pool

to collect into a pool of liquid

The spilled milk pooled in the center of the table.



pool

a supply of vehicles or goods available for use when needed

We own the oldest vehicle in the motor pool.



pool

a group of people available for work when required or considered as a resource

We'll need access to the typing pool for help with typing up this project.



pool

a group of contestants who compete against each other in a tournament for the right to advance to the next round

I am in the second pool of contestants in the singing competition.

pool

(of two or more people or organizations) put (money or other assets) into a common fund

They entered a contract to pool any gains from their investments.



pool

share (things) for the benefit of all those involved

We had some time to think by ourselves and then we pooled our ideas.



pool

a game played on a table using fifteen colored and numbered balls and a white cue ball

My dad has a pool table in our basement.



pound

to strike over and over with heavy blows

The construction worker pounded the nails with a hammer.

to put into someone's mind by repeating over and over

He won't remember to do it unless you pound it into him.



pound

to throb or beat

My heart was pounding after the race.



pound

the act of pounding

Barry gave the tent stake a good pound with a rock.



pound

a unit of weight equal to 16 ounces or 453.592 grams

I'll need a pound of minced meat.

the main unit of money of the United Kingdom and Ireland

We need to exchange our dollars into pounds for our trip to London.



pound

a shelter for keeping stray animals

Let's go to the pound to look at the dogs.



pupil

a student in school

The teacher pointed out the pupil's mistakes.



pupil

the small, dark opening in the center of the eye. Light passes through the pupil into the eye

The pupil of the eye expands as much as 45 percent when a person looks at something they like.

racket

a loud unpleasant noise; a din

The bus driver told us to stop making such a racket.



racket

dishonest activities by a group of people whose aim is to cheat others of their money

The gangsters in the movie were running a protection racket.





racket

an object used to hit the ball in tennis, squash or badminton. It is made of a round or oval frame with a network of tightly laced strings and a long handle

I broke the string in my racket, so I'll have to get it restrung.

range

the two points or limits between which something can vary, or the distance between the limits

This shirt comes in a wide range of sizes.

the distance or area over which something can reach or function

Dogs can hear sounds that are not in the range of human hearing.



range

an area used for practice in shooting.

Police officers learn to shoot at a shooting range.



range

a large, open area of land on which livestock graze and roam

The cowboys rode on the open range.



range

a series of connected mountains

The Himalayan mountain range is the highest on earth.

a cooking stove with burners and an oven

We cook our food on the range.



range

to be within certain limits

The school grades range from A to D.



range

to roam; wander

The backpackers ranged all over the US.



rent

a regular payment made to an owner of property for the right to live in or use that property

The rent for our house is \$1,000 a month.

right

facing out; outer; front

The right side of the jacket is red; the inside is black.

proper; appropriate

His new job was just right for him.



right

healthy in body or mind

I don't feel right and need to go see a doctor.



right

of, located on, or pertaining to the side of the human body that is opposite where the heart is or to the side of any other thing in the same position.





right

that which is just, fair, or good

I did right by returning the lost wallet.

(sometimes plural) that which is due to a person from nature or law

Freedom of speech is one of the most important rights enjoyed by Americans.



right

the quality or condition of being correct

I have to admit you were in the right about completing the project your way.

directly; straight

She walked right toward me.



right

without delay; immediately

They went right home.

a tool with a thin metal blade that has sharp teeth along the edge. Saws are used for cutting hard materials such as wood or metal.

scale

one of the many small, hard, thin plates that cover fish, reptiles, and certain other animals

The scales on the lizard feel cold to the touch.

scale

any thin, flat piece that flakes off skin or another surface

When I scratched my arm, scales of skin fell off.





scale

to remove the scales from

We need to scale and clean the fish before we cook them.



PRE

scale

(often plural) a device used for weighing

The fish mongers use a scale to weigh the fish.

scale



a set of numbered marks made at evenly spaced points along a ruler, thermometer, or other measuring device

The scale of this measuring tape is in centimeters.



scale



the size of a model or map compared to the actual size of the thing it represents

This map has a scale of one inch to ten miles.



scale



degree, extent, or level

We like to do our Christmas celebrations on a large scale for the whole family.



scale

a series of musical tones going up or down in pitch

I need to practice my scales to learn the piano.

to climb up or on top of

We scaled a steep cliff.
