CAVS QUICK FACTS

- The Cleveland Cavaliers face the Washington Wizards this evening in the second night of a back-to-back. This will be the first of four matchups this season between the Cavs and Wizards (Dec. 8 at CLE, Jan. 29 at CLE & Feb. 8 at WAS). **Cleveland has won 4 straight road contests in Washington, their second-longest active road winning streak against an opponent (9 consecutive road wins at New York).**
- Since the 2012-13 season, the Cavs hold a 15-7 record against Washington, which includes a 9-2 mark on the road. In the last 11 road outings versus the Wizards, Cleveland is averaging 110.1 points (.469 FG%, .403 3FG%, .813 FT%).
- The last time these two teams squared off, Cleveland overcame a 17-point deficit (87-104) with 7:35 left in the fourth quarter to win 119-115 at The Q (4/5/18). The Cavaliers went on a 32-11 run to close out the contest. The last time the Wine & Gold overcame a 17+ point deficit in the fourth quarter was on Nov. 14, 2014 versus Boston (trailed by 19). With the win, the Cavs ended up going 3-1 against the Wizards in 2017-18.
- UPCOMING MILESTONES: TRISTAN THOMPSON (2,744 DREB) is 7 defensive rebounds shy of passing Jim Chones (2,750 DREB) for the 6th-most in franchise history.
- Cleveland has held each of their last 3 opponents to under 100 points. Over that stretch (since 11/7), foes are averaging 94.3 points on .410 shooting from the field, including just .256 from three-point range. Cleveland has also outrebounded them 54.7 to 39.7 in that time.
- The Cavs are coming off a 24-point win (113-89) over the Charlotte Hornets last night at The Q. In the victory, Cleveland set season highs for field goal percentage (.529, 45-85), three-point percentage (.542, 13-24), points in the first quarter (38) and points in the first half (67), while also having at least six players score in double figures for the 8th time this season (Jordan Clarkson-24, David Nwaba-18, Rodney Hood-16, Collin Sexton-16, JR Smith-13, Tristan Thompson-11). On the defensive side, the Cavs limited the Hornets to .347 (33-95) shooting from the field and .195 (8-41) from three-point range (both opponent season lows).
- Also in last night's win, Cleveland outrebound Charlotte 60-37 (+23), their biggest rebound margin since Feb. 28, 2014 versus Utah (+25, 56-31). The last time the Cavs pulled down at least 60 rebounds also occurred that year (2/18/14 at PHI, 61 rebounds). Yesterday was the 10th time this season that the Cavs have secured more rebounds than their opponent. (Elias Sports Bureau)
- In three quarters of play last night, TRISTAN THOMPSON finished with 11 points on 5-6 (.833) shooting, a career-high tying 21 rebounds and a career-high tying five assists in 28 minutes. The last Cavs player to grab 20+ rebounds through the first three quarters of a game was Anderson Varejao (21 through 3Q on 10/30/2012 vs. WSH). Thompson enters tonight's contest with 4 consecutive double-doubles (15.5 PTS, 16.0 REB, .644 FG%, 32.0 MIN since 11/5), tying his career long streak accomplished 6 other times (most recently 2/11/17-2/23/17). (Elias Sports Bureau)
- In his three starts (since 11/7), COLLIN SEXTON is averaging 17.0 points, 3.7 rebounds and 2.7 assists in 36.3 minutes. Sexton continues to lead all rookie qualifiers in free throw percentage at .919, while ranking 4th in PPG (12.0) and 5th in APG (2.3).
- Entering tonight, the Cavs rank 4th in PPG off the bench (45.5). Last night, the team had 50 points from the reserves. JORDAN CLARKSON, who has scored in double-digits in all 13 games so far, finished with a game-high 24 points on 9-15 (.600) shooting, five rebounds, two assists and a block in 28 minutes, while DAVID NWABA posted season-highs of 18 points on 7-9 (.778) shooting, five rebounds, two assists in 27 minutes.
- JR SMITH has scored in double figures in 4 of the last 5 games, including last night (13 PTS, 3-7 3FG, 3 REB, 5 AST, 1 STL, 1 BLK, 39 MIN).

CAVALIERS 119, WIZARDS 115 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (4/5/18)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James registered his 50th double-double of the season with a game-high 33 points (13 in the 4th Q) on 12-20 (.600) shooting, a game-high tying 14 assists and nine rebounds in 39 minutes...Kevin Love contributed 16 points, going 4-6 (.667) from deep, six rebounds, three assists and one steal in 31 minutes...Rodney Hood notched 11 points on 3-6 (.500) shooting, three rebounds, two assists and a team-high tying two steals in 27 minutes...Kyle Korver tallied 13 points, knocking down 3-5 (.600) triples, three rebounds and one block in 22 minutes as a reserve...Jordan Clarkson added 10 points and a team-high tying two steals in 22 minutes off the bench...For the Wizards, John Wall recorded a team-high 28 points on 10-20 (.500) shooting, a game-high tying 14 assists, four rebounds and a game-high three steals in 38 minutes...Bradley Beal contributed 19 points, connecting on 4-6 (.667) three-pointers, a team-high nine rebounds and eight assists in 43 minutes.

