sex of an animal that is huntable in a unit may have changed from previous years.
- THE HUNT CODE COLUMN** displays the code you will use to apply for the license you want. There are many possible hunt codes associated with each unit, and they may have changed since the last time you hunted, so please read carefully. *See section at left on how to read hunt codes.*
- THE LIST COLUMN** displays what type of license you are buying. There are opportunities to purchase more than one license during the year, as long as the licenses meet the requirements of being List A, B or C.
  - For details, see the "List A, B & C: Get More Than One License" charts under the big-game species you'd like to hunt in the following brochure pages. When applying in the draw, **DO NOT** include the list letter on the application.

**NOTE:** You may submit one application for each species, per draw, per year. For each application, you may fill in up to 4 hunt code choices.

## OTHER HUNT CODE TABLE SYMBOLS

- A SQUARE BULLET (■)** in the **UNIT** column indicates there is a special note about that unit, displayed below the hunt code information.
- A PLUS (+)** in the **SEX** column indicates hunt codes for which an average of at least six preference points are needed for a resident to draw that license. This is only an average and does not guarantee a license will be drawn. *These calculations are based on a 3-year period ending with the 2009 drawing.*



# GENERAL INFORMATION

FIELD INFORMATION & REFERENCE: TOOLS, TIPS & RESOURCES FOR HUNTING COLORADO

## BIG GAME SPECIES IDENTIFICATION

- 1 ID FIRST, TRIGGER FINGER SECOND.**  
Take as much time as necessary to identify an animal before you shoot. Use your binoculars, not your rifle scope, to make a positive ID on an animal. Then put your finger on the trigger.
- 2 STUDY THE BODY.**  
There are telltale ways to tell different animals apart. Don't just look at an animal's antlers, study the entire head and body of an animal before you shoot. This will help distinguish elk from moose and mule deer from whitetails.

- 3 WATCH FOR BABIES.**  
When hunting elk or moose, be careful not to mistake a moose calf for a cow elk. Young moose have a reddish coat, similar to an elk. Also, it is illegal to kill a bear that has cubs with it. Bear cubs younger than a year old cannot be harvested.
- 4 MAKE A MISTAKE?**  
Accidents happen. If you've shot the wrong species of animal in the field, don't panic. Call the local district wildlife manager or the CPW office nearest to you listed at the front of this brochure. Admitting a mistake is a hunter's most responsible plan of action.

**ATTENTION!** Moose can be found in the same habitat as elk in Colorado. Elk hunters must know the difference between the two species to avoid accidentally killing a moose.

### ELK



#### TRAITS

- **BODY:** reddish, lighter brown, darker legs
- **NECK:** chestnut brown
- **SNOUT:** slender
- **RUMP:** pale yellow
- **BULLS:** antlers aren't palmated and have obvious brow tines coming off main beam

### MOOSE



#### TRAITS

- **BODY:** black or dark brown with paler gray legs and belly
- **NECK:** large bell (beard) on throat
- **SNOUT:** overhanging, bulbous nose
- **BULLS:** palmated antlers with tines

**ATTENTION!** It is quite common to find both mule deer and white-tailed deer in the same areas, especially on the Eastern Plains. Since both types of deer have the same general body shape and size, hunters can look for a few key differences to make a positive identification. The primary telltale characteristic a hunter should look for is the tail.

### MULE DEER



#### TRAITS

- **TAIL:** rope-like tail with black tip
- **ANTLERS:** fork and then fork again, usually very evenly, on older males
- **EARS:** large in proportion to head on both bucks and does
- **GAIT:** stiff-legged bounce, tail held down
- **RANGE:** statewide; in mountain shrubs, foothills, communities

### WHITE-TAILED DEER



#### TRAITS

- **TAIL:** broad and brown with white fringe; all white when tail is up
- **ANTLERS:** consist of one main beam with three to five tines pointing upward
- **EARS:** smaller in proportion to head
- **GAIT:** move with a graceful lope, flag-like tail often held up
- **RANGE:** common on Eastern Plains; in streamside woodland areas; cropland along rivers

### PRONGHORN



#### BUCK TRAITS

- **HORNS:** Prominent, with prong or point between the base and tip
- **FACE:** Black cheek patch



#### DOE TRAITS

- **HORNS:** May have horns less than 5 inches
- **FACE:** No black cheek patch
- **FAWNS** of either sex are considered does

### BEAR



#### TRAITS

- **COAT:** Adults have long, thick hair; yearlings may have thin, bleached-looking hair
- **EARS:** Small ears and a large head usually indicates a large bear
- **FACE:** Narrow face and long noses are a trait of young bears that are not yet adults

## LEGAL BIG-GAME HUNTING HOURS

Legal hunting hours for big game are one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset, unless specifically restricted.

The sunrise/sunset chart below lists times for Denver. Subtract 1 minute from opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles east of Denver. Add 1 minute to opening and closing time for each 12 1/2 miles west of Denver. (These changes assume that each degree of longitude equals 50 miles and a change of 1 degree of longitude equals a 4-minute change in sunrise and sunset times.)

## GET THE LEAD OUT

From the field to the table, ensuring your next harvest is safe for your family is important. Switching from lead bullets may be an option that's right for you. Science tells us that ingesting lead can cause potential health problems over time. Risks are low for most people; however, you can also:

1. Use lead-free shot or bullets.
2. Choose a firearm with lower-velocity bullets, so the bullet fragments don't scatter as far into the wound. Liberally trim and discard meat damaged by the bullet when you process an animal.
3. Clean your meat grinder between each animal. Lead is soft and can go through your grinder, contaminating an entire batch of ground meat. If you don't grind the meat yourself, speak with your commercial processor about their equipment cleaning process between animals.
4. Avoid eating game meat from animals harvested with lead bullets if you are pregnant. Children younger than 6 should also avoid it.

## HUNT PROGRAMS

### SHED ANTLER COLLECTION CLOSURE

► **WEST OF I-25, PUBLIC LANDS:** Collection and possession of antlers or horns on public lands west I-25 from Jan 1–April 30, is prohibited. The public lands west of I-25 are open to collection and possession of shed antlers or horns May 1–Dec 31 **ONLY**, except in GMUs 54, 55, 66, 67 and 551, where collecting antlers or horns is further restricted May 1–May 15 between legal sunset and 10:00 am.

► **WEST OF I-25, PRIVATE LANDS:** On private lands west of I-25, any person may, with lawful access, collect shed antlers or horns at any time.

► **EAST OF I-25, PUBLIC AND PRIVATE LANDS:** On any lands east of I-25, any person may, with lawful access, collect shed antlers or horns at any time.

**NOTE:** Public land management agencies may have additional restrictions on use of public lands and removal of shed antlers. Refer to land manager restrictions prior to shed hunting.

### RANCHING FOR WILDLIFE (RFW)

Public Ranching for Wildlife licenses are available only to Colorado residents by draw. Licenses are valid only for the season and ranch specified. RFW landowners must provide free access to hunters who draw a public license for their ranch. By applying for a RFW license, hunters allow CPW to provide applicant information to the ranch. Hunting rules differ for each ranch. Read ranch rules before applying:

### NEW NOVICE ADULT OUTREACH LICENSES

Outreach licenses for novice adults are now offered to qualified organizations sponsoring educational, novice-adult hunting activities.

Licenses are offered on a first-come, first-served basis on private land for novice adult hunters who are 18 and older, and who have never purchased a big-game license, have not purchased a big-game license in the last 5 years, or who have only purchased a big-game license in the previous year. ### NEW BIG GAME WALK-IN ACCESS PROGRAM

The Big Game Walk-In Access Program will now offer big-game hunting on many properties across eastern Colorado. There will be overlap in small-game and big-game seasons, and properties will be signed with WIA boundary signs.

In 2020 these properties are open for big-game hunting to properly licensed hunters during established big-game seasons from Sept. 1–Dec. 31 and to small-game hunting from Sept. 1–Feb. 28, 2021. Big-game hunters must possess a valid pronghorn, deer or elk license valid for the unit in which the Walk-In Access property lies. All normal WIA regulations apply. ### GUIDES & OUTFITTERS

Guides and outfitters must be registered, bonded and insured in Colorado. They also need permits to operate on public land and must register with the Office of Outfitter Registration, 1560 Broadway, Suite 1340, Denver, CO 80202; 303-894-7778; or [www.dora.state.co.us/outfitters](http://www.dora.state.co.us/outfitters).

Legal, legitimate outfitters operate around the state and can provide invaluable resources for your hunting trip. Verify an outfitter's registration by contacting the above office or the Colorado Outfitters Association online: [coloradooutfitters.org](http://coloradooutfitters.org)

### DREAM HUNT LICENSES

Deer, elk, pronghorn, mountain lion and bear licenses are available to hunters ages 12–21 with a terminal illness or life-threatening disease or injury.

Requested dates for hunting events must occur between Aug. 15 and Jan. 31 each year. Licenses are now offered in those units with at least one hunt code that requires 10 or more resident preference points to draw (excluding Ranching for Wildlife).

Before a license is issued, hunters must obtain written permission from the landowner to hunt on private land. Sponsoring organizations must request licenses in writing and document the life-threatening or terminal condition, hunting experience, logistical considerations, hunt location and dates. Submit requests to CPW, Hunter Outreach Coordinator, 6060 Broadway, Denver, CO 80216.

### HUNTER SURVEYS HELP ASSESS HARVEST

CPW conducts big-game harvest surveys each year to estimate harvest, hunter numbers and recreation days. Deer, elk and pronghorn hunters may receive a phone call or email, asking to take part in a survey. This includes questions such as: where you hunted, if you harvested an animal and if you saw overcrowding from other hunters.

Only randomly selected hunters can participate. Participation is not required, but responding (even if you didn't hunt or harvest) is an important part of setting future seasons and license numbers. ## CHRONIC WASTING DISEASE (CWD)

### 1 WHAT IS IT?

Chronic wasting disease (CWD) is a fatal neurological disease that attacks the brains of deer, elk and moose. It causes animals to become emaciated, display abnormal behavior and eventually die. Infected animals often show no signs of illness.

### 2 WHERE IS IT?

The map in the back of this brochure highlights game management units in red and yellow where CWD has been detected (*inside back cover*). CWD has been found in several regions in Colorado, as well as other states and provinces. For deer, infection rates tend to be highest in prime-aged mature bucks.

### 3 MANDATORY TESTING 2020

In 2020, CPW will require mandatory submission of CWD test samples (heads) from all deer harvested during rifle seasons from specific GMUs to better evaluate the prevalence of CWD in herds. There will be no charge for mandatory testing. Find the GMUs and hunt codes selected for mandatory testing on pages 20–34.

### 4 VOLUNTARY CWD TESTING

If a hunter is not selected for mandatory testing but wants to know whether their harvested deer, elk or moose has CWD, they can submit their animal and pay a testing fee of \$25. Voluntary submissions are accepted annually statewide. In 2020, testing fees for voluntary submissions will be waived for all deer harvested within the same GMUs selected for mandatory testing (*pages 20–34*).

## IMPORTANT PUBLIC HEALTH MESSAGE

Disease in humans resulting from CWD exposure has not been reported to date. However, public health officials cannot determine there is no risk from eating meat from infected animals. Consequently, officials recommend that people avoid exposure to CWD-infected animals. Please see the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment website ([www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/prion-diseases](http://www.colorado.gov/pacific/cdphe/prion-diseases)) for the most current recommendations on carcass testing and other preventive measures.

To minimize exposure to CWD and other diseases of potential concern, Colorado Parks and Wildlife (CPW) and state public health officials advise hunters not to shoot, handle or consume any deer, elk or moose that is acting abnormally or appears to be sick. When field-dressing game, wear rubber gloves and minimize the use of a bone saw to cut through the brain or spinal cord (backbone). Minimize contact with brain or spinal cord tissues, eyes, spleen or lymph nodes. Always wash hands and utensils thoroughly after dressing and processing game meat.

## OTHER INFORMATION

### MARK YOUR HARVEST SITE WITH YOUR GPS



Hunters who have GPS units are encouraged to mark the location of their harvest in the field. **This is especially important for hunters who harvest a bear or moose, as these species require mandatory inspections** (*see pages 58 and 63 for details*).

During mandatory inspections, hunters will be asked to give a location of their harvest. Having GPS coordinates makes reporting simple and precise. Use your GPS to set a waypoint where you harvest an animal, and save the UTM or longitude and latitude coordinates. Bring that information to record on the check report form during harvest inspections.

