Directions for Using the 101 *Captivating Motivational Quotes* eBook

EBOOKS

An eBook is a PDF computer document of a book that can be read by any computer that has the software program Adobe Acrobat Reader. This software is available free from Adobe. If you do not have the latest version, you may download it free at www.adobe.com.

GETTING HELP FOR USING ACROBAT READER

Click on ACROBAT READER HELP in the menu bar at the top of your screen for detailed help.

You will learn how to scroll through the pages using the arrows at the top of your screen, and how to add bookmarks for the pages you want as well as many other things you can do with your eBook. One thing that you will notice is that you will not be able to alter any of the text or color on any of the pages. This preserves the integrity of your eBook, and allows you to let others use it - without worrying that they may accidentally change something.

BOOKMARKS AND THUMBNAILS

The panel on your left side of the screen has four tabs. You will be using the two tabs that say, Bookmarks and Thumbnails. Bookmarks are in text, while Thumbnails are pictures of each page.

When you click on any of the Bookmarks you will be linked to that page. While there are only a few bookmarks pre-set, you may add your own bookmarks for the pages you want to return to. However, every page in this eBook has a Thumbnail picture. When you click on a Thumbnail you will be linked to that page. You can easily switch between Bookmarks and Thumbnails by clicking on the tabs on the left side of your screen.

BROWSE THROUGH THE TABLE OF CONTENTS

Each of the Quotes Categories is linked to a page listing of all of the quotes in that category. Simply click on the category to see the listing of quotes. Then click directly on the quote you want to see in the colorful full-page display size.

If you prefer, you can just browse through the 101 large full-page quotes by scrolling through the [Thumbnails](#) or by browsing through the [full page size quotes](#) beginning on page 21.

HOW TO PRINT YOUR QUOTES

Most of the time you will want to print in color. The quotes look great on plain letter size paper, and they even look better on paper with preprinted colored borders - up to 1+1/4" wide. Bordered paper makes the quotes stand out. Paper with colored borders may be purchased at office supply stores or at Paper Direct 800-272-7377 or on the web at www.paperdirect.com. Click on PaperFrames to see their whole library of bordered paper.

You can also print your quotes on solid colored paper. If you are printing on dark colored paper you may want to print in black ink. Experiment to see what looks best.

PRINTER COLOR SETTINGS

On your print dialogue box, under print settings choose either [Color](#) to print the quotes as they look in color, or choose [Black](#) (the colors will then print as black and gray tones.)

PRINTER QUALITY OR SPEED SETTINGS

[Choose either the medium or highest print quality and print speed.](#) Do not choose the lowest quality or fastest options as you may experience poor quality and may see grid lines printed on

your page. Do a test print on plain copy paper before printing on any bordered or special paper.

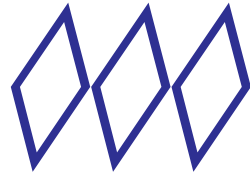

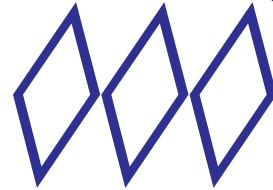
