#### Use of Cell Phones in School

## Delayed Start Mondays

ALL Freshmen are required to attend school during the Delayed Start Mondays for the duration of the first marking period. Ninth-grade students will be introduced to a variety of activities that are designed to create a successful transition into the high school community. In order to earn the option to attend or not attend Delayed Start Mondays for the 2nd, 3rd, and 4th marking period, freshmen must meet 3 out of the 5 following criteria:



Perseverance: no unexcused lates (to class or school) or unexcused absences

Respect: no behavioral issues that result in a write up to the Office

Integrity: Being actively involved in the School Community (participate or attend clubs, sports, fine arts, extracurricular, etc)

Discipline: complete all classwork and turn it in on time

Excellence: earn Academic Honor Roll for the Marking Period

The P.R.I.D.E. criteria will be routinely monitored so it is very important that freshmen chose to do their best and make appropriate decisions. If they choose to not attend the activities during the Delayed Start Mondays, it will be considered an unexcused late. Students will be provided a notice at the start of each marking period indicating whether or not they have earned the option to not attend the freshmen activities on Delayed Start Mondays.

#### Attendance

Habitual tardiness could lead to consequences such as loss of privileges and possible fines. Student absences should be reported by calling the school prior to 9:00 a.m. on the day of the absence. When a student is absent, parents will receive an automated call through the SchoolMessenger system. Upon returning to school following an absence, a note with parent's signature, reason for absence, and date of absence is required. IF A NOTE IS NOT RECEIVED WITHIN THREE DAYS, THE ABSENCE IS CONSIDERED ILLEGAL.

#### **Annual Student Update**

Each year, parents must update their Powerschool accounts for EVERY CHILD who is attending a MASD school. This enables the District to contact you immediately in the event of an emergency involving your child. Parents are also able to select their contact preferences so they can specify to receive a phone call, text or email for weather related delays and cancellations. **NOTE TO PARENTS:** If you choose to use your child's iPad to log into PowerSchool, you must use YOUR username and password NOT your child's log-in.