### HERD MANAGEMENT: YOUR INPUT IS WANTED!

Approximately every 10 years, each big-game population undergoes a herd management plan review process during which CPW updates management objectives for that herd. These plans set objectives for population size and the ratio of males to females. Management objectives influence decisions about how many licenses of each type can be made available in any given year.

Every plan update allows for public comment and review. CPW appreciates hearing from all interests to help guide decisions about how big-game populations are managed. Please do not miss these important opportunities to have your voice heard.

### TURN IN POACHERS (TIP) PROGRAM

The TIPs program awards licenses and preference points to eligible persons that report the illegal take, possession or willful destruction of big game or turkey that results in a person being charged for the illegal take, possession or willful destruction of big game or turkey. Advise the charging officer of your interest in a TIPs award. ### EAR TAGS, RADIO COLLARS

If you shoot a big-game animal with a collar or ear tag, report the number, color, harvest location and date to CPW, and return the radio collars.

### OFF-HIGHWAY VEHICLES (OHVs)

All off-highway vehicles operated in Colorado on public lands or traveling on an OHV-designated route must have a valid Colorado OHV registration or a Colorado OHV permit (except on private property).

Registrations/permits are \$25.25, valid April 1–March 31. OHV permits (*applicable for nonresidents and street-legal/plated vehicles*) are available online at [cpw.state.co.us/bg/ohvpermit](http://cpw.state.co.us/bg/ohvpermit), at CPW locations and sales agents. Questions, call 303-297-1192. Renewal registrations are available online and at CPW locations. New registrations and transfers must be done in person or by mail. Visit [cpw.state.co.us](http://cpw.state.co.us) for details.

Contact each public land management agency for their current motor vehicle-use rules, regulations, agency maps and game retrieval specifications and hours. Most areas do not allow off-trail game retrieval with any motorized vehicle. If you witness or observe a violation of OHV misuse on public lands, please report it to any law enforcement officer in that area.

### ACCIDENTAL KILL

Accidental kill is unintentionally killing wildlife not due to carelessness or negligence. You must report big-game animals accidentally killed to a CPW office (*listed on inside front cover*) before continuing to hunt and as soon as practical. Before contacting CPW, field dress the animal. CPW evaluates the circumstances, including shots fired, species and number of animals present, firearms, ammunition, etc. Big game accidentally killed does not count toward annual bag limits.

### CERTIFIED HAY MUST BE MARKED

Hay, straw and mulch are illegal on federal land and CPW property unless certified free of noxious weeds. Hay must be clearly marked by certifying agency. People who transport these materials on public roads crossing CPW property are exempt. ### HUNTERS USING HORSES

If you are bringing a horse into Colorado from out of state, you must contact a veterinarian to get a Certificate of Health Inspection no more than 30 days before. Horses need a Coggins blood test for equine infectious anemia within a year before coming to Colorado. Call the Colorado State Veterinarian's office, 303-869-9130. Residents: Horses may require brand inspection before transportation. Call the brand inspector: 303-869-9160



# HUNTING LAWS

## LEGAL METHODS OF TAKE

### 1. CENTERFIRE RIFLES

- a. Must be a minimum of .24 caliber (6 mm).
- b. Must have a minimum 16-inch barrel and be at least 26 inches long.
- c. If semiautomatic, a maximum of six rounds are allowed in the magazine and chamber combined.
- d. Must use expanding bullets that weigh a minimum of 70 grains for deer, pronghorn and bear, 85 grains for elk and moose, and have an impact energy (at 100 yards) of 1,000 ft.-pounds as rated by manufacturer.
- e. It is illegal to hunt game birds, small-game mammals or furbearers with a centerfire rifle larger than .23 caliber during regular rifle deer and elk seasons west of I-25, without an unfilled deer or elk license for the season. A small-game, furbearer or unfilled big-game license is required.

**NOTE: SMART RIFLES** are prohibited, including any firearm equipped with a target tracking system, electronically controlled, assisted or computer-linked trigger or a ballistics computer. Any firearm equipped with a scope containing a computer processor is considered to be a smart rifle.

**NOTE: FULLY AUTOMATIC RIFLES** are prohibited.

### 3. MUZZLELOADING RIFLES & SMOOTHBORE MUSKETS

- a. Only legal muzzleloaders allowed in muzzleloading seasons.
- b. In-line muzzleloaders are legal.
- c. Must be a single barrel that fires a single round ball or conical projectile.
- d. To hunt deer, pronghorn or bear, conical bullets must be a minimum of .40 caliber, and round-ball bullets must be a minimum of .50 caliber.
- e. To hunt elk or moose, conical bullets must be a minimum of .50 caliber, and round-ball bullets must be a minimum of .54 caliber.
- f. From .40 caliber to .50 caliber, bullets must weigh a minimum of 170 grains.
- g. If greater than .50 caliber, bullets must weigh a minimum of 210 grains.
- h. Shotgun primers and B.O.R. Lock MZ System bullets are legal.
- i. Pelletized powder systems are prohibited during muzzleloading seasons.
- j. Cannot be loaded from the breech during muzzleloading seasons.
- k. Only open or iron sights allowed in muzzleloading seasons. Fiber optics and fluorescent paint incorporated into or on open or iron sights are legal. Scopes or any sighting device using artificial light, batteries and electronic gear are prohibited during muzzleloading seasons.
- l. Sabots are prohibited during muzzleloading seasons. Cloth patches are not sabots.
- m. Smokeless powder is prohibited in muzzleloading seasons. Black powder and black-powder substitutes are legal.
- n. Electronic or battery-powered devices cannot be incorporated into or attached to muzzleloader during muzzleloading seasons.

### 4. SHOTGUNS

- a. Must be minimum 20 gauge and fire a single slug. Use of buckshot is illegal for hunting big game.
- b. Barrel must be a minimum of 18 inches long. Minimum overall length must be 26 inches.

### 5. HAND-HELD BOWS

A long bow, recurve bow or compound bow on which the string is not drawn mechanically or held mechanically under tension. String or mechanical releases are legal if they are hand-drawn or hand-held with no other attachments or connections to bow (except bowstring).

- a. Hand-held bows, including compound bows, must use arrows with a broadhead having a minimum of 7/8-inch outside diameter (width) and a minimum of two steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in same plane for entire length of cutting surface.
- b. Only legal, hand-held bows are allowed during archery seasons.
- c. A minimum draw weight of 35 pounds/let-off maximum of 80 percent required.
- d. No part of a bow's riser (handle) or track, trough, channel, arrow rest or other device (excluding cables and bowstring) that attaches to riser can contact, support and/or guide the arrow from a point rearward of the bow's brace height behind the undrawn string.
- e. Bows can propel only a single arrow at a time. No mechanisms for automatically loading arrows allowed.
- f. Scopes and electronic or battery-powered devices cannot be incorporated into or attached to bow or arrow, with the exception of lighted nocks on arrows. Recording devices such as cameras or video recorders attached to bows may be used as long as they do not cast light toward the target or aid in range finding, sighting or shooting the bow.
- g. Hydraulic or pneumatic technology cannot be used to derive or store energy to propel arrows. Explosive arrows are prohibited.

## LEGAL FIREARMS & BOWS

Different firearms can be used for big-game hunts during different seasons. The chart below shows which method of take may be used in each season.

### 6. CROSSBOWS

- a. Draw weight must be a minimum of 125 pounds.
- b. Draw length must be a minimum of 14 inches from front of bow to nocking point of drawstring.
- c. Positive mechanical safety device required.
- d. Bolt must be a minimum of 16 inches long, have a broadhead that is a minimum of 7/8-inch wide and with a minimum of two steel cutting edges. Each cutting edge must be in the same plane for entire length of cutting surface.
- e. Illegal during archery seasons.

### 7. HANDGUNS

- a. Barrel must be a minimum of 4 inches long.
- b. Must use a minimum .24-caliber (6 mm) in diameter expanding bullet.
- c. Shoulder stocks or attachments prohibited.
- d. Must use a cartridge or load that produces minimum energy of 550-ft.-pounds at 50 yards as rated by manufacturer.

### 8. CALLS

- a. Mechanical calls are legal, including mouth calls.
- b. Electronic calls, such as amplified audio players or smartphone apps, are prohibited for big-game hunting.

## ILLEGAL ACTIVITIES

If convicted of these felony violations, you can face a lifetime license suspension:

- FELONY OFFENSE:** To kill and abandon big game. It is illegal to remove only the hide, antlers or other trophy parts and leave the carcass in the field.
- FELONY OFFENSE:** To sell, buy or offer to sell or buy big game.
- FELONY OFFENSE:** To solicit someone to illegally kill big game for commercial gain or provide outfitting services without required registration.

### IT IS ALSO AGAINST THE LAW TO:

- Have a loaded (in the chamber) rifle or shotgun in or on any motor vehicle. Muzzleloading rifles are considered unloaded if the percussion cap or shotshell primer is removed, or if the powder is removed from flashpan. It is illegal for anyone to have a loaded electronic-ignition muzzleloader in or on a motor vehicle: The chamber must be unloaded or the battery must be disconnected and removed from its compartment.
- Carry firearms (except handguns) on an OHV during deer, elk, pronghorn and bear seasons unless they are unloaded in the chamber and magazine. Firearms (except handguns) and bows carried on an OHV must be fully enclosed in a hard or soft case. Scabbards or cases with open ends or sides are prohibited. This does not apply to landowners or their agents who carry a firearm on an OHV to take depredating wildlife on property they own or lease.
- Establish a permanent structure or plant vegetation on CPW-owned land or waters. Only portable blinds and tree stands for big-game hunting can be erected on CPW land, and no more than 30 days prior to the season during which they will be used. No nails can be driven into trees. Man-made materials for blinds or stands must be removed within 10 days after the season they are used in ends. The owner's Customer Identification (CID) number and dates of use must be visible on outside of portable blinds or underside of tree stands. Placement of blinds or stands does not reserve them for personal use; they may be used on first-come, first-served basis.
- Hunt carelessly or discharge a firearm or release an arrow disregarding human life or property.
- Operate or ride a snowmobile with a firearm unless it's completely unloaded and cased, or with a bow unless it's unstrung or cased. Compound bows must be cased, not unstrung.
- Shoot from or use a motor vehicle, motorcycle, off-highway vehicle, snowmobile or aircraft to hunt, intercept, chase, harass or drive wildlife.
- Use aircraft to hunt, to direct hunters on the ground or to hunt the same day or day after a flight was made to find wildlife.
- Use computer-assisted remote technology (any device, equipment or software used to remotely control a weapon, including the Internet) to hunt or fish. Hunters and anglers must be physically present in the immediate vicinity while hunting and fishing.
- Use unmanned or remote-control drones to look for, scout or detect wildlife.
- Use live-action game cameras to locate, surveil, or aid or assist in locating or surveiling game wildlife in order to take/try to take game wildlife during the same or following day. "Live-action game camera" is any device capable of recording and transmitting photographic/video data *wirelessly* to a remote device (such as a computer or smart phone). This doesn't include game cameras that record photographic/video data and store such data for later use, *as long as the device cannot transmit data wirelessly*.
- Use a drone to look for/scout/detect game wildlife.
- Hunt under the influence of alcohol or controlled substances.
- Use artificial light as an aid in hunting.
- Use poison, drugs or explosives to hunt or harass wildlife.
- Fail to extinguish a campfire completely.
- Fail to make a reasonable attempt to track and kill animals you wound or may have wounded. It is against the law to pursue wounded wildlife that goes on private property without first obtaining permission from landowner or person in charge.
- Fail to reasonably dress, care for and prepare edible wildlife meat for human consumption. At a minimum, the four quarters, tenderloins and backstraps are edible meat. Internal organs are not considered edible meat.

## HUNTER ORANGE & PINK

### HUNTERS MUST WEAR FLUORESCENT ORANGE OR PINK

Law requires hunters to wear at least 500 square inches of **SOLID DAY-LIGHT FLUORESCENT ORANGE OR FLUORESCENT PINK** material on an outer garment above the waist while hunting deer, elk, pronghorn, bear or moose with any firearm license. A fluorescent orange or pink hat or head covering, visible from all directions, is also required.

