





- "We have only to kick in the front door and the whole rotten Russian edifice will come tumbling down." Hitler


## Why does Germany attack the Soviet Union?

- Hitler's system would be based on the British occupation of India: "What India was for England the territories of Russia will be for us... The German colonists ought to live on handsome, spacious farms. The German services will be lodged in marvellous buildings, the governors in palaces...
- Oil field in Caucasus Mountains
- To Enslave or exterminate Slavs



# Why is Russia such a difficult country to attack?

- 2,000 mile front
- Timing is everything
- Russian soldiers: bravery and fear







- Initially, Germans were to start May 15 set back (dangerous WHY???) Russian winter! 1943 44 below zero...
- In total the Germans and allies used 3 million soldiers, 3580 tanks, 7184 artillery guns, 1830 planes and 750,000 horses.

• Stalin's strategy: Keep using fresh Red **Army troops** to counterattack the blitzkrieg

#### Ruthless brutality in Soviet Union



- 10 Russian lives per German
- 1941 3 million
   Russians killed

Stalin and Soviet Leadership included: Battle of Moscow – 8,000 Soviet citizens executed for perceived cowardice

Scorched Earth Policy



#### Einsatzgruppen

- SS paramilitary death squads
- Principal Task: "liquidation" of Jews, Gypsies, and Soviet political commissars
- According to their records:
   more than 1 million murdered
   (almost all civilians) average
   337 murders per day for each
   group of 500-800 in 2 years

Methods: costly, demoralizing to troops, and inefficient – leads to the decision of establishing extermination camps at the Wannsee Conference (Jan. 1942)





- 1940: French Indochina


### American Response to Japanese Expansion


- Trade Treaties cancelled in 1937
- US was officially neutral but backed the "Allies" –
   Atlantic Charter, Lend-Lease Act
- 1940: Banned export of oil & scrap metal to Japan
  - Japan imported 100% of its oil
  - Over 50% of Japan's oil came from US before 1940
  - Embargo was seen as an act of war
- US moved large Pacific Fleet to base at Pearl Harbor, Hawaii

#### Why bomb America?



- Hideki Tojo believed that war with the US was inevitable; attack plan was formed
- Goal: neutralize US Navy power
- Fleet Admiral Yamamoto
   Isoroku is said to have mused,
   "I fear that all we have done is awakened a sleeping giant and filled him with terrible resolve."


## USS Lexington, USS Enterprise, and USS Saratoga are out to sea at the time of attack



#### The First Wave



- 6am 183 fighters, dive bombers, and torpedo planes took off
- 6:45am US destroyer Ward fires on Midget submarine
- 7am radar spotted unidentified aircraft; 7:15 report from US Ward
- 7:33am Warning from Washington by telegraph (does not reach headquarters until 11:45)






#### The Attack

- To, to, to attack
- To ra, to ra, to ra: attack, surprise achieved
- 7:55am: AIR RAID ON PEARL HARBOR X THIS IS NOT A DRILL
- 8:54am Second Attack Wave: 35 fighters, 78 dive-bombers, and 54 high altitude bombers meet heavy anti-aircraft fire
- 10am Japanese return to aircraft carriers







#### Results

- Astonishing surprise and success for Japanese
- US Fleet was severely crippled 21 ships sunk/damaged, including 8 battleships (6 mo.)
- Around 200 aircraft were lost
- Japanese losses: 29 aircraft and 5 midget subs
- Panic spread in western US: possible Japanese invasion???
- US declared war on Dec. 8
- Japan expanded its attacks in Asia: Philippines,
   Guam, Burma, Borneo, and Hong Kong

- 1178 more were wounded
- 68 civilians killed
- Fires burned for 2 days







## Japanese "mistakes"

- No immediate follow up plan (3<sup>rd</sup> attack cancelled)
- "Divided" America now ready for war
- Ships attacked were older, built in 1920s
- Ships sunk in shallow harbor waters (All but Arizona, Utah, and Oklahoma were raised/rebuilt)
- No damage to dry docks, fuel tanks, repair facilities
- Aircraft Carriers: not in the base
- Submarine bases: not damaged
- Hitler declares war on the US Dec. 11: now America can help Britain!



## USS Arizona



- Positioned in "Battle Row".
- Hit within 10 min.
   after attack began
- Bomb crashed through the 2 armored deck, igniting its magazine
- Went down with 1,177/1400 lives in around 9 minutes



"Created to honor the survivors of Pearl Harbor, their families and friends, and to all those who died."

The ship has been preserved as a tomb for those who went down with the ship.

Erected in 1962.

### How did the U.S. retaliate?


- Doolittle Raid April 18, 1942
- Lieutenant Colonel Jimmy Doolittle led 16 B-25 Mitchell Medium bombers with 5 member crews into Japan

 Dropped bombs on factories, military targets, and the imperial palace









But...over the next 2 years, the U.S. & the Allies began to win the wars in Europe & the Pacific

#### Incarceration of Japanese Americans




FDR was convinced to sign Executive Order 9066 – 10 internment camps: Canada followed and interned 23,000 Japanese

 The word "Jap" is considered an ethnic slur today – controversial/offensive








The Wartime Relocation **Agency** (WRA) forced approximately 110,000 Japanese Americans to...

...sell their homes and businesses,




