

# Five Things You **NEED TO DO** Before You Take the NYS Teacher Certification Exams

All teacher education students need to take teacher certification exams in order to get certified in New York State. While there are exceptions by program, students generally need to pass three exams – the EAS, edTPA, and a content test specific to your content area– in order to get certified. These exams are challenging. Don't waste your time and money by having to retake exams. Make time to prepare!

Here are **five** things you need to do to prepare to pass the certification exams:

## 1) Learn about the Exam Content

Start by reading through the **exam frameworks**:

### 2) Take advantage of free test prep resources

### 3) <u>Practice, practice, practice</u>!

#### 4) Plan Ahead

Give yourself enough time to study and practice before the day of your test. Some **testing centers** fill up quickly,