**This includes all muzzleloader hunters. It also includes archery hunters who hunt during rifle season.** Archers hunting with an archery bear, deer, elk, pronghorn or moose license, or licensed for private land hunting through the Ranching for Wildlife program do not have to wear fluorescent orange or pink, but should consider wearing it to increase safety while in the field.

Auction- and raffle-license holders do not have to wear orange or pink when hunting with archery equipment when no rifle seasons are open. If using a ground blind or pop-up blind, hunters should display orange or pink that is visible from all directions on the outside of the blind.

### CAMOUFLAGE ORANGE OR PINK DOES NOT QUALIFY!



Mesh garments are legal but not recommended. CPW strongly recommends wearing daylight fluorescent orange or fluorescent pink clothes in the field, even if you're not hunting. Wearing orange or pink is for hunter safety, as big-game animals don't see these colors like we do. Movement, sound and smell are what give hunters away.



- Hunt with rifles, handguns or shotguns firing a single slug, or archery equipment within an area 50 feet on each side of the center line of any state highway or municipal or county road, as designated by the county.
- Discharge any firearm or release an arrow from, upon or across any public road.
- Party hunt (i.e. harvest someone else's game or let someone harvest yours).
- Interfere with hunters. This includes distracting or frightening prey; causing prey to flee by using light or noise; chasing prey on foot or by vehicle; throwing objects; making movements; harassing hunters by using threats or actions; erecting barriers to deny access to hunting areas; intentionally injecting yourself into the line of fire. Violators face prosecution and may have to pay victim's damages and court costs.
- For two or more people on the ground, in a vehicle or vessel to use electronic devices to communicate information that violates any wildlife law or regulation.
- Use dogs.
- Hunt big game over bait, whether or not the person hunting personally placed the bait. Bait means to put, expose, distribute or scatter salt, minerals, grain, animal parts or other food as an attraction for big game. Salt or mineral blocks used for normal agricultural purposes are not considered bait. Scent sticks that smell like food are illegal for bears.
- Kill cubs or bears accompanied by one or more cubs. A cub is a bear less than a year old.
- Hunt bears in their dens.
- Have a carcass, hide, skull, claws or parts of bears or mountain lions without a valid hunting license or unless authorized by CPW.
- Sell, trade, barter or offer to sell, trade or barter bear gall bladders or edible portions of bears.
- Hunt on private land without first obtaining permission from landowner or person in charge.
- Post, sign or indicate that public lands, not under an exclusive-control lease, are private.
- Use State Land Board properties not leased and signed by CPW, unless permission is given by the lessee.

**LICENSE RESTRICTIONS**

**FELONY OFFENSES & WEAPONS**

Colorado and federal laws prohibit people convicted of certain crimes, including felony offenses and domestic violence-related offenses, from possessing weapons even for hunting. If you've been convicted of a crime, check with the appropriate Colorado and federal law enforcement authority to find out how these laws apply to you.

**CHILD SUPPORT DELINQUENCY**

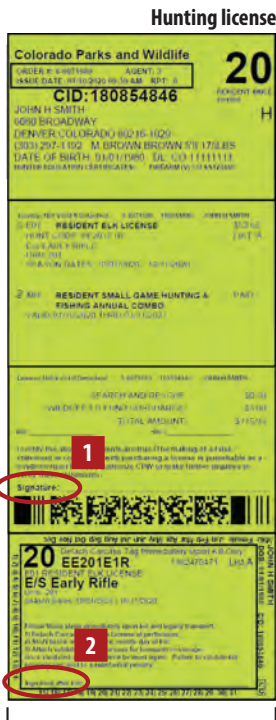
State and Federal law require a Social Security number to buy a license. It is not displayed on the license but is provided, if requested, to Child Support Enforcement authorities. Hunting and fishing licenses are not issued to those suspended for noncompliance with child support. Any current licenses become invalid if held by an individual who is deemed noncompliant by Child Support Enforcement.

**BAG LIMITS**

- 1. BAG LIMITS, LICENSE PURCHASES:** The bag and possession limit is the total number of animals you can legally take of each species. Big game taken in Jan. and Feb. seasons set as part of the previous license year's seasons fall under the previous year's bag and possession limit. When a license allows hunting in more than one unit, the unit in the hunt code determines the maximum number of licenses a hunter can obtain per year for that species.
- 2. MOOSE:** The lifetime bag limit for bull moose is one, except for auction, raffle or special management licenses.
- 3. COYOTES:** You can hunt coyotes without a small-game license during big-game seasons if you have an unfilled big-game license. You can hunt coyotes only in the same unit, season and manner of take as on your big-game license. Once you fill your big-game license, you must buy a small-game or furbearer license to hunt coyotes. Harvesting a coyote does not void your big-game license.

**CARCASS TAGS**

- ▶ You must attach a carcass tag to animals you harvest per instructions on tag. Tags must be signed, dated and detached from the license immediately upon harvest. *See image at right for where to sign.*
- ▶ The carcass tag should be attached to the carcass (not to detached hides, horns or antlers carried separately) immediately prior to and during transportation in any vehicle, or while in camp or at a residence or other place of storage. Tags must stay on until meat is processed and remain with meat until consumed.
- ▶ The carcass tag, when dated, signed and attached to the species lawfully taken or killed and lawfully in possession, authorizes the possession, use, storage, and transportation of the carcass, or any part thereof.
- ▶ **It is illegal to sign or tear the tag before harvesting an animal.**
- ▶ Do not remove any parts of a license except the carcass tag **only after harvest**. Doing so voids the license and you must buy a duplicate. **The upper part of the license must be kept by whoever harvested the animal.**
- ▶ If you lose, accidentally destroy or detach the tag, you must buy a duplicate from a CPW office before hunting and prove the loss, detachment or destruction was accidental.
- ▶ If you have a nonresident big game/fishing combo license, the fishing license is valid after the carcass tag is detached, as long as the rest of the license is intact.

- 1** Review all information on your license and sign here as soon as you receive it.
- 2** Detach and sign the carcass tag only AFTER harvesting your animal. You must then attach the tag to the carcass (not to the head or antlers).

**EVIDENCE OF SEX**

- It is illegal to have or transport a big-game carcass without evidence of sex naturally attached. It is illegal to have only detached evidence of sex accompany the carcass. If you submit a deer or elk head for CWD testing, leave evidence of sex on the carcass.
  - EVIDENCE OF SEX IS:**
    - A. BUCK/BULL:** Head with antlers or horns attached to carcass; or testicle, scrotum or penis attached to carcass.
    - B. DOE/COW:** Head, udder (mammary) or vulva attached to carcass.
    - C. BLACK BEAR:** Male: testicles or penis. Female: vulva.
  - Heads detached from carcass are not adequate evidence of sex.
  - If a carcass is cut in pieces or deboned, evidence of sex needs to be attached to a quarter or another major part of carcass. All portions must be transported together.
  - Evidence of sex is not required if a donation certificate accompanies less than 20 pounds of meat or after the carcass is cut into processed meat, wrapped and frozen, or stored at licensee's home.
- TIP:** If you shoot a young buck or bull with antlers less than 5 inches long, it can be considered "antlerless." But what do you do about evidence of sex?
- ▶ Leave the head and antlers naturally attached to a portion of the carcass to prove it meets the requirement.
  - ▶ Leave the testicles attached to a portion of the carcass, and then you can detach the head or skull plate and carry it out with the antlers intact.

**TRANSPORTING GAME**

- You can be cited for illegally transporting game animals even if someone else made an error. When you transport carcasses or processed meat:
  - Carcasses must be properly tagged. You must meet evidence of sex and antler-point requirements. Hunters must keep their own license.
  - Carcass tags or donation certificates (for 20 pounds of meat or less) must accompany processed game meat.
- Carcass tags must be securely attached to carcass, not antlers or horns, or must accompany processed meat.
- To ship by commercial carrier, the license, photocopy of license, carcass tag or donation certificate must accompany carcass or processed meat.
- Hunters transporting game through national parks or monuments must follow federal regulations. Contact the National Park Service.
- Nonresident hunters should follow their home state regulations in place for transporting harvested deer, elk or moose back from a state known to have CWD.

**DONATING GAME MEAT**

Donation certificates are required for all game-meat donations. Certificates must show names, addresses and telephone numbers of donor and recipient; donor's hunting license number; species and amounts donated; date of kill; donor's signature. The certificate can be a simple note; no special form required. It must stay with the meat until completely consumed. Donor and recipient are subject to bag and possession limits. **NOTE:** A "like license" is a license for exactly the same species, sex, season and method of take as a donor's license.

- You can donate to someone **WITH** or **WITHOUT** a like license:
  - any amount of processed and packaged game meat, anywhere.
- You can donate to someone **WITHOUT** a like license:
  - up to 20 pounds of unprocessed meat, anywhere.
  - more than 20 pounds of unprocessed meat, only at recipient's home.
- You can donate to someone **WITH** a like license:
  - up to 20 pounds of unprocessed meat, anywhere.
  - more than 20 pounds of unprocessed meat, anywhere, only if:
    - recipient's license is unfilled, and
    - recipient's carcass tag is on the meat. This establishes recipient's claim to his/her portion of meat and voids his/her license. Donor's tag must remain with his/her portion.
  - the entire carcass, if:
    - recipient's license is unfilled, and
    - donor's carcass tag and recipient's like-license carcass tag is on the meat, voiding both licenses.

# YOUTH HUNTING

## Deer, elk, pronghorn and bear opportunities for hunters ages 12–17

### BIG-GAME HUNTING RULES FOR YOUTH

#### YOUTH EXPANDED HUNTING OPPORTUNITIES

CPW expanded youth hunting by giving kids more opportunities to harvest big-game animals.

Youth may pursue antlerless deer or elk during any rifle season open to antlerless hunts in valid GMUs (see page 18), as well as hunt pronghorn does during Dec. **NEW** and the season that runs until Jan. 31, 2021 in GMUs 9 and 191.

**NEW** Youth may now also hunt bear with the new youth bear license (see license fee table on page 5) during all seasons. See the "Bear" section, page 62, for the hunt code tables and map.

#### HOW TO PARTICIPATE

1. Youth must be ages 12–17 (see age requirements at right) and meet hunter education requirements.
2. Youth must have an unfilled limited antlerless deer, antlerless elk or either-sex elk license after their original season ends. Then they may participate in any open rifle antlerless deer or elk hunt that begins after the last day of the season listed on their original license. (Does not include *Ranching for Wildlife*.) See pronghorn rules on page 19.  
Youth may hunt in the areas specified on the maps (pages 18–19), and must hunt the same species listed on their original license.
3. Youth with an unfilled either-sex elk license must take the original license to a CPW location to have it converted to an antlerless license before hunting any extended seasons.
4. Youth hunters 12–15 years old *must* be accompanied by a mentor who is 18 or older and also meets hunter education requirements. Youth and

mentors must be able to see and hear each other while hunting. Mentors can hunt only if they have a current license valid for the same units and dates the youth will be hunting.

5. Youth must follow all applicable regulations for any hunts and units they select during the extended season, including season dates and geographic restrictions.
6. Antlered licenses, over-the-counter licenses and either-sex plains rifle elk licenses may not be converted for extended youth hunting.

#### AGE REQUIREMENTS

1. Youth ages 12–17 are offered reduced-cost licenses for deer, elk and pronghorn.
2. At age 11, youth may buy or apply for a license if they will turn 12 before the end of season on the license. Youth cannot hunt with the license until they turn 12.
3. Youth who get their original license when they are 17 and later turn 18 may participate in the extended season hunt. Youth hunting rules still apply, even though the hunter is 18 while hunting.
4. Youth must be 12–17 at time of purchase to buy a youth unlimited or leftover license.
5. In order to receive a reduced-cost license and/or youth preference in the draw, youth must be 17 or younger at the time of application.

#### YOUTH DRAW PREFERENCE

1. A minimum of 15 percent of limited licenses for doe pronghorn, antlerless and either-sex deer and antlerless elk for each GMU shall be available for youth ages 12–17 who meet hunter education requirements.

These licenses are available by draw for all seasons and methods of take — including early

and late rifle seasons. Licenses not drawn by youth are available to the public. (*The Air Force Academy unit and Ranching for Wildlife hunts are excluded from this.*)

2. Group applications are not accepted.
3. If youth enter more than one hunt code on their application, all hunt codes must qualify for youth preference. **NEW** Youth receive preference on **ALL** hunt codes available in the secondary draw.

