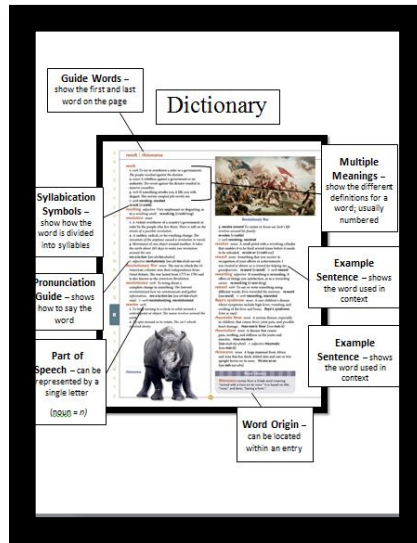
Lesson Overview: 5.2E/Fig. 19D : Dictionary Overview

Using and interpreting dictionary definitions is a multi-faceted skill. The teacher needs to explicitly teach each part of the entry, helping students to understand features like:

- ❑ Syllabication symbols
- ❑ Pronunciation guides
- ❑ Part of speech
- ❑ Word origins
- ❑ Multiple meanings (a.k.a. Homographs)
- ❑ Example Sentence

Dictionary Overview

1. The teacher begins by projecting the Dictionary Anchor Chart. The teacher shows the students the navigational tools and features of the dictionary included on the Dictionary Anchor Chart.



2. Next the teacher asks the students to alphabetize a short list of words.

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3. Once the words are alphabetized, the student searches through the dictionary for the guide words that appear on the page on which each entry is contained. The students alphabetize the words and fill out a form that looks like this:

revolt | rhinoceros

revolt
1. *verb* To try to overthrow a ruler or a government: *The people revolted against the dictator.*
2. *noun* A rebellion against a government or an authority: *The revolt against the dictator resulted in massive casualties.*
3. *verb* If something revolts you, it fills you with disgust: *This wormy compost pile revolts me.*
▷ *verb* revolting, revolted
revolt (ri-voht)
revolt (ri-voht)
revolting *adjective* Very unpleasant or disgusting, as in a revolting smell. **rev-olt-ing** (ri-voht-ing)
revolution *noun*
1. A violent overthrow of a country's government or ruler by the people who live there: *There is talk on the streets of a possible revolution.*
2. A sudden, radical, or far-reaching change: *The invention of the airplane caused a revolution in travel.*
3. Movement of one object around another: *It takes the earth about 365 days to make one revolution around the sun.*
rev-o-lu-tion (rev-uh-loo-shuhn)
▷ *adjective* **revolutionary** (rev-uh-loo-shuh-ner-ee)
Revolutionary War *noun* The war in which the 13 American colonies won their independence from Great Britain. The war lasted from 1775 to 1783 and is also known as the *American Revolution*.
revolutionize *verb* To bring about a complete change in something: *The Internet revolutionized how we communicate and gather information.* **rev-o-lu-tion-ize** (rev-uh-loo-shuh-nize) ▷ *verb* revolutionizing, revolutionized
revolve *verb*
1. To keep turning in a circle or orbit around a central point or object: *The moon revolves around the earth.*
2. To spin around or to rotate: *The car's wheels revolved slowly.*

3. **revolve around** To center or focus on: *Jack's life revolves around his family.*
re-volve (ri-vahlv)
▷ *verb* revolving, revolved
revolver *noun* A small pistol with a revolving cylinder that enables it to be fired several times before it needs to be reloaded. **re-volv-er** (ri-vahl-vur)
reward *noun* Something that you receive in recognition of your efforts or achievements: *I was treated to dinner as a reward for helping my grandparents.* **re-ward** (ri-word) ▷ *verb* reward
rewarding *adjective* If something is rewarding, it offers or brings you satisfaction, as in a rewarding career. **re-ward-ing** (ri-wor-ding)
reward *verb* To say or write something using different words: *Erin rewarded the sentence.* **re-word** (ree-wurd) ▷ *verb* rewarding, rewarded
Reye's syndrome *noun* A rare children's disease whose symptoms include high fever, vomiting, and swelling of the liver and brain. **Reye's syndrome** (rize or rayz)
rheumatic fever *noun* A serious disease, especially in children, that causes fever, joint pain, and possible heart damage. **rheu-mat-ic fever** (roo-mat-ik)
rheumatism *noun* A disease that causes pain, swelling, and stiffness in the joints and muscles. **rheu-ma-tism** (roo-muh-tiz-uhm) ▷ *adjective* rheumatic (roo-mat-ik)
rhinoceros *noun* A large mammal from Africa and Asia that has thick, folded skin and one or two upright horns on its nose. **rhi-noc-er-os** (rye-nah-sur-uhs)



rhinoceros

Word History
Rhinoceros comes from a Greek word meaning "animal with a horn on its nose." It is based on *rhin*, "nose," and *keros*, "having a horn."

Multiple-Meaning Words (a.k.a. Homographs)

1. For lessons on Multiple-Meaning Words (or as they are technically known, homographs), use the MMW PowerPoint. The slides feature sentences that use a word in a given context that has multiple meanings.
2. Model thinking through the question and finding the correct definition for the first word *pit*.
3. Then ask the students to Turn and Talk to their partner about which definition makes most sense given the context of the sentence using the next slide for the word *seal*.
4. The students' individual practice would be to identify a reasonable definition for the last two slides in the PowerPoint for the words *check* and *cool*.
5. Independent Practice: This can be done in a center that all students rotate through, or during independent work time. It could be completed on various days throughout the week. This will depend on how you structure your independent time.
