



How this activity helps?

Your preschooler identifies the birds in their natural habitat and colours to complete the scenery. Help your child narrate a simple story about the birds — where they live, what they eat, etc.

Where We Belong


In one column are the birds — penguin, hen, and duck; in the other are their environments. Do you know where they belong?

Help your preschooler match each bird to its correct environment. Then, describe the environments.



Penguin






How this activity helps?

Your preschooler observes and associates the birds to their environment. Encourage your child to talk about each bird; how each is different. Eg: Penguins cannot fly, etc.

Spot The Odd One

There are birds, then there are few others. Something seems odd though.

Help your preschooler identify and circle the odd one out in each scenario. Then, explain why.



How this activity helps?


Your preschooler observes and identifies the odd one out.

Introduce your child to each of the elements given in each scenario. Name them.


Fingerprinted Birds
















How this activity helps?

Help your preschooler trace along the dotted lines to guide the penguins to go swimming in the antarctic waters. How about a story then?




How this activity helps?


Your preschooler traces along the dotted lines to take the penguins for a swim. With your child, discuss about the penguins, the birds that are great swimmers, but cannot fly.


Counting Birds

1,2,3... How many birds can you spot?

How this activity helps?

Your preschooler learns to count and identify how a number looks.

On a sheet of paper, help your child draw the numbers 1–5 by finger-painting.


Introduce numbers as patterns.

My Little Penguin

Do you know how a penguin looks? Can you put together the one?

Help your preschooler colour the penguin body and its parts in any manner. Then, cut them out and stick them to complete the penguin. Introduce the names — eyes, beak, feet, and body. (Note: An image has been given for reference)



How this activity helps?


Your preschooler assembles the penguin from scratch
— from colouring to sticking different parts together.

Ask your child to describe the penguin and then narrate a story about where it lives.

B For Birds


H For Hen, F for Flamingo, D For Duck... Are you ready to learn the letters?

Help your preschooler draw along the dotted lines using a crayon and then colour them. Introduce the name of each bird.



How this activity helps?

Your preschooler draws along the dotted lines to trace the letters 'H,' 'F,' and 'D.' Help your child describe each bird. Then, tell a story about of each of them.



Complete The Owl

Hoot... Hooooot! Something seems amiss in the owl.

Help your preschooler complete the owl by drawing along the dotted lines and then colouring it by finger-painting. How about a colourful owl? (Note: An image has been given for reference)


How this activity helps?

Your preschooler patiently traces along the dotted lines and then colours the owl. Narrate a story about the owl. Isn't it a nocturnal bird? Introduce your child to this bird.

Lifecycle of Hen

From an egg to hen, are you ready to learn about the lifecycle of hen?

Help your preschooler cut and paste the different stages in the lifecycle of a hen — egg, hatchling, chick, and hen — on another sheet of paper. Then, describe each stage.



How this activity helps?

Your preschooler learns the lifecycle of hen by cutting and pasting each stage. Help your child name each stage and then come up with a simple rhyme.

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