#### YOUTH OUTREACH LICENSES

Youth outreach licenses are offered for deer, elk and pronghorn to qualified organizations sponsoring youth hunting activities. Application procedures: [cpw.state.co.us/youthoutreachlicense](http://cpw.state.co.us/youthoutreachlicense)

### YOUTH DEER & ELK HUNTS IN 2020

1

#### CHOOSE YOUR SPECIES

Youth may hunt antlerless deer or elk in extended seasons. Youth may hunt only the species that is on their original license. "Antlerless" means female deer (does) and elk (cows), as well as young males of both species with antlers less than 5 inches long.

2

#### CHOOSE WHEN TO HUNT

If a youth does not fill their original limited antlerless deer, antlerless elk or either-sex elk license (see "Purchasing and Converting Licenses" to the right) — whether it's for archery, muzzleloader or rifle hunting — they may continue to hunt during any of the rifle seasons listed in this brochure, except for *Ranching for Wildlife*. They must hunt within areas specified on the maps on page 18, and there must be an antlerless hunt going on in the unit and season they wish to hunt.

3

#### PLAN AHEAD

To hunt deer or elk in the extended season, youth must buy a limited antlerless deer, antlerless elk or either-sex elk license. If they don't fill their tag during the original season, they will be able to continue hunting in certain areas of the state. Look at the maps on page 18 to make sure you purchase the original deer or elk license within the area you intend to hunt during the extended season.

4

#### FOLLOW THE RULES

When participating in the extended season, youth **MUST** follow all the rules of hunting during the rifle season, including wearing blaze orange or pink and using a method of take allowed in rifle season. Youth must also follow all unit restrictions where they choose to hunt in the extended season, including any private-land-only designations and any unit boundary restrictions.

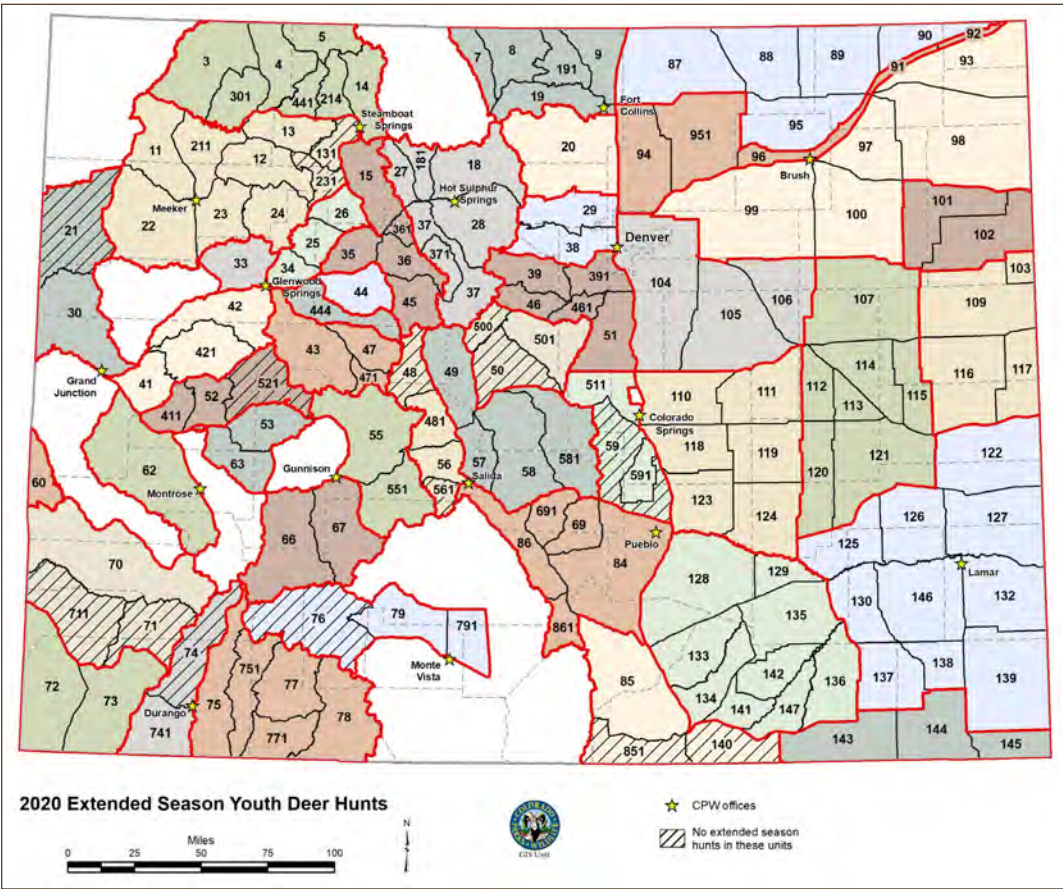
#### YOUTH EXTENDED SEASON EXPLAINED ONLINE

A complete list of available hunts for the youth extended season and the corresponding units.

#### PURCHASING & CONVERTING LICENSES

- ▶ Youth must purchase their original license through the draw or from the leftover licenses list.
- ▶ Either-sex elk licenses must be converted to an antlerless license at a CPW office if the original license is unfilled and the youth wishes to continue hunting an antlerless animal.
- ▶ Over-the-counter archery licenses, OTC whitetail licenses, antlered licenses and either-sex plains rifle elk licenses may NOT be converted to participate in the extended season.

DEER EXTENDED SEASON: YOUTH



WHERE TO HUNT DEER & ELK

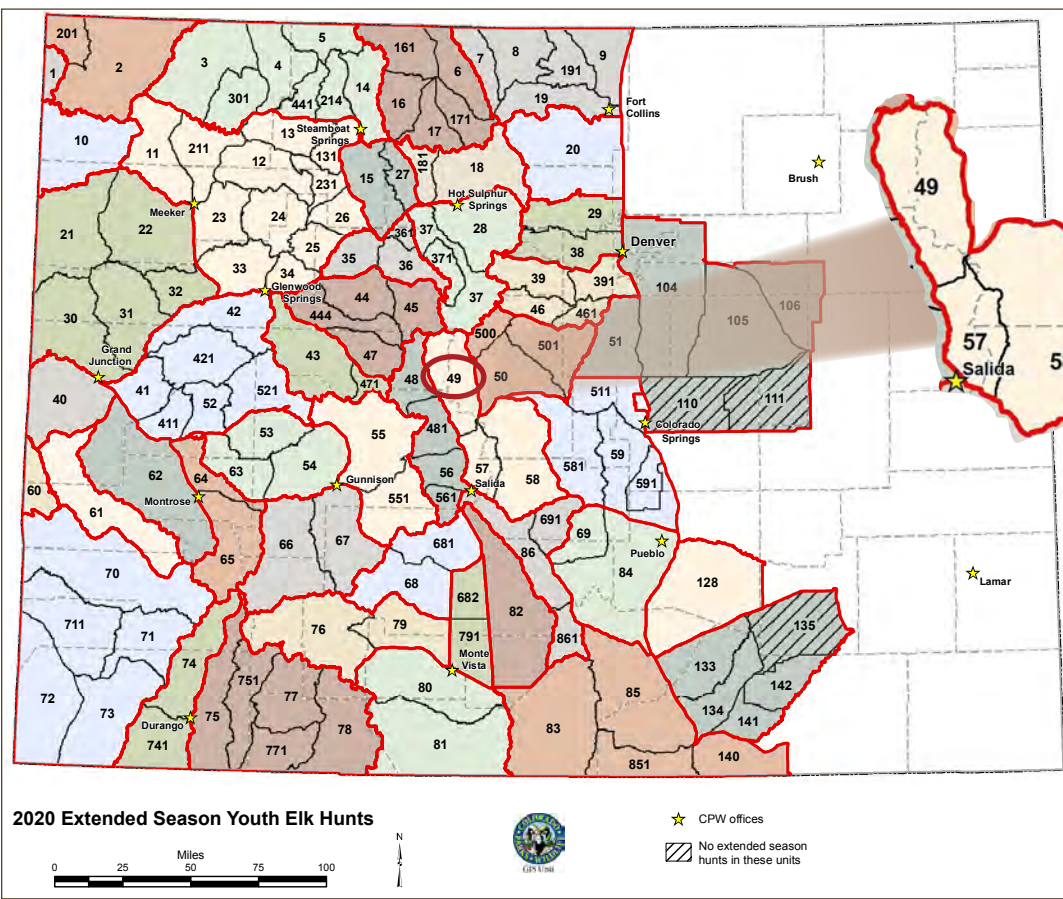
- ▶ Youth may hunt in any area on the map within the red boundary that also contains the unit for which they purchased their original license. (Units with lines through them and blank, white areas are not open to extended-season hunting.)
- ▶ Youth may only hunt the extended season when an open antlerless rifle hunt is going on in the unit they choose to hunt.
- ▶ Unfilled antlered elk and deer licenses may not be used to participate in the program. Limited either-sex elk licenses must be converted to antlerless licenses at a CPW office, and are only valid to hunt and take antlerless elk after doing so.

FOR EXAMPLE: (see elk map at bottom left)

- An original license is purchased in the draw for a youth to hunt either-sex elk in unit 49 during archery season.
- The youth does not harvest during archery season and takes the tag to a CPW office to convert it to antlerless.
- The youth, accompanied by a mentor, may continue to hunt during any of the rifle seasons listed in this brochure for units 49, 57 or 58, as long as there is an antlerless season in progress in the unit the youth wants to hunt.

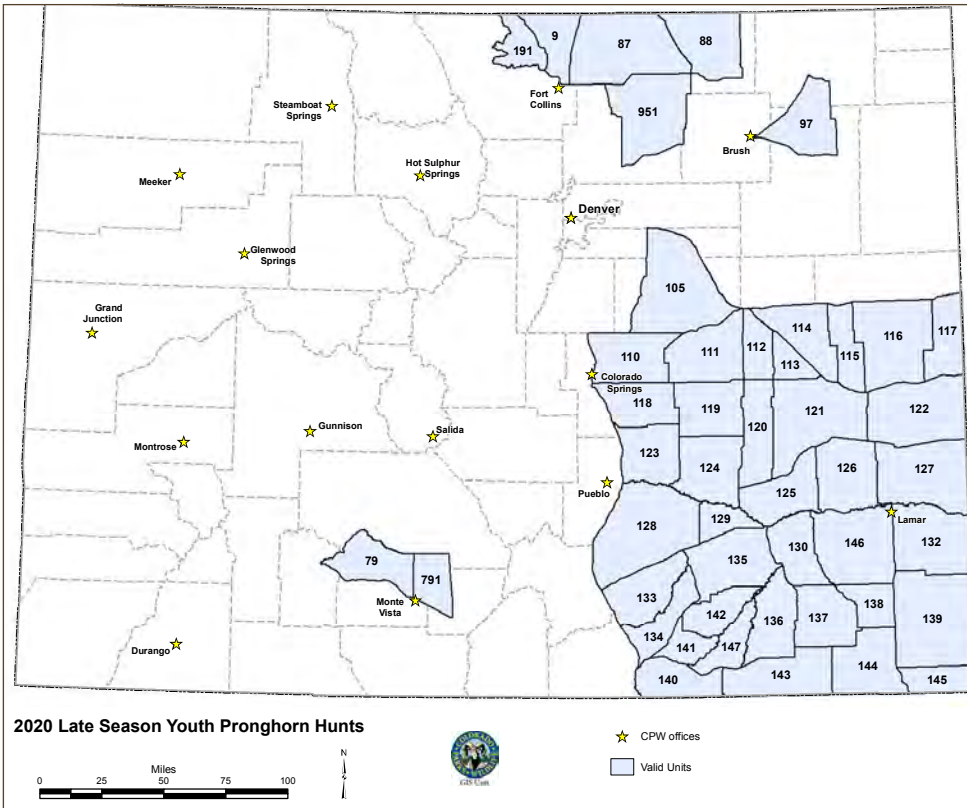

- If the youth wishes to continue hunting in unit 49, they may hunt Oct. 24–Nov. 1, Nov. 7–13 or Nov. 18–22. They may also hunt in units 57 or 58 from Oct. 10–14, Oct. 24–Nov. 1, Nov. 7–13 or Nov. 18–22, or on private land only during the late season Oct. 1–Jan. 31, 2021. *Why Oct. 1? The original archery season (Sept. 2–30) must be over before the youth can begin hunting the late rifle season.*
- During the extended season, the youth may use any method of take allowed during rifle season. See page 14.