TURNING POINT: Down by 17 (87-104) with 7:35 left in the game, the Cavaliers went on a 32-11 run to close out the contest; The last time the Cavaliers overcame a 17+ point deficit in the fourth quarter was on Nov. 14, 2014 versus Boston (trailed by 19).

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: The Cavaliers took the season series against Washington (3-1)...Cleveland outscored the Wizards 37-25 in the final period, going 11-15 (.733) from the field, while also knocking down 13 free throws in the fourth quarter...For the game, Cleveland shot 42-77 (.545) from the field, including 13-27 (.481) from beyond the arc, and had 26 assists...The Cavaliers notched 20 fast break points...Cleveland swiped 10 steals from the Wizards and scored 23 points off of 15 Washington turnovers.

CAVALIERS 103, WIZARDS 110 – QUICKEN LOANS ARENA – CLEVELAND, OH (2/22/18)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James recorded a game-high 32 points on 13-18 (.722) shooting, a team-high eight assists, a game-high tying nine rebounds and two steals in 37 minutes...Tristan Thompson contributed 12 points on 6-7 (.857) shooting, a game-high tying nine rebounds and two assists in 28 minutes...J.R. Smith registered 15 points on 6-12 (.500) shooting, connecting on three three-pointers, one block and one steal in 33 minutes...For Washington, Bradley Beal contributed a team-high 18 points, a game-high nine assists, two rebounds and two blocks in 36 minutes.

TURNING POINT: After leading 89-88 with 9:42 left in the fourth quarter, the Cavs were outscored by the Wizards 16-5 over the next six minutes and trailed 104-93 with 3:44 remaining.

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James tied his career high with his 3rd straight triple-double (6th on the season), tallying 20 points, a game-high 12 rebounds, a game-high 15 assists and one block in 41 minutes...Kevin Love posted a team-high 25 points, shooting 5-8 (.625) from deep, nine rebounds and one steal in 32 minutes...Kyle Korver finished with 11 points on 4-6 (.667) shooting, two assists and a steal in 24 minutes as a reserve...J.R. Smith grabbed a season-high nine rebounds, to go along with seven points, two steals and one block in 29 minutes...For the Wizards, Bradley Beal tallied a game-high 27 points, five rebounds and five assists in 43 minutes...John Wall had 15 points, a team-high 10 rebounds and a team-high six assists in 32 minutes...Mike Scott added 19 points, four rebounds and four assists in 33 minutes.

CAVALIERS 130, WIZARDS 122 – CAPITAL ONE ARENA – WASHINGTON, DC (11/3/17)

KEY PERFORMERS: LeBron James recorded his 6th double-double of the season with a franchise-record tying 57 points on 23-34 (.676) shooting, a perfect 9-9 mark from the foul line, a game-high 11 rebounds, a team-high seven assists, three steals and two blocks in 43 minutes; James set a career-high and franchise record in field goals made (23) and scored the 29,000th point of his career with his dunk at the 7:31 mark of the first quarter, becoming the 7th player to reach that plateau and the youngest (32 years, 308 days)...Derrick Rose finished with 20 points on 8-16 (.500) shooting and two assists in 29 minutes...Jae Crowder tallied 17 points on 4-7 (.571) shooting, a perfect 8-8 clip from the charity stripe, seven rebounds and two steals in 34 minutes...Kevin Love added 11 points, eight rebounds and a steal in 27 minutes...For the Wizards, Bradley Beal had a team-high 36 points on 12-19 (.632) shooting and four rebounds in 37 minutes...Kelly Oubre Jr. tallied 21 points and six rebounds in 34 minutes off the bench...John Wall posted a double-double with 13 points and a game-high 15 assists in 38 minutes.

TURNING POINT: With the score knotted at 35 with 1:11 to go in the first quarter, Cleveland went on a 7-1 run to go up 42-36 and would lead the rest of the way.

CAVS HIGHLIGHTS: Offensively, the Cavs scored 130 points on 46-82 (.561) shooting from the field, 12-27 (.444) from beyond the arc and 26-28 (.929) from the foul line...Defensively, the Cavs had 11 steals and gave up zero fast break points.

CLEVELAND TO HOST NBA ALL-STAR 2022 AND COMMEMORATE THE LEAGUE'S 75th ANNIVERSARY

CLEVELAND, Nov. 1, 2018 – The NBA announced that Cleveland has been selected to host NBA All-Star 2022, when the league will be commemorating its 75th anniversary. The 71st NBA All-Star Game will take place at Quicken Loans Arena, home of the Cleveland Cavaliers, on Sunday, Feb. 20, 2022. The Cavaliers previously hosted NBA All-Star in 1997, when the NBA celebrated its 50th anniversary, and in 1981.

NBA Commissioner Adam Silver made the announcement on Nov. 1 during a press conference at Quicken Loans Arena, where he was joined by Cavaliers Chairman Dan Gilbert, Cavaliers and Quicken Loans Arena CEO Len Komoroski, Cleveland Mayor Frank G. Jackson, Cuyahoga County Executive Armond Budish and U.S. Representative, Eleventh Congressional District of Ohio, Marcia Fudge.

