<p><b>question</b> a sentence that asks for a reply <i>I asked you a question. Can you please respond?</i></p> <p>a matter to be discussed <i>The members at the question of whether to add more tennis courts at the club.</i></p> <p>to express doubt about <i>The parents question their son's decision not to go to college.</i></p>	<p><b>any</b> one or some, no matter which or how many <i>You can pick any candy you want.</i></p> <p>one or another; each and every <i>Draw a picture of any kitten.</i></p> <p>even a very small amount of <i>I do not want any trouble.</i></p> <p>at all; to a degree <i>Do you feel any better?</i></p>