**WHERE TO HUNT PRONGHORN**

- ▶ Youth must be ages 12–17.

- ▶ Youth with an unfilled either-sex pronghorn license must bring that license to a CPW office to have it converted to a doe license before hunting in a Dec. or the late Jan. season. Youth with doe licenses do not need to convert those licenses, the original license is valid for an extended hunt.
- ▶ Unfilled pronghorn buck licenses may not be used to participate in this program.
- ▶ Youth must comply with all regulations that apply to the Dec. or the late Jan. season they hunt.

**HYBRID DRAW  
DEER, ELK, PRONGHORN**

To expand quality opportunities to big-game hunters, the Colorado Parks and Wildlife Commission offers a “hybrid” drawing for select elk, deer, pronghorn and bear licenses.

The purpose of the draw is to give hunters additional opportunity to draw a license for some of the state’s premier deer, elk, pronghorn and bear hunting areas.

Hunters who normally would not have enough preference points to draw these licenses now have a slight chance to draw a small number of the most coveted licenses through this process. Nonresident caps apply.

**HOW IT WORKS**

Hunt codes that require 10 or more resident preference points to draw (based on a 3-year average ending with the 2009 drawing), up to 20 percent of the available licenses may be issued through a random drawing.

Qualified resident and nonresident hunters who select applicable hunt codes (listed at right) and have at least five preference points for that species will automatically enter the hybrid draw.

- ▶ These hunt codes must be entered as your first choice on your application.
- ▶ Winning applicants in the hybrid draw will be selected randomly.
- ▶ Hunters who successfully draw a license in the hybrid draw lose all of their preference points for that species. Unsuccessful applicants will be awarded one point.

**HUNTER QUALIFICATIONS**

Qualified hunters wishing to participate in the hybrid draw must meet the following criteria and choose from the hunt codes listed at right as their first choice on their application.

1. Hunters must have a minimum of five preference points for the species they wish to hunt to participate in the hybrid drawing.
2. Hunters must apply individually; group applications are not accepted.
3. Hunt codes that contain a W are Ranching for Wildlife properties. These hunts are for Colorado residents only.

**NOTE:** There are no qualifying hybrid draw hunts for bear in 2020.

### HOW TO GET THEM:

- ▶ **LIST A & B:** You may purchase **ONE** List A and **ONE** List B license per year, **OR TWO** List B licenses per year. These licenses are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **LIST C:** You may purchase as many List C licenses per year that you'd like, in addition to any other licenses you hold. These are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **EXAMPLE:** If you get a List B license in the primary draw, you can get either a List A or List B license in the secondary draw, and multiple List C licenses as leftover or over-the-counter licenses.

## PREFERENCE POINTS

To apply for a point, enter **D-P-999-99-P** as your first-choice hunt code on your application.

You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your primary draw application to use another year. You can use your second through fourth choices on the same application to apply for a license. You may only submit one application per species, per draw, per year.

**NEW Note that the secondary draw does not gain or use preference points.**

All big game species, except for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat, no longer have a preference point fee. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. See “Preference Points” on page 9.

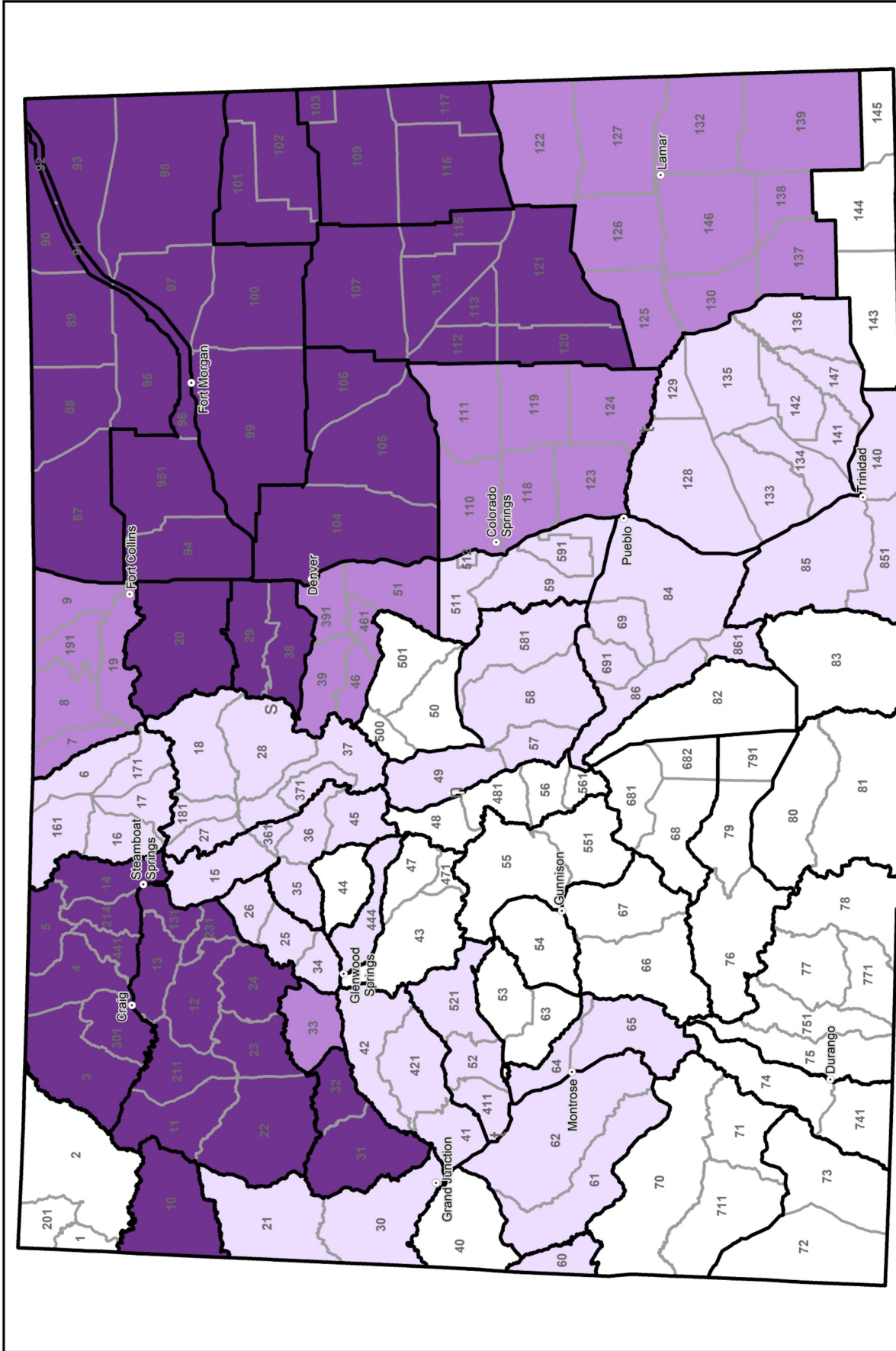
- ▶ **SPECIES IDENTIFICATION PAGE.** Whitetails and mule deer. See pages 11 and 33.
- ▶ **BUCK (ANTLERED):** A male animal with antlers at least 5 inches long. There are no antler-point restrictions for deer.
- ▶ **DOE (ANTLERLESS):** A female animal with no antlers. Antlerless can also mean a young male with antlers less than 5 inches.
- ▶ **EITHER SEX:** A legal buck or doe.

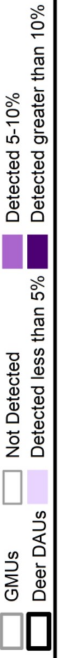

- ▶ You **MUST** use the correct method of take and follow the dates for each season. All other season restrictions also apply.
- ▶ **NOTE:** **NEW** Season choice hunt codes now end with an "X" instead of an "R."

**REMEMBER:** Hunters can hunt with archery equipment during any rifle season. They **must** wear fluorescent orange or pink during first, second, third or fourth rifle season.

# WHITETAIL ONLY

## OVER-THE-COUNTER LICENSES: LATE RIFLE

► **NOTE:** All deer harvested with a whitetail-only OTC rifle license (see right ►) and some deer harvested with a whitetail-only limited rifle license (page 34) are included in CWD mandatory testing. Get more information about where and how to submit a CWD sample at [cpw.state.co.us/cwd](http://cpw.state.co.us/cwd). Also see page 13 of this brochure for more about CWD.

### WHAT CAN I EXPECT?

These over-the-counter licenses provide an opportunity to hunt white-tailed deer in a portion of the state where mule deer are the primary species of management interest.

This means there are few white-tailed deer in the area, and hunters can expect to see more mule deer than white-tailed deer when hunting in these GMUs.

### WHERE ARE THE WHITETAILS FOUND IN THIS SEASON?

White-tailed deer in these GMUs can be most commonly found along lower-elevation river bottoms.

Hunters should focus on these areas to improve their chances of finding white-tailed deer. Much of the white-tailed deer habitat is located on private lands where permission is required prior to hunting.

### WHAT METHOD OF TAKE CAN I USE?

The license is valid for any legal method of take. However, because this is a rifle season, hunters are required to follow blaze orange or pink requirements (see page 14), regardless of the type of weapon used.

Some public properties prohibit the use of rifles and/or muzzleloaders. Check property regulations to determine what types of weapons are legal before going afield.

### WHAT IS THE BEST WAY TO IDENTIFY A WHITE-TAILED DEER?

The best way to tell the difference between a white-tailed deer and a mule deer is the tail.

White-tailed deer tails are broad and brown from top to bottom with a white fringe. Mule deer have a white rump patch and tail, with a black tip on the tail.

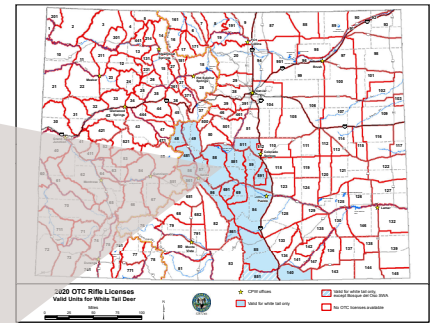
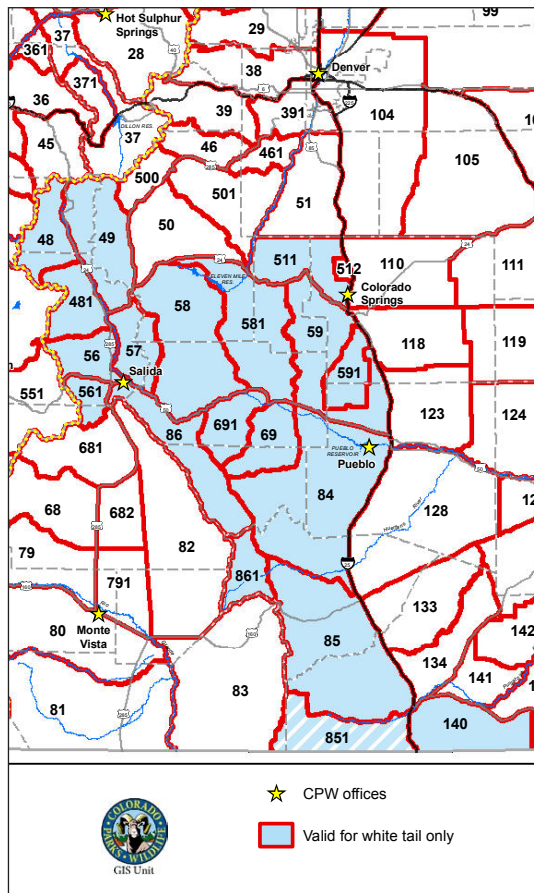
### CAN'T I JUST LOOK AT THE ANTLERS?

Antlers differ between the species, but are not a reliable distinguishing characteristic between white-tailed deer and mule deer.

### WHAT IF I SHOOT A MULE DEER ACCIDENTALLY?

Hunters must be certain of their target to avoid killing a mule deer with a whitetail-only license.

However, accidents happen. Please report any mistaken kills immediately to the nearest CPW office (listed on the inside front cover of this brochure) or the District Wildlife Manager in the area. See the "Accidental Kill" section on page 13 for more details.