“Cleveland is a passionate sports city with a proven track record of hosting large-scale, global events,” said Silver. “We thank Dan Gilbert, Len Komoroski and the civic leaders for their commitment, and we look forward to a weeklong celebration of our game.”

With the current, large-scale arena renovations underway that will be completed in advance of NBA All-Star 2022, the game and extended activities in the transformed Quicken Loans Arena will offer fans an enhanced experience.

“We are proud to host NBA All-Star weekend in Cleveland in 2022,” said Gilbert. “We have been working with the NBA, the City of Cleveland and Cuyahoga County to deliver this iconic event to Northeast Ohio for the last couple of years. The transformation and new state-of-the-art Quicken Loans Arena was an important factor in the NBA’s decision to choose Cleveland for this exciting classic broadcast across the globe. The world will get to see the modern Cleveland and all of its diversity, innovation and promise for the future.”

“Along with the excitement and appreciation for the NBA selecting Cleveland and Quicken Loans Arena to host NBA All-Star 2022, we want to extend a big ‘thanks’ to our local partners at Destination Cleveland and the Greater Cleveland Sports Commission, and our City, County and Civic leaders,” said Komoroski. “Their support and energy to always demonstrate what we as a community do best is at the core of bringing these major events to our city. We have a great partnership that will deliver an experience fitting for the NBA All-Star global spotlight. We thank the NBA for their confidence in this collective group, and we will put forth the focus and commitment to ensure that the players, fans, corporate partners, media and all who visit have an extraordinary experience in Cleveland and at the transformed Q in 2022.”

“The City of Cleveland is pleased to host NBA All-Star 2022,” said Mayor Jackson. “Our city is no stranger to hosting successful, large, global events. It is a good opportunity, once again, for visitors to come to Cleveland and experience all we have to offer.”

“This is great news for Cleveland and Cuyahoga County,” said Budish. “When we made the decision to invest in the transformation of the Q, we were aiming for exactly this kind of result. I am thrilled to see the NBA All-Star Game coming in 2022 with an expected \$100 million economic impact to our region. Once again, our city and county will shine on the national and international stage and our businesses and residents will reap the rewards.”

NBA All-Star on-court events will tip off on Friday, Feb. 18 at Quicken Loans Arena with MTN DEW ICE Rising Stars, an annual showcase for top rookies and second-year NBA players. On Feb. 19, State Farm All-Star Saturday Night will feature the Taco Bell Skills Challenge and the Three-Point and Slam Dunk contests. NBA All-Star 2022 will culminate with the NBA All-Star Game on Sunday, Feb. 20.

The NBA will host several events for fans of all ages at venues throughout the city, including The Wolstein Center at Cleveland State University and Huntington Convention Center of Cleveland. These events, including NBA All-Star Practice and the NBA All-Star Celebrity Game presented by Ruffles, will feature basketball programming and entertainment for fans as well as up-close access to NBA players, legends and celebrities.

The league will also continue to celebrate its tradition and commitment to social responsibility with a full schedule of NBA Cares events during NBA All-Star 2022. Through partnerships with schools, government and local nonprofit organizations in Cleveland and surrounding areas, the league will reach thousands of children and families and provide critical resources to community-based programs.

In 2022, the NBA All-Star Game will be televised in prime time on TNT for the 20th consecutive year, marking Turner Sports’ 37th year of NBA All-Star coverage. The game will be broadcast worldwide in 215 countries and territories and in 50 languages.

NBA ALL-STAR HISTORY IN CLEVELAND

Cleveland last hosted NBA All-Star in 1997, when the league celebrated its 50th anniversary season. The NBA’s 50 Greatest Players were honored during a ceremony at halftime of the All-Star Game.

The 1997 NBA All-Star Game featured a historic performance from Charlotte Hornets forward Glen Rice, who set an All-Star record for points in a quarter with 20 in the third period. Rice finished with 26 points to lead the Eastern Conference past the Western Conference 132-120, earning MVP honors.

Also at NBA All-Star 1997, Los Angeles Lakers rookie guard Kobe Bryant won the Slam Dunk Contest, Chicago Bulls guard Steve Kerr triumphed in the Three-Point Contest and Philadelphia 76ers rookie guard Allen Iverson was named MVP of Rising Stars.

The Cavaliers also hosted NBA All-Star 1981, at Richfield Coliseum, the team’s home from 1974-94. Behind MVP Tiny Archibald of the Boston Celtics, the East defeated the West 123-120.

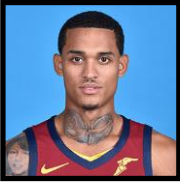

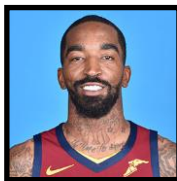

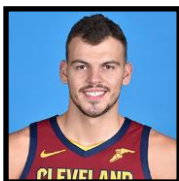
