

















Multiple Meaning Words

 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a small area of still water, typically one formed naturally</p> <p><i>Pools of water formed on the street after the rain.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a small, shallow patch of liquid lying on a surface</p> <p><i>There's a pool of oil under our car.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a deep place in a stream or river</p> <p><i>The water in the pool is colder than the water near the banks.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a large hole lined with cement or a very large container that is filled with water and used for swimming; swimming pool</p> <p><i>He swam in the pool.</i></p>

 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>to collect into a pool of liquid</p> <p><i>The spilled milk pooled in the center of the table.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a supply of vehicles or goods available for use when needed</p> <p><i>We own the oldest vehicle in the motor pool.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a group of people available for work when required or considered as a resource</p> <p><i>We'll need access to the typing pool for help with typing up this project.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a group of contestants who compete against each other in a tournament for the right to advance to the next round</p> <p><i>I am in the second pool of contestants in the singing competition.</i></p>

 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>(of two or more people or organizations) put (money or other assets) into a common fund</p> <p><i>They entered a contract to pool any gains from their investments.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>share (things) for the benefit of all those involved</p> <p><i>We had some time to think by ourselves and then we pooled our ideas.</i></p> 
 <h1>pool</h1>	<p>a game played on a table using fifteen colored and numbered balls and a white cue ball</p> <p><i>My dad has a pool table in our basement.</i></p> 
 <h1>pound</h1>	<p>to strike over and over with heavy blows</p> <p><i>The construction worker pounded the nails with a hammer.</i></p>

<p>pound</p> 	<p>to put into someone's mind by repeating over and over</p> <p><i>He won't remember to do it unless you pound it into him.</i></p> 
<p>pound</p> 	<p>to throb or beat</p> <p><i>My heart was pounding after the race.</i></p> 
<p>pound</p> 	<p>the act of pounding</p> <p><i>Barry gave the tent stake a good pound with a rock.</i></p> 
<p>pound</p> 	<p>a unit of weight equal to 16 ounces or 453.592 grams</p> <p><i>I'll need a pound of minced meat.</i></p>

 <h1>pound</h1>	<p>the main unit of money of the United Kingdom and Ireland</p> <p><i>We need to exchange our dollars into pounds for our trip to London.</i></p> 
 <h1>pound</h1>	<p>a shelter for keeping stray animals</p> <p><i>Let's go to the pound to look at the dogs.</i></p> 
 <h1>pupil</h1>	<p>a student in school</p> <p><i>The teacher pointed out the pupil's mistakes.</i></p> 
 <h1>pupil</h1>	<p>the small, dark opening in the center of the eye. Light passes through the pupil into the eye</p> <p><i>The pupil of the eye expands as much as 45 percent when a person looks at something they like.</i></p>

 <h1>racket</h1>	<p>a loud unpleasant noise; a din</p> <p><i>The bus driver told us to stop making such a racket.</i></p> 
 <h1>racket</h1>	<p>dishonest activities by a group of people whose aim is to cheat others of their money</p> <p><i>The gangsters in the movie were running a protection racket.</i></p> 
 <h1>racket</h1>	<p>an object used to hit the ball in tennis, squash or badminton. It is made of a round or oval frame with a network of tightly laced strings and a long handle</p> <p><i>I broke the string in my racket, so I'll have to get it restrung.</i></p> 
 <h1>range</h1>	<p>the two points or limits between which something can vary, or the distance between the limits</p> <p><i>This shirt comes in a wide range of sizes.</i></p>

 <h1>range</h1>	<p>the distance or area over which something can reach or function</p> <p><i>Dogs can hear sounds that are not in the range of human hearing.</i></p> 
 <h1>range</h1>	<p>an area used for practice in shooting.</p> <p><i>Police officers learn to shoot at a shooting range.</i></p> 
 <h1>range</h1>	<p>a large, open area of land on which livestock graze and roam</p> <p><i>The cowboys rode on the open range.</i></p> 
 <h1>range</h1>	<p>a series of connected mountains</p> <p><i>The Himalayan mountain range is the highest on earth.</i></p>

 <h1>rent</h1>	<p>a regular payment made to an owner of property for the right to live in or use that property</p> <p><i>The rent for our house is \$1,000 a month.</i></p>

 <h1>rent</h1>	<p>to grant use of in exchange for payment</p> <p><i>We rent part of our land to a farmer for his cattle.</i></p> 
 <h1>rent</h1>	<p>to be offered for rent</p> <p><i>The cabin rents for three hundred dollars a month.</i></p> 
 <h1>rent</h1>	<p>be let or hired out at a specified rate</p> <p><i>Skis and snowboards rent for \$60–80 for six days.</i></p>

 <h1>right</h1>	<p>in keeping with what is fair and good</p> <p><i>Helping a friend in need is the right thing to do.</i></p> 
 <h1>right</h1>	<p>in keeping with the rules of justice, law, or society</p> <p><i>It's not right to take your brother's sweets.</i></p> 
 <h1>right</h1>	<p>in keeping with fact or reason; true; correct.</p> <p><i>All her answers were right.</i></p> 
 <h1>right</h1>	<p>facing out; outer; front</p> <p><i>The right side of the jacket is red; the inside is black.</i></p>

 <h1>right</h1>	<p>proper; appropriate</p> <p><i>His new job was just right for him.</i></p>

 <h1>rose</h1>	<p>Stood up after lying, kneeling, or sitting</p> <p><i>Everyone rose when the judge entered the courtroom.</i></p> 
 <h1>rose</h1>	<p>got up from bed</p> <p><i>We rose at four o'clock in the morning to catch a flight.</i></p> 
 <h1>rose</h1>	<p>moved upward</p> <p><i>The smoke from the camp fire rose up in the air.</i></p> 
 <h1>rose</h1>	<p>rebelled</p> <p><i>The people rose up against the cruel king.</i></p>

 <h1>saw</h1>	<p>a tool with a thin metal blade that has sharp teeth along the edge. Saws are used for cutting hard materials such as wood or metal.</p> <p><i>The fishermen made a round hole in the ice with a saw.</i></p> 
 <h1>saw</h1>	<p>to cut, separate, or shape with a saw or a tool like a saw</p> <p><i>He sawed the wood for the new deck.</i></p>

 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>any thin, flat piece that flakes off skin or another surface</p> <p><i>When I scratched my arm, scales of skin fell off.</i></p> 
 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>to remove the scales from</p> <p><i>We need to scale and clean the fish before we cook them.</i></p> 
 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>(often plural) a device used for weighing</p> <p><i>The fish mongers use a scale to weigh the fish.</i></p>

 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>a set of numbered marks made at evenly spaced points along a ruler, thermometer, or other measuring device</p> <p>The scale of this measuring tape is in centimeters.</p> 
 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>the size of a model or map compared to the actual size of the thing it represents</p> <p><i>This map has a scale of one inch to ten miles.</i></p> 
 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>degree, extent, or level</p> <p><i>We like to do our Christmas celebrations on a large scale for the whole family.</i></p> 
 <h1>scale</h1>	<p>a series of musical tones going up or down in pitch</p> <p><i>I need to practice my scales to learn the piano.</i></p>