## IDENTIFYING WHITETAIL VS. MULE DEER



### WHITE-TAILED DEER

- **PRIMARY CHARACTERISTIC — THE TAIL:** The first thing to look for is the tail. It's broad and brown with white fringe, all white when tail is up
- **ANTLERS:** consist of one main beam with three to five tines pointing upward. *Caution:* Mule deer with small antlers may appear to have a similar antler formation.
- **EARS:** smaller in proportion to head
- **GAIT:** a graceful lope, flag-like tail often held up
- **RANGE:** common on Eastern Plains, in streamside wooded areas and cropland along rivers



### MULE DEER

- **TAIL:** rope-like tail with black tip
- **ANTLERS:** fork and fork again — often very evenly — on older males
- **EARS:** large in proportion to head on both bucks and does
- **GAIT:** stiff-legged bounce, tail held down
- **RANGE:** statewide, in mountain shrubs, foothills, communities

## PREFERENCE POINTS

To apply for a point, enter **E-P-999-99-P** as your first-choice hunt code on your application.

You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your primary draw application to use another year. You can use your second through fourth choices on the same application to apply for a license. You may only submit one application per species, per draw, per year. **NEW** Note that the secondary draw does not gain or use preference points.

All big game species, except for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat, no longer have a preference point fee. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. See "Preference Points" on page 9.

## TAXIDERMY

If you leave the head of your harvest with its antlers at a taxidermist, you are encouraged to get a receipt from the taxidermist — with date delivered and a description of the antlers — before you take the carcass home or to a commercial processor.

## HANDLING ANTLERS IN CAMP

Head or skull plate, with both antlers naturally attached, must accompany the carcass of bulls in camp or in transit, even when the scrotum or testicles are used as evidence of sex.

## LIST A, B & C: GET MORE THAN ONE ELK LICENSE

All big-game hunting licenses are either List A, B or C, as indicated in the last column of the hunt code tables. The List types exist so that you know if you can get more than one license for the same species:

- ◆ **List A:** You can only get **ONE** List A license = **A**
- ◆ **List B:** If a hunt is List B, you can get up to **TWO** licenses: one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B** or **B+B**
- ◆ **List C:** If a hunt is List C, you can get **ANY** number of List C licenses, as well as one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B+C+C+C, etc.** or **B+B+C+C+C, etc.**

See below for your options of getting more than one elk license!

**ATTENTION:** You may submit **ONLY ONE** application for **EACH SPECIES, PER DRAW, PER YEAR**. Additional licenses for the same species must be obtained as leftovers, over the counter or special licenses issued by CPW. 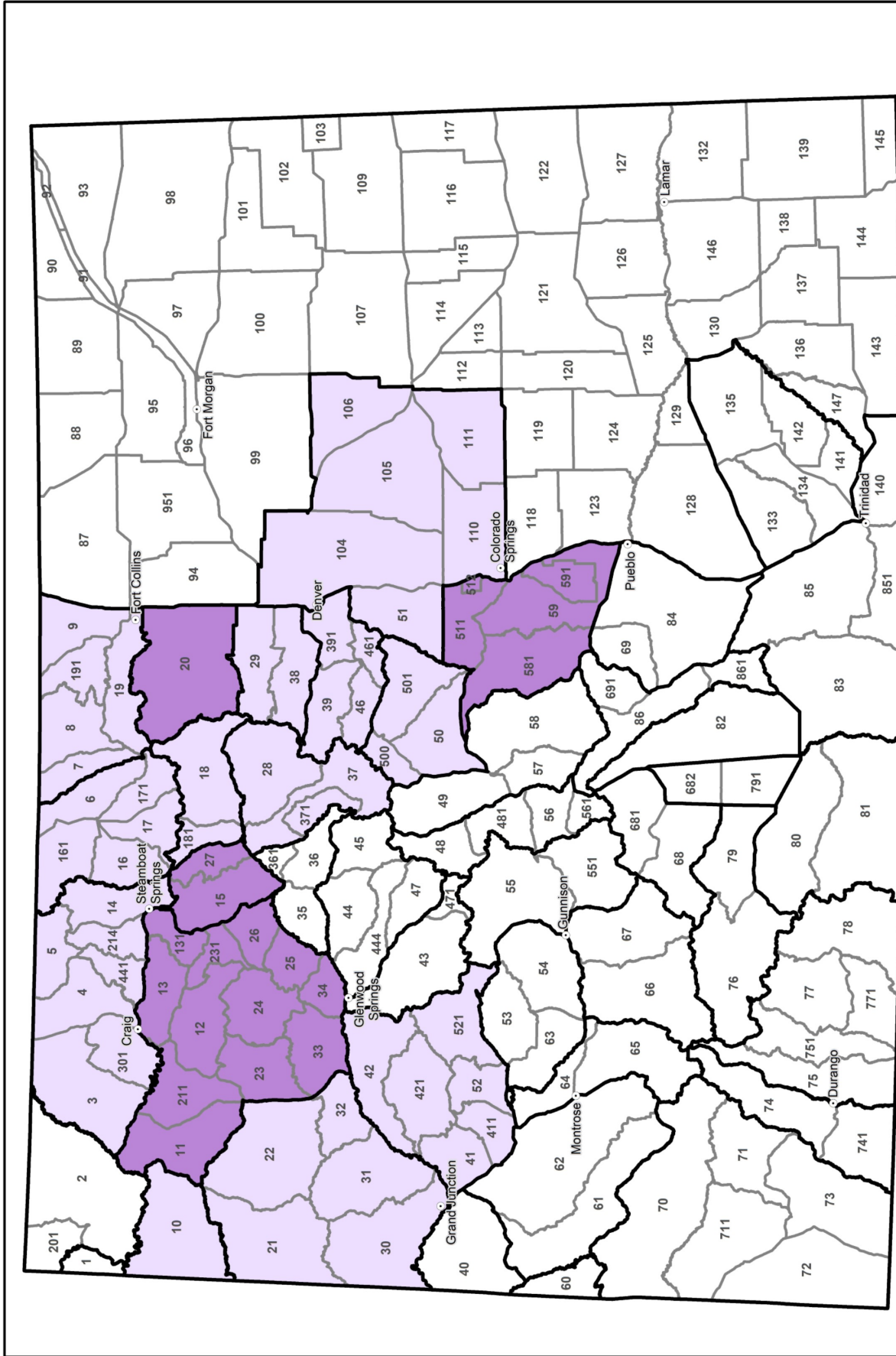

### ATTENTION HUNTERS:

**MOST LAND IS PRIVATE EAST OF I-25, IN MANY PRONGHORN HUNTING AREAS.** Landowner permission is advisable before applying for the following units, as most land is private: 9, 104, 107, 110, 112, 113, 114, 115, 116, 120, 121, 128, 129, 130, 132, 136, 137 and 214.

## NEED TO KNOW

- ▶ **NEW LATE RIFLE DOE SEASON IN GMUS 9 & 191 NOW EXTENDED:** The late doe season that ran from Nov. 1–Dec. 31 in previous years has been extended until Jan. 31. This gives all hunters an extra month to hunt pronghorn, including youth. See page 56.
- ▶ **ARCHERY.** Only legal hand-held bows are allowed in archery season. See page 14.
- ▶ **MUZZLELOADING.** Only legal muzzleloading rifles and smoothbore muskets are allowed in muzzleloader season. See page 14.

## PREFERENCE POINTS

To apply for a point, enter **A-P-999-99-P** as your first-choice hunt code on your application.

You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your primary draw application to use another year. You can use your second through fourth choices on the same application to apply for a license. You may only submit one application per species, per draw, per year. **NEW Note that the secondary draw does not gain or use preference points.**

All big game species, except for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat, no longer have a preference point fee. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. See “Preference Points” on page 9.

## DEFINITIONS

- ▶ **SPECIES IDENTIFICATION.** See page 11.
- ▶ **EITHER:** A legal buck or doe.
- ▶ **BUCK:** A male animal with horns at least 5 inches long from skull to tip, excluding a prong or point between the base and tip. Bucks have a black cheek patch.
- ▶ **DOE:** A female has horns that are less than 5 inches and no black cheek patch. Young bucks do have a black cheek patch; those with horns less than 5 inches long are also in this category. Fawns of either sex are considered does.

## LIST A, B & C: GET MORE THAN ONE PRONGHORN LICENSE

All big-game hunting licenses are either List A, B or C, as indicated in the last column of the hunt code tables. The List types exist so that you know if you can get more than one license for the same species:

- ▶ **List A:** You can only get **ONE** List A license = **A**
- ▶ **List B:** If a hunt is List B, you can get up to **TWO** licenses: one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B** or **B+B**
- ▶ **List C:** If a hunt is List C, you can get **ANY** number of List C licenses, as well as one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B+C+C+C, etc.** or **B+B+C+C+C, etc.**

See below for your options of getting more than one pronghorn license!

**ATTENTION:** You may submit **ONLY ONE** application for **EACH SPECIES, PER DRAW, PER YEAR.** Additional licenses for the same species must be obtained as leftovers, over the counter or special licenses issued by CPW.

### HOW TO GET THEM:

- ▶ **LIST A & B:** You may purchase **ONE** List A and **ONE** List B license per year, **OR TWO** List B licenses per year. These licenses are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **LIST C:** You may purchase as many List C licenses per year that you'd like, in addition to any other licenses you hold. These are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **EXAMPLE:** If you get a List B license in the primary draw, you can get either a List A or List B license in the secondary draw, and multiple List C licenses as leftover or over-the-counter licenses.

## TIPS FOR SAFELY HANDLING GAME MEAT

Most of the time, properly handled and prepared game meat poses no greater risk than domestic meat of causing or carrying disease that could make humans sick. Hunters are encouraged to contact their local public health department or CPW office for information on wildlife diseases where they plan to hunt. Public health officials recommend the following precautions when handling and preparing game meat:

1. Do not handle animals that are obviously sick or found dead. Report sick or dead animals you find to a CPW office near you.
2. Keep game cool, clean and dry.
3. Do not eat, drink or smoke while dressing game.

4. Use disposable gloves when cleaning game.
5. Wash your hands with soap and water or use alcohol wipes after dressing game.
6. Clean all tools and surfaces immediately after use. Use hot soapy water, then disinfect with a 10 percent chlorine bleach solution.
7. Cook game meat to an internal temperature of at least 165° F to kill disease organisms and parasites. Juices from adequately cooked game meat should be clear.
8. Do not eat any raw portions of wild game.
9. Do not feed raw wild game to domestic pets.

