



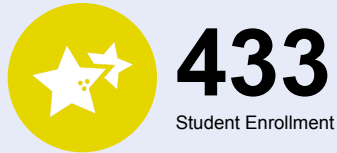

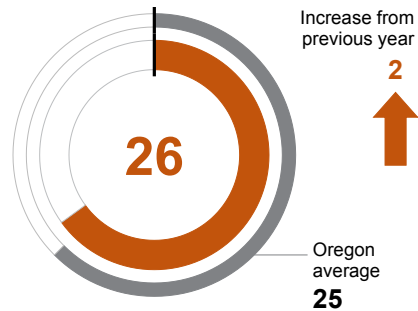

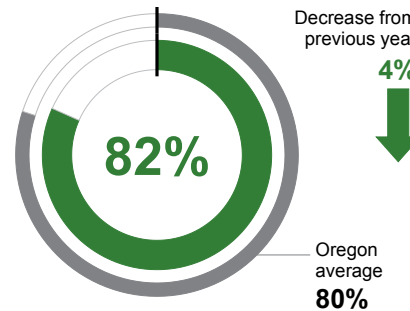
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

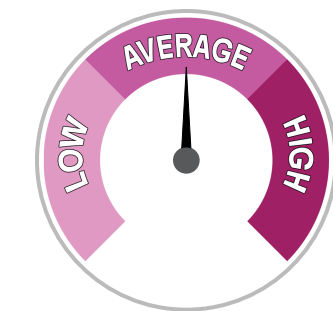
Students who attended more than 90% of their enrolled school days.

INDIVIDUAL STUDENT PROGRESS

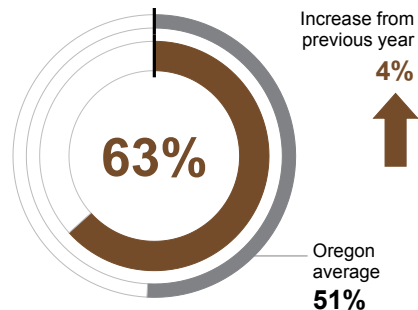
Year-to-year progress in English language arts and mathematics.

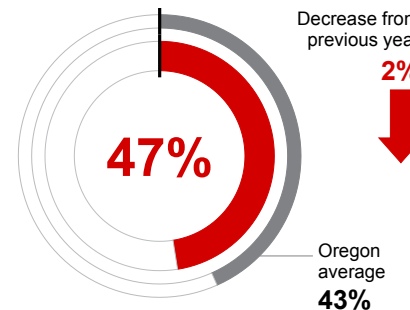
ENGLISH LANGUAGE ARTS

Students meeting state grade-level expectations.



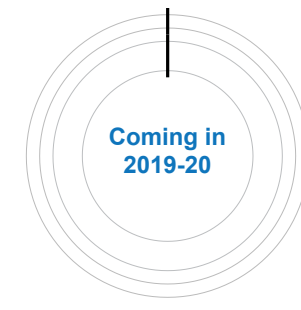
MATHEMATICS

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Our school environment is a key aspect in helping us accomplish our goal of helping our students find academic, social, and emotional success. We have several areas of emphasis to help us achieve a safe and welcoming environment. We focus on 3 character traits/rules that are the backbone of creating a positive environment. We encourage and promote all our students and staff to Be Responsible, Be Safe, and Be Respectful. We also have a comprehensive security system in place that helps secure our Firwood families which includes key cards, cameras, remote lock-down capabilities, a single point of entry for all visitors, and secure fencing.

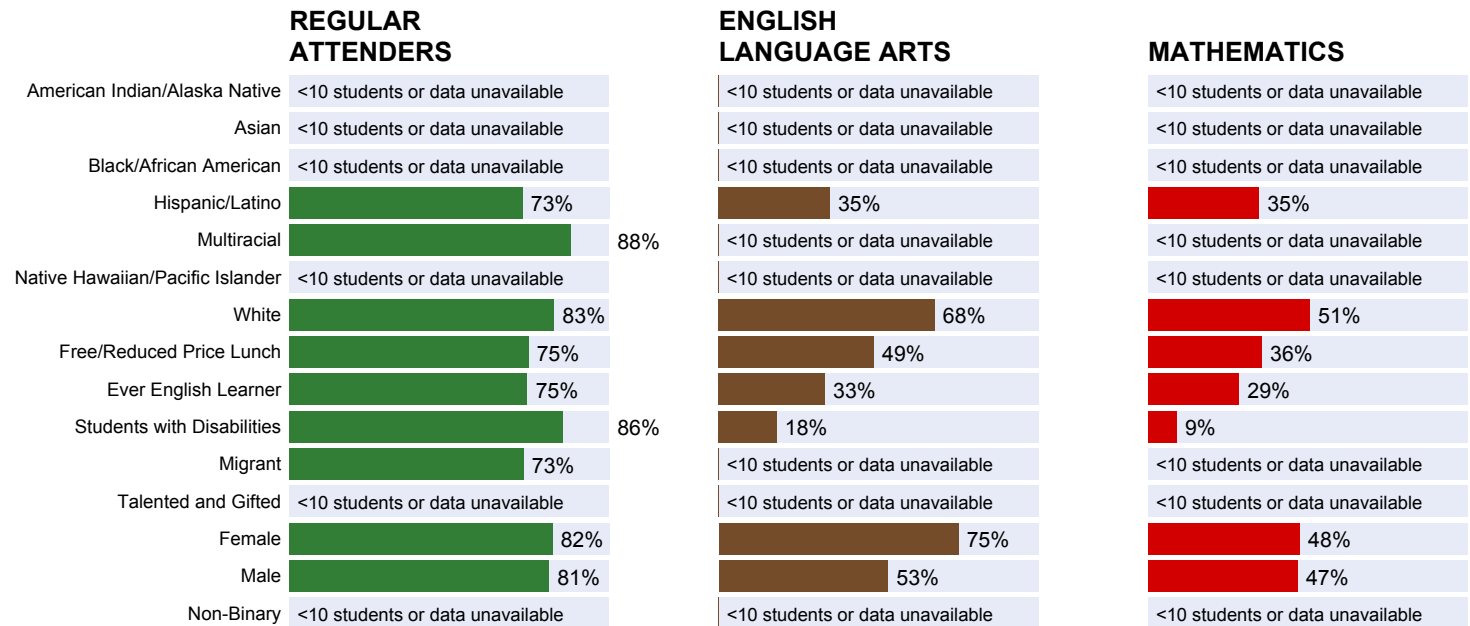

Measures that ensure a safe and secure environment for students:

- A Comprehensive Guidance Counseling program