# OVER-THE-COUNTER LICENSES: EITHER-SEX PRONGHORN — ARCHERY

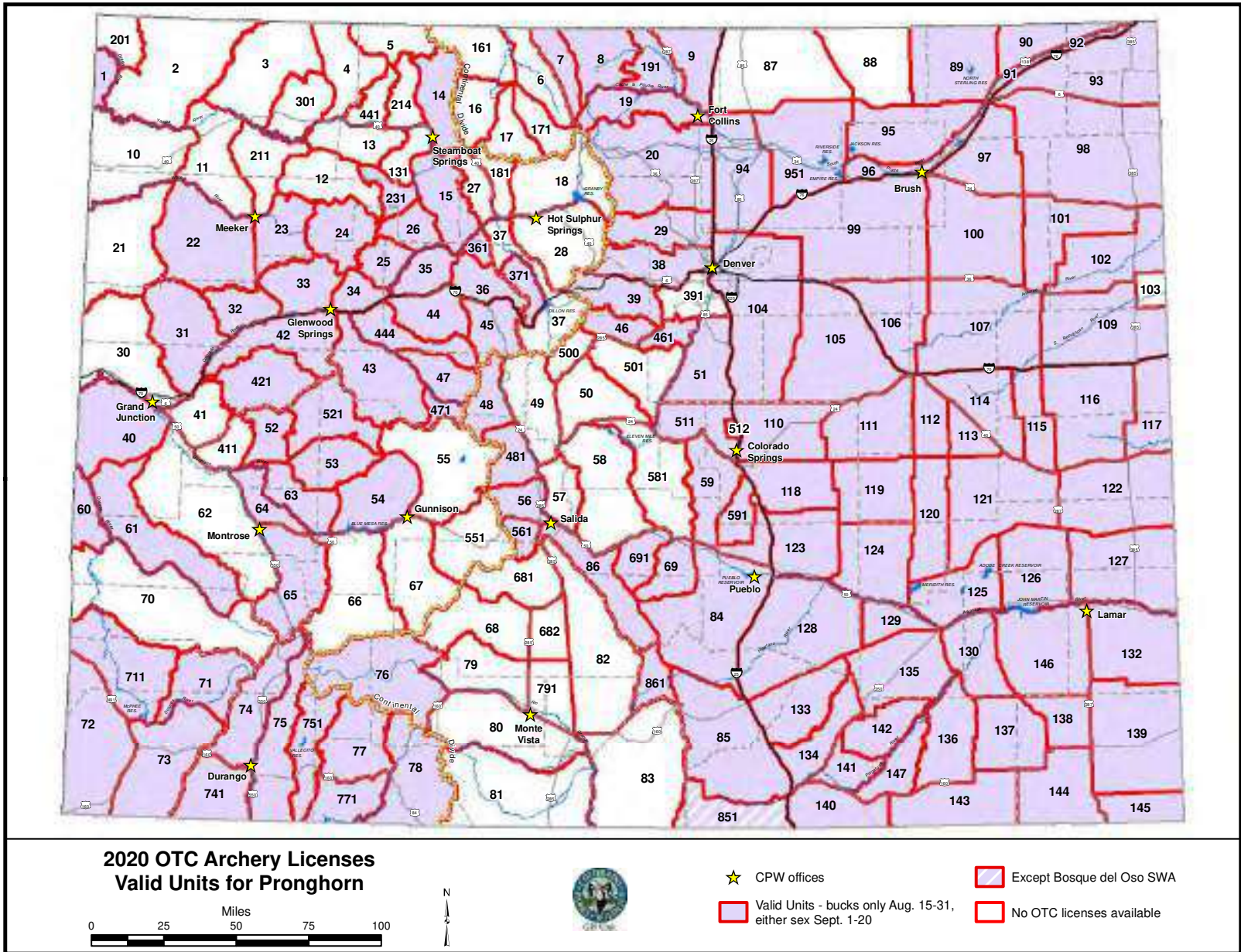

**DON'T FORGET:** You can exchange your moose license for a different method of take **within the same unit**. Take your tag to a CPW location before Sept. 12 to exchange it to hunt in a different season. *The exchange fee still applies.*

## NEED TO KNOW

▶ **NEW SEASON CHOICE HUNT OPTIONS ONLY FOR BULL & EITHER-SEX MOOSE:** For 2020, in certain units you can hunt moose during archery, muzzleloader and/or rifle seasons with the correct method of take until you fill your license. You must follow all applicable season restrictions, including season dates. **Note that season choice hunt codes now use the letter “X” instead of “R.”** See page 61 for details and available hunts.

▶ **NEW COW-ONLY MOOSE HUNTS FOR ARCHERY, MUZZLELOADER & RIFLE SEASONS:** Cow hunts for archery, muzzleloader and rifle seasons will be available for residents and nonresidents. See pages 59–60.

## LIST A, B & C: GET MORE THAN ONE MOOSE LICENSE

All big-game hunting licenses are either List A, B or C, as indicated in the last column of the hunt code tables. The List types exist so that you know if you can get more than one license for the same species:

- ♦ **List A:** You can only get **ONE** List A license = **A**
- ♦ **List B:** If a hunt is List B, you can get up to **TWO** licenses: one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B** or **B+B**
- ♦ **List C:** If a hunt is List C, you can get **ANY** number of List C licenses, as well as one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B+C+C+C**, etc. or **B+B+C+C+C**, etc.

## MANDATORY MOOSE INSPECTIONS

- 1. ALL MOOSE LICENSE HOLDERS** must complete and return a harvest questionnaire provided by CPW within 30 days after their hunting season ends. Anyone who does not complete and return it, including those who were unsuccessful or did not hunt, will not be eligible for a future moose license or point.
- 2. ALL MOOSE MUST BE SUBMITTED IN PERSON FOR INSPECTION** within five working days of harvest. Hunters must submit the head and lower jaw of antlerless moose or the head and lower jaw of antlered moose with antlers attached to a CPW office during normal business hours. A mandatory report will be completed during inspection.
- 3. TOOTH EXTRACTION IS MANDATORY.** An incisor will be removed from the lower jaw and retained to determine age. Heads must be unfrozen for inspection.
- 4. VOLUNTARY CWD TESTING.** During inspection, hunters may choose to have their moose tested for chronic wasting disease. Testing cost is \$25.



## PREFERENCE POINT FEE & WEIGHTED PREFERENCE POINTS

- ▶ To apply for a preference point only, enter **M-P-999-99-P** as your first-choice hunt code on your application. You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your primary draw application to use another year. You can use your second choice on the same application to apply for a license.
- ▶ Moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat have a preference and weighted preference point fee. If you apply for a preference point hunt code as your first choice or are unsuccessful in drawing your first choice hunt, you'll be charged a **\$50 resident or \$100 nonresident preference point fee**. The fee is waived for youth, resident lifetime license holders and residents who are in the military on active duty outside Colorado.
- ▶ You'll have the option to **OPT OUT** of paying the preference point fee while filling out your draw application(s), and therefore will not be charged the fee and will **NOT** acquire a preference or weighted point for 2020. This includes if you

apply for a preference point hunt code as your first choice.

- ▶ If you apply for a point only, your credit card on file will be charged after the draw. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. If your card can't be charged, you will get an email notification. If you don't pay by the payment deadline (**JUNE 19**), you will forfeit your preference point for 2020. For more, see "Preference Points" on page 9.

### MOOSE LICENSE DRAWS USE WEIGHTED PREFERENCE POINTS:

1. There are three species of big-game animals that use the weighted preference point system to award licenses in Colorado: moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat.
2. Weighted preference increases your probability of drawing and applies to both male and female licenses.

3. Hunters can only accumulate up to three points for moose. If you have three preference points and you fail to draw a first-choice license, you will receive weighted preference.

4. Weighted preference is calculated by converting your application number into a different, random application number, then dividing that new application number by the number of weighted points you have, plus one. Individuals with three preference points and no weighted preference will have their application number divided by one.

5. This generates a new application number. Applications are sorted by this new number from lowest to highest, and low numbers for each hunt code are awarded licenses.

**NOTE:** The preference point fee for moose, Rocky Mountain bighorn sheep and mountain goat applies to preference points **AND** weighted preference points. For more details, go to: [cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference](http://cpw.state.co.us/weightedpreference)

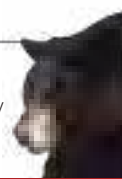

## NEED TO KNOW

▶ **NEW LOOK FOR THE BEAR PAW SYMBOL TO GET AN ADD-ON OVER-THE-COUNTER ARCHERY OR MUZZLELOADER BEAR LICENSE!**



Some archery and muzzleloader bear licenses are available in unlimited numbers this year as “add-on” licenses only: You can add on one of these bear licenses if you have a deer or elk license for the same method of take and at least one unit overlaps.

Check the archery and muzzleloader hunt code tables for deer (pages 22–25) and elk (pages 41–43) for the available add-on OTC bear license hunts. **Note that for some unit groupings, not every unit is valid for adding on an OTC bear license. Check the unit information in the tables carefully! Also see page 66 of this section.**

Go to [cpw.state.co.us/bearhunts](http://cpw.state.co.us/bearhunts) and check out the full list of every available bear hunt broken out by unit and hunt code to help find your ideal hunt.

▶ **NEW LIMITED LICENSES AVAILABLE FOR ARCHERY & MUZZLELOADER SEASONS:** In addition to rifle seasons, limited licenses are now available for archery and muzzleloader seasons too. *See the hunt code tables on pages 63–64.*

▶ **NEW YOUTH BEAR LICENSES NOW AVAILABLE:** Resident youth bear licenses are \$14, and nonresident youth bear licenses are \$50. These licenses will require the \$1.50 Wildlife Education Fund fee. *See license fee table on page 5.*

▶ **NEW RESIDENT BEAR LICENSE FEE REDUCED:** Resident bear licenses will be \$38 instead of \$48 this year. Nonresident bear licenses are \$100. These licenses will require the \$1.50 Wildlife Education Fund and \$0.25 search-and-rescue fees. *See license fee table on page 5.*

▶ **NEW ALL BEAR LICENSES FOR GMUs 71, 72, 73, 74, 711 & 741 THAT WERE LIST A ARE NOW LIST B:** This means hunters can get more than one bear license in these GMUs. Also, all private-land-only bear licenses in these same GMUs are now List C, meaning hunters can get any number of licenses. *See the “List A, B & C” table at right for options.*

▶ **CARCASS TAGS:** See page 16 for detailed instructions on when to detach your tag and how to transport your harvest.

▶ **INSIDE DENS:** Hunting, harvesting or harassing bears inside their dens is prohibited.

▶ **CUBS:** Black bears accompanied by one or more cubs cannot be killed. Cubs (bears younger than one year old) cannot be killed.

## LIST A, B &amp; C: GET MORE THAN ONE BEAR LICENSE

All big-game hunting licenses are either List A, B or C, as indicated in the last column of the hunt code tables. The List types exist so that you know if you can get more than one license for the same species:

- ♦ **List A:** You can only get **ONE** List A license = **A**
- ♦ **List B:** If a hunt is List B, you can get up to **TWO** licenses: one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B** or **B+B**
- ♦ **List C:** If a hunt is List C, you can get **ANY** number of List C licenses, as well as one List A license and one List B license, or two List B licenses = **A+B+C+C+C, etc.** or **B+B+C+C+C, etc.**

See below for your options of getting more than one bear license!

**ATTENTION:** You may submit **ONLY ONE** application for **EACH SPECIES, PER DRAW, PER YEAR**. Additional licenses for the same species must be obtained as leftovers, over the counter or special licenses issued by CPW.

## HOW TO GET THEM:

- ▶ **LIST A & B:** You may purchase **ONE** List A and **ONE** List B license per year, **OR TWO** List B licenses per year. These licenses are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **LIST C:** You may purchase as many List C licenses per year that you'd like, in addition to any other licenses you hold. These are available through the primary draw, secondary draw, as leftover licenses and over-the-counter as available.
- ▶ **EXAMPLE:** If you get a List B license in the primary draw, you can get either a List A or List B license in the secondary draw, and multiple List C licenses as leftover or over-the-counter licenses.
- ▶ **OVER-THE-COUNTER:** Sold at sales agents, CPW locations and online for rifle, archery and muzzleloader seasons. After the season opens, these are only sold at CPW locations. OTC archery and muzzleloader bear licenses are add-on only licenses. *See page 66 and below for details.*

## MULTIPLE OPTIONS FOR HUNTING BEAR!

**There are multiple ways to get a license and hunt bear in Colorado for 2020; it just depends on what you'd like to do! For example:**

**Hunter A:** Hunter A only likes to hunt bear, so hunter A would need to:

1. Apply for a **limited** archery, muzzleloader or rifle bear license from the hunt code tables on pages 63–65. And/or:
2. Buy an **over-the-counter** rifle bear license when OTC licenses go on sale Aug. 6 at 9 a.m. (*hunt code tables on page 67*).

**Hunter B:** Hunter B is planning to draw a deer or elk license, so hunter B has two options:

1. Also apply for a **limited** archery, muzzleloader or rifle bear license.
2. Wait to see if they are awarded an archery or muzzleloader deer or elk license, and then add on an **over-the-counter** bear license of the same method of take that matches at least one of the same units when OTC licenses go on sale.

**Hunter C:** Hunter C does not participate in the draw, but purchases an over-the-counter *archery elk* license every year. Hunter C will wait until **over-the-counter** licenses go on sale, purchase an OTC *archery elk* license, and then add on an OTC archery bear license that matches at least one of the same units. *There are no OTC archery deer licenses or OTC muzzleloader licenses for any species available.*

**PREFERENCE POINTS**

To apply for a point, enter **B-P-999-99-P** as your first-choice hunt code on your primary draw application.

You can gain a preference point as a first choice on your primary draw application to use another year. You can use your second through fourth choices on the same application to apply for a license. You may only submit one application per species, per draw, per year. **NEW** Note that the secondary draw does not gain or use preference points.

All big game species, except for moose, Rocky Mountain big-horn sheep and mountain goat, no longer have a preference point fee. The application fee, \$10.13 Habitat Stamp and qualifying license are nonrefundable. See *“Preference Points”* on page 9.

**MANDATORY BEAR INSPECTION & SEALS**

Hunters must personally present bears to a CPW office (*listed on the inside cover*) for a free inspection, check report and sealing within five working days after harvest.

Bear heads and hides must be unfrozen when presented for inspection. Seals must be attached to the hide until tanned.

Contact the nearest CPW office or CPW officer for inspection and sealing.

At inspection, CPW is authorized to extract and keep a premolar tooth. If the head and hide are frozen, CPW may keep them long enough to thaw so that a tooth can be removed. Hunters can help by mak-

ing sure the jaw is propped open with a stick before rigor sets in.

Bears cannot be taken out of Colorado until hide and skull are inspected and sealed. Having a bear hide without a seal after the five-day period is illegal, and the hide becomes state property.

To transport a bear or parts to a foreign country, you must first obtain CITES documents. Contact the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service, 303-342-7430. Do not call the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service about inspections or seals for bears.

  - You **must** have any deer or elk license that is valid during archery season before you can purchase an over-the-counter archery bear license.
  - You **must** have any deer or elk license that is valid during muzzleloader season before you can purchase an over-the-counter muzzleloader bear license.
  - At least **one** game management unit on your deer or elk license must match **one** unit listed on your bear license.

- ▶ **CHECK THE DEER & ELK HUNT CODE TABLES:** Look for the bear paw symbol in the archery and muzzleloader hunt code tables for deer (pages 22–25) and elk (pages 41–43) to find hunts with add-on archery and muzzleloader bear licenses available.
- ▶ **WHEN YOU CAN HUNT:** You may hunt bear any time during the dates specified in the archery and muzzleloader tables below, with the correct method of take.
- ▶ **WHERE YOU CAN HUNT:** You may hunt bear in any of the unit(s) listed in the table for which your bear license is valid. **If your deer or elk license is for private land only, you must use your bear license on private land only.**

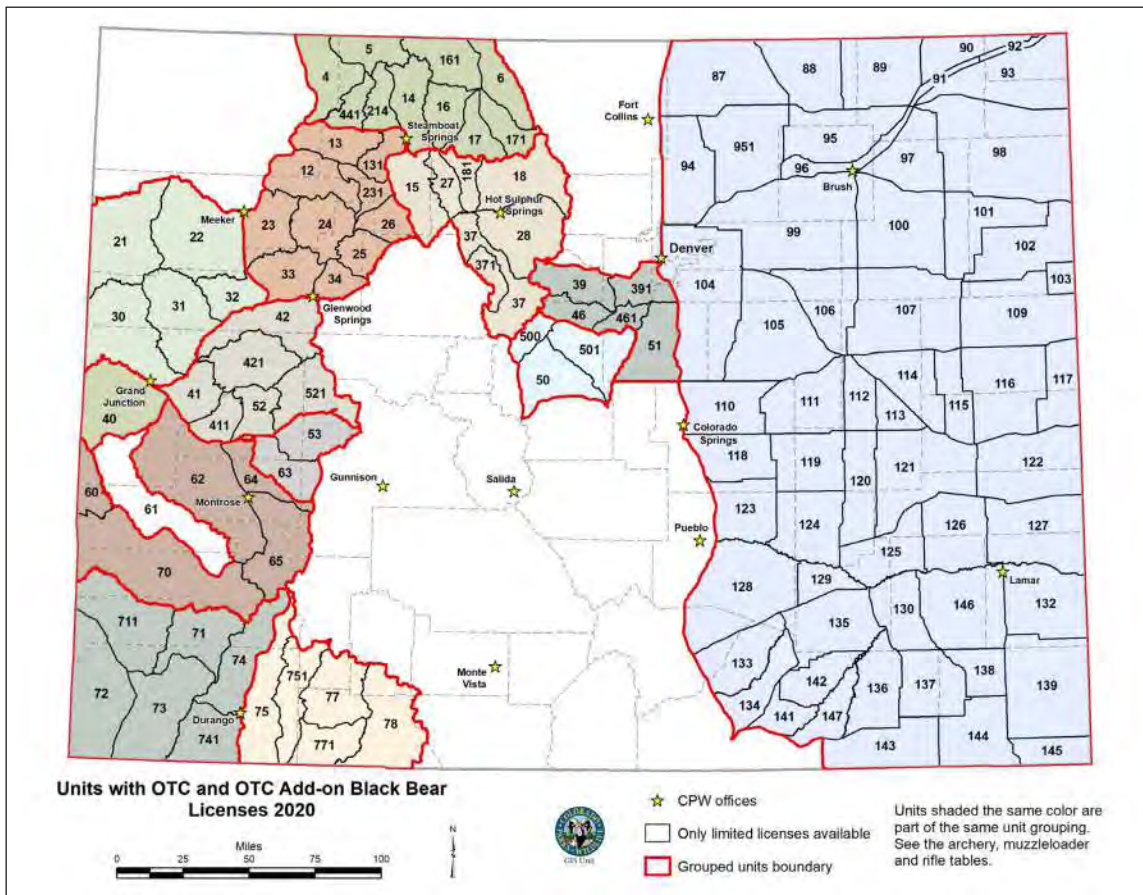

These licenses are **NOT** available through the draws. If you apply for these hunt codes in a draw, your application will be automatically disqualified. Licenses are available on a first-come, first-served basis starting at **9 A.M. AUG 6.**

## LATE-SEASON BIG-GAME COUNTS

CPW conducts big-game counts with planes and helicopters in late seasons. The counts must occur at this time and may disperse animals.

### 4UR RANCH ACCESS PERMIT (UNIT 76)

Limited public access to USFS lands for big-game hunting is available through the 4UR ranch by permit during rifle seasons only. Hunters must possess a valid GMU 76 rifle elk or rifle deer license. Hunters are selected by random drawing. Application deadline: August 15. Group applications are allowed.

Permits not issued by draw will be issued on a first request basis. For information or a permit application, call the CPW Monte Vista Office at 719-587-6900.

### AIR FORCE ACADEMY (AFA)

Hunters must pay an Air Force Academy access fee and receive a mandatory safety orientation. All hunting is escorted, and is allowed only on the days, areas and by method of take authorized by the Academy. Call 719-333-3308 or visit [usafa.isportsman.net](http://usafa.isportsman.net) for more details.

1. Oct. 1–Dec. 31, unit 512 (specific days determined by AFA): Limited buck and doe deer licenses available by CPW drawing. See unit 512 in deer rifle section for hunt code. Deer hunting on the AFA is conducted to accomplish population management objectives.

### CONUNDRUM HOT SPRINGS AREA OF MAROON BELLS-SNOWMASS WILDERNESS (UNIT 43)

Limited licenses are available by CPW drawing. Archery either-sex and bull elk licenses for second and third seasons are sold over the counter. A CPW license does not guarantee or authorize access to Fort Carson or Piñon Canyon. Military training has priority, CPW cannot offer refunds after the start of the season if access is unavailable.

Seasons on Fort Carson may be limited to muzzleloader, shotgun or archery. Access to Fort Carson and Piñon Canyon may be limited and subject to closures, call or check website. In addition to CPW requirements, Fort Carson requires other permits and briefings for hunters.

Be advised that both Fort Carson and Piñon Canyon utilize an automated check-in procedure called I-Sportsman. Check the website below for more information.

## STATEWIDE RESTRICTIONS

1. Hunting is prohibited within 50 feet of centerline of state highways or municipal or county roads. Land between divided highways is closed to hunting.
2. **HUNTERS:** Be aware that specific restrictions apply on State Wildlife Areas and State Trust Lands leased by CPW. Before hunting on any of these properties, please consult the CPW State Recreational Lands brochure, available at CPW offices, license agents or online.
3. Hunting is prohibited in Gore Creek drainage south of I-70 from Lion's Head ski lift at Vail to I-70 and U.S. 24. Hunting is prohibited north of I-70 and within a half-mile of I-70 between Vail and I-70 and U.S. 24.
4. Certain counties and national wildlife refuges may have individual restrictions. Consult specific counties and refuges websites for more information.
5. National parks and monuments managed by the National Park Service are closed to hunting. Check park websites for more information.
6. Research your hunting area before your hunting season. CPW cannot offer refunds after the start of the season if hunting access is unavailable.

### STATE TRUST LANDS (STL)

CPW participates in the State Trust Lands public access program, but not all State Trust Lands designated on maps are in the CPW program. Only STL properties in CPW's State Recreational Lands brochure may be open for wildlife recreation.

### PUBLIC LANDS USE & CLOSURES

Public lands throughout Colorado are managed by several different agencies. At any time, projects and other uses can be occurring on the land and impact hunting destination, access or change animal distribution. Hunters must be aware that destinations or travel routes might be altered during hunting seasons. Contact the agency that manages the land where you will be hunting before the start of the hunting season.

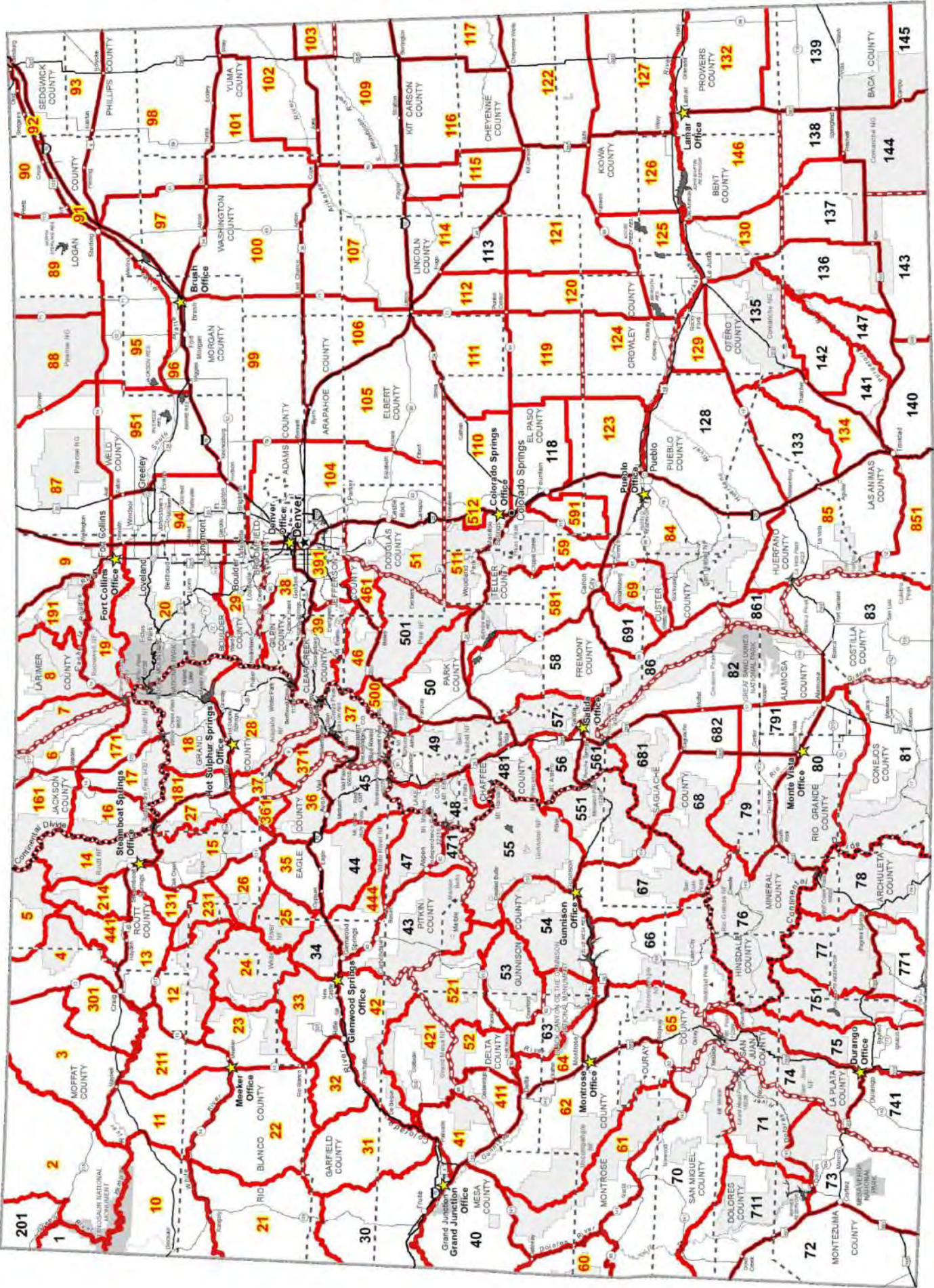
